Standoff in Iuka Ends with Arrest of One

After stand-
off with en-
forcement
which
lasted 14
hours,
Donald
Bullard,
was
arrested on multiple felony and
misdemeanor charges at his
home at 1790 Spruce, St. in Iuka
on Sunday evening.
The Iuka Police Depart-
ment responded to the Spruce
street location after receiving
a call at 6:30 a.m. of gun shots
being heard in the area; reports
indicate that the shooting had
started earlier around 4 a.m.
on Sunday morning, on March
10th. According to Chief of

Police Randy Stringer, when
officers arrived at the residence
they identified themselves as
police officers to which Bullard
used profanities towards the of-
ficers and eventually resumed
firing his weapon at the officers
through the walls and windows
of the house. Bullard refused to
come out and go with law en-
forcement peacefully.

Along with the city and
county officers who responded
to Spruce St. both state and
federal agencies responded to
Iuka throughout the day and
into the night as well. Various
law enforcement agencies spent
over 8 hours talking with Bul-
lard. Hostage Negotiators from
the Mississippi Highway Patrol
worked for two to three hours
talking with Bullard attempting
to get him to come out on his
own accord. They were unfor-

tunately unsuccessful at which
time the Mississippi Highway
Patrol SWAT Team was called
in to help. They eventually broke
the door down and were able to
apprehend Bullard without inci-
dence. No injuries were reported
during this event and no hostag-
es were held.

Bullard was transported to
the Lafayette County jail for
holding where he also could face
federal charges with the Bureau
of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Fire-
arms.

Chief Stringer would like
to express thanks to those who
responded in support of his of-
ficers both locally and at the state
and federal level. He would like
to thank the Mississippi High-
way Patrol, Hostage Negotia-
tors, members of the ATF and
the SWAT Team, as well as city
and county officers for working

tirelessly together to bring this
situation to a peaceful end.

Bullard is ex-military and
according to his family mem-
bers, suffers from post-traumatic

stress disorder. He was found to
be in possession of many guns
at the time of his arrest. Bullard
has a history of arrests in Tisho-
mingo County.

County Hit by Second Tornado in Less than a Month Goat Island Resort Area Hit Hard

On March 9th the Goat Is-
land RV Park and Campground
was heavily affected by the E-F1
tornado which came through
Tishomingo County around 5
p.m. During this severe storm
several homes, RV's and camp-
sites were damaged or complete-
ly destroyed. Over 300 trees are
down and there is widespread
damage in an area that easily
ranges 400 yards wide.

There were five people stay-
ing in the campground at the
time of the tornado; according
to Campground Manager Craig
Mitchell but thankfully no inju-
ries were reported. Mitchell stat-
ed that he was outside and no-
ticed the storm approaching, by
the time he reached a safe point
the doors it was already over. The
massive amount of damage done
within minutes is overwhelming
to think about; everyone who
experienced the storm expressed
feeling very blessed and lucky to
have survived. Mitchell also re-
ported that all three goats from
the island made it through the

storm safely and are doing well.

Efforts to recover fully will
be a difficult process given that
the area is owned by TVA; their
permission will be needed in
moving forward with the clean-
up and restoration of Goat Is-
land. The campground is closed
for the time being due to the
dangers of falling trees and other
hazards caused by the storm.
Much of the area is still with-
out running water at this time.
Mitchell is hopeful that the re-
creational sites will be able to re-
open at some point this year for
public use.

Both Switcher Logging and
Dew South Logging have been
working at Goat Island at their
own expense to clear trees and
debris from the roads and areas
affected by the storm in order to
help the campground and near-
by residents. This community
has pulled together and many
have gotten involved to help
out their neighbors, family and
friends.

New Through Traffic Ordinance Coming into Effect within the City Limits of Iuka

After a recent meeting between the Mayor of Iuka, John
Castleberry, and the Board of Aldermen, a new ordinance
is going into effect in Iuka which will regulate and prohibit
truck traffic within the corporate city limits. There are some
exceptions to this ruling of course for trucks traveling in the
area with specific business inside the city; such as making
deliveries to local businesses.

