## County Man Threatens to Kill VA Doctor

OXFORD, Miss. — According to AP, court documents say a Mississippi man threatened to kill a U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs physician for failing to detect a deadly illness.

VA Office of Inspector General Agent John Ramsey says Edward Steve McNatt of Tishomingo County called a VA hotline Friday threatening to kill a doctor at his next appointment at a Tupelo VA clinic.

Ramsey says McNatt told agents he'd sought a neuro-

logical exam for more than six months and blamed the physician for a delay in detecting his illness.

Ramsey says McNatt told agents in a Friday interview at a Red Bay, Alabama, hospital that he planned to beat the physician "within an inch of his life."

McNatt is jailed pending a Wednesday hearing. A defense lawyer didn't immediately respond Tuesday to an email seeking comment.

## Native American Art on Display at Tishomingo County Museum

TCHGS was all ears on Friday afternoon as Brady Anglin spoke with museum staff about several Native American pieces. Skillfully hand crafted by his maternal grandfather, Harry Truman McGaughy, these reminders of everyday life for Native Americans will forever hold a special place in Brady's heart.

While visiting the museum, Anglin reminisced with staff about assisting his grandfather when he was a child. He described in detail the process of creating pottery using the same ancient technique as the Native Americans. From forming the

pottery into shapes by hand to using a special rock to polish the pieces and drawing on symbols, it was evident that the items and the memories shared between McGaughy and his grandson were created with love.

Mr. McGaughy is not only a master artisan, but also a decorated veteran of the Vietnam War. He also participated in creating history by helping dig the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway. Nowadays, McGaughy can be found dedicating time to his favorite hobbies, such as making pottery and whittling.

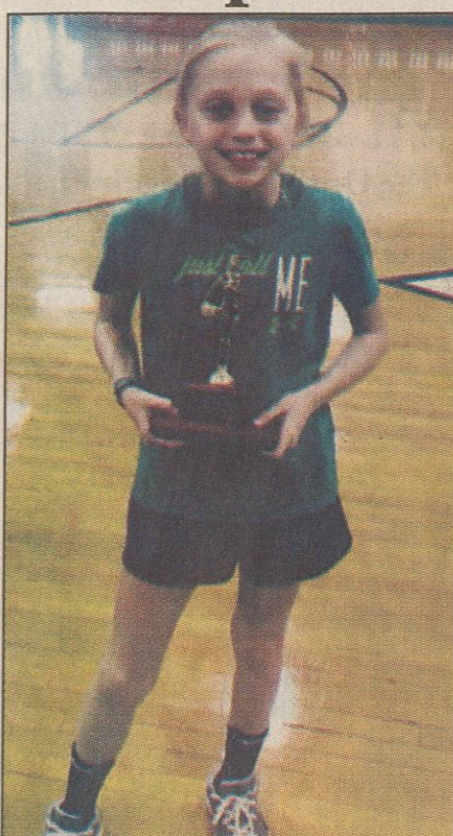

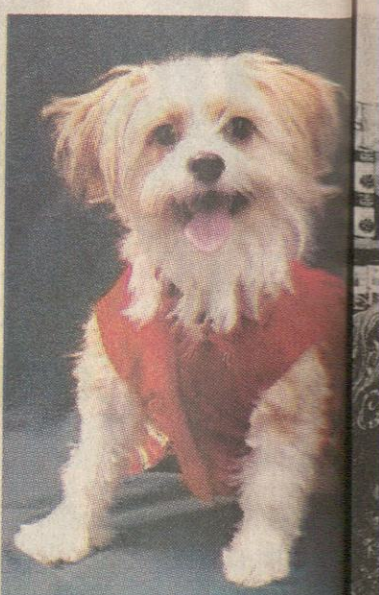

Dogs and humans communicate very differently, but that doesn't mean dogs don't understand us. A recent study suggests that dogs can read human facial expressions. Dogs were shown

different photos of the same human face while they were eating. The faces expressed anger, fear, happiness, sadness, surprise, disgust or being neutral. When the dogs saw anger, fear or happiness they turned their heads to the left, had an increased heart rate and took longer to go back to eating, a much different response than when they viewed other expressions. Dogs show humans how they feel through their own expressions. Be sure to observe your dog's expressions and

## Like Grandfather, Like Grandson - 52 Years Later

On January 18, 1966, Jimmy Don Whitfield was sworn in the United States Air Force at the old Kennedy Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee, during the Vietnam War era. He was trained at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas; then on to Chanute Air Force Base in Canton, Illinois, for training as a Jet Engine Mechanic. During his enlistment, his home base was Columbus Air Force Base in Columbus, Mississippi. He served in Okinawa, Thailand, Vietnam and Guam. He was discharged May, 1969.

On December 12, 2017, Austin Noel Whitfield was sworn in the United States Air Force at Memphis, Tennessee. He was also trained at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas; then to Sheppard Air Force Base in Wichita Falls, Texas, training in Aerospace propulsion. He is currently stationed at Charleston Air Force Base in Charleston, South Carolina.

