## Iuka Man Charged with First-Degree Murder

An Iuka man, Christopher Mailhot, 21, is being charged with murder after the shooting death of Jeffery Steven White, 50, of Savannah, TN on Wednesday, March 20th.

The wife of Jeffery Steven White, Elaina Michelle White, 38 was also arrested and charged according to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation. Mailhot has been charged with first-degree murder and conspiracy to commit first-degree murder, and White is charged with criminal responsibility for first-degree murder and conspiracy to commit first-degree murder. The bond in this case was set at \$2 million each. The body of Jeffery Steven White was found outside his home in Savannah, TN; an autopsy has been ordered to determine the exact cause of death though it is apparent at this time he had been shot. Mailhot allegedly conspired with White to kill her husband. The investigation that took place in this situation was a joint effort between the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, the Savannah Police Department and the 24th District Attorney General's Office.

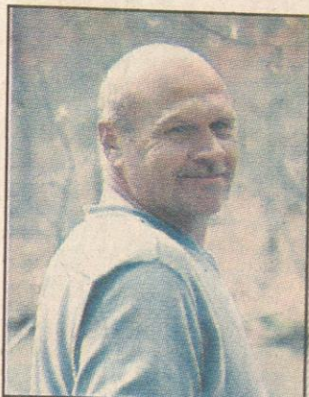

Jerry Miller, expresses his thoughts on the kind of man Cummings was. "He was not only a boss but a great friend that will be missed by everyone."

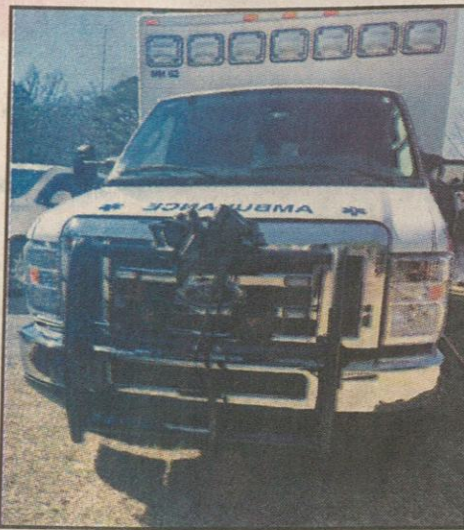

## Dennis Man Arrested Again for Possession

On March 22nd Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies responded to the Tishomingo area for a welfare check on a person sitting in a vehicle. Billy Don Hall was arrested for possession with intent to

sell.

When the deputies arrived, they observed a vehicle sitting in the roadway blocking traffic. The deputies noticed that the driver, Billy Don Hall, appeared to be unconscious as they approached the vehicle. Deputies could also smell an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Deputies had Hall come out of the vehicle and a search yielded a large amount of alleged methamphetamine in separate baggies along with a small amount of alleged marijuana. The deputies also recovered some scales as well as suboxone. Hall was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Billy Don Hall, 36-year-old, white male of Dennis, was officially charged with felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) w/intent to sell. Hall's bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$10,000. Hall also has a hold placed on him by the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC).

## March UDC Meeting at Library

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 met March 18th, 11 am, at the Iuka Public Library. Those present were Gail Smith, Vickie Durham and Sharon Hairrell. The pledges to the flags and the UDC rituals were completed and the meeting was declared opened. Sharon, Secretary gave the minutes of the last meeting and the old business was discussed and Vickie Durham gave the treasure report and it was approved. New business was following up on Gail and Jean's applications. We also plan to fix a display cabinet at the Iuka Public Library for Confederate Memorial Month (April). We also will be having a Memorial Service for one of our members that passed away and we will be placing a wreath on the the Confederate Monument at Tishomingo Archives and History Museum and the Grave of the Unknown Soldiers.

Vickie Durham presented the program on "James B. Eads, he put together an ironclad inland Navy and how it affected the Confederacy.. James Buchanan Eads was born in Lawrenceburg, Indiana, on May 23, 1820. He came to St. Louis when he was 13 years old. The boat trip to St. Louis

ended in disaster when the boat caught fire. The family was left with only the clothes on their back. His first job was selling apples on the streets. After a term as a clerk in a dry goods store, he became a purser on a Mississippi River boat.