The ordinance will affect Mississippi Highway 172,
Quitman Street, Battleground Drive and Constitution
Drive. Any violations of this ordinance can result in a fine
for individuals or corporations convicted of breaking this
new law. The ordinance will go into effect during the first

Alcorn County Man Caught Stealing a Vehicle

On March 7th Tishomingo County 911 advised all agencies of a person that was in the process of stealing a vehicle from a business parking lot in Burnsville. Matthew Blake Voyles was arrested and charged with the felony theft of a vehicle.

Employees from the business in Burnsville told the 911 operator that they locked down the business in order to protect their customers and employees from Voyles. All local and state agencies in the area responded to the call.

A Mississippi Highway Patrol trooper arrived on the scene first and was able to detain the suspect as he was in the process of driving away in the stolen vehicle. Tishomingo County deputies and Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) officers immediately arrived on scene. The suspect was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Matthew Blake Voyles, 25-year-old, white male of 33 CR 326 Corinth, Mississippi was officially charged with **felony taking of motor vehicle**. Voyles remains in the custody of the Tishomingo County Jail where he awaits his bond to be set by Justice Court.

Sheriff Daugherty would like to thank the Mississippi Highway Patrol and the Mississippi Department of Transportation with their assistance in this arrest.

Notice from County Tax Assessor

It's that time of year again. January - the time of year when you are able to file for Homestead exemption. When you come in there are a few things you will need.

1. Current Car Tag number
2. Copy of your Deed
3. Social Security number for you and your spouse if married.
4. Proof of Disability if filing for Disability Exemption.
5. Proof of age if filing for over 65 Exemption.
6. For Disabled Veteran Exemption Proof of Disability and year awarded.
7. If you have lost a spouse during 2018 year you will also need to bring a copy of their death certificate and the above listed things for you to file your Homestead exemption.

Please make sure to come within these 3 months because this is the only time you are allowed to file for these exemptions. Also, for those people who are over 65 years old please make sure that we have correct mailing address and phone number. Please contact our office at 662-423-7059 if you have any other questions. 

Trash Masters Tournament

Nelson Johnson, Chairman of the Tishomingo County Adopt-a-Highway Program, is working on plans for the Trash Masters Tournament on Saturday, May 4, 2019.

Nelson reported that we will be awarding prizes to teams that collect the most litter. The 1st place prize is \$300, second place \$200, and third place \$100. The Mississippi Department of Transportation will have scales on hand to weigh trailer loads of litter. The event kicks off at 8 AM and ends at 11 AM. The weigh in is from 11 AM to 12 PM followed by prize awards and a big fish fry for the participants. There will be entertainment by local singers and musicians. We are raising funds now for this special event and asking for team sponsors. We urge everyone to get involved to help beautify Tishomingo County."

Mr. Johnson further stated that "our adopt-a-highway" effort has been very successful and we thank all of the businesses and individuals who have volunteered to help keep our highways free of litter."

Sponsored by the Mississippi Department of Transportation, the adopt a Highway Program encourages businesses, schools, and oth-

ers to adopt a mile of state highway for litter control. Those who have signed up so far include:

There are also several individuals and families that regularly pick up litter along county roads. Some of these individuals include Wayne Steele, Larry Sanders, Carolyn Terry, and others. We thank those who have volunteered and ask others to consider signing up for a section of highway or volunteering to pick up litter on a county road.

Although we have been successful in the north end of the county, we need someone to take the lead in the center and south end of Tishomingo County. Face to face meetings are the only effective way to encourage businesses and others to take an interest in beauti-



fying our county.

The Mississippi Department of Transportation reports that Mississippi has a litter rate 30% higher than any other state. 62% of the litter is deliberate, mostly convenience packaging such as take-out, snack, and beverage containers. 38% percent of litter is accidental such as blowing out of open bed vehicles and trash can spills. Most litter originates from males between the ages of 11 and 34.

News from Representative "Bubba" Carpenter

This was the ninth week of the 2019 Legislative Session. The deadline for House committees to report Senate bills occurred Tuesday at 8 p.m. Any Senate bills that did not make it out of committees died. Throughout the rest of the week, the House met to discuss bills that survived this deadline. Representatives passed a number of Senate bills, including the following:

Senate Bill 2161 would amend current law by revising definitions and clarifying qualifications for the office of the State Medical Examiner and its deputies. A lengthy discussion ensued when opponents of the bill argued that the bill would not do enough to speed up the lengthy autopsy process in the state. Proponents said that the bill would be a step in the right direction for repairing that process. The bill passed House 81-31 without changes and is on its way

to the Governor.

