Child Abuse Trial Underway in Tishomingo County

Lonnie L. Lee, of Iuka, is on trial by jury in Tishomingo County Circuit Court this week, charged with felony child abuse.

The alleged incident happened in March 2016 when a three-year-old female child was taken to North Mississippi Medical Center in Iuka for life-threatening injuries which occurred while the child was in the care of Lee.

The abuse appeared to be both physical and sexual in nature and affected the child's entire body; she also sustained a brain injury during the incident. The child's condition was deemed so severe that she had to be airlifted to Le Bonheur Children's Hospital where she was hospitalized for six weeks in addition to needing therapy after her release.

Several witnesses have testified in the case so far including law enforcement, an individual from child protective services, a doctor from Le

Bonheur, a long with family members and other medical professionals. The child's medical records and graphic photographs from the incident were also submitted and shown as evidence in this case.

Lee had originally reported to authorities that the child sustained the injuries due to being clumsy and falling from the back of a truck and from a ladder of a tree house. The evidence presented however seems very inconsistent with that claim.

At the time of press on Wednesday, May 1, 2019 the court proceedings were on day three of the trial and it is expected to wrap up soon.

Congratulations to Moon Pie Hudson. This pretty kitty is our Pet of the Week at Iuka Animal Clinic. Her owner is Heidi Hudson. Moon Pie is a very loving and playful cat. She loves to be outside and roll in the dirt. Her favorite activity is mouse hunting which she is very good at.

Moon Pie loves when you rub her chin and behind her ears. A friend wasn't able to keep her so that is how she became a part of the Hudson family 2 years ago. She came with the name Moon Pie and they kept it because she is so sweet.

Spring is in the air and so is love. Many animals are looking for mates this time of year, especially cats. Once a kitten reaches puberty, typically between 5 months and 9 months of age, he or she will be able to reproduce. Some cats mature as young as 3 1/2 months of age, usually after they reach 4 pounds in weight. A sexually mature kitten can have kittens herself in her first heat cycle. Pregnancy in cats lasts approximately 65 days, after which that nursing mom can immediately go into heat, even while nursing, and become pregnant again. As for male cats, they can impregnate countless numbers of females in heat. Theoretically, a cat can give birth to three litters of kittens per year, with an average of four kittens per litter, in an average lifetime of 15 years. This could result in up to 180 kittens in her lifetime. Assuming that her litters remain intact, and breed themselves, hundreds of thousands of kittens could result, contributing to the pet overpopulation problem. Even though all of these kittens won't likely survive, even a fraction of this number is way too many. The only way to stop overpopulation is to have your cat spayed or neutered. Longtime Tishomingo County Resident Turns 106 Years Old

Ms. Ruby Sandy Wilson, a resident of Tishomingo Manor Nursing Home in Iuka, turned 106 years old on February 5th. Ms. Wilson has resided there for nearly 14 years. "We're unsure if she's the oldest person in the county," says a family member, "but we're certain she's in the running!"

Her early life consisted of working on her uncle's farm while going to school and helping to care for family members. She met her husband, Sidney, who was a neighbor. They fell in love and were married on her birthday in 1931.

The children note that they can remember how she would walk them to church on Sundays (before cars). She loved having people from church over in the afternoons on Sunday for lunch and she especially loved entertaining and getting to know missionaries. "If she received money for any of her sewing, baby-sitting, for a birthday, anything... she would almost always send that money straight to a missionary."

