

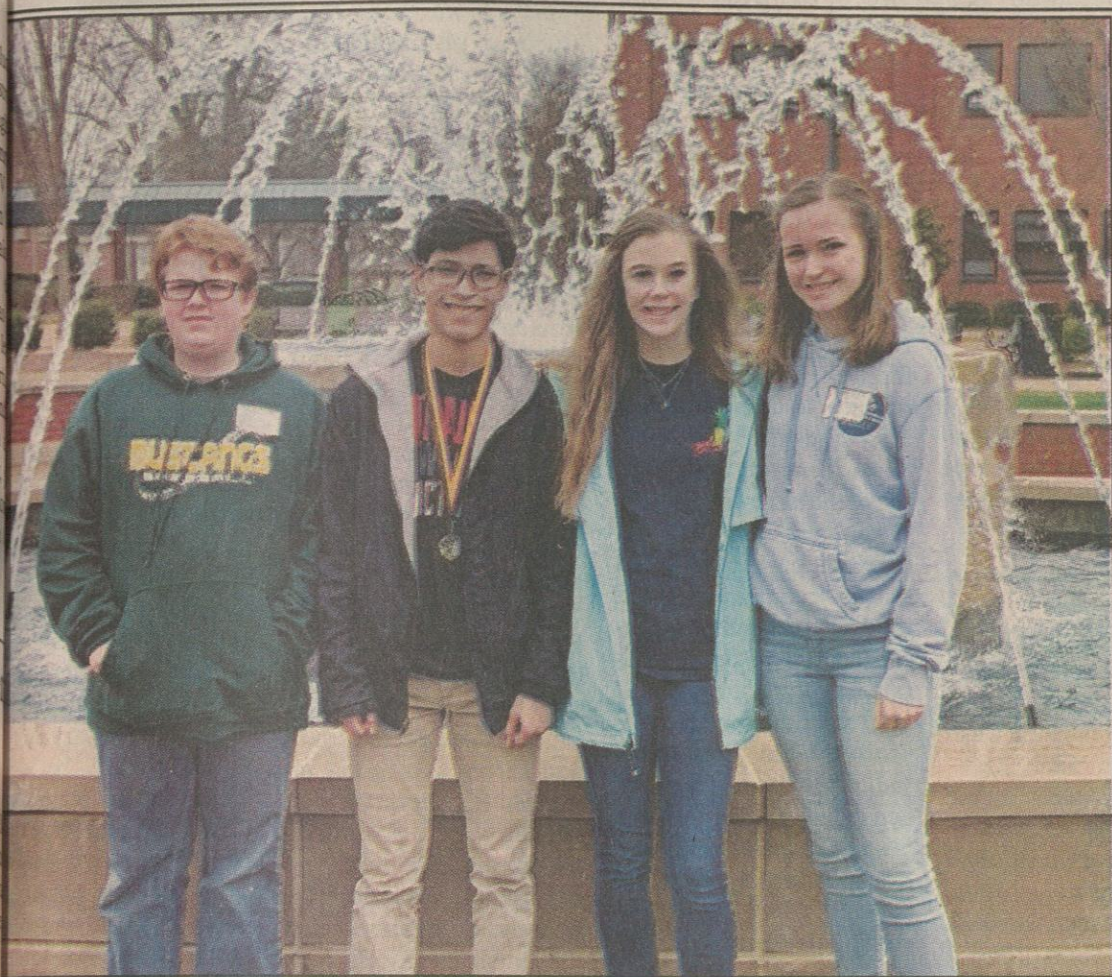

## Businesses Caught Not Checking ID's for Alcohol Purchases

On Friday March 15th a joint investigation was conducted between the Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC), the Iuka Police Department and the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office. The results of this investigation could cause certain businesses in Tishomingo County to lose their licenses to sale beer and liquor.

This investigation was focused on businesses that are permitted to sell Beer and Liquor in Tishomingo County. During the course of this investigation, eight businesses in total were checked by sending in minors who are in possession of a valid Mississippi Driver's License, which showed their true age to be 17 years old. The investigation was done to see if the businesses would verify the ages of the individuals trying to purchase alcohol. The following is a list of the businesses checked and the results of the investigation.