With the passage of Senate Bill 2043, the fee for a marriage license would increase from \$20 to \$35. Currently, circuit clerks also deposit \$14 of every fee collected into the Victims of Domestic Violence Fund. The House Ways and Means Committee proposed an amendment that would increase the amount deposited into the fund to \$24. The amendment was adopted with a voice vote, and the bill passed as amended by a vote of 96-17.

Under Senate Bill 2827, local public officials' salaries would increase. These public officials include chancery and circuit clerks, tax assessors, county supervisors and others. If enacted into law, certain fees collected by city and county entities would increase to pay for the pay raises. The House Appropriations Committee introduced a strike-all amendment changing

some of the original language of the bill. The bill passed as amended by a vote of 93-14 and has been sent back to the Senate.

Senate Bill 2864 would revise the current definition of a "covered claim" under the Mississippi Insurance Guaranty Association Law. The House passed an identical bill earlier in the session (HB 322), so there was little debate when this was introduced to the House floor. The bill passed with a bipartisan vote of 114-2 and has been sent to Governor Bryant to sign.

All Senate bills approved by the House will be sent back with changes to the Senate for concurrence or to invite conference.

Legislators honored several Mississippians at the Capitol this week for their personal accomplishments and positive representation of our state. On Tuesday, we honored the 2018 Alcorn State University Football Team for winning the 2018 Southwestern Atlantic Conference Championship, their third championship in the last five years. That same day, we recognized DeSoto County natives Dan and Daniel Arata and Jesse Wims for representing the State of Mississippi at the 2018 Special Olympics National Games. Wims was also recognized for winning four gold medals while competing. On Wednesday, the House recognized the West Point High School Football Team for winning the MHSAA 5A State Championship for the third year in a row.

Several groups visited legislators at the Capitol this week, including the Alcorn State University National Alumni Association; the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks; the Catfish Farmers of Mississippi; and the Mississippi Federation of Republican Women.

Approximately 600 guests were in attendance at the first "Family Night" held Tuesday night at the Tishomingo Shoe Company in Iuka. Guests were members of employee's families and had the opportunity of seeing how the machines operated, learning more about the work that is done at the plant.

The party commenced about 7 o'clock and a constant flow of visitors continued for about three hours. Refreshments consisting of Cokes and cookies were served.

A movie program of cartoons was shown for children while adults inspected the plant.

Mr. Lee Binkley, division personnel director of the General Shoe Corp., was an invited guest.

Tishomingo Shoe Company, a subsidiary of the General Shoe Corp., has been operating almost a year. The huge plant that will eventually employ 350 men and women is a result of a BAWI election held in the Spring of 1955.



LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE OF CITY OF IUKA, COUNTY OF TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI, REGULATING AND PROHIBITING TRUCK TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka do hereby FIND, DETERMINE AND ADJUDGE as follows:

That as a fact the roadways of Mississippi Highway 172 or Quitman Street commonly called Old 72 and Battleground Drive and Constitution Drive; and That the City finds that truck traffic should be regulated, designated and/or prohibited as set forth in this ordinance; therefore: The City is empowered to regulate and prohibit truck traffic for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the City of Iuka, MS, and that these regulations are a valid exercise of that power.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The following words or phrases when used in this ordinance shall have the meanings respectively described to in this section.

- (a) **Truck:** Shall mean all motor vehicles with more than two axels and also shall include any motor vehicle weighing more than 10,000 pounds. For the provisions of this ordinance truck shall not mean any type of pickup truck, school bus, fire apparatus or any emergency vehicle.
- (b) **Local truck or delivery traffic:** Truck traffic traveling inside the City of Iuka with a stopping or delivery point inside the City of Iuka, Mississippi.
- (c) **Through truck traffic:** Truck traffic traveling in and through the City of Iuka with no legitimate stopping or delivery point inside the City of Iuka, Mississippi.
- (d) **Destination:** Delivery points or ultimate temporary storage or resting points for local truck traffic.