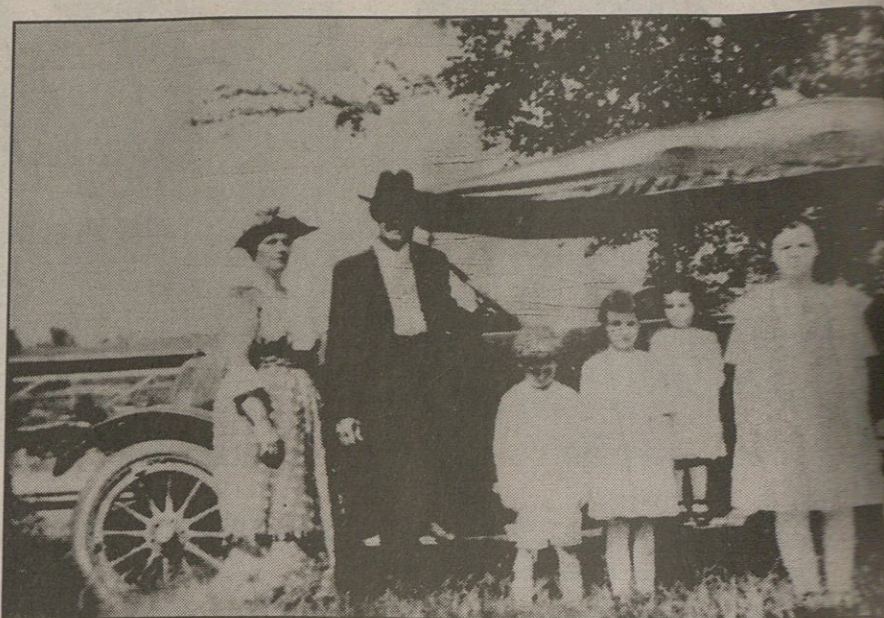
They also note that Ms. Wilson was an avid reader, mainly the Bible – which was her daily spiritual food. They recall their mother working very hard, though never outside the home, she worked hard at home. She never drove but faithfully attended church (last congregation before settling into nursing home was the Maud Church of Christ

where her father had helped plant the seeds many years before). "Growing up, we remember that she would trade eggs with the local peddler who came once a week. Before refrigerators, there were iceboxes but to keep the milk cold, she would lower it in the well in a bucket. Things were very different at that time, but we never felt like we were without", note Faye and Cora.

"We all wish she could speak to us now like she used to. She would share stories about growing up, going through the depression and the importance of loving the Lord. That was something she insisted on and she lived it daily much like the woman of Proverbs 31," notes a grandchild. "Her vocabulary was always very sharp. She could quote the scripture readily and reverently. She was always a bit quiet but witty and charming."

Ms. Wilson has 2 living children (Faye and Cora), 2 living sons-in-law (Steve Taylor & Quitman Wiginton), 9 grandchildren (Mitch Parrish, Wanda Wilson, Phyliss Russell, Warren Taylor, Tina Robinson, Mark Taylor, Melissa Watson, Heather Palmer & Crystal Nunley), 11 Great- Grandchildren and 2 Great-Great Grandchildren.

The family appreciates all the care she has been given for the past 17 years while in nursing homes.

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 12)

We are looking at the Book of Ecclesiastes written by King Solomon, and seeking to draw lessons on how to live life on earth before we leave for eternity. This little book has twelve chapters that are packed with wisdom concerning earthly life. It is not a book about heaven, or necessarily how to get there, rather it is a book about how to live on earth. Ecclesiastes 2:24-26 says, "There is nothing better for a man, than that he should eat and drink, and that he should make his soul enjoy good in his labour. This also I saw, that it was from the hand of God. For who can eat, or who else can hasten hereunto more than I? For God giveth to a man that is good in His sight wisdom, and knowledge, and joy: but to the sinner He giveth travail, to gather and to heap up, that he may give to him that is good before God. This also is vanity and vexation of spirit." There are situations in life that may seem to contradict what Solomon has said in these verses, but if we could see life from God's viewpoint,

as Solomon saw it here, we would be in agreement with the wise king!