OLD 25 WINE & SPIRITS - 1105 Battleground Drive - Iuka, MS - FAILED.

The Package Store - 279 D US-HWY 72 - Burnsville, MS - FAILED.

One Stop Marathon - 1005 West Quitman Street - Iuka, MS

- FAILED.  
Burnsville Fast Stop - 246 US-Hwy. 72 - Burnsville, MS - FAILED.

The persons who received citations will have a court date in the Tishomingo County Justice Court on misdemeanor charges and the businesses where the violations occurred could face administrative fines and suspensions of their permits. The other four businesses in the area that were checked are listed here.

Currently there is no state issued statute requiring businesses to check an ID. The state statute does require that the person purchasing alcoholic beverages or beer must be 21; the only way to verify the persons age is by checking ID's. If you have information related to the sale of alcoholic beverages or beer to underage persons, please contact the Mississippi ABC or your local law enforcement agency.

## Why the Tax Increase to the Citizens of Tishomingo County?

Over the past couple of years there has been an increase in taxes in our county. This increase has been due in part to a number of factors.

### 1. Index increased in 2017

In 2017 the county had an update year and on these years the index is subject to change. In 2017 our index changed from 1.0 to 1.02 and is dictated by the cost of new homes built in the county. It is required by the state of MS that we do an index study. This requires a lot of time and effort to try and keep the index as low as possible. The index affects the square foot cost of all buildings, homes and structures on the properties in our county. This in turn caused the values to increase in 2017 which caused the taxes to increase.

### 2. Reassessment or 25% list

The properties in the county must be reassessed every four years. There are guidelines in doing this reassessment which are mandated by the state of MS. We must reassess 25% of the county each year to cover the entire county over a four year term. Reassessing involves a lot of field work and when reassessing we must account for all buildings, homes, and structures on each property. They are all taxable and must be accounted for in order to stay in

compliance with the laws of the state of MS. We are audited each year on several different areas of work in our office. If we don't pass these audits the 1 Mill reassessment would be put on hold and not be available for the county to use. This 1 Mill was valued at around \$155,000 for 2018, this is a lot of tax money to be used for the benefit of the county.

These are a couple of reasons there has been an increase in taxes over the past few years. I realize being the Assessor is not a popular job, but it is a necessary job in order for the county and our schools to receive the tax dollars it needs to maintain itself.

We don't like the fact that our taxes have increased but we have a job to do and we must do it in the right way. We may not always get it perfect but we do our best and work hard for Tishomingo County. We do the job fairly, honestly and without partiality.

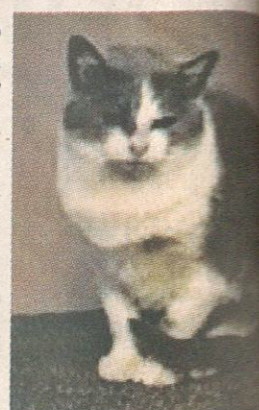

meat and even bones can be detrimental to a pet's health. If you have the urge to share your furry friend's peanut butter, baby carrots, apple slices, or pumpkin or cooked green beans. Plants and spruce up a home with several varieties can be toxic to cats and dogs. For example, are they really poisonous to cats? Should be removed from cat households. Other poisonous plants include leas, aloe vera and dils. It is also important to pay attention to medications. Over-the-counter and prescription medications should be locked up in secure boards. Do not leave on countertops or store them in plastic baggies, which can be easily chewed through. Sometimes pets get into things they shouldn't. 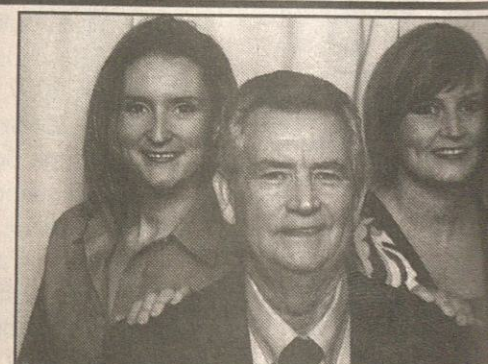
## Notice from County Tax Assessor

It's that time of year again. January - March is the time of year when you are able to file for Homestead exemption. When you come in there are a few things you will need.

