## Chancellor Tennison, Circuit Judge White Take Oaths Dec. 28 in Booneville

An investiture ceremony for Chancellor Bradley D. Tennison and new Circuit Judge Rusty White was held Dec. 28 at 10 a.m. at Northeast Mississippi Community College, in Booneville.

The ceremony was held in the Claude Wright Room at the Hank Haney Union.

Chancellor John Hatcher presided over Judge Tennison as his predecessor. Circuit Judge Jim S. Pounds swore in Judge White

to take his place. Judge Hatcher and Judge Pounds, who each served for 12 years, retired Dec. 31.

Judge Tennison previously served as Prentiss County Youth Court referee and as a public defender in Prentiss County. He is a graduate of the University of Mississippi and the University of Mississippi School of Law.

Judge White was elected without opposition. He has practiced law for 30 years. His

private practice has been primarily criminal law. He is a graduate of the University of Mississippi.

The eight-county First Chancery District includes Alcorn, Itawamba, Lee, Monroe, Pontotoc, Prentiss, Tishomingo and Union counties. The seven-county First Circuit Court includes Alcorn, Itawamba, Lee, Monroe, Pontotoc, Prentiss and Tishomingo counties.

## Husband Charged with 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Murder in the Missing Person Case of Susie Rena Lanier

In the wake of an extensive investigation a Tishomingo County man, Russell Leon Lanier, has been charged with the murder of his wife, Susie Rena Lanier, who was last seen on June the 6th 2017.

On December 26th 2018, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office officially charged Russell Leon Lanier with 1st Degree Murder. Susie was only 43 years old when she was reported missing on June 7, 2017 from her mobile home at 12 Whitfield Drive in Iuka, Mississippi.

Susie was reported missing by her husband, Russell Lanier and her step-father. A search was conducted immediately in the area with several volunteers and family members, but Susie was not found.

The first solid piece of evidence in the case came to light on August 31st 2017, when the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office received a call from a man who found what appeared to be a human skull on his property. Tishomingo County Deputies and Investigators arrived on the scene and collected the skull as evidence. Once dental records were obtained of Susie Lanier, the records were forwarded to the Coroner to be analyzed with the skull. Within a few days, the sheriff's office received word that the human skull found was positively identified as that of Susie Lanier.

Another search was conducted in the immediate area where the skull was found. A group of cadaver dogs were brought in from out of state to conduct a search. This particular search located some clothing believed to be worn by Susie Lanier as identified by family but no

other human remains were located.

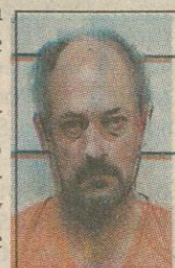
On December 24th 2018, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office received new additional information pertaining to the Lanier case.

Russell Lanier was detained and on December 26th 2018, Russell Lanier was officially charged in the death of his wife. Lanier remains in custody with a \$500,000 bond

that was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court. This case will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.

Sheriff John Daugherty would like to personally thank all the volunteers that helped for several months in the search of Susie. These volunteers were both local citizens and individuals from different parts of the state and out of state. Sheriff Daugherty would also like to thank those business that provided water and food to the volunteers during these searches.

Finally, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office would like to extend our deep appreciation to Susie's family and also offer our prayers and condolences. The family was a great part of this investigation and a tremendous help. This is a difficult thing for any family to deal with and we ask the public to respect the family, as they go through this emotional process.

## Notice from County Tax Assessor

It's that time of year again. January - March is the time of year when you are able to file for your Homestead exemption. When you come in to file there are a few things you will need.

1. Current Car Tag number
2. Copy of your Deed
3. Social Security number for you and your spouse if married.
4. Proof of Disability if filing for Disability Exemption.
5. Proof of age if filing for over 65 Year Exemption.
6. For Disabled Veteran Exemption- Proof of Disability and year awarded.
7. If you have lost a spouse during the 2018 year you will also need to come and refile your Homestead. Please bring a copy of their death certificate and the above listed things for you to file your Homestead exemption.

Please make sure to come within these 3 months because this is the only time you are allowed to file for these exemptions. Also, for those people who are over 65 years old please make sure that we have your correct mailing address and phone number. Please contact our office at 662-423-7059 if you have any other questions. Thank you.

# Scenes From The Last Chapter In The Bible (part XIV)

We are coming to a couple of verses in Revelation that have been debated and considered quite a bit, yet the explanation does not really seem too hard, when we consider them in connection with the rest of the Bible on the subject covered here. Revelation 22:18-19 says, "For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book, if any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book. And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things that are written in this book."

