

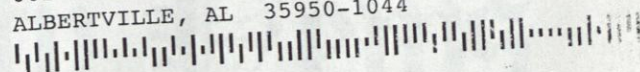

## TRAXYS Cuts the Ribbon

Burnsville, Mississippi, July 15, 2019. A ribbon cutting ceremony was held for TRAXYS, Tishomingo County's newest industry. Located north of Burnsville, the new industry will manufacture additives for the oil and aluminum industries.

Beginning as Project 100 in 2016, TRAXYS conferred sites in several states before finally selecting the Tishomingo County site in Burnsville.

TRAXYS is leasing a 100,000 SF industrial building from Yellow Creek Port Authority. The company

will be using the barge facility on the Tenn-Tom Waterway at Burnsville as well as the new rail spur, both of which are owned and operated by Yellow Creek Port Authority. Yellow Creek Port Authority, the Mississippi Development Authority, Tishomingo County, and the Tishomingo County Development Foundation provided assistance.

Plant Manager Jennifer Black said "we thank Burnsville, Tishomingo County, Yellow Creek Port, and the State of Mississippi for welcoming us to the area. We are very pleased to be here and have found the labor

force to be both motivated and creative problem solvers. We look forward to additional growth and a bright future here at Yellow Creek Port South."

## Barnes Accepted into Rural Physician Scholarship Program

JACKSON, Miss.—Katelyn Barnes, a junior at the University of Mississippi and native of Tishomingo, was recently selected to participate in the undergraduate portion of the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program (MRPSP). Barnes is the daughter of Donna Barnes and the late Scotty Barnes of Tishomingo.



SP Scholars must enter a residency program in one of five primary care specialties: family medicine, general internal medicine, medicine-pediatrics, obstetrics/gynecology or pediatrics. The MRPSP Scholar must provide four years of service in a clinic-based practice in an approved Mississippi community of 15,000 or fewer population located more than 20 miles from a medically served area.

The MRPSP provides a means for rural Mississippi students to earn a seat in medical school, receive mentoring during the medical school application process, earn a \$120,000 medical school scholarship in return for four years of service and learn the art of healing from practicing rural physicians.

## Pet of the Week

Congratulations to Lakota Blue German (Cody). This adorable little fellow is our Pet of the Week at Iuka Animal Clinic. His owner is Christi German. Cody is a very mischievous 4 month old Golden Retriever. He loves to play



with his many toys, but his favorite is his Big Al elephant that his Aunt Scarlett got him. He loves to play in his pool on hot days then nap with his kity brothers. Cody is very smart and likes to give "high fives". He is very much loved and has made their family whole.

The first few months in a dog's life are his most formative. He's meeting his human family for the first time and learning how to interact with the world around him. But just as important are the steps you take to address his physical health through vaccinations. It's best to get your puppy examined by a veterinarian as soon as possible. During the examination, your veterinarian will look at your dog's

medical and vaccination history. If the breeder or shelter has recently vaccinated your puppy and your veterinarian is confident that it was done properly, a schedule for follow-up vaccinations will be made based on your pup's particular needs. Puppies should be vaccinated every two to four weeks between the ages of 6 and 16 weeks with the final puppy vaccines given no earlier than 16 weeks of age. ## Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 22)

We are looking at the writing of King Solomon in the Bible Book of Ecclesiastes. Yes, I am aware that some "scholars" have strong doubts that Solomon is the author of Ecclesiastes, but internal evidence seems clear to me that he was the writer. In Ecclesiastes 4:15-16, Solomon continues his reasoning: "I considered all the living which walk under the sun, with the second child that shall stand up in his stead. There is no end of all the people, even of all that have been before them: they also that come after shall not rejoice in him. Surely this also is vanity and vexation of spirit." Solomon may still be speaking of the old and foolish king who is seen in verses 13 and 14 of this chapter, but he could be speaking of anyone

and the descendant who takes his place in life when he is dead. At any rate, the wise king is considering men who live on earth ("under the sun" means life on earth) and those who follow them. He says that the population of people continues to increase, so that there is no shortage of people on earth, nor of all who have lived and died, so Solomon says that second generations of foolish kings, or people, will not rejoice in those who lived before them, if they lived foolishly! This might be worth a little thought, for most of us have children, nephews or nieces who will live on earth after us. What will they conclude about how we lived life? Will they see us as having been selfish "know it alls" or foolish? Or, will they perhaps see us as having made a

good contribution to life on earth and as having left a legacy that is worth mimicking? Solomon said that life lived with no regard for those who follow us is an empty way to live!

Ecclesiastes 5:1-2 says, "Keep thy foot when thou goest to the house of God, and be more ready to hear, than to give the sacrifice of fools: for they consider not that they do evil. Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few." Although Solomon lived in the days of temple worship, at least after he built the temple, yet there is a lesson here for churchgoers in our day. Everybody in church does not have to make a speech every

time the church doors open, nor does anyone need to suppose that he can contribute more to the church than others. The idea here is that we should not make rash vows concerning our giving of money to the church, or of giving ourselves in service to the church. Any true giving we do, in either area, should be first to the Lord, then it may also be beneficial to others. Notice the admonition that one should be more willing to hear than to vow foolishly, or to participate in the service itself. Yes, I think there should be room for personal participation in church meetings, but I have seen some people dominate the service in this area under the mistaken idea that the Spirit of God was leading them. Solomon says that a vow,

or anything else, that is done in a public worship service, should be done with forethought. He says men should not be rash to utter anything before God, because God in heaven is keeping a record, and men on earth are not always open to the leadership of God's Spirit when they make rash vows or statements. Sometimes the people who are rather quiet in church may be doing more for God than those who make sure that they are heard in every service! God does move on His people to speak in public worship, but we must be able to discern between the Holy Spirit and our own spirits.

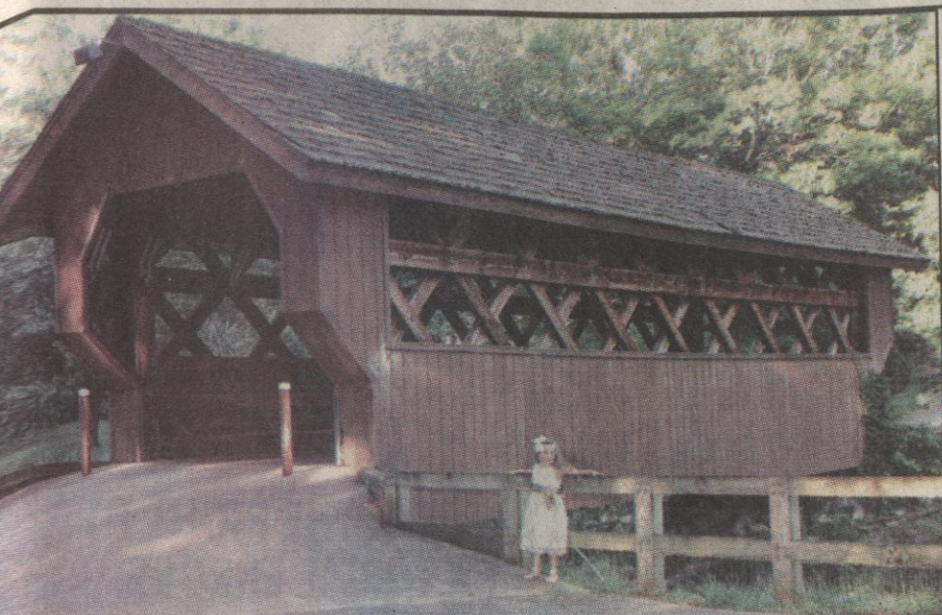