1. Current Car Tag number
2. Copy of your Deed
3. Social Security number for you and your spouse if married.
4. Proof of Disability if filing for Disability Exemption.
5. Proof of age if filing for over 65 Exemption.
6. For Disabled Veteran Exemption Proof of Disability and year awarded.
7. If you have lost a spouse during 2018 year you will also need to provide and refile your Homestead. Please bring a copy of their death certificate and the above listed things for you to file your Homestead exemption.

Please make sure to come within these 3 months because this is the only time you are allowed to file for these exemptions. Also, for those people who are over 65 years old please make sure that we have correct mailing address and phone number. Please contact our office at 662-423-7059 if you have any other questions. 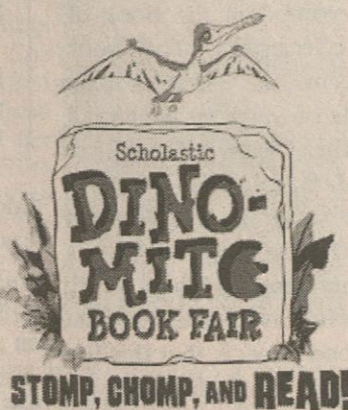

## Report from

### Representative "Bubba" Carpenter

This was the tenth week of the 2019 Legislative Session. Wednesday of this week was the deadline for the House to discuss general Senate bills. Any Senate bills that did not make it off the calendar died. The deadline to discuss Senate appropriations and other revenue bills will occur Tuesday, March 19. Many Senate general bills were discussed and debated, including the following:

**Senate Bill 2770** would give teachers and assistant teachers a pay raise for the first time since the last raises were authorized over a two year period beginning in 2014. Initially, the bill stated that salaries would increase \$1,000 to be phased in over two years. During Tuesday's floor action, the House Education Committee introduced the bill with a strike-all amendment with the same \$1,000 raise. Representative Steve Holland (D-Lee) offered an amendment to the strike-all raising the amount of the increase for teachers only from \$1,000 to \$4,000. The increase for assistant teachers remained the same. Rep. Holland and several others stated that the raise is long overdue and just \$500 a year would not be sufficient. A motion to table this amendment was raised because several House members argued that the final numbers of the raise would be decided in conference, along with the rest of the state budget. The motion to table the amendment failed 50-55, and the amendment passed after a voice vote.

The final vote for the entire bill was a bipartisan vote of 112-2, and the bill has been returned to the Senate.

Another highly debated bill that had floor action this week was **Senate Bill 2116**. The bill would prohibit an abortion of an unborn fetus with a detectable heartbeat. If enacted, the law would be one of the most restrictive abortion laws in the United States. The House passed a similar bill earlier this session (HB 732), but the bill died on the Senate calendar. Senate Bill 2116 passed as amended with a vote of 78-37 and has been returned to the Senate.

**Senate Bill 2716** would amend the state's Landlord Tenant Act to remove the grace period tenants who are behind on rent had been given before being evicted. Proponents of the bill argued that landlords are losing money and the elimination of the grace period would make the eviction process smoother. Opponents argued that the bill was unfair to lower income tenants who are already struggling to make ends meet and that the grace period offers them a cushion to figure things out. The bill passed 72-40.

**Senate Bill 2892** would allow community hospitals around the state to begin servicing areas that are outside the State of Mississippi. The bill was amended in the House Public Health and Human Services Committee to give further clarification. SB 2892 passed as amended 78-28 and has been returned to the Senate.

