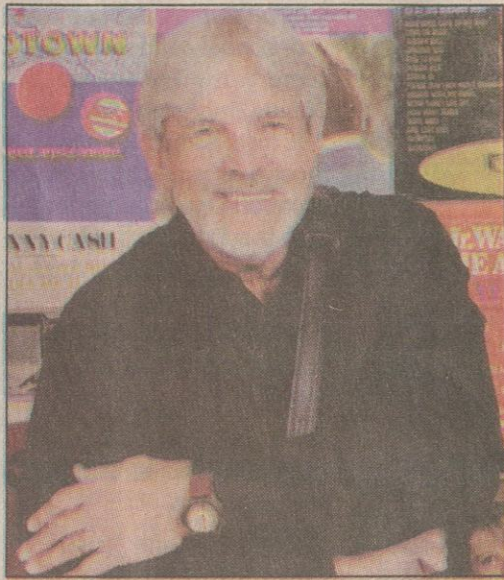

The "Fastest Guitar Player in the South" Travis Wammack to be in Concert at the Old Courthouse Museum in Iuka to Kick-Off Renaissance Day

Recently, Travis Wammack, the "Fastest Guitar Player in the South" visited the Tishomingo County News office with his friend L.O. Bishop to let everyone know that he is excited to perform a concert at the Old Courthouse Museum in Iuka on April 27th at 7 p.m. A limited number of tickets are available for this concert, the cost of the tickets are \$10 each. The tickets will be sold in advance so get one before they are gone, just come by the Old Courthouse Museum in Iuka or call 662-423-3500. All of the proceeds for this concert will be donated to the Old Courthouse Museum. This concert kicks off Renaissance Day in Iuka which is scheduled for April 27th.

There are some names you can't forget. Names like Narvel Felton Jarvis, Elvis Presley, Good Southern names for the boys that made some of rock-n-roll's great records. Such a name and such a man is Travis Wammack. Born in Walnut, Mississippi, he began his professional music career when he wrote and recorded his first record at the tender age of eleven, and also became the youngest member ever voted into the musicians union. After moving to Memphis, Tennessee, the young guitarist made his mark on the music world at the age of sixteen with his

1963 number one hit "Scratchy". He was the first to develop and use the fuzz tone for an electric guitar. By 1969, Wammack's skills landed him in Muscle Shoals, Alabama where he teamed with legendary producer Rick Hall at Hall's FAME Records. Travis' guitar licks can be heard on hit records that have sold over 'SIXTY MILLION' copies...songs recorded by artists such as Aretha Franklin, Wilson Pickett, Little Richard, Mac Davis, Clarence Carter, the Osmond Brothers, Bobbie Gentry, Candi Staton, Delbert McClinton, Liza Minnelli, Narvel Felton and many more. Wammack's solo artist career (produced by Hall) also sky rocketed with the release of albums in 1971 and 1975. He traveled the world as Little Richard's band leader from 1984 until 1995, performing on several nationally syndicated television programs as well as President Bill Clinton's inauguration party. Wammack became known as the "Fastest Guitar Player in the South", where he was described by Rolling Stone's Greg Shaw as "the fastest guitar player I have ever

heard in my life, and not just fast but good. Brilliant, even. His stage show is flamboyant and exciting."

Travis is a member of the Memphis Music Hall of Fame, and in 1999 Wammack received the Professional Musician Award from the Alabama Music Hall of Fame. In 2015 he was inducted into the Southern Legends Entertainment and Performing Arts Hall of Fame and the Record Collectors Hall of Fame. In May of 2006 Gibson Guitars presented Travis with a new Gibson ES-335 guitar as part of their documentary honoring legendary Gibson ES series players.



Car Crashes into Building Site of Future Subway

On Thursday, March 28th around 10 p.m. a vehicle ran into the unfinished building which is the site of the new Subway located on Battleground Drive across from Wal-Mart in Iuka.