In our verses above we see Solomon speaking about the best thing man can do in life, so we need to perk up our ears and listen, for all of us should be interested in this. The problem is that most people want good things in life, but they go down the wrong avenues to find them. The wise king said that nothing is better than to eat, drink and enjoy the good things of life. Notice that the word "labor" is always connected with these "good things", for God never expects men to go through life as "freeloaders", for since the fall of Adam man has needed to work for his upkeep. The good that Solomon said a man should enjoy is that which comes through his labor. His conclusion

was that such good things, when earned, were from the hand of God, so we can conclude that God is not against good things and enjoyable things, as long as we do not indulge in things that are sinful. Solomon asked the question as to whether or not anyone could eat or hasten to the enjoyable things of life more than he. This king had the financial means to enjoy much more than most of us, and he said that the matter of enjoying good things was from God's hand. Then he said that the travail of sinners was also from the hand of God, for God does not desire to make those who are sinning against Him enjoy life. More than that, God often takes what sinners have gained and gives it to those who please God. Then our writer concludes

that the sinner faces emptiness and weariness of his spirit, because whatever he gains does not really satisfy the deep hunger of his heart.

Now we come to Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, which has often been misunderstood by many people. I will give only verses 1-2 here: "To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted." Every "time and season" mentioned here may not necessarily be the time or season that God has chosen, for men do have ways of changing what God desires for what they desire. Some people misuse these verses to say, "Well it was just the right season for this to happen, or it was just his time to die." I will cover this in detail in the next article; I do not have enough space here.

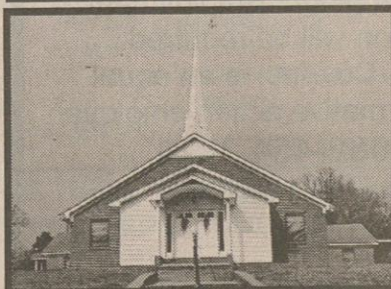

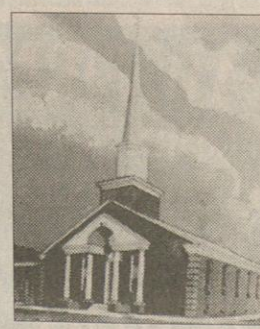

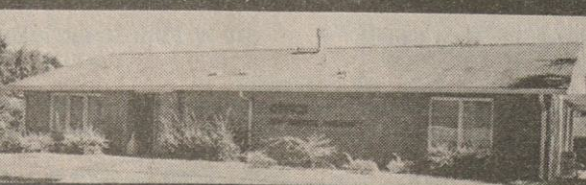

Controlling Fire Ants

Fire ant mounds are eye sores. However, looking at one isn't nearly as painful as stepping in one. Fire ants, with their copper-brown head and body with a darker abdomen, came into Mobile, Alabama, on a South American cargo ship in the early 1900s. They are now all across the southern part of the United States and have even moved into parts of California.

A typical fire ant colony has large mounds in open areas and feeds mostly on young plants and seeds. They often attack small animals, including pets and livestock, and can kill them.

Moisture is essential to fire ant survival. Fire ants often nest near river banks, pond edges, watered lawns and highway edges. When the weather is hot and dry, they burrow deep into the soil to find moisture and cooler temperatures. When it's cold, they burrow down to stay warm. But in warm, damp weather (spring or fall), fire ants are most likely to be active, foraging near the soil surface and building mounds.

Mounds can be up to 18 inches high. The nests can also be formed in rotting logs, around stumps and trees and in or under buildings. The ants guard the nests and fiercely attack intruders. Even the lightest touch brings them out in a fury.

If you have a lot of ground to cover, control can be time consuming and expensive. Fire ant baits are a good, cost effective method of control if you have few mounds. Baits are not to be confused with granular forms of insecticides. They work much slower than granules. Bait is carried back to the colony and fed to other ants, including the queen and it affects her reproductive ability. Eventually the colony dies because no new ants are born to replenish the population. Baits don't last a long time so it is best if the ants feed on them within a day. Late spring, or immediately after a rain, works best for bait.