Durning his four years on the river, Eads became convinced that it held the key to the development of the West while remaining vital to the entire East. He conceived the notion of getting the federal government to clear the river of wrecks and snags, but Washington did not listen to his proposal.

When he could not get action, he took things into his own hands. He invented a contraption he called a diving bell, enabling workmen to stay under water without wearing pressurized suits. He began hauling up wrecks himself. He made a fortune in a hurry.

He later made a proposal to General Scott and President Lincoln about designing boats for the Union Navy. Lincoln bypassed top naval officials. He knew they would never approve plans for an armored vessel designed by a self-taught salvage master, not a veteran shipbuilder. He promised to have the "turtle-backs" in a hundred days.

On the long journey back to St. Louis, the successful inventor, whose schooling had ended at the age of thirteen, made a series of sketches. They became the basis for working drawings that called for production of eight armor-plated steam-powered gunboats.

With the outbreak of the Civil War, James Eads oversaw the construction of ironclad gunboats for the War Department from the spring of 1861 to the spring of 1864 from his boatyard in Carondelet. He constructed boats at an incredibly fast pace that put pressure on the city's carpenters and ironworkers. This included the Excelsior Stove Works owned by the Filley brothers, who switched their production from stoves to cannons and iron plating in support of the war effort. Eads received his first contract from the War Department in August 1861 thanks to a letter from General Frank Blair to his brother-in-law army quartermaster general, Montgomery C. Meigs. The contract asked for seven boats. While his original timetable stipulated that the boats would be ready for crews in 65 days, they were not sent until late November 1862, and weren't accepted into service until January 15, 1863.

It wasn't even a month before the ironclads would prove their effectiveness, aiding General Grant in the taking of Confederate Fort Donelson and Fort Henry, and again in the taking of New Madrid and Island No. 10. Eventually Eads would produce 14 of the 22 ironclad gunboats used during the Civil War. These boats would be integral in securing Union control of the Mississippi and opening the river to commerce by July of 1863.

We also discussed the "Farewell to our Confederate Women" and the parts they played in the War. Many women had to carry on family business, farms and providing for their family. Women made clothes for our soldiers and gathered supplies. Some women became nurses and helped in hospitals. Many women became spies and several even disguised themselves as men and fought. Some of their names are Rose O'Neal Greenhow, Bell Boyd, Antonia Ford, Charlotte and Virginia Moon, Mary Surralt and Sally Lousia Tompkin known as "Angel of the Confederacy"). There are many others.

## Kindergarten Registration in Tishomingo County School District

Tishomingo County School District will hold Kindergarten Registration on Friday, April 12, 2019, at the following schools: Belmont, Burnsville Elementary, Iuka Elementary, and Tishomingo Elementary, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. for students who will be five (5) years old on or before September 1. The child must register at the school in which he/she is zoned to attend.

Parents/Guardians will need the following documents to register - birth certificate, Immunization Compliance Form from the Health Department, Social Security card, and two (2) proofs of residency.

The Office of the State Auditor mandates two proofs of residency, and these documents must be on file before a child is officially enrolled in our district. The information required is to prove that each student physically resides full time, weekday/nights and weekends, at the place of abode located within the limits of the school district. Please notice

the requirements below and keep in mind that the proofs must be current. This means that a utility bill must be within 30 days of the date it is presented. Other documents must be the latest available. Example: driver license and auto registration must be current. All proofs must contain the child's physical address and date of proof. Listed below are items that will be accepted as proof:

- Affidavit and/ or personal visit by a designated school district official
- Apartment or Home Lease (hand written rent receipt must be notarized)
- Current Utility Bills: (Water, Electric, TV, Phone (no cell phone bill will be accepted, bill must be for a land line or internet service)
- Current Driver License or Firearms Permit (only one can be accepted)
- Current Automobile Registration
- Document from a government agency that proves residency in our district

## Conservation Corner: Landscaping to Conserve Energy

Today's energy prices have everyone looking for ways to cut costs. One often-overlooked way of reducing energy costs is through landscaping, and spring is a great time to do it. Landscaping not only helps with your energy bills, it also enhances the overall beauty and value of your property.