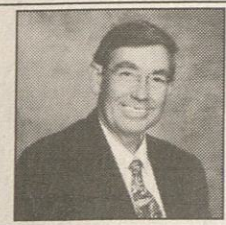

## Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 6)

We are looking at the words written by King Solomon in the Book of Ecclesiastes. This book seems to paint human life on earth, as well as all other earthly things, in "dark colors". We have seen that life is futile when the only thing we have is the present portion of life as it is lived on earth. The good news is that this life is not the "whole show", for more is to come in the future than what has been lived on earth in the entire history of the planet! We have seen that some things cannot be changed while we live on earth, now we will see that Solomon faced the same problems others face, even though he had great riches and wisdom. Ecclesiastes 1:16-18 says, "I communed with mine own heart, saying, Lo, I am come to great estate, and have gotten more wisdom than all they that have been before me in Jerusalem: yea, my heart had great experience of wisdom and knowledge. And I gave my heart to

know wisdom, and to know madness and folly: I perceived that this also is vexation of spirit. For in much wisdom is much grief: and he that increaseth knowledge increaseth sorrow."

If the Book of Ecclesiastes had no more to tell us than what we have already seen, I would not be writing about this book! We will have to wait until further into the book to find any trace of Solomon's "positive conclusion". The "positive thinkers" and the "positive only preachers" never seem to get around to any teaching of the whole picture painted by Solomon in the Book of Ecclesiastes. Have you ever noticed that it is almost impossible to get much out of any book if the "skip around

method" is used in reading it? Many people do exactly that with the Bible, therefore we have all sorts of teachings in the churches, simply because the bulk of the whole book has never been read, understood or taught. None of us knows all about the Bible, but the best way to learn more of it is to read it all carefully and often and to explain it in context. Notice that Solomon had a "heart to heart" communion with himself, if that can be imagined. The reasoning of this wise man was that he had come to a great estate, especially in the matters of wisdom and knowledge, yet he could not seem to solve the most important riddle of life: that is, why are we here, and what gain are we getting out of liv-

ing on earth? Our realized that he had wisdom and knowledge but he also realized that he had not gained his own, rather given them to him. It did not mean that he studied things but it did mean that own, he would have had these. In out the reasons for on earth, he saw wisdom, madness (mel to boast, or rave) and (silliness) were all a tion (grasping or des things that cannot tained through the side of earth life. he gave his heart to or try, all these things concluded that they desires of the human that could not be real by man's abilities, an adding of wisdom knowledge only more sorrow.

## How Does a Neighborhood Watch Group Work?

A Neighborhood Watch Group consists of concerned citizens coming together to form an organized and efficient way to keep "watch" of their neighborhood. A neighborhood watch group understands that law enforcement cannot be everywhere all the time. It should be noted that in Tishomingo County, one of the largest counties in the state, law enforcement is pushed to their limits. An effective Neighborhood Watch Group can help to augment an already overworked Sheriff's department. However, this augmentation does not mean Neighborhood Watch groups enforce the law; it only means they become the eyes and ears for law enforcement. In the

case of Harmony New Salem Neighborhood Watch Group, they use a zone approach which consists of five color coded zone areas with Team Captains in charge of each zone. The residents within the different zones report any suspicious activity directly to their Team Captain and the Team Captain reports that activity to the President of the Neighborhood Watch group. In some cases the Team Captains may call the Sheriff's department directly with their concerns however; going through the President of the Watch Group is the preferred method. By using a 'chain of command' approach the Neighborhood Watch Group can maximize their effectiveness. It is extremely important the Sheriff's department and the Neighborhood Watch

Group work closely together and I'm proud to say the Harmony New Salem Neighborhood Watch Group receives great support from Sheriff John Daughtery and his entire staff. The key to a successful Neighborhood Watch Group must maintain that close working relationship with local law enforcement. It should be noted that all of the Harmony New Salem Team Captains have received weapons training and have their Enhanced Carry permits this adds another layer of safety for the Team Captains and the neighborhood they are helping to protect. 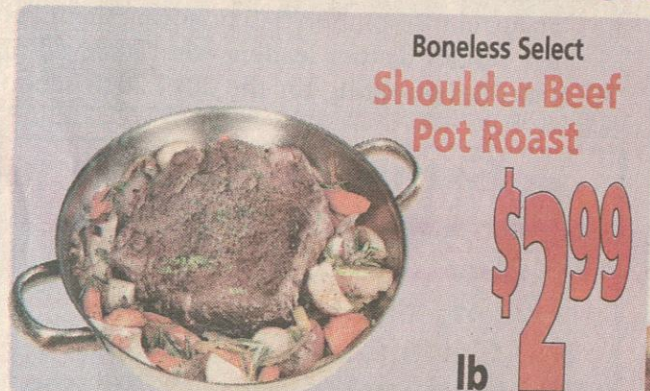

