How to Handle Unwanted **Telemarketing Calls** Telemarketing phone calls lines being placed on the list,

and spoof phone calls are a major issue for the residents of Tishomingo County. It is a difficult problem to resolve due to the ever-changing tactics used by the companies and individuals responsible for the calls. To report these types of phone calls contact the Mississippi Public Service Commission at the toll free number: 1-86NOCALLMS (1-866-622-5567).

One option to combat these daily interruptions is to place your number on the "No Call" list with the Public Service Commission of Mississippi. This will not eliminate the calls, especially ones that are from illegitimate sources but it may lessen the unwanted solicitation that happens frequently.

After a waiting period your number is added to the list, unapproved businesses are not allowed to contact you. After being put on the list you are within your rights to file a claim with the public service commission if the calls continue. You may have your number placed on the "No Call" list if you are 18 years of age or older, the owner of the

and the phone number in question is not classified as a business line. To pace your number on the list online visit http:// www.psc.state.ms.us.

The Federal Trade Commission is working on this matter also; they are another helpful resource in dealing with this problem. If you are receiving a call from an unknown phone number, please take the following steps: (1) It is best not to answer the phone. (2) If that is not an option, hang up immediately upon determining that it is an unsolicited prerecorded telemarketing phone call. (3) Never press a button if prompted by a recording. Any type of participation with the call may increase the number of calls you receive in the future. Robocalls as they are referred to, which are frequently reported to the PSC include but are not limited to: (1) Credit card services (2) Home Security (3) Medical devices targeting Senior Citizens (4) Diabetic Supplies. You can seek more information on this topic on the Federal Trade Commission website.

It's that time of year again. January - March the time of year when you are able to file for you Homestead exemption. When you come in to there are a few things you will need.

- 1. Current Car Tag number
- 2. Copy of your Deed
- 3. Social Security number for you and your spouse if married.
- 4. Proof of Disability if filing for Disab ity Exemption.
- 5. Proof of age if filing for over 65 Year Exemption.
- 6. For Disabled Veteran Exemption-Proof of Disability and year awarde
- 7. If you have lost a spouse during the 2018 year you will also need to con and refile your Homestead. Please bring a copy of their death certification and the above listed things for you file your Homestead exemption.

Please make sure to come within these 3 mont because this is the only time you are allowed to flom for these exemptions. Also, for those people who a REI over 65 years old please make sure that we have yought correct mailing address and phone number. 



Continue to Look at Revelation 22:18-19

We will continue to look at Revelation 22:18-19: "For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book, If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book. And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things that are written in this book." I believe that God has given in our sixtysix books what He inspired men to write. John was putting up a guard against those who would seek to destroy the message of the Bible by additional writings or writing that take away from what has been written. For example, I have many books in my library that claim to be a part of "the lost books of the Bible" (which is

books). Some people have said, "Maybe we have lost a part of the inspired word God, so these books have "found it for us". I have read long sections of some of these books, and believe me, they are not inspired, for they certainly differ from the Bible we have accepted since the days of John's writing. Psychic writers have brought all kinds of garbage to the minds of modern day readers, even claiming that Jesus Christ was married to Mary Magdalene. I have read some of this material and I am here to say that Satan is behind it. These writers cannot be telling the truth, if the Bible is telling the

ly disagree with Scripture. John is seeking to guard against such writings in the warnings that we see in our verses, for it is true that some of the writing that disagree with Scripture were certainly around in John's day. The same "books" were not around, but the same teaching was!

Now we must consider the judgment that John pronounces on those who would seek to destroy the message of God by adding "uninspired information", or by leaving out part of the message of the "inspired writings". First we see the plagues of the Book of Revelation that will be added to those who add to the message of

God that John wrote. (Although the plagues are not mentioned in Deuteronomy 4:2 and 12:32, there is a warning there against adding to or taking from any of God's Word.) John specifically says that God would add the mentioned plagues Revelation in those who added to his message. does not have to mean that the people who add to John's message have to live in the days when the plagues of Revelation start coming, rather that the same kind of judgment will come on any who add to the message that God inspired John to write. Those who take away from the message of John will have their parts taken out of the book of life. We need to notice that this "book of life" is not called "the Lamb's book of life" here, thus it seems to refer to the "book of the living", or those alive on earth. The judgment

would be death, so that this "part" (life) is denied such people. His "part" is also taken out of the holy city, which means that such people do not know God, have never known God, and will have no part in the New Jerusalem, which they could have had, if they had believed God and His Word. The blessing written in Revelation will never be offered to those who take from the Word of God, for these are not the people of God, thus they will have no place with the people of God in the eternal city. There is no reference in the Bible that says anyone's name will ever be taken out of the Lamb's book of life. Revelation 13:8 says, "And all that dwell upon the earth shall worship him (the beast, or anti-christ), whose names are not written in the book of life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world." Then Revelation 21:27 says,

"And there shall wise enter into 1t Jerusalem) any that defileth, ne whatsoever Or abomination, keth a lie; but which are writte the Lamb's boo life." 

