## Standoff in Iuka Ends with Arrest of One

was ested on multiple felony and isdemeanor charges at his ome at 1790 Spruce, St. in Iuka Sunday evening.

The Iuka Police Departent responded to the Spruce reet location after receiving call at 6:30 a.m. of gun shots ing heard in the area; reports dicate that the shooting had arted earlier around 4 a.m. inday morning, on March th. According to Chief of

Police Randy Stringer, when officers arrived at the residence they identified themselves as police officers to which Bullard used profanities towards the officers and eventually resumed firing his weapon at the officers through the walls and windows of the house. Bullard refused to come out and go with law enforcement peacefully.

Along with the city and county officers who responded to Spruce St. both state and federal agencies responded to Iuka throughout the day and into the night as well. Various law enforcement agencies spent over 8 hours talking with Bullard. Hostage Negotiators from the Mississippi Highway Patrol worked for two to three hours talking with Bullard attempting to get him to come out on his own accord. They were unfortunately unsuccessful at which time the Mississippi Highway Patrol SWAT Team was called in to help. They eventually broke the door down and were able to apprehend Bullard without incidence. No injuries were reported during this event and no hostages were held.

Bullard was transported to the Lafayette County jail for holding where he also could face federal charges with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Fire-

Mitchell also rerted that all three goats from e island made it through the

storm safely and are doing well.

Efforts to recover fully will be a difficult process given that the area is owned by TVA; their permission will be needed in moving forward with the cleanup and restoration of Goat Island. The campground is closed for the time being due to the dangers of falling trees and other hazards caused by the storm. Much of the area is still without running water at this time. Mitchell is hopeful that the recreational sites will be able to reopen at some point this year for public use.

Both Switcher Logging and Dew South Logging have been working at Goat Island at their own expense to clear trees and debris from the roads and areas affected by the storm in order to help the campground and nearby residents. This community has pulled together and many have gotten involved to help out their neighbors, family and friends.



a vehicle from a business parking lot in Burnsville. Matthew Blake Voyles was arrested and charged with the felony theft of a vehicle.

Employees from the business in Burnsville told the 911 operator that they locked down the business in order to protect their customers and employees from Voyles. All local and state agencies in the area responded to the call.

A Mississippi Highway Patrol trooper arrived on the scene first and was able to detain the suspect as he was in the process of driving away in the stolen vehicle. Tishomingo County deputies and Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) officers immediately arrived on scene. The suspect was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Voyles, 25-year-old, white male of 33 CR 326 Corinth, Mississippi was officially charged with felony taking of motor vehicle. Voyles remains in the custody of the Tishomingo County Jail where he awaits his bond to be set by Justice Court.



#### News from Representative Carpenter

This was the ninth ek of the 2019 Legislawe Session. The deadline House committees to port Senate bills ocmed Tuesday at 8 p.m. my Senate bills that did t make it out of comttees died. Throughout e rest of the week, the ouse met to discuss bills at survived this deadline. presentatives passed a mber of Senate bills, iniding the following:

Senate Bill 2161 ould amend current law revising definitions and arifying qualifications the office of the State ledical Examiner and its eputies. A lengthy disssion ensued when oponents of the bill argued at the bill would not do lough to speed up the ready lengthy autopsy ocess in the state. Proments said that the bill ould be a step in the right rection for repairing that rocess. The bill passed e House 81-31 without anges and is on its way

of th

ogress

to the Governor.

With the passage of Senate Bill 2043, the fee for a marriage license would increase from \$20 to \$35. Currently, circuit clerks also deposit \$14 of every fee collected into the Victims of Domestic Violence Fund. The House Ways and Means Committee proposed an amendment that would increase the amount deposited into the fund to \$24. The amendment was adopted with a voice vote, and the bill passed as amended by a vote of 96-17.

Under Senate Bill 2827, local public officials' salaries would increase. These public officials include chancery and circuit clerks, tax assessors, county supervisors and others. If enacted into law, certain fees collected by city and county entities would increase to pay for the pay raises. The House Appropriations Committee introduced a strikeall amendment changing

some of the original language of the bill. The bill passed as amended by a vote of 93-14 and has been sent back to the Senate.

Senate Bill 2864 would revise the current definition of a "covered claim" under the Mississippi Insurance Guaranty Association Law. The House passed an identical bill earlier in the session (HB 322), so there was little debate when this was introduced to the House floor. The bill passed with a bipartisan vote of 114-2 and has been sent to Governor Bryant to sign.