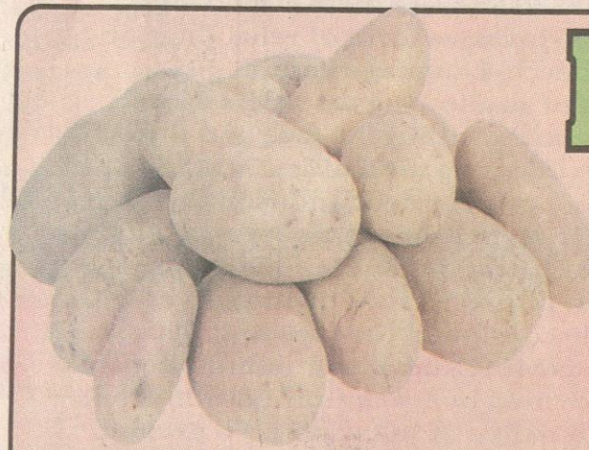

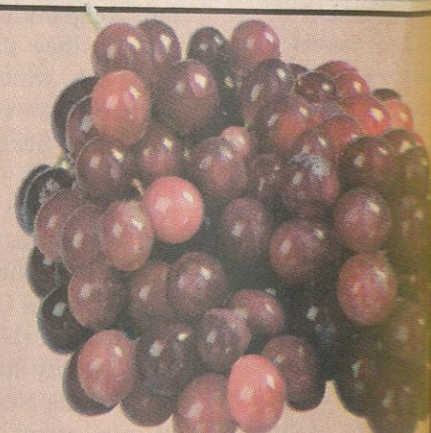

## More about the Shackelford Family

A bit more history on the Shackelfords to add to the photos and article on James (Jim) Elliott Shackelford family that appeared in the March 7, 2019 edition of The Tishomingo County News. My great-great-grandfather was Ludia Carroll Shackelford, the 11<sup>th</sup> child of Willis Arnold Hopgood (Haygood) Shackelford, and a brother to James (Jim) Elliott Shackelford of the recent article.

Carroll married December 1879 Eliza Camilla Ann Woodruff. To them were born 7 chil-

dren. The first was my great-grandmother, Maggie Lee Shackelford, who married Johnny Jefferson Daniel Woodruff. (Yes, I said Woodruff, but I am not addressing the Woodruff genealogy today.) Maggie nor their 2<sup>nd</sup> child, John Arnold Shackelford, are in the group photo, but the other 5 children are on the back row. Left to right: Bennett Shackelford, Mattie S. Hellums, Jeffie S. Davis, Sally S. Lunsford, Charles Richard Shackelford.

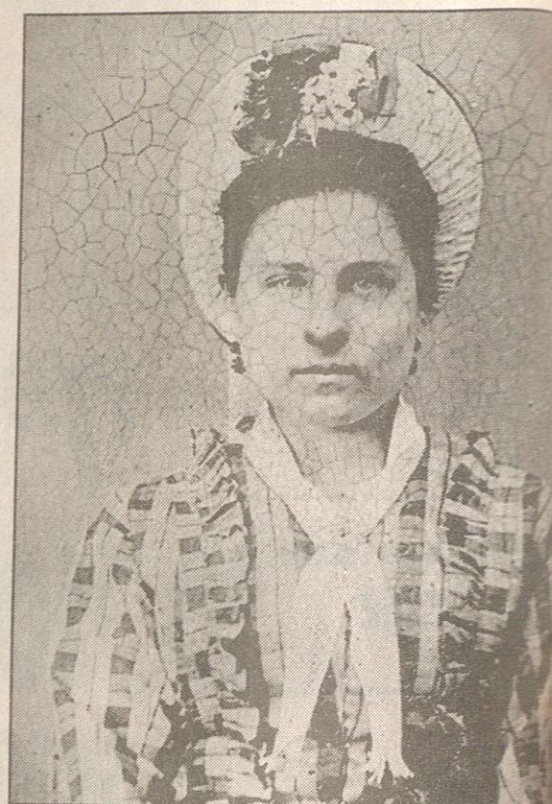
Carroll's wife Eliza died in 1895. Carroll remarried around 1896, Annie Lizer Owens. They