If the infestation is larger, broadcast the bait and time the application for when the ants are out foraging for food. Try to avoid disturbing the mounds because the ants will flee back to protect the queen and they will usually move the colony rather than carry the bait back to the nest.

One common remedy used to get rid of mounds is a pot of boiling water. It is most effective when used right after a rainfall. At that time, a lot of the ants are near the surface and vulnerable to the scalding water. However, there are a couple of drawbacks to this method. Unless you kill the queen, the ants will just move to another part of your yard and construct another mound. Secondly, you may end up with a big brown spot on your lawn because the boiling water could kill the grass. Be very careful if you decide to use this method.

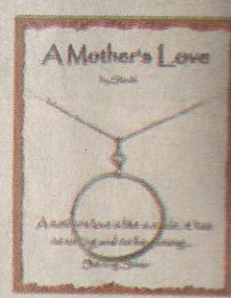

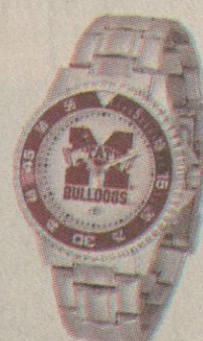

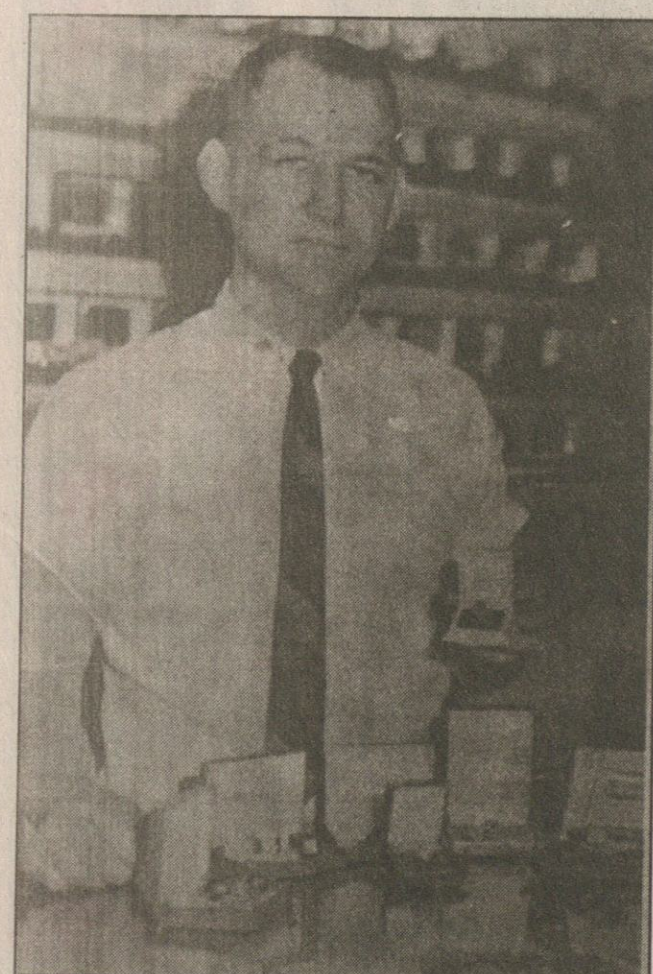

Iuka Native Announced as Finalist for 2019 Extraordinary Healer Award

Angela Guice Hammack, a cancer nurse at Jackson Oncology, is one of three nominees for the annual "CURE" magazine's 2019 Extraordinary Healer Award.

Finalists were announced earlier this month in Anaheim, California. The award recognizes oncology nurses "who have gone above and beyond for cancer patients." The winner will be announced in May.

Hammack, a full-time cancer nurse since 2004, began running competitively in 2007 to raise money for various cancer charities. A she ran track in high school, Hammack has completed 34 marathons in 11 states — plus Ireland — and two 100-mile races. She's also run countless 5K, 10K and half-marathon events and two Warrior Dashes.

