The Mississippi Lottery Begins Sales in Tishomingo County

Beginning on November 25th, you can now purchase lottery tickets in the state of Mississippi. Currently, there are three different kinds of scratch-off tickets available for purchase across the state and more will be added in the future. The "3 Times Lucky" scratch-off ticket costs \$1 per ticket, the "Happy Holidays Y'all" and the "7" tickets cost \$2 each, and the "\$100,000

"spot" ticket costs \$5. The scratch-off lottery and Mega Millions tickets will go on sale on Monday, November 30th 2020. Wiley's Discount Tobacco is one of the first locations selling lottery tickets in Iuka; they are open Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Friday and Saturday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Battleground Drive in Iuka. Anyone 21 years of age and older can play the Mississippi Lottery games. The Mississippi Lottery Corporation was established under the Alyce G. Clarke Missis-

issippi Lottery Law, which passed during a 2018 session of the Mississippi State Legislature. The lottery is expected to impact the economy in a positive way; during the first ten years of the lottery the net proceeds up to \$80 million made each year will go to the State Highway Fund until June 30, 2028. The State Highway Fund will repair, renovate and maintain highways and bridges in the state.

Lottery proceeds made over the initial \$80 million in each fiscal year will be transferred into the Education Enhancement

Fund up to \$80 million. After June 2028 the proceeds will be deposited into the Lottery Proceeds Fund which will be transferred to the State General Fund, and any amount over \$80 million per year will continue to be deposited in the Education Enhancement Fund. Any retailer interested in selling lottery tickets should fill out the retailer application form or call the Lottery's Retailer Services number at (855) 652-5688. Retailers receive a 6% commission on lottery sales.

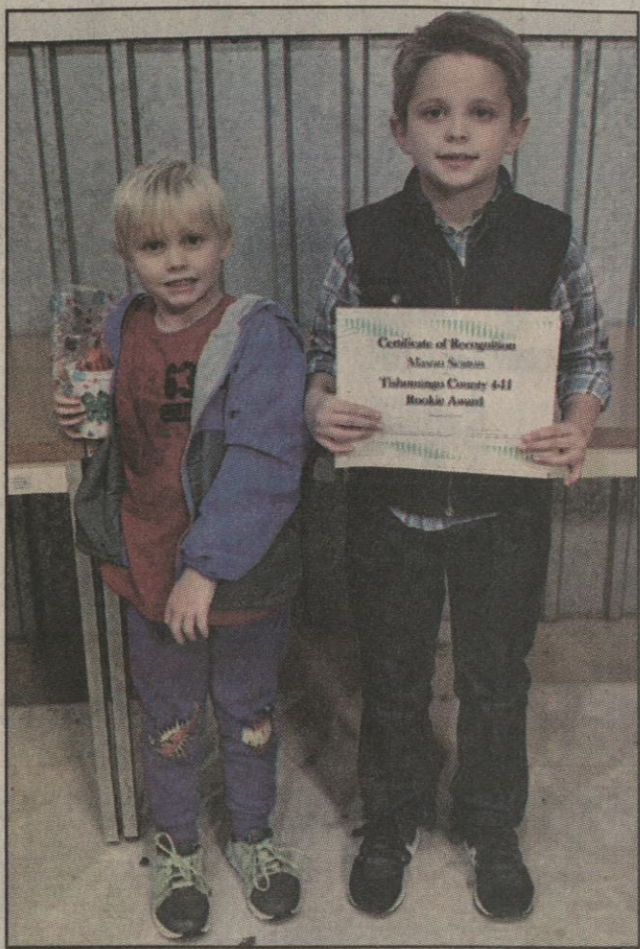

UDC Met at Iuka Library November 18th

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone Chapter met November 18th, 11 a.m., at the Iuka Public Library. Four members were present, Vicky Durham, Gail Smith, Jean Works and Sharon Hairrell. We read minutes, gave treasure and registrar reports and were approved.

We read and went over the November Program "The Complex Topic of Slavery," by Corinne Smith, Historian General. She brought out that references to slavery have been found in the new and old testaments and in our history even before the War between the States. This was an interesting article that we decide to report in another article in the UDC magazine.