## Suspended License Leads To Drug Arrest

On January 25, 2019, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies, conducted a traffic stop on Hwy. 72 in Iuka for improper equipment. Deputies then learned that the driver, Carey Dillard, had a suspended driver's license.

Dillard was then placed under arrest. The deputies witnessed Dillard attempting to hide some alleged methamphetamine in a soda can. They were able to retrieve the alleged narcotic and Dillard was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Carey Dillard, 43-year-old, white male, of 110 CR 995 Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and the felony tampering with evidence. Dillard's bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$10,000.

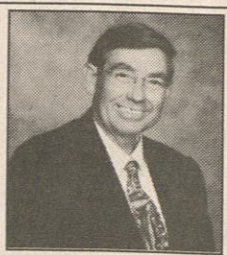


# The Last Two Verses in the Bible

I have been writing about the Book of Revelation for a long time, but we are about to come to the end of this amazing book. Revelation 22:20-21 says, "He which testifieth these things saith, Surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so come, Lord Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen." The first words of the Book of Revelation say: "The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave unto Him, to show unto His servants things which must shortly come to pass; and He sent and signified it by His angel unto His servant John." So, the whole Book of Revelation is about Jesus Christ, and because it is called "Revelation", it is a revealing of Who Christ is and what He has done and is going to do. Many people have feared to read this book, or even to think that it can be understood

even generally, but the name of the book says that God is revealing truth to us by this book. Revelation 1:3 pronounces a blessing on those who read, hear and keep those things which are written in this book. How can anyone "keep" what is written in the Book of Revelation, unless he has some understanding of what he is supposed to keep? So, God gave us this book for our learning and obedience to its message!

Revelation 22:20-21 shows us that Jesus is the One Who has testified to the truth of the Book of Revelation. Then we hear Jesus saying that He will surely come quickly. These words have

caused much paper and ink to be used in writing about when Jesus will come, but Mark 13:32 says, "But of that day and that hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels which are in heaven, neither the Son, but the Father." Jesus clearly stated that nobody, not even Himself when He was on earth, knows when the second coming to earth will take place. The matter of His coming quickly says nothing about how soon He will come, but that when He comes it will be "quickly", or at an instant.

John is excited about the coming of Jesus, for he says, "Even so, come, Lord Jesus." We too should be excited about His

coming, for nothing else will ever bring "peace on earth", as the angels said at Jesus' birth. John ends his letter by asking that the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with all his readers. This lets us know that the Son is also God and is equal to the Father, otherwise John would have wished the grace of the Father to be on his readers. Notice also the full title that John uses here, when he calls Jesus "our Lord Jesus Christ". Many people want to talk about Jesus as if He were little more than other men, but God's Word says that He is "Ours" if we are believers. It says that He is the "Lord", because He has the "preeminence" in all things, according

to Colossians 1:18. We also see that He is the blessed and only "potentate" in I Timothy 6:15, where He is also called "the King of kings, and Lord of lords". Even a fairly casual reading of the Bible will bring the honest reader to the conclusion that Jesus is God the Son. He is "Jesus", which means "Savior", and He is "Christ", which means the "anointed One", as Isaiah 61:1-2 says. This means that our Lord Jesus Christ has been anointed, or appointed, by the Fa-

ther to be both Savior and Lord. He is registered on the calendar until the age of about thirty-three, always doing what the Father had instructed Him to do. He is truly only "man" Who lived on earth for sole purpose of rying out the Father's will, even to the point of dying for our sins and arising again. And I say with John in Revelation 22:20, "Amen", or "so be it".

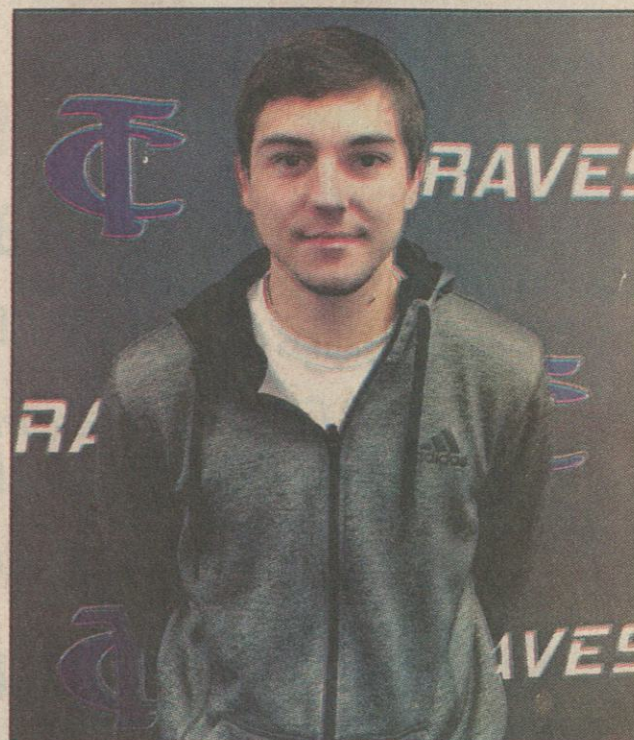
### Chieftain Chatter
