

Circuit Court Held in Tishomingo County

The Circuit Court of Tishomingo County Mississippi was held the week of January, 14th through 19th, with Judge Kelly Lee presiding over the cases. Here are some of the cases presented during this court session. David Lee Nunley, 66 of Tishomingo was convicted of felonies burglary of a building and possession of methamphetamine. Sentence imposed order- 10 years MDOC/10 years SUSP/5 years supervised prob/ drug court. Mark Carpenter, 52 of Iuka was convicted of the felony sale

of morphine. Sentence imposed by order- 8 years MDOC/8 years SUSP.

Matthew Arnold, 35 of Booneville was convicted of the felony possession of methamphetamine. Sentence imposed by order- 3 years MDOC/2 years ISP/1 year PRS.

Travis Adonis Jackson 38, of Russellville was convicted of the felony possession of methamphetamine. Sentence imposed by order- 3 years MDOC/credit time served/BAL SUSP/2 years SUP.





Multiple Felony Arrests Made in Tishomingo County

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office reports that multiple felony arrests have been made in the area ranging from narcotic possession to burglary. Those arrests and the individuals involved are listed here.

On January 18th Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputies responded to the report of individuals removing items from a residence located on County Road 179 in Iuka. Deputies found one of the individuals, Kevin Wayne Carson, was in possession of items that came from the residence and Carson was arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Kevin Wayne Carson, 48-year-old, white male of 111 CR 989 Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with burglary of dwelling. Carson's bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$25,000.

On January 20th Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputies received information of a stolen vehicle from a car lot in Corinth, Mississippi. Deputies spotted the vehicle and attempted to stop it. The driver, Jeremy Wayne Rice, refused to stop for the deputy and began driving in a dangerous manner before finally com-

ing to a stop. Rice was then arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. Jeremy Wayne

Rice, 40-year-old, white male, of 44B CR 172 Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony failure to yield to emergency vehicle and possession of stolen property. Rice is currently out on a felony bond for a weapons charge stemming from an arrest back in November of 2018. Rice also has a hold for investigation for the Corinth Police Department as well as a hold from the Mississippi Department of Corrections. Rice remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting bond to be set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court.

On January 21st Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputies received information of an alleged methamphetamine manufacturing operation taking place at a residence in Golden. Deputies noticed a vehicle leaving the residence and a traffic stop was conducted. Brody Rogers and Charles Hester were the occupants of the vehicle. The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office requested the assistance of the Itawamba County Sheriff's Office K-9 unit. The K-9 unit arrived on scene and detected the presence of narcotics coming from the vehicle. A search of the vehicle yielded some alleged metham-

phetamine found in console of the vehicle.

A search of the residence was later conducted and several items found that is used in manufacturing of amphetamine. At time, both the driver and the passenger of the vehicle were arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Brody Rogers, 28-year-old, white male, of 99 Road Golden, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of (2) or more precursor intent to manufacture a controlled substance and the possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Rogers remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting a bond to be set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court.

Charles Hester, 44-year-old, white male, of HWY 11 Red Bay, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of (2) or more precursor w/ intent to manufacture controlled substance. Hester also remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office awaiting his bond to be set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court.

Sheriff John Deery would like to thank the Itawamba County Sheriff's Office and K-9 team, K-9 handler Chet White and K-9 handler for assisting his department with this search.

Master Gardener Training Classes Begin Soon

Do you like to get your hands dirty? Do you love plants? Do you enjoy learning? Then you are a great candidate for Master Gardener Training. You don't have to already be a garden pro, just be willing to learn and have fun and we can teach you the rest.

Master Gardener training classes will be held at the Tishomingo County Extension Office 1-5 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays beginning Tuesday, February 29 through Thursday, March 8, 2019. The classes will be conducted through the Mississippi State University Extension Interactive Video System, with support from Tishomingo County Master Gardeners.

The one-time \$100.00 registration fee includes 10 hours of educational training, a 3-inch binder gardening resources from Mississippi State University Extension, plus additional insight and tips from local master gardeners. In exchange for this training participants will earn 40 hours of volunteer service to the county

within one year of training.

Local projects of Tishomingo County Master Gardeners where volunteers will provide support include:

- Jaybird Park - Tishomingo County Master Gardeners perform periodic maintenance work in the planting beds, install plantings and trees, and provide extra care to enhance special events held in the park throughout the year.

- Butterfly Garden - Another Tishomingo County Master Gardener project installed a butterfly garden next to Iuka Elementary School. This outdoor learning space is a place where children can learn about the plants that attract butterfly pollinators and the importance of these pollinators to our environment and the ecosystem.