All Senate bills approved by the House will be sent back with changes to the Senate for concurrence or to invite confer-

Legislators honored several Mississippians at the Capitol this week for their personal accomplishments and positive representation of our state. On Tuesday, we honored the 2018 Alcorn State University Football Team for winning the 2018 Southwestern Atlantic Conference Championship, their third championship in the last five years. That same day, we recognized DeSoto County natives Dan and Daniel Arata and Jesse Wims for representing the State of Mississippi at the 2018 Special Olympics National Games. Wims was also recognized for winning four gold medals while competing. On Wednesday, the House recognized the West Point High School Football Team for winning the MHSAA 5A State Championship for the third year

That as a fact the roadways of Mississippi Highway 172 or Quitman Street commonly called Old 72 and **Battleground Drive and Constitution** 

That the City finds that truck traffic should be regulated, designated and/or prohibited as set forth in this ordinance;

The City is empowered to regulate and prohibit truck traffic for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the City of luka, MS, and that these regulations are a valid exercise of that power.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT rs. Ch ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** The following words Irs. Jalor phrases when used in this ordinance shall r. and the meanings respectively described to s starm in this section.

(a) Truck: Shall mean all motor vehicles with more than two axels and also shall include any motor vehicle weighing more than 10,000 pounds. For the provisions of this ordinance truck shall not mean any type of pickup truck, school bus, fire apparatus or any emergency vehicle.

(b) Local truck or delivery traffic: Truck traffic traveling inside the City of luka with a stopping or delivery point inside the City of luka, Mississippi.

(c) Through truck traffic: Truck traffic traveling in and through the City of luka with no legitimate stopping or delivery point inside the City of luka, Mississippi.

(d) Destination: Delivery points or ultimate temporary storage or resting points for local truck traffic.

**SECTION 2:** From and after effective date of this ordinance, it shall be wful for truck traffic to use the following lic streets of luka, Mississippi: Mississippi hway 172, Quitman Street, Battleground Drive Constitution Drive.

**SECTION 3:** Any person, firm or poration violating this ordinance shall be guilty he misdemeanor of No Through Truck Traffic upon conviction shall be punished by a fine to exceed \$500.00 and not less than \$250.

**SECTION 4:** This ordinance s not apply to local truck or delivery traffic. hall be effective despite any conflict with any er ordinance, and does repeal any portion of evious ordinance regarding these specific dways mentioned herein.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be ective 30 days from and after passage. CTION 6: If any Section, subsection or tence held within this document is found to unlawful or otherwise unenforceable, then the aining enforceable portions shall remain in effect as stated herein.

## FEMA & MEMA to Begin Joint Damage Assessments This Week in State

PEARL - This week the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) and select local emergency management offices will be conducting Joint Damage Assessments in response to the severe storms and flooding that impacted the state from February 19th-24th. These assessments, which will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday, help confirm the types and amounts of damage a disaster inflicted on individuals and property. It also helps determine whether the scope of damage is beyond the state's threshold and if federal assistance is needed to support those counties. Federal Assistance includes, but is not limited to:

Public Assistance (PA) -- inspecting structures, roads, water and sewer treatment facilities and other essential public facilities. (This assistance is not available to residents.)

Individual Assistance (IA) - interviewing residents to determine the extent of the disaster on individuals, families and personal property.

Hazard Mitigation - determining possible future preventive actions as well as gauging the effectiveness of measures already in place.

Initially, representatives from FEMA will provide support in conducting damage assessments for Public Assistance in Calhoun, Chickasaw, Clay, Grenada, Lowndes, Pontotoc and Tishomingo

FEMA will also provide support in conducting damage assessments Individual tance in Lowndes County, where 375 homes were damaged due to an EF-2 tornado.

Once damage assessments are completed in other counties that were affected by those storms, they could become eligible for federal assistance as

"I expect that Mississippi will receive a federal declaration", said MEMA Executive Director Greg Michel. "Furthermore, I expect the declaration will be expanded to include other counties affected by the Mississippi River and backwater flooding."

Governor Phil Bryant signed and declared a State of Emergency on February 25th in response to the damage caused statewide by severe weather. A State of Emergency is an administrative tool that authorizes the use of state resources to aid in response and recovery ef-

The State Emergency Operations Center is activated and monitoring any requests or unmet needs from the county emergency management offices.

The public is encouraged to report damage to homes or businesses to

their county emergency management office. A directory of all the offices can be found at http:// www.msema.org/county-

Solomon has told us that there are some things that are crooked and cannot be straightened. We all probably have observed this, even in the actions of men that follow the same old ways of life that their predecessors have followed!

also said that there are some things that are "wanting", meaning: deficient. I have had many people ask me such questions as: why was my child born with problems? My state answer has been: I do not know why your child was born with problems, but I do know why any child is subject to be born with problems. It is because we are a part of a fallen race that has had problems since Adam. Others have asked why a child has died as an infant or youngster, when it has done nothing wrong. The fact is that babies and children too young to understand sin do not set out to defy God and do things that He does not approve. 




The one day convention was presided by the


