TCHS Cheerleaders Win Big at National Competition in Orlando, FL

The Medium Varsity, Non-Tumbling division, (Shown above) from TCHS placed 1st in the nation. The Super Varsity, Non-Tumbling group from TCHS took 10th place in the nation.

The Tishomingo County High School Cheerleaders competed in the UCA National High School Cheerleading Championship at the ESPN Center in Orlando, Florida February 8th through 10th. There were 953 squads who competed in different divisions. TCHS won 10th place in the Nation in the Super Varsity Non-Tumbling division. There

were 32 squads in this division. The TCHS Performance Squad also competed and won 7th in the Nation in the Medium Varsity Non-Tumbling division. There were 36 squads in this division.

The girls have worked very hard since last August preparing for competitions. In October they competed in the Mid-South Regionals where they won 1st place and received a bid to Nationals in Game Day. They competed in the Dixie Regionals in December where they placed 1st and received a bid to Nationals in Medium Varsity Non-Tumbling. Also in December they

won the Medium Varsity Non-Tumbling State Championship. These girls are coached by Beth James, Amy Webb, and Beverly Butler. They had fans who also traveled to Orlando to support them in their competitions.

To say these girls have worked very hard is an understatement. They and their coaches met many mornings at 5:30 to condition and practice. They overcame several obstacles and setbacks to make it this far. It was hard, but these ladies were determined and dedicated to being one of the best. And they are!!

Drug Investigation Leads to Multiple Arrests

On February 7th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies and narcotic investigators conducted a traffic stop on County Road 957 in Tishomingo County, due to an ongoing drug investigation between the State of Alabama and Mississippi. The traffic stop led to the search of a local residence and several arrests were made. Heather Huges, JC (Bo) Johnson, Dellie Earnest, and Danny Joe Hacker were all placed under arrest on felony charges.

Sheriff officials state that the original investigation was tied to the driver and the passenger of the stopped vehicle. During the traffic stop, deputies learned that the driver had a suspended driver's license and a search

of the vehicle by the deputies yielded approximately 43 Suboxone pills being found, that were hidden under the dash of the vehicle.

The passenger had outstanding felony warrants for his arrest from the State of Alabama. Deputies then transported both the driver and passenger to jail.

Once at the jail, the driver attempted to hide a bag of alleged methamphetamine in the deputy's vehicle, but was caught by the deputy. Corrections staff then conducted a search of the driver and found more alleged methamphetamine as well as some alleged marijuana hidden

Pet of the Week

Congratulations to Jasmine Monjeau! This pretty kitty is our Pet of the Week at Iuka Animal Clinic. Jasmine's owners are Harold & Vicky Monjeau. Jasmine is approximately 7 years old and master of her domain. She was a little over two weeks old when the Monjeau's Rottweiler found her abandoned in their golf cart. The mother cat never came back so they brought her into the house and began bottle feeding her. Mr. & Mrs. Monjeau thought they could find her a good home, since they had 3 dogs at the time, but she was meant to stay with them. Jasmine loves getting treats, playing with her toys, and laying in the window watching to make sure the outside cat, Tiger, doesn't get away with anything. She is not a cuddly cat, but she can be very lovey when you are near the treat bag or open a can of tuna.

Adult cats should have a complete veterinary examination at least once a year. Kittens need veterinary visits usually every 3 to 4 weeks until they are about 4 months old. Geriatric cats (older than 8 to 9 years old) should see their veterinarian twice a year or more frequently because illness is more common



in older pets and should be identified sooner to provide proper treatment. It is important to set up a wellness program for your pet, such as routine blood tests to monitor for early kidney or liver disease. Because you are more familiar with your cat than anyone else, you should watch it carefully for subtle signs of illness. General signs of illness include a lack of appetite or decreased activity. Other more specific signs include vomiting and diarrhea, urinating more (or less) frequently, coughing and sneezing, or a discharge from the eyes, ears, or nose. Illness can also show up as a loss of hair or itchy areas on the skin or around the ears. If your cat shows any of these signs for more than a day or two it is a good idea to visit Dr. Jim Perkins at Iuka Animal Clinic. Call for an appointment today at 423-3470. Your pet will thank you.

Local Elderly Man Dies in Monday Morning House Fire

On Monday, February 11th William Gentry, 89, was pronounced dead by Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon. A fire destroyed the Gentry residence on County Road 439 which is a little over a mile off of Harmony Road in Iuka. The fire claimed the life of Gentry.

According to Wilemon, Vance McGuire, a neighbor of Gentry looked out the window of his home and saw smoke; by the time he reached the residence the house was already engulfed in flames. Harmony Central Fire

Department and Burnsville Fire Department responded to the blaze. They located Mr. Gentry, who was found near the door on the inside of his home.