Gail Smith presented the program, «The Fighting Parson, General Mark Lowrey. He was born in 1823, in McNairy County, Tennessee to Adam and Marguerite (Ross) Lowrey. His parents had immigrated from England and Ireland to America. He received no formal education. His father died from yellow fever when he was very young. In 1843 his mother moved the family to Tishomingo Co., Mississippi, where he became a bricklayer. He made a profession of faith at the age of 17. At the age of 18 he enlisted in the Mexican War as a private. He was the 2nd Mississippi Volunteer. Neither he nor his regiment ever saw action and he was mustered out in 1848.

Just prior to his 21st birthday he married Sarah Holmes. By the time he was 24 he was struggling with his material riches and his religious beliefs. He surrendered to the Lord's

call to preach. He realized that his lack of education was a hindrance and with the help of his wife he spent hours daily in the books. He became educated and an exceptional speaker.

He was the preacher at Farmington Baptist Church in Alcorn co., in 1853. He later organized the Baptist Church in Corinth. He also preached in churches in Kossuth and Ripley Ms., until the outbreak of the War between the States.

As Mississippi moved toward secession, he attempted to remain politically neutral, but he was never the less asked to lead men into war because of his prior military service, slim as it was. He soon found himself serving as a colonel of the 4th Mississippi Regiment. Opposed to human bondage and owning no slaves, he saw himself solely as defending his home and family from invasion by Union forces. He entered the Confederate service in 1861 as a colonel and in 1862 he became commander of the 32nd Mississippi Infantry. He fought in the battles of Shiloh, Battle of Perryville, and the Kentucky Campaign, and the Battle of Chickamauga. At the Battle of Perryville in October 1862 he was shot in the left arm but stayed on the battlefield. During the retreat which began the next day, he had great difficulty keeping up with the army. He obtained leave and traveled to his brothers house for safety, after six weeks of recuperation, Lowrey joined back with his forces and fought at the Battle of Murfreesboro on January 1, 1863.

Confederate soldiers remembered him as the «Fighting Parson» of the Tennessee Army, declar-

ing that he would «preach like hell on Sunday and fight like the devil all week.»

He was promoted to brigadier general on October 4, 1863, he participated in the Battle old Missionary Ridge and the Atlanta Campaign. He lead a division in the Battle of Jonesborough, he took over brigade command in the Franklin and Nashville Campaign,

During the Nashville rally his faithful horse, «Rebel», was fatally wounded. One of his men gave him his horse; however, Old «Rebel», followed his master until he came to a log that he couldn't step over. After the battle was over Lowrey came back and that was where he founded his beloved Rebel.

While in the army, he took part in a religious revival, and baptized 50 men in a two-week period in the spring of 1864. He resigned his commission in March of 1865, and returned to his ministry. Lowrey established the Blue Mountain Female Institute in Mississippi in 1873, and he wrote for «the Christian Index», a religious newspaper. Lowrey died while traveling in Tennessee, on February 27, 1885.

He was buried in the Old Macedonia Cemetery located in Blue Mountain. A beautiful monument erected by his students of Blue Mountain Female Institute stands guard over his remains.

Do You Remember Threet's Store on Old 72 just over the line in Alabama?

The store owned by Carroll & Gladys Threet sat in the corner of HWY 72 and County Rd 3, which is now Margerum Road & Margerum Annex. It was a grocery store and Standard Service Station. They also had a minor car repair and fixed flats. They carried the Liberty Cash Supermarket line of groceries. There was a long meat cooler with sandwich meats and cheeses. Bologna could be sliced however thick you wanted. Travelers and

sawmill workers could get made to order sandwiches. People would sit on the rock wall left of the store to eat their lunch.

Carroll & Gladys's house was directly behind the store. This is where a saloon once was. (I wonder if that is why the rock wall was there).

Carroll & Gladys like to square dance and was quite good at it, winning several awards. Gladys taught the women's Sunday School class at the Margerum Methodist Church.

Gladys was a Gaiser, and once lived across the

creek at the old Gaiser place. Her Mother was Martha Gaiser. Roy Gaiser and Charles Gaiser were her brothers. Another brother, Hollis Gaiser was killed in WWI.

Carroll & Gladys had one child, a son named Carroll Hollis Threet. He got killed in a motorcycle accident. He had picked up a hitch hiker, causing him to lose control of the cycle. He was not wearing a helmet. Motorcyclists from all around led the funeral procession. It was a sight not seen before by many people.