are on the front row with their daughters: Winnie S. Stephens, Willie S. Coleman, Fannie Ethel Shackelford. Another child born after the photo was Lanis S. Boone. The photo was made around 1904. Carroll died March 1936. Annie Lizer died January 1941.

I would love to have other Shackelford photos, particularly further back to Willis Shackelford, etc. I would be glad to share what I have. I'm trying to identify a box of really old pictures from my great-grandparents (Johnny and Maggie) we have lost them. Many years ago we

## Sarah Green "Sallie" Shackelford Woodruff

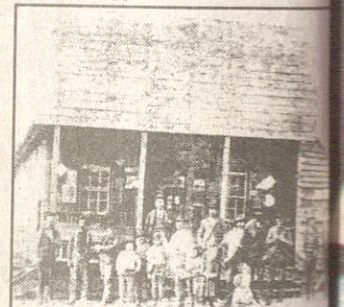

Sarah Green "Sallie" Shackelford Woodruff was the 12<sup>th</sup> child of Willis Arnold Hopgood (or Haygood) Shackelford and a sister to both James (Jim) Elliott Shackelford and Ludia Carroll Shackelford. And yes, I said Woodruff. Sallie married Marshall Cosiesco Woodruff. He was from Lee County but I am not sure if he was a relative. Marshall owned a store in the community of Burton. In the early years, 1841-1906, Mr. Burton operated the post office out of Marshall's Store. The community of Burton was named after him.

My mother, Earline Barnes Whitfield, says she remembers as a young girl going with her Uncle Homer Woodruff to visit Aunt Sallie and two of her sons who never married. Those two sons were John Willis and James Allen Woodruff. I assume these are the two men in the photo with Aunt Sallie.

## Shackelfords Come to North Mississippi

(taken from the Shackelford Clan Magazine)

### Willis Arnold Hopgood Shackelford

In the year 1819, October the 10th, in the humble farm home of Richard Shackelford, Jr. and his wife, Frances (Fanny) Arnold Shackelford in Madison County, Alabama, a new heir; their 6th child, third son, and one of their eleven children was born. The new heir was christened Willis Arnold Hopgood. The first two names being for his maternal grandfather (actually for his mother's brother), and the third being for one of his grandfather's associates in the ministry.

When he as a small boy his parents moved to

Henderson County, Tenn., where he grew to manhood, and where he, on August 7, 1839, married Frances Riddle. And to them were born 13 children, all of whom grew to manhood, and womanhood. The children being as follows: Nancy Elizabeth, born June, 1840; Martha Jane, born Aug. 21, 1841; Eliza Frances, born July 9, 1843; Mary Ann, born June 6, 1845; Charles Richard, born May 12, 1847; William Harmon, born Dec. 24, 1848; Emily Kiziah, born Oct. 2, 1850; Harriet Milbrey, born Jun. 13, 1852;

James Elliott born Aug. 22, 1854; Thomas Alfred born Aug. 20, 1856; Ludie Carrol born Oct. 14, 1859; Sarah Green born July 7, 1862; and John Mitchum born about 1865. The major part of the descendants are living in North Mississippi.

Willis married in Henderson Co but soon moved to Mississippi and settled near the little village of Burton, Tishomingo County. He had 13 children, 97 grandchildren and 252 great-grandchildren.
