The statue was funded by Friends of the Park and a matching grant from the Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area Alliance. The event included the official unveiling of the CCC statue with a presentation and ribbon cutting. A special thanks goes out to Tim Burton, Burton Builders; Kenneth Cox, Charles Poole Stone Contractors; North Mississippi Hills National Heritage Area Alliance; Corinth Rotary Club; Corinth Kiwanis Club; and the Iuka Rotary Club for making the CCC Worker Statue Possible.

This monument to the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) workers stands near the swimming pool and iconic Swinging Bridge at Tishomingo State Park. The CCC was part of

the 1930s, ment from all

region participated in this public works program that was modeled on the military. They were furnished room and board, and learned valuable trade skills working on infrastructure ects like Tishomingo State Park that helped the country rebound from The Great Depression. The iconic Swinging Bridge and the other structures in the Park were built in the late 1930s by the men of CCC Company 3497 and some stayed in the Tishomingo area, becoming part of the local community. The bridge was designed by civil engineer Clifford G. Worsham and built by the CCC men. Total cost for the 186-foot-long suspension bridge over Bear Creek was \$238, plus donated and scav-

enged materials.

### **Tishomingo County** School District Addresses the Safety of Students

Last week, rumors of a possible incident at Tishomingo County High School circulated among parents and students concerning a student being arrested for suspicious actions. While the Tishomingo County School District did not clarify the nature of the incident that may have occurred, they did release this statement on the mat-

The Tishomingo County School District has had inquiries related to increased police presence at Tishomingo County High School Friday of last week. "We had Facebook rumors and some texts associated with concerns dealing with a possible security situation that arose earlier in the week. As always, we investigate rumors, student statements, and other significant issues that are associated with student and school safety. We take that very seriously in our district as evidenced by our financial investment in seven (7) certified school resource officers in our district. We placed extra security at TCHS to give an added sense of safety for parents concerned about Facebook posts and other rumors. We also use these times to coordinate with our local officials, such as the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, to strengthen our crisis management plans any time we can," stated Superintendent Christie Holly. "It's at the end of the year, and many of our students are exempt from

exams and not in school. We have students on field trips or at ceremony practices. Seniors are not on campus at this time due to graduation and the completion of their requirements. This gives the misperception that students are missing school for other reasons, when in reality, it just happens to be the time of year for those types of absences." Mrs. Holly stated that none of the schools in the district were ever on lockdown or faced a significant threat, "During the course of our investigation, we interviewed students who were connected to these possible rumors as well as students who may have heard information about the rumors. We followed our protocol for such investigations. We proceeded with student discipline when we felt necessary with our investigation. Of course, those are matters that cannot be discussed. We always encourage our students, parents, community, and faculty to report any suspicious statements or rumors to administration, our school resource officers, or local authorities so we can thoroughly investigate any concerns. Nothing is more important to us in this district than the safety of our children. I appreciate the support we get from the community for our schools and encourage them to reach out to us with concerns about social media posts instead of taking them at face value."

### Stop for School Buses!!

Recently one local bus driver in Tishomingo County reported an increased number of individuals passing the school bus while it was stopped to allow children to enter the bus. Here is what she had to say.

"In the last two weeks, I have had three people to pass my bus while stopped at a school loading students. The stop sign was out and lights flashing all three times! One lady passed on the right side and when yelled at, stopped briefly and said the stop sign is on the other side!! Really?? Y'all, people are really this careless. If you aren't educated, or your children who drive aren't educated about stopping for buses loading and unloading students, please take the time to educate yourself!! I transport precious gifts from above and I would hate for their families to suffer such a loss. You, on the

This is a dangerous issue that could be fatal to children in our area. Fortunately this is a totally preventable problem. If you come to a stopped school bus while driving be aware and cautious. If you see lights flashing and the stop sign showing, come to a complete stop well in advance of reaching the bus to insure the safety of students getting on and off the bus.

Although school is out for the summer, there are still buses running with special education students on board. Be mindful of any bus you meet on the road, even in the summer.

ment, to all citizens of Tishomingo County who are over the age of 60, live alone, and are homebound or medically disabled on a permanent or longterm basis, regardless of age. It can be used for short periods of

time or long term. The automated system will call subscribers every morning between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m., asking, "Good morning - Are you OK today?" A response lets the system know that follow-up action doesn't need to be taken. But if there is no answer or the telephone line is busy after three calls, one of our officers will be notified and sent to your home to check on you. If you are on vacation or have to leave your home for an extended period of time, contact the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office and advise them so we can stop

the computer from calling you. When you come home simply call back and we will resume

To join this program eligible participants are required to sign up, providing basic personal information and a signed liability waive, all information provided by the participant is kept confidential and secure at the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office.