- Demonstration Beds at the Extension Office - This year Tishomingo County Master Gardeners will be revamping the demonstration beds in front of the Tishomingo County Extension Office

to show the community solutions to a variety of common gardening problems and questions, such as how different varieties of grass perform in our local landscapes; what groundcovers work in our local environment; how to grow different ornamental plants and trees; and much more.

Why Was The Tower of Babel So Named?

Through the years people have talked about the tower of Babel, both because of its name and because of its purpose. Perhaps the very name "Babel" should give us a good clue, for "Babel" means "confusion". It might be of interest to my readers to know that the name "Babylon" is from the same Hebrew word. The city of Babylon was at one time the capitol of the empire of Babylon, and this old city was located in the country that we now call Iraq. Babylon was known for its hanging gardens and its massive wall that some say was wide enough to allow six chariots to race side by side on top of it. Genesis 11:1-9 gives us the information we need about the tower of Babel, but that is not the first mention of that word, for Genesis 10:9-10 tells us that the beginning of Nimrod's kingdom was Babel, Erech, Accad and Calneh, in the land of Shinar. Shinar is another name for the land of the Chaldeans, which is also called Babylon. The information in Gen-

esis 10:9-10 seems to be chronologically later than that given about the tower of Babel in Genesis 11:1-9, since the Bible's chapters are not always in chronological order.

Genesis 11:4 gives us the reason for the tower of Babel, which was not so named by its builders, but by the Lord, as we will see later. Genesis 11:4 says, "And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth." The purpose of the tower was not to have access to God's throne in heaven, rather it was to make a name for men. The mention of the top that "may reach unto heaven" simply

means a top that would reach into the heavens. It is very doubtful that wicked men would have had any desire to reach to the throne of God in heaven, since they do not seem to have had any great desire to know or serve God! The purpose also included the idea of unity for the human race, seen in the words "lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth". The name "Babel" comes from Genesis 11:9: "Therefore is the name called Babel; because the LORD did there confound the language of all the earth; and from thence did the LORD scatter them abroad upon the face of all the earth." God confused their language and their purpose, because they thought to run the earth without God!

I wonder how our society fits into this equation?

Does God Have Any Secrets?

Men seem to have a keen interest in trying to discover things that have been secret so far. I am always amazed at the extent some people will go in their efforts to learn some "secret thing". Perhaps it has never occurred to some people that God has some secrets that He has never been willing to divulge to humanity. It is not worthwhile for us to try to learn the things that God does not want us to know, for He is the Master, when it comes to hiding things from those who do not need to know! Deuteronomy 29:29 is our verse: "The secret things belong to God: but those things which are revealed belong unto us and to our children for ever, that we may do all the words of this law." Yes, the Bible does use language like that of Psalm 25:14, which says, "The secret of the LORD is with them that fear Him; and He will show them His

covenant." This, however, does not mean that God does not have any secrets that He is not presently willing to show us, or else our verse from Deuteronomy 19:19 would make no sense. So, the conclusion seems to be that God is willing to make known to us some things that we do not presently know, but God has some things that remain His Own secret, and we cannot know them, at least not on earth.

It is fine with me that God has some secret things, as our verse says, but I am also glad that He said that those things which are revealed belong to us and our children. Is it not enough that God has revealed sixty-six books to us, which we call the Bible? Does the Bible itself not have enough information, even some that is hard to understand, to keep us busy for a lifetime studying it and seeking to learn its meaning? I have studied the Bible quite rigorously for 50 years, since I have been a preacher. Oh, I

could have done much better in my study, but I have made some effort to learn what God is saying in His Book, moreover, have thoroughly enjoyed the journey! If what is revealed is for us and our children, then why do we not major on learning what is ours? The purpose of our learning, first and foremost, is that we may do what God has instructed us to do, as our verse says.

Yes, we must rightly divide the Word, so that we do not try to follow Old Testament law, if it were binding on our church, for it is not. The moral teaching of the law, however, is all repeated in the church epistles, so God has not changed His mind about holiness and righteousness in our lives. Make the most of what is revealed, and do not worry about what is not revealed. Do not go around looking for some so-called "new revelation"; try to master as much as possible of the "old revelation" then teach your children and grandchildren, by the written Word and your godly example!

Mississippi Tobacco Free Youth Advocacy Team Member Reed Strickland of Prentiss County did a Juul Presentation for the Jumpertown Mayor and its Aldermen. Reed's Presentation was to make the board aware of the dangers that youth his age face with the tobacco product called the Juul. The damage done, though E-cigarette use jumped 78% among high school students in 2018, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). That means 1 in 5 high school kids used an e-cig in 2018. Reed explained how students his age are finding ways to use and hide the Juul from school officials and parents. Reed used a board put together to show how the Juul looks very much like USB products, to help them understand how the youth are hiding them. He also explained that the smell is easily covered up by the 7,000 different flavors this product has available.