This is the second fire-related death in Tishomingo County within a 3 week time frame. On January 23rd Linda Kay Taylor, 58, was also pronounced dead after a house fire. The fire in question happened sometime around 5:30 p.m. in the Bethlehem Church community which is around three miles north of Tishomingo.

on the driver.

This lead the investigators to obtain a search warrant for the residence that both the driver and passenger share. When the deputies and investigators arrived, they were met by an adult male and an adult female who were staying at the residence. There was also a female juvenile at the residence. The search yielded more alleged methamphetamine as well as scales and pipes. A firearm was also located in one of the bedrooms. The adult male and female were arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. The juvenile was released to family members.

Notice from County Tax Assessor

It's that time of year again. January - March is the time of year when you are able to file for your Homestead exemption. When you come in to file there are a few things you will need.

1. Current Car Tag number
2. Copy of your Deed
3. Social Security number for you and your spouse if married.
4. Proof of Disability if filing for Disability Exemption.
5. Proof of age if filing for over 65 Year Exemption.
6. For Disabled Veteran Exemption- Proof of Disability and year awarded
7. If you have lost a spouse during the 2018 year you will also need to contact and refile your Homestead. Please bring a copy of their death certificate and the above listed things for you to file your Homestead exemption.

Please make sure to come within these 3 months because this is the only time you are allowed to file for these exemptions. Also, for those people who are over 65 years old please make sure that we have your correct mailing address and phone number. Please contact our office at 662-423-7059 if you have any other questions. Thank you.

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus

I have decided to write on the Book of Ecclesiastes for a period of time, because it was written by King Solomon, to whom God gave wisdom beyond all other kings of the earth. Yes, there are those who debate the authorship of Ecclesiastes, but most conservative scholars believe that Solomon wrote it. More than that, it really does not matter who the penman was, for God inspired the writing of all sixty-six books of our Bible!

In the Book of Ecclesiastes we will see a king who had everything that one could wish to have, yet when he looked on all his labors and all his riches, he said that the whole thing was only vanity. The word "vanity" means emptiness in its Hebrew usage, so we are about to delve into twelve chapters of the Bible that show us how to live an empty life, or, on the other hand, how not to live an empty life. The word "vanity" or "vain" appears 34 times in our short book, so the writer is seeking to inform us concerning how we can have lives that are not empty. Many modern

people, especially those involved in advertising products, seem to be saying that life will be a "bed of roses", if we only purchase certain products, or live in certain communities with certain lifestyles. The sad news is that this has never worked to produce the desired results, and it will not work now or in the future.

There is a formula that will produce peace, joy, security and even sometimes happiness, but it is not a man-made formula. We will see in the Book of Ecclesiastes that King Solomon was in a position to enjoy whatever he desired, but his life was still empty, as he actually admits. It is interesting, however, that this short book that he penned does have answers as to how we may keep away from the things that do not bring God's peace and joy to our spirits, souls and bodies. So, stay with

me for the long haul of traveling through this book and perhaps you too will learn the ropes as to how we may live joyfully, and even happily, on earth.

The Book of Ecclesiastes starts by identifying the writer in the first verse of the first chapter: "The words of the Preacher, the son of David, king in Jerusalem." If we simply believe what is written here to be the truthful words of the writer, then we have to believe that at least a son of David wrote this book. If we also notice that he was king in Jerusalem, then we will quickly conclude that Solomon wrote the Book of Ecclesiastes, for he was the only son of David who reigned as king in Jerusalem. Yes, I have read some of the arguments that say that a later descendant of David wrote Ecclesiastes, or perhaps someone else, who de-

sired the reader to think Solomon wrote the book, wrote it. After reading the book itself for well over three hundred times, I still hold to the old teaching that says Solomon wrote the Book of Ecclesiastes. We see in Ecclesiastes 1:2 the next words of Solomon to his readers: "Vanity of vanities, saith the Preacher, vanity of vanities, all is vanity." In modern language we could say: "Emptiness of emptiness, says Solomon, everything in life is empty." Did Solomon go through all of life with such a feeling of emptiness? Actually, he did not, but when he became old his strange wives took away his heart (I Kings 11:1-8), and from that time onward life was basically empty for King Solomon. Even when everything in life is not actually empty, it can seem empty for those who have walked away from a close fellowship with God, and this is what Solomon did!

- Thread (can use any color to match your fabric)
- Scissors and/or rotary cutter and 24" x 36" cutting mat (can use 18" x 24" but the larger one works better)
- Fabric marking pen
- Straight Pins
- 6" x 24" ruler
- Bobbin
- Small bladed scissors for clipping the fabric (Fiskars Easy Action scissors that have a 2 inch blade are recommended)
- Sewing machine (a sewing machine will be available at the Extension Office, or you can bring your own)