After being closed for awhile, the store was opened by Virginia Griffin

with the help of her husband, Roy. They had previously lived in Chicago,

and had two sons, Roy and Timothy.

All my life we called these snakes spreading-outers. We didn't have that "Google Girl" back in the old days. She knows almost everything. Well, I got bit on the ankle that day by a Brown Recluse Spider. The Doc and most everyone I told about it said "it will eat your tissue to the bone!" My wife, Bess, who is a true faith believing Christian, started praying for me. We anointed the Big Circle every day with Watkins Carbo Petro Salve. It soon began to heal up. On another fine day, June 1st, Bess's birthday, a Black Widow spider bit me on the right middle finger! It felt like a needle went straight thru my nail and finger. Ouch! I started jumping and dancing and crying and praying!! I said "Lord, you have healed up the Brown-Recluse bite, so now you have got to help me with this Black Widow bite!" I asked the Doc, what is going to happen to me now with two deadly doses of poison in my body. She didn't seem too concerned, and said, oh your body will take care of it. About one month later, I began having anxiety at-



tacks! I had heard of these, but not ever experienced one. I began to stay awake all night for two nights, then my body would collapse the third night and I would be out a long night. When I woke up the third day, I would be high as a kite! I couldn't say what I was thinking, I would say something else! It was awful, especially in church! Almost every time it was funny, but sometimes not funny at all. No one could help me! The Doc said we have lots of medicine to help. I asked her which one was least harmful, she said, the oldest one, Prozac. I asked what are the side effects? She said number one is suicide. I said thanks Doc, but I will just trust in the Lord. My life for 22 months was the same cycle (2 nights - no sleep, one night - complete exhausting sleep, everyday - can't say what I want to say). My Pastor helped me more than anyone. I began to write stories of life experiences. Many people really liked my writing. I wrote my Pastor a letter to tell him how sorry I was for talk-

ing out loud in church. I was 75 years old and he gave me some slack for my age. I wrote on a big notebook page with 26 lines on it. All 26 lines said the same thing... Pastor, I am so sorry I can't shut my mouth in church. Every line said the same thing. At the bottom of the page, I wrote P.S. Pastor, I am so sorry I can't shut my mouth in church. I thought it was a good letter. I felt much better, but I was afraid to hand it to him. So I mailed it the few miles to him. I still smile when I think about it. I have never spent a day in a hospital or taken very much medicine. I am English/Cherokee, and Chickasaw, so I have been healthy now for 80 years. My creation level for many years was 1.7. The Doc always said it was high, I asked what was normal, she said 1.5, I said Doc, that is only 2 points. She would always say, it's too high. So, after 2 or 3 years since the spider bites it became normal. One man told me the Cherokee and others treated some illness with spider poison. The Chickasaw and other never had to amputate a leg or arm for gangrene. They treated the wounds with salves and etc. and gangrene would heal up! As I have grown older I am so thankful to have a great-great-grandmother who was Cherokee, and a great-grandmother who was Chickasaw. I like to say I have 2 wild Indians in me. Thank you, Jesus