We must notice several things about our verses: John is speaking to those who have heard the words of the Book of Revelation, for it is called "the prophecy of this book", and not all books of the Bible are books of prophecy. The Book of Revelation was originally written to the seven churches in Asia, as Revelation chapters two and three clearly show, so the hearers would at least include those within the seven churches, yet others are no doubt

included. Those who would add to the words of John's prophecy would be assuming the place of an inspired writer, and that would make such additions have an adverse effect on what John had truly prophesied through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. In the day when John wrote this book many spurious writings were being circulated among the believers in the early churches. An agreement as to what books belonged in the New Testament was not confirmed

until 367 AD, when a man named Athanasius wrote a list of the twenty-seven books we now have in our New Testament. Even then, the western church did not accept this list until 397 AD. John was guarding against anyone who might seek to add spurious material to what he had written, claiming them to have been inspired of God, thus he said that God would add to that person the plagues that are written in the Book of Revelation. I believe that we may apply the "safeguard" given by John to all of the Bible, for God does that in Deuteronomy 4:2: "Ye shall not add unto the word which I command you, neither shall ye diminish ought from it, that ye may keep the command-

ments of the LORD your God which I command you." Deuteronomy 12:32 says about the same: "What thing soever I command you, observe to do it: thou shalt not add thereto, nor diminish from it."

We must acknowledge that Moses was not writing for the entire world of all ages when he said that Israel was to keep all that he had commanded, for that would put all of us back under the law. Yet we must realize that we are still obligated to study all that Moses and all other inspired writers have written. We do get many great lessons from the books of the law, but Galatians shows that we are not under the law, thus we are not required to follow all of the ritual

and ceremonies of law, yet the moral law, yet the moral law that is there is repeated in the New Testament. My point is that cannot directly apply all of the Bible to the church age, the church can learn from all of the Bible. Moreover, the warning against adding the Word of God still binding, in we are not to change the record that God given, whether it rectly applies to us not. John wrote to of the people who on earth "this side the cross" and warning against adding to truth that he had written for the churches in Asia, but also for churches of all ages.

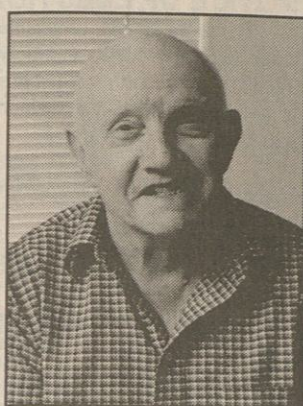

## MSU's Must-see Museums and Galleries

STARKVILLE, Miss.— From rare rocks and antique clocks to self-playing instruments and eye-opening insects, Mississippi State's museums and galleries have something for everyone.

Curious visitors and serious researchers can investigate the more than 20 museums and collections highlighting different disciplines in the sciences, arts and humanities. Many of these are free and open to the public year-round.

"Our galleries and collections bring 15,000 to 18,000 people to campus each year, including school-aged children, researchers, university students and faculty, and families," said Amy Moe-Hoffman, chair of MSU's museums and galleries committee who also serves as an instructor in the university's Department of Geosciences. "We are very proud of our museums and galleries' contributions to education and outreach, and we are continually working to increase our impact and further support the mission of the university."

Located at Cullis Wade Depot is the Cullis and Gladys Wade Clock Museum, where more than 400 clocks and watches dating back to the 1700s are exhibited year-round. The collection belonged to MSU electrical engineering alumnus and renowned antique clock collector, the late Charles Cullis Wade of Newton, and his late wife, Gladys Valentine Wade of Laurel. While most are original productions, several clocks were customized by Cullis Wade with hand-painted glass designs, and a number of French clocks and several English and German pieces are featured.

Making MSU a leading destination for research on the Civil War, Reconstruction and the nation's 16th and 18th presidents, the Ulysses S. Grant Presidential Library and the Frank and Virginia Williams Collection of Lincolniana are housed in Mitchell Memorial Library. In November 2017, MSU Libraries celebrated the opening of the state-of-the-art museum chronicling Grant and Lincoln's lives through correspondence, photographs, paintings, engravings, statues and other artifacts and ephemera.

The library also is where patrons can explore the Charles H. Templeton Sr. Music Museum, a collection that was donated to MSU nearly 30 years ago by the late Starkville businessman. Highlighting the industry when ragtime dominated popular American music, the collection tells the story of the "business of music" through more than 22,000 pieces of sheet music, 200 self-playing musical instruments, 15,000 recordings and unique musical memorabilia from the 1880s-1930s.

The Cully A. Cobb Antique Tool Museum, maintained by the College of Forest Resources, is another must-see collection. The museum serves as a showplace for more than 350 antique tools, axes, saws, hammers, drills and chisels that can be viewed by appointment.

MSU's museums and galleries committee also hosts a number of fun, collaborative events each year to raise awareness of the resources available to the university and local communities. "Science Night at the Museum" draws all ages to the university's Lois Dowdle Cobb Museum of Archaeology and the Dunn-Seiler Museum. Participants can observe scientific demonstrations in a variety of disciplines, including anthropology, archaeology, art, astronomy, biology, chemistry, meteorology, physics and veterinary science.

"I love seeing people of all ages get excited about science while learning more about the importance of the collections on campus," Moe-Hoffman said.

Objects in the Cobb Museum of Archaeology are a must-see for the avid archaeologist, educator or curious patron interested in learning more about the ancient Middle East and southeastern U.S. Located on Lee Boulevard, the museum houses a significant collection of casts of ancient Near Eastern sculptures and panels that were donated by the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. Among these are replicas of the Code of Hammurabi, the Moabite Stone, the Black Obelisk of Shalmanezar III and the Rosetta Stone.

