### Jailer Arrested for Bringing in Contraband

On February 16th Tishom- items, withingo County Sheriff's deputies arrested a correction's officer for the Tishomingo County Jail, Rodney Fisher, Jr. This was due to an investigation done by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office and the Tishomingo County Jail. The correction's officer was under investigation for the past few weeks due to reports of taking money to bring tobacco and drugs into the Tishomingo County Jail when he came to work. When Fisher arrived to begin working, he was found to be in possession of contraband items.

Sheriff Daugherty explains that this is a very dangerous situation due to the fact that the inmates use tobacco and other items as "currency" and this can lead to "paying" other inmates to assault deputies and correction's officers. Also, Sheriff Daugherty states that the real victims are the families of these inmates that use cash money towards the purchasing of these

knowing what the money used for.

For over a year, the Tishomingo County Jail has been tobacco free as



an attempt to prevent incidents like this.

Rodney Fisher, JR. a 33-year-old, white male, of 108 East Fourth Street Iuka, Mississippi, was officially charged with the introduction of contraband into a correctional facility and attempted introduction of contraband into a correctional facility. Fisher's bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$3,500. Fisher was immediately terminated from his employment with the Tishomingo County Jail.







Those who are believers in Christ and have read Scripture at least a fair amount know that even the earth itself, in its present form, will not be here eternally. So, what does one gain by beating himself silly trying to "get ahead in life", if it is all empty living from the beginning? This is the question to which Solomon would like to have an answer. We will see toward the end of this book that there is an answer, but we will have

to hold that for later. Solomon goes from teaching that the earth abides forever to other parts of God's creation. He speaks of the sun arising and setting; the wind whirling about and the rivers running into the sea without overfilling it (Ecclesiastes 1:5-7). Then in 1:8 he says, "All things are full of labour; man cannot utter it: the eye is not satisfied with seeing, nor the ear with hearing.' With whatever beauty our eyes may see, we are never at the place to say, "I have seen enough; I no longer need my eyes." The same would be true of our ears. Solomon will walk us through the chapters of his book and tell us how empty things are, if we see only the natural side of life; then he will draw the right conclusion. Stay with me and we will finally see that life is not all empty, yet there is a

"formula" that we must follow to make life something other than empty!

### **CONSERVATION CORNER**

The Water Cycle

by James L. Cummins With all of the rain we have been receiving, you probably don't want to hear more about water. However, I thought this would be an appropriate time to discuss the water cycle and how it works.

Water covers threefourths of the earth's surface. There are many forms of water - ice, snow, rain, hail, dew, fog and steam. The majority of this life source is sea water. It is from our oceans that most of our precipitation comes, although cleaned of its salt and minerals. So, how does this happen? Water moves from land to clouds to land and back to the ocean in an on-going cycle. This cycle is known as the water cycle, or the hydrologic cycle. Lets take a closer look at it.

Every year about 95,000 cubic miles of water evaporates from the oceans and land. This water evaporates atmosphere, leavimpurities behind. This evaporated moisture moves across the earth in

the form of water vapor. A small portion of this water vapor is visible to us as fog, mist or lowlying sion. This repeated acclouds. The water vapor then condenses, filling the clouds and then releasing back to the earth in one of the various forms of water depending on region, climate, season and topog-

When water falls to the ground, some of it soaks into the soil and the rest runs off. The water that is absorbed by the ground sustains plant and animal life in the soil. The rest finds its way into underground reservoirs where almost all of this water re-enters the water cycle, which then starts

Humans can do little to alter this cycle, however we can manage and conserve water as it becomes available. Water management begins with soil management. Because our water supply comes as precipitation falling on the land, the fate of its fallen form depends on the condition of the soil it reaches.

and causes runoff, carrying the particles away. This is known as soil erotion ruins land for many uses and is the source of sediment that fills streams, pollutes water and shortens the useful life of dams and reservoirs.

In areas where much of the land is paved or covered, runoff occurs up to ten times faster than on unpaved lands. The water that falls here rapidly flows down storm drains and sewer systems carrying debris and other pollutants to nearby streams.

A human needs only a little over a gallon of water a day in order to fill his or her basic needs. Currently, however, we use close to 1,600 gallons each day to supply our needs and comforts which include cooling purposes, lawn maintenance and beautification, recreational endeavors and industrial

The demand for water continues to rise as the population increases. This is precisely why quality A rainstorm on bare management of precipita-

I began watching some of the videos online of Dr. King's speeches and interviews over the years, because I wanted to hear for myself what he believed and what he actually was encouraging people to do (and not

With February designated as Black History Month, I encourage everyone in the community to investigate this important part of our shared history. I invite each of you to go to your local library, where you can use free public computers to gather information and draw your own conclusions. I especially urge those who, like myself, were children during those tumultuous years, because as an adult you now have the ability to fact-check your memories and opinions against the reality of the historical record. You may gain a new understanding of our society not only during that time, but also as it has been influenced even into today's current events.

At the Iuka Public Library, some of the more significant information is displayed just inside the doors on a bulletin board titled "Black in America: 400 Years of Historical Perspective." Everyone is invited to come and see if there is something new for you to learn. I know I did! Sincerely,