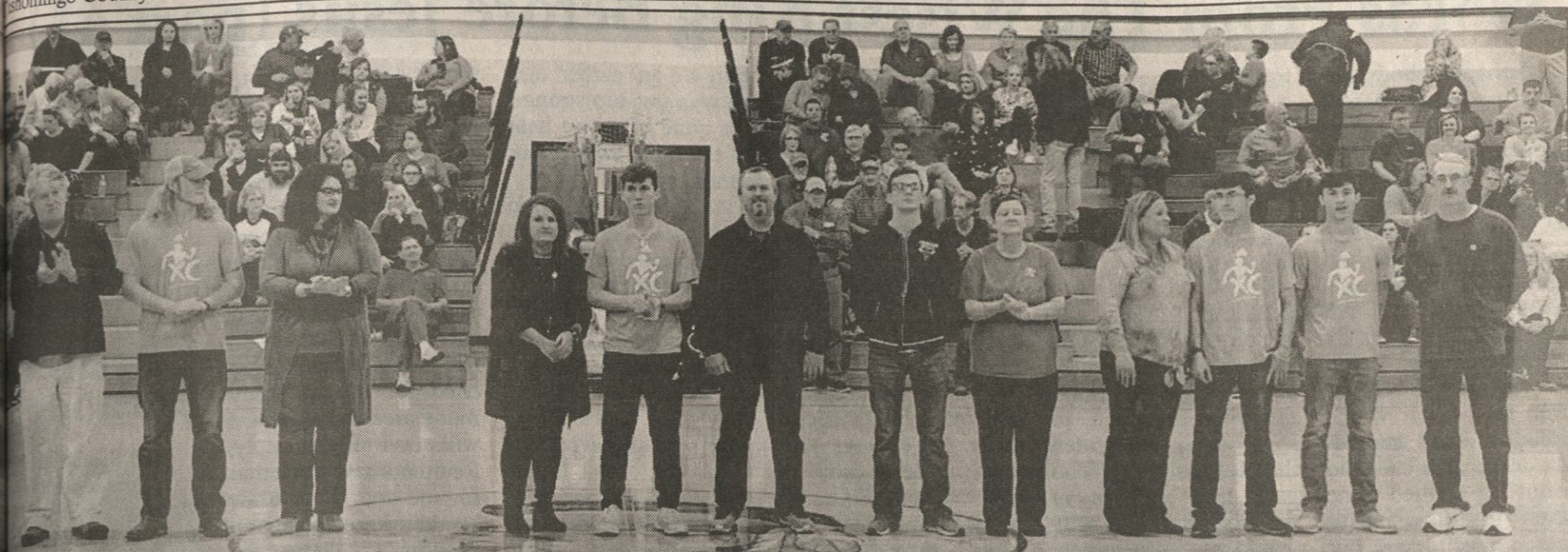

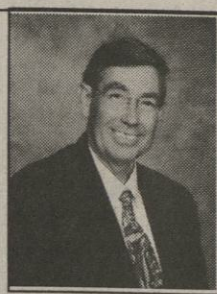

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 41)

Perhaps nobody has ever tried any harder to learn why things happen the way they do than did King Solomon. He wrote the Book of Ecclesiastes to tell us what he had learned. In Ecclesiastes 7:23-25 he says: "All this have I proved by wisdom: I said, I will be wise; but it was far from me. That which is far off, and exceeding deep, who can find it out? I applied mine heart to know, and to search, and to seek out wisdom, and the reason of things, and to know the wickedness of folly, even of foolishness and madness." It seems that Solomon wrote the Book of Ecclesiastes toward the end of his life, many years after God had given him wisdom,

yet he was still seeking to learn why things happen as they do. Perhaps this wise man had, to some extent, forgotten that it was God Who gave him wisdom in the first place, so why would he be seemingly seeking to learn things on his own? I ask this question, because Solomon did some very foolish things in his life after that God had given him wisdom concerning the building of the temple. Sometimes wise men "die as fools", and it

seems that Solomon may have done exactly that. I am not speaking "out of school" necessarily, for I Kings 11:4 says, "For it came to pass, when Solomon was old, that his wives turned away his heart after other gods; and his heart was not perfect with the LORD his God, as was the heart of David his father." So God Himself inspired the writer of I Kings to write about Solomon's failure to follow the wisdom that God had given

him at an earlier age. This is not too strange, for quite often we hear of the same thing in our times.

So, Solomon finds that his wisdom has deserted him, to a great extent, and it is because he turned away from God in his later years. I am almost age 76, and I ask people to pray that I will "end well" in the work of God. Solomon forgot that God was the only One Who could cause him to "end well". Now we hear Solomon saying that some things are far off and too deep to understand, and this is always the case concerning spiritual matters, if we do not follow God's direction. Our writer applied his heart to know things, to

seek by wisdom and to search things out, but he forgot the Master Teacher, Who is the one to help us to understand what we need to know. More than that, there are some things that we do not need to know, and there are things that others know that we do not know. There is no need for me to study many areas of life that I will never need to apply, for others have done that for me and I can draw on their knowledge and wisdom. There are other things that all of us need to know, and we must ask God to help us to learn these things and apply them to our lives. In seeking to understand folly and madness (silliness and foolishness), Solomon overlooked the most im-

portant things that need to learn, and is to listen to God, obey Him and to His guidance in everything we do.

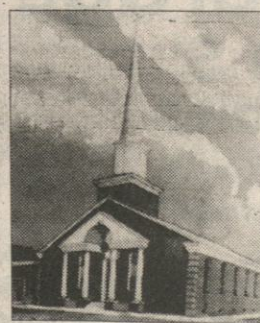