The Iuka Police Department responded to the scene along with emergency medical services. The driver of the vehicle, a 20 year old female, apparently blacked-out behind the wheel, possibly due to a medical condition. After ensuring that the driver was being cared for the Iuka PD contacted the owners of the building, Gary and Tricia Littlejohn of Iuka, who were quite surprised to learn of this incident.

The vehicle in question drove through several small posts along the roadside before entering the parking lot where Farmhouse Restaurant is located. It then continued on accelerating through the ditch next to the future Subway and became airborne before crashing through the wall approximately 5 1/2 feet off the ground. Reports



indicate that the driver was taken to the hospital from the scene of the accident and luckily it seems she only suffered minor injuries during the wreck.

Subway is expected to open at the new location sometime this summer according to the Littlejohn's despite the fact that this incident may delay the construction progress by 3 to 4 weeks. An exact "Grand Opening" date has not been determined at this time.

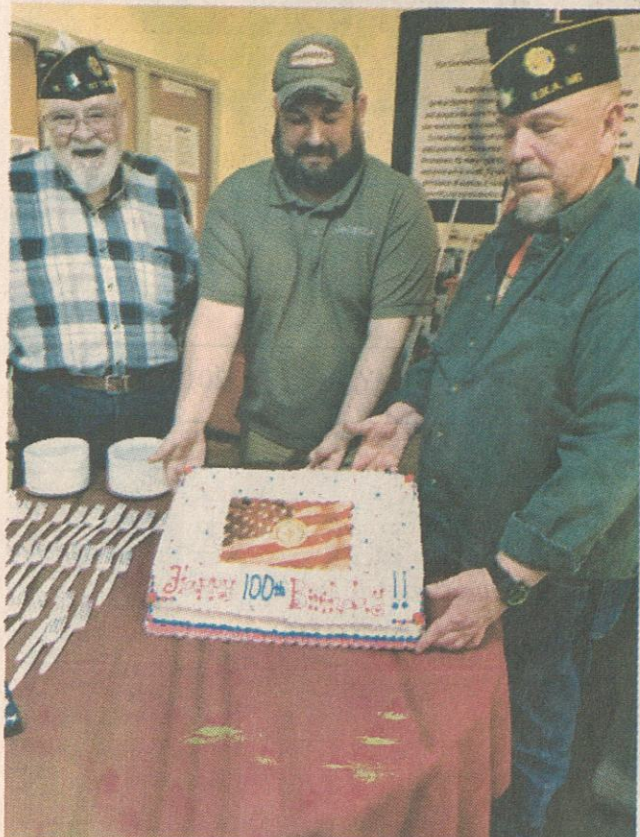

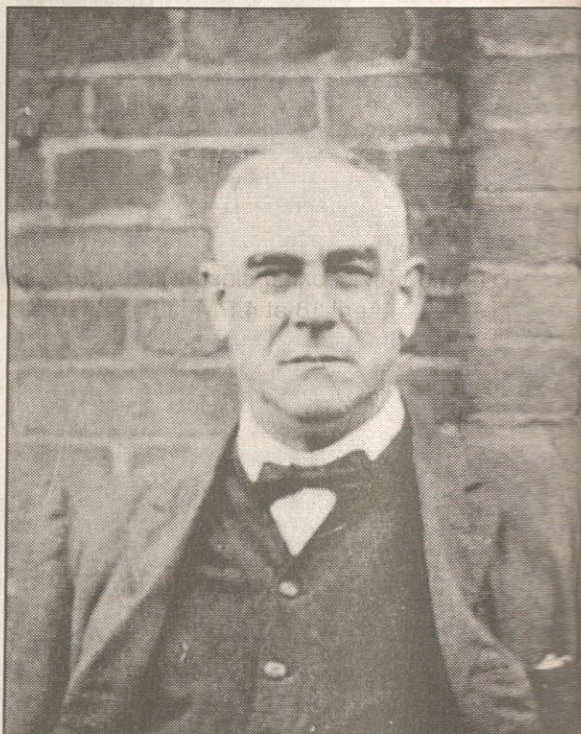
The Phillips Family

Blunt, Lela Campbell Phillips, and Mary Lee (Molly) Phillips. Children are, Ray Phillips (son of David and Sarah), Esther Blunt Rushing, Ercell Blunt Underwood, Howard Phillips, and Leonard G. Phillips. Nick reports that Orrin Lamon Phillips was his great-grandfather. He served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War and Nicolas Lafayette Phillips was his