Indoor Fire Ant Invasions

Indoor fire ant invasions become more common during wet rainy weather when fire ants are forced to abandon flooded, saturated soils in search of drier places to nest. Because of their aggressive, stinging habits, indoor fire ant invasions have to be controlled quickly and effectively and clients who are experiencing this problem want fast answers. Here are some quick tips you can share with clients to help them get started, as well as links to more detailed information.

1. First, go look around the outside foundation of the house and see if you can find a mound and/ or trail that shows where the infestation is originating. You will deal with these later, but it is important to know where the problem is coming from.

2. Now, go back inside and kill those fire ants.

- If you don't have any insecticide on hand, you can mix a solution of 2 to 3 tablespoons of dishwashing liquid per gallon of water and spray this on the ants. This soapy water will quickly kill any ants it contacts.

- If you don't have any type of spray bottle, you may be able to use a bucket and mop or wash cloth to "clean up the ants" with this soapy solution. Wear plastic gloves to prevent or at least reduce stings.

- Better yet, use an aerosol spray or trigger pump spray of a household insecticide that contains a pyrethroid insecticide such as: pyrethrin, permethrin, bifenthrin, cyfluthrin, deltamethrin, or others. Just be sure the product you are using is labeled for use in the type of site you are treating. Allow sprays to dry before cleaning up dead ants using a broom and dustpan, or vacuum.

3. Now that you have the indoor situation under control, go back outside and spray any trails around the foundation, exterior walls, or the areas where you saw they were trailing originally, with one of the pyrethroid insecticides mentioned above. The goal here is to stop and prevent any re-invasion.

4. The final step is to treat the mound the ants were coming from, assuming you were able to identify such a mound. Use one of the liquid mound drenches such as Hi-Yield Bug Blaster (bifenthrin), Bonide Eight Insect Control (permethrin).

5. If you can't identify any outside mound, but continue to be plagued by indoor fire ant invasions, or see fire ants trailing around the outside of the building, try applying some Advion Fire Ant Bait (indoxacarb) around the outside perimeter of the building, including around any trails that you can identify. This bait works much faster than other fire ant baits, often providing control in as little as 3 to 7 days. Dr. Blake Layton, Mississippi State Extension Entomology Specialist.



The Vidette, February 08, 1940, Obituary:

The last Confederate veteran in Tishomingo County, John Fusson Grimes, died at the home of his son, George Grimes, near Holcut, Miss. early Saturday morning. He was 93 years, 5 months, and 21 days old and had lived in Tishomingo County ever since he was six years old, moving here with his parents from Fayette, Mississippi, in 1852 and settling within five miles of where he died. As a boy of about ten, he had attended the big celebration held at the new town of Iuka when the golden spike marking the completion of the Memphis & Charleston Railroad, was driven. Fifty years later he saw the completion of the Birmingham division of the Illinois Central and from his home high on a hill he could see the trains run over the land which his father had settled in the long ago. In those nearly 100 years of existence he had seen the primitive log school houses with the split log benches and clay floors, where the blueblack speller was the chief book used, give way to the brick consolidated school, one of which he could see from his home. He had seen the slow moving ox wagon give way to the swift moving automobiles and airplanes. Too young to enlist at the beginning of the Civil War, he saw service the last two years with Roddy under Forrest and was in several important battles. Funeral services were conducted at Cross Roads cemetery Sunday afternoon. Besides the son with whom he made his home, he left one daughter, Mrs. T. F. Hall of Huntsville, Ala., fifteen grandchildren and seventeen great grandchildren.

The Vidette February 15, 1940: We were grieved to hear of Uncle John Grimes' death. We know how to sympathize with his relatives that he left behind. Sources: The Vidette, Death Record, Cemetery Record, 1880 Tishomingo County Census Record, Cutshall Funeral Home Record.

The 1860 Census of Tishomingo county Mississippi listed five children in the household.

Mississippi Department of Archives and History records record that he enlisted July 7, 1863 and was discharged May 4, 1865. He served in Co. D, 7th Alabama Calvary, and his rank was private.





Crafty Crafters Met at Iuka Library For Christmas Social