She is a graduate of Iuka High School and the daughter of Milton and Sandra Guice of Iuka.

She has helped raise more than \$100,000, which is amazing when you consider she's a runner who suffers from asthma.

"I'm honored to be nominated for the award," Hammack said. "It's special because it makes me realize that maybe I have made a difference in some people's lives. I hope so. I never got into running for awards or publicity. I've always wanted to help cancer patients, and particularly blood cancer patients because it attacks people across the board. It doesn't choose a gender, age or race."

"I've always said that I'm just one person doing very small things. I hope

to keep doing this as long as possible."

In a USA Today story in 2017, Hammack said she can feel her patients running with her.

"I know that might sound far out to some people," Hammack said in the article, "but a lot of my patients that I've grown to know and love who eventually died from cancer ... it's like they're right alongside me every step I take."

She also told USA Today that she "gains determination" from her patients.

"Seeing patients come into the clinic, continuing to fight when there seems to be little hope left ... I push myself to try and help make a difference so maybe others won't have to go through that," she said.

She is the Program Chair for the Central Mississippi chapter of ONS. She educates oncology nurses and all clinical support staff and periodically works weekends at the Elvis Presley Memorial Trauma Center in Memphis.

In her spare time, Hammack volunteers for the Cancer League of Jackson and as well as many fund-raising events.

Also nominated for the award are Barbara Bittner of New Smyrna Beach, Florida and Caitlin Cohen of Chicago.

"All three of these finalists have demonstrated an incredible passion for caring for cancer patients. They have gone above and beyond what is asked of them, and we are honored to recognize them for their contributions," said Michael J. Hennessy Jr., president of MJH Associates, parent company of CURE Media Group.

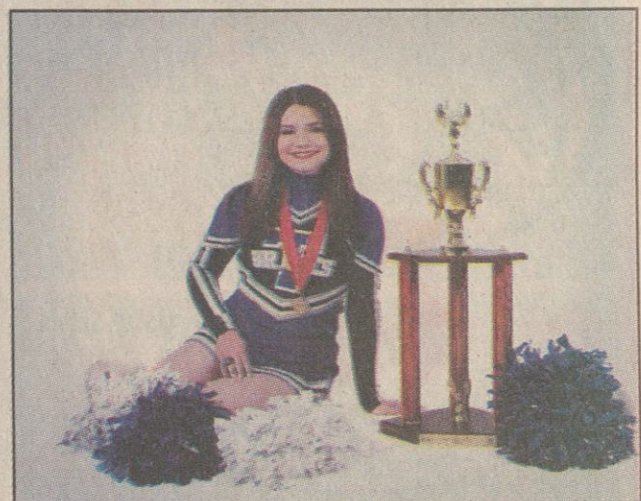
hour and 15 minutes. We will also recognize our seniors, so we will finish up around 7:30.

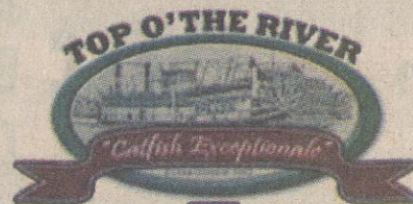

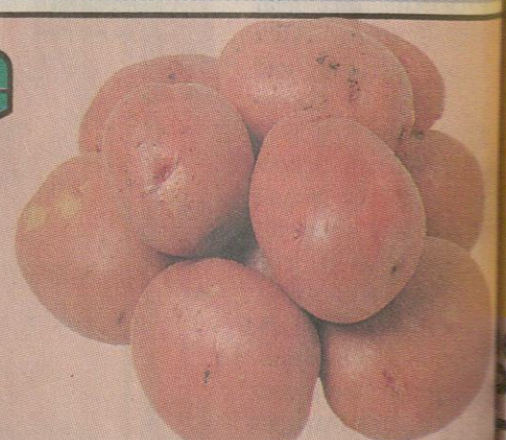