grandfather. (Note that he spelled his first name without the "h."). He was Superintendent of Education of Tishomingo County from 1916 until 1920, and then he served as Sheriff from 1920 until 1924. He would have signed teacher contracts like the one with Miss Margaret Edmondson (the mother of L. O. Bishop) to teach at the Cripple Deer School. Years ago, I heard many stories from the people

who were in school when he was superintendent that he traveled all over the county visiting schools, and it was his practice to conduct a spelling bee during his visits. Mr. N. L. also was a businessman, had a general store in Iuka which later became Phillips Hardware. Nick expresses his appreciation to Gary Walker for helping him to identify the family members.

Obit found for N. L. Phillips in April 12, 1945 issue of the Vidette.

N. L. Phillips, age 73, passed away at his home Saturday night (April 7), after an illness of only a few hours. His death came as a complete shock to the whole county, where

he was well known and highly esteemed. Being an educator, he was at one time Supt. of Education in this county and had also served as Sheriff during which term he was respected for his fearlessness and integrity in enforcing the law.

Mr. Phillips was born in the southern portion of the county, where his family was among the earliest settlers.

Genesco/Iuka Shoe Factory Memories Remain Strong

When Genesco, Inc. of Nashville, Tennessee announced in February 1998 that it would be closing its Iuka plant, it changed the lives of generations of plant workers.

And yet, two decades after the plant shut its doors, dozens of former coworkers like Judy Rhodes, Sheila Phifer and Ann Wiley have begun to fellowship and reminisce over lunch once a month.

The group, which last month changed its meeting day and location to 11:30 a.m. on the third Tuesday of each month at Lil' Smokies Restaurant in Iuka, usually brings together about two dozen former plant employees.

"We've had as many as 40 people to come," Rhodes said. There is no agenda, just a social time among friends, and they

make the Christmas lunch a time to reach out to more of the retirees.

Rhodes spent more than 38 years working at the plant, and the friendships she made there remain strong enough for her to want to revisit that time with her former coworkers.

"We just want to see if we can get more people to come," she said.

Phifer also finds the monthly lunches a great time to reconnect with people in the community she may not see any other time.

"I've been at every lunch since we started doing this in 2017," Phifer said. "I really enjoyed this last one. It seemed like I talked to more folks."

The monthly gatherings allow participants, most of whom are retired

from jobs they held after the plant closing, to spend time with other seniors.

"Even though I haven't been able to attend every month, I really enjoy the time we spend together," Wiley said.

The Iuka plant manufactured boots for the Genesco company, which was known for its Laredo, Code West and Larry Mahan boots, and also for Johnston & Murphy, Nautica and Dockers brand shoes.

The company continues to sell branded footwear, headwear and licensed sports apparel, but closed United States manufacturing operations in 2002. It now contracts for its products with third party companies located outside the United States.

Ecclesiastes 2:7-8 continues our story of Solomon's attempts to learn how to live best: "I got me servants and maidens, and had servants born in my house; also I had great possessions of great and small cattle above all that were in Jerusalem before me: I gathered me also silver and gold, and the peculiar treasure of kings and of the provinces: I gat me men singers and women singers, and the delights of the sons of men, as musical instruments, and that of all sorts." My what a list of "great things" to accomplish, but what an empty heart they left along their trail! Humanity is adept at trying all of the things of the world to produce what only God can give, satisfaction! Most of us would likely be happy to have even one servant around our dwell-

ings, but Solomon had hundreds of them, yet he found no real satisfaction in life. He had males and females as servants, as well as servants that were born in his household; he had all kinds of livestock, with steak every day if he wished, yet he was not satisfied. He excelled all the great men who lived in Jerusalem before his time, yet he was not joyful. His monetary finances would have been a staggering sum, especially since his real valuables were in the form of silver and gold as security. Solomon had treasures that only kings could afford, and to the number that should have filled his desires, but they didn't! So he decided also to add the music to his personal party and wealth, thus he gathered the best of singing men and women with the best instru-

ments, but their sound was a hollow one.