SECTION 2: From and after effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for truck traffic to use the following public streets of Iuka, Mississippi: Mississippi Highway 172, Quitman Street, Battleground Drive and Constitution Drive.

SECTION 3: Any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance shall be guilty of the misdemeanor of No Through Truck Traffic and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 and not less than \$250.

SECTION 4: This ordinance does not apply to local truck or delivery traffic. It shall be effective despite any conflict with any other ordinance, and does repeal any portion of previous ordinance regarding these specific matters mentioned herein.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be effective 30 days from and after passage.

SECTION 6: If any Section, subsection or sentence held within this document is found to be unlawful or otherwise unenforceable, then the remaining enforceable portions shall remain in effect as stated herein.

FEMA & MEMA to Begin Joint Damage Assessments This Week in State

PEARL - This week the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) and select local emergency management offices will be conducting Joint Damage Assessments in response to the severe storms and flooding that impacted the state from February 19th-24th. These assessments, which will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday, help confirm the types and amounts of damage a disaster inflicted on individuals and property. It also helps determine whether the scope of damage is beyond the state's threshold and if federal assistance is needed to support those counties. Federal Assistance includes, but is not limited to:

- **Public Assistance (PA)** - inspecting structures, roads, water and sewer treatment facilities and other essential public facilities. (This assistance is not available to residents.)
 - **Individual Assistance (IA)** - interviewing residents to determine the extent of the disaster on individuals, families and personal property.
 - **Hazard Mitigation** - determining possible future preventive actions as well as gauging the effectiveness of measures already in place.
- Initially, representatives from FEMA will provide support in conducting damage assessments for Public Assistance in Calhoun, Chickasaw, Clay, Grenada, Lowndes, Pontotoc and Tishomingo counties.

FEMA will also provide support in conducting damage assessments for Individual Assistance in Lowndes County, where 375 homes were damaged due to an EF-2 tornado.

Once damage assessments are completed in other counties that were affected by those storms, they could become eligible for federal assistance as well.

"I expect that Mississippi will receive a federal declaration", said MEMA Executive Director Greg Michel. "Furthermore, I expect the declaration will be expanded to include other counties affected by the Mississippi River and backwater flooding."

Governor Phil Bryant signed and declared a State of Emergency on February 25th in response to the damage caused statewide by severe weather. A State of Emergency is an administrative tool that authorizes the use of state resources to aid in response and recovery efforts.

The State Emergency Operations Center is activated and monitoring any requests or unmet needs from the county emergency management offices.

The public is encouraged to report damage to homes or businesses to

their county emergency management office. A directory of all the offices can be found at <http://www.msema.org/county-ema/>

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 5)

Poison Prevention Week by James L. Cummins

Poison Prevention Week is March 17 - 23, the third week in March each year is nationally recognized to highlight the dangers of poisonings and prevent them.

Over 3.1 million poisonings are reported each year by the 55 Poison Control Centers across the States. More than 93.5 percent of these poisonings occur at home. The majority of non-fatal poisonings are children younger than 6 years old. You have to be aware in times of stress or when family activities are in a place. This is a common time for poisonings.

The first step in preventing unintentional poisonings is to keep medications and common household chemicals out of sight and out of reach of children.

If there are young children in your home, ask your pharmacist for child-proof containers. Children never refer to medication as candy and don't play with a medication container, even if it is in the game of taking medication. You should not let children play with a medication container, even if it is in the game of taking medication. Never store chemicals or cleaning products in marked containers or food and beverage containers. There are many colorful drinking products on the shelves and each year thousands of adults and children are poisoned by chemicals for what they thought were less drinks of lemonade or juice. One such product, anti-freeze, resembles some of the drinks on the shelves today because of its sweet taste and its lovely color.

There are a number of indoor and outdoor plants that can be poisonous also. Check with your local nursery for books on poisonous plants or your plant manager for help with identifying what may be harmful.

Some pharmacies stock poison first aid kits that contain syrup of ipecac, activated charcoal, and som salts. You would use these products only after getting professional advice as to whether to induce vomiting or not. NEVER treat your child unless you have to a poison control center, your physician or an emergency room first. The number to the Poison Center is 1-800-222-1222.