As trees transpire during the day, they serve as an evaporative coolant. Therefore, trees, shrubs and other plants affect solar radiation more than structural devices, such as awnings. Shade trees significantly reduce air temperatures indoors and outdoors in the summer as trees intercept and absorb the sun's heat while transpiring, and thus lowering immediate air temperatures.

Before you begin planting, you should take a few things into con-

sideration. First, spend some time outdoors. Take note of how the sun falls across your property at different times of the day. We all know that the sun rises in the east and sets in the west, but did you know that it rises more from the northeast during the summer solstice and the southeast during the winter solstice? So, keep this in mind as you decide how and what to plant for which season.

To provide morning shade in the summer, trees should be planted on the eastern and northeastern exposures of your home. For afternoon shade, trees placed on the western and northwestern exposures are most effective. However, avoid placing trees too close to your home; planting trees a distance of 25 feet from the walls or roof line is usually adequate. Also, take precautions to

plant away from power lines, underground sewer, water or utility lines and be sure to space trees properly according to their anticipated mature size.

Effective tree planting will allow the winter sun to warm the roof and walls of your home. An important consideration for energy conservation in the winter is the use of deciduous tree species. These trees lose their leaves in the winter and should be planted on the east and southeast sides of your home to allow the sun through to help warm the house. You should also incorporate evergreens such as pine, magnolia and cedar on the north and northwestern sides to act as a screen against cold, northerly winds so that your heater does not have to work as hard to heat your home.

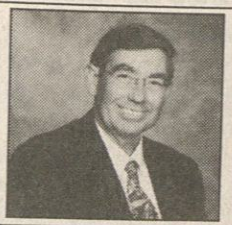


# Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 7)

Ecclesiastes 2:1-3 shows us a king of Israel, Solomon, who set out in his heart and mind to find the best way to live life on earth. He did find that way, but he did not end up using it to the fullest extent, which we will see later. Ecclesiastes 2:1-3 says, "I said in mine heart, Go to now, I will prove thee with mirth, therefore enjoy pleasure: and, behold, this also is vanity. I said of laughter, It is mad: and of mirth, What doeth it? I sought in mine heart to give myself unto wine, yet acquainting mine heart with wisdom; and to lay hold on folly, till I might see what was that good for the sons of men, which they should do under the heaven all the days of their life."

Here we see a man with the wisdom, knowledge and the finances to try anything in life that he pleased, so he tried it all. His goal was to find out what was the best thing a man can do on earth to enjoy his time here, so he set out in hot pursuit. Solomon started with a "self-addressed message" within his own heart, and is that not how we all start? He said that he was going to prove the best way to live life by having personal pleasure, and so he started the process of chasing pleasure. Our word "mirth" means: glee, blithesomeness; it is also translated: exceeding gladness; joy, pleasure and rejoicing. So Solomon is on his way to all of these things, or so he thinks. He said he would enjoy pleasure, a good laugh, a good glass of wine and folly, but

when he got to the end of the road lined with these pleasures, he said that the whole pursuit was empty and insane. He asked the question as to what these things had done for him, and the answer was: nothing! Perhaps some of my readers have traveled some of these roads and found the same emptiness, if so hold on, for we will finally see a better road of opportunity. The whole quest in Solomon's pursuit was to find out what is really good for a man to do while living on earth, but all the things he has tried so far have produced no good results! So our wise king must try another avenue, and thus he will, as our next verses will show.

Ecclesiastes 2:4-6 says, "I made me great works; I builded me houses; I planted me vineyards; I made me gardens and

orchards, and I planted trees in them of all kind of fruits: I made me pools of water, to water therewith the wood that bringeth forth trees:" Well he is on his way to the top, or so it would seem, but is he really headed to the top? Notice the word "me" in these verses, for it is used five times in three verses. This alone should tell us something about the futility of Solomon's pursuit, for life is not all about "me" or "you"; it is about God and how you and I are to fit into His plan. It looks like the "great works" of erecting buildings, along with houses, would have been enough for Solomon, but the selfish man never gets enough for himself, and Solomon is being selfish here. Vineyards would have produced wine; gardens would have produced good fruits; trees would have been both for beauty and building; irrigation was to produce better trees and perhaps plants, but the heart of Solomon was still empty, so we will see if more of his plans will be productive for him.