Now dear Solomon has to sit back and make an assessment of all that he has gathered, and so he does, as is recorded in Ecclesiastes 2:9-11: "So I was great, and increased more than all that were before me in Jerusalem: also my wisdom remained with me. And whatsoever mine eyes desired I kept not from them, I withheld not my heart from any joy; for my heart rejoiced in all my labour: and this was my portion of all my labour. Then I looked on all the works that my hands had wrought, and on the labour that I had laboured to do: and, behold, all was vanity and vexation of spirit, and there was no profit under the sun." Oh how great it would be if all humanity would read these words and believe

them! Solomon was the wisest and richest man in Jerusalem, with both assets remaining with him, yet he was still empty inside! Can you imagine a man getting everything that he "sees and wants"? That is exactly what Solomon did, yet he could not find a real purpose for life. No joy had been withheld from him; no labor had been too much for his servants to perform for him; he had rejoiced in all his works, yet no deep joy remained within him when "the party was over". When he really assessed all that he had done, he concluded that all of it was vanity (empty) and vexation (a grasping after) of spirit. There was nothing under the sun that was really profitable to Solomon, and believe me he had tried it all. For all who have been "shopping at the world's markets" for real joy, let me save you some time by telling you to read about the man who has tried it all and found it of no real value!

April is Autism Awareness Month!!

There is no one type of autism, but many.

Autism, or autism spectrum disorder (ASD), refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication. According to the Centers for Disease Control, autism affects an estimated 1 in 59 children in the United States today.

We know that there is not one autism but many subtypes, most influenced by a combination of genetic and environmental factors. Because autism is a spectrum disorder, each person with autism has a distinct set of strengths and challenges. The ways in which people with autism learn, think and problem-solve can range from highly skilled to severely challenged. Some people with ASD may require significant support in their daily lives, while others may need less support and, in some cases, live entirely independently.

Several factors may influence the development of autism, and it is often accompanied by sensory sensitivities and medi-

cal issues such as gastrointestinal (GI) disorders, seizures or sleep disorders, as well as mental health challenges such as anxiety, depression and attention issues.

Indicators of autism usually appear by age 2 or 3. Some associated development delays can appear even earlier, and often, it can be diagnosed as early as 18 months. Research shows that early intervention leads to positive outcomes later in life for people with autism.

* In 2013, the American Psychiatric Association merged four distinct autism diagnoses into one umbrella diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder (ASD). They included autistic disorder, childhood disintegrative disorder, pervasive developmental disorder-not otherwise specified (PDD-NOS) and Asperger syndrome.

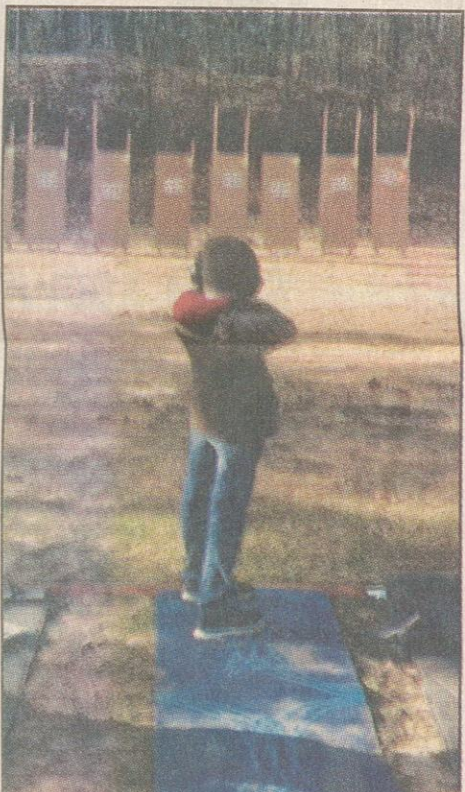