With collections dating to the late 1800s, the Dunn-Seiler Museum houses extensive mineral, rock and fossil collections.

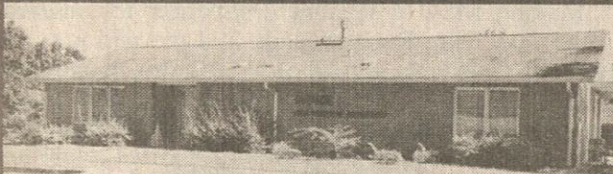

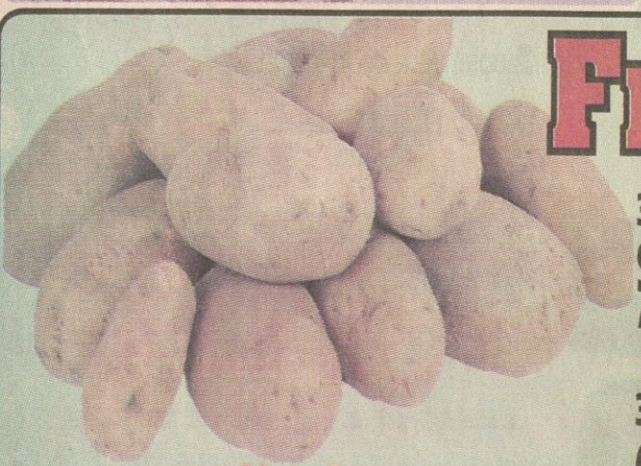

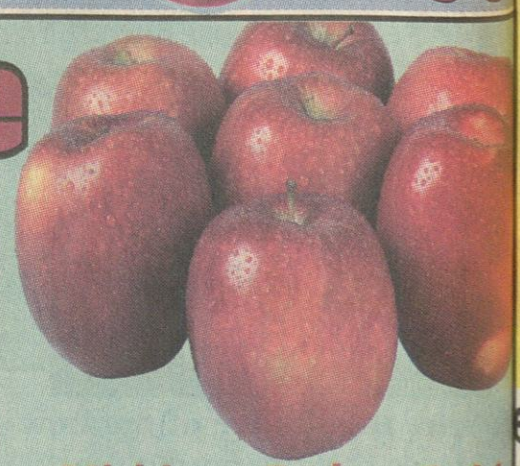

# Charlotte's Attic



## The Thomas Randolph Smith Family

by Charlotte McVay

Once again I am sharing an old photo from my family archives. This is my great-great-grandfather Thomas Randolph Smith and his wife Amy Louhaney Millsapps and their family. This photo was taken around 1900. Identified are, front row, from left: Annie L. Smith (Haines), Thomas R. (grandpa) Smith, little Lula Adams, and Amy Louhaney Millsapps (grandma) Smith. Second row, from left, Owen Smith, Charlie Smith, Bryan Adams, Julia Bayliss (King), Lucille Smith (Wadkins), Ross Smith Robinson, Orlena Smith (Robinson), and Loven Ross Robinson. Third row, from left, James T. Smith (known as Uncle Bud), Mary Ann Archer (Aunt Mollie) Smith, Walter Smith, and Blanche

Bayliss (Daugherty my grandmother). Fourth row, from left, Frank Bayliss, Maude Smith (Mars), Churchy Adams, Blanche Ice, Bessie Bayliss (Patterson), and Elizabeth E. (Betty Bayliss, my great-grandmother). Fifth row, from left, Sallie (Sarah) Shockley (T.R. Smith's sister), Lucinda Pinkard Adams; Henreitta Smith Adams, Tom Adams and Lou Anna Smith Adams.

Thomas Randolph Smith was born October 21, 1812, near Villa Rica County, Georgia, but when about two years of age his parents moved to Cass now Barthow County. Here his father, Hugh Smith was drowned in the Etowah River a few years later. At the age of 18 he decided to go to Eastport, Mississippi

to work on the farm of Jeremiah Millsapps, who had married his oldest sister. He arrived there in December 1852 and married Amy Louhaney Millsapps, youngest sister of Jeremiah Millsapps.

Thomas Randolph Smith lived to be in his 90's and served in the Civil War in Company B, composed of men from Tishomingo County under Capt John Doan and put into the 4th Alabama Cavalry under Col Johnston. Before he died he wrote his biography and the details of his serving in the war and being taken a prisoner to Camp Case in Ohio.

He was the son of Elizabeth Edwards Yarbrough, who married Hugh Smith about 1817 in Wiinsboro, SC. After his

father drowned, his mother came to Eastport where her daughter and son had moved and settled in Iuka. She later married Aurelius Eccles who also served in the Civil War.

(Taken from an old Vidette) Mrs. Eccles lived in a house on north Main Street known as the Hubbard House (today owned by Lila Ham). Legend has it that Mrs. Eccles was coming down the stairs when she put herself in front of a Federal soldier who attempted to enter her home. When she defied his power and it is said gave him a "good Rebel cussing," he struck her across the head with his gun and gave her a big scar which she always wore as proud as a boy with his first britches.
