## Mississippi Tobacco Free Coalition (MTFC) of Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties recognized as tops in the State

The Mississippi Tobacco Free Coalition (MTFC) of Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties recently was awarded "Coalition of the Year" for 2018-19 by the Office of Tobacco Control, Mississippi State Department of Health in Jackson. The honor and plaque was presented to Program Director Jennifer Palmer for meeting the scope of work in every area, as well as entering all the data in the evaluation database by the deadline each and every month.

The state grant that funds this Coalition is administered by Aiming for Healthy Families, a non-profit organization led by Executive Director Evelyn Gowen.

"With the volume of work to be done, we are so blessed to have Jennifer Palmer, who goes above and beyond her du-

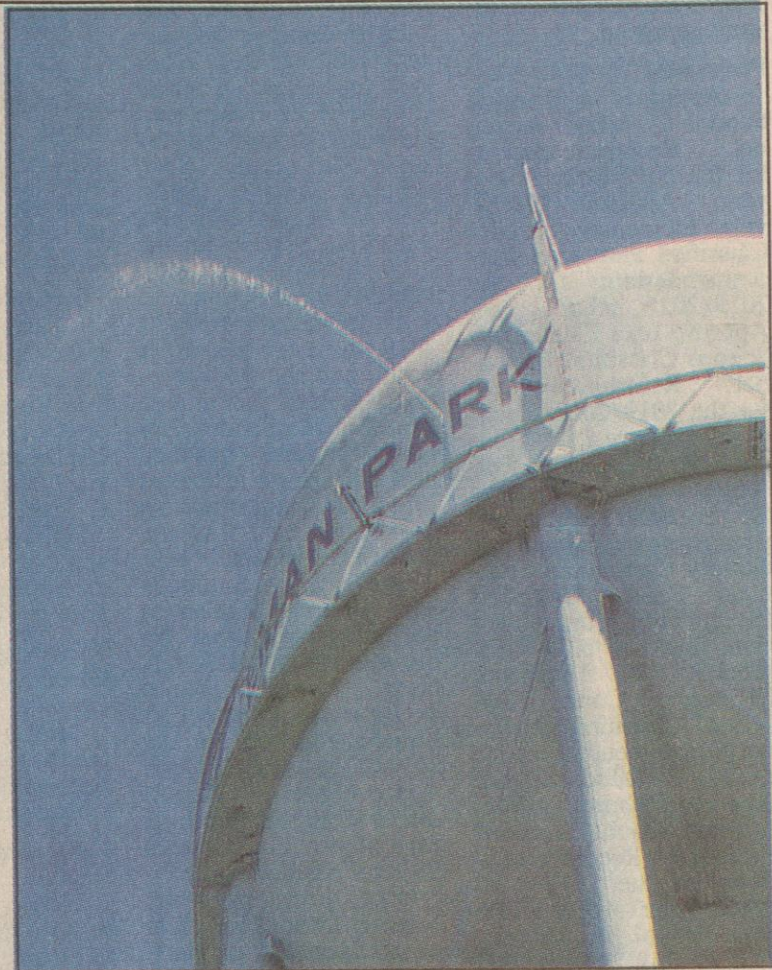
ties to do the excellent work that she does," Gowen said. "She depends on her coalition and they come through for her. The MTFC work could not be done effectively without their involvement".

In addition to developing a working volunteer community coalition who helps guide the work, the program director develops a leadership committee to conduct regularly scheduled coalition meetings and assist with the programmatic activities. The MTFC serves two counties and must organize six RAT (Resist All Tobacco) teams per county for K-6th graders, as well as six teams per county for 7-12th grade youth, and these teams have to be in-school teams and out-of-school teams who have to complete tobacco activities each month.

The program director conducts awareness presentations, develops communication activities, advocacy and policy work in comprehensive smoke-free air policies, ordinance work in the communities, conducts multi-unit housing presentations, Youth Advocacy Council trainings, and implements cessation activities.

The MTFC of Prentiss and Tishomingo is the epitome of collaboration.

"I have never seen such cohesiveness and unity when I attend the meetings," Gowen said. "The Coalition members are willing to set up health fairs, purchase incentives, and do anything Jennifer asks them to. We are looking forward to continuing the meaningful work for more healthy communities."



## Local Water Tank Damaged by Gunshot

Short Coleman Park Water Association, Inc. is asking for the public's help in identifying individuals who may have been involved in the shooting of one of their water tanks. The incident was reported around Monday, May 20th, the tank in question is located on Colman Park Road. This is a 500,000-gallon water storage tank that would

cost around \$2 million to replace. Not only was this a major inconvenience to the community of our water association, but tampering with or vandalizing water property is also a very serious crime. ## Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office is Now NIBRS Certified

Tishomingo County Sheriff John Daugherty is pleased to announce that his agency is officially certified by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, through the NIBRS (National Incident-Based Reporting System) program. This process was achieved by months of work between this agency and Tiger Correctional Software, the services that this agency uses for not only maintaining the booking records of the inmates but also the incident reports filed by the deputy's and case management records that are filed by investigators.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office is now one of the few agencies in the state of Mississippi to become NIBRS certified.

The National Incident-Based Reporting System, will be the mandatory data standard for the FBI beginning January 2021, but they are urging facilities to begin the transition now. The Federal Bureau of Investigation Director Chris Wray stated that NIBRS "...provides a more comprehensive view of crime data and allows law enforcement agencies to report detailed

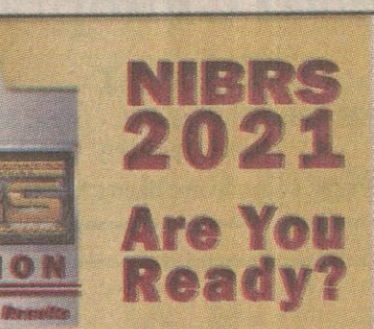
offense and arrest records."

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office became NIBRS certified using Tiger Correctional Services' jail management software. Tiger Correctional Services worked closely with the FBI while developing their reporting software and created a tool to meet the stringent requirements for NIBRS certification.

Certification requirements include six consecutive months of data with an error rate of less than four percent and passing an extensive data quality review conducted by the FBI.

Tiger Correctional Services also served as liaison between Tishomingo Sheriff's Office and the FBI during the certification process.

"Tiger works hand in hand with our customer and the FBI during the certification process to ensure our clients meet all requirements as efficiently as pos-



sible," said Tiger Correctional Services Technology Director Keith Reed. "We've spent several years developing this piece of software to deliver accurate and reliable results so our customers can achieve their NIBRS certification."

"I'm extremely proud of this accomplishment for our agency and our county" said Sheriff Daugherty. "We are ahead of the curve of the mandate to be certified and this will help in the future of any possible grant funding since those grants are getting harder to obtain due to federal budget restraints. Again, this is a major, major accomplishment to achieve at this level. I want to thank our partners at Tiger and our team for their hard work on this."

# Iuka Man Arrested For Stealing SUV

On May 19th Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputies took a report of a stolen Chevrolet Tahoe from a business around the area of CR 995. The alleged Suspect(s) unhooked a trailer that was attached to the Tahoe.

The following day, an off-duty Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) Probation Officer, saw the alleged suspect, Brandon Stacy in the stolen vehicle in Alcorn County. The probation officer ran the vehicle tag on the Tahoe, it was confirmed that the vehicle was stolen from Tishomingo County. The officer began following Stacy but lost sight of him. The officer informed both Alcorn and Tishomingo County authorities of this information, and also gave positive

identification of the alleged suspect. Stacy was later apprehended at the Magnolia Hotel in Corinth by both Mississippi Department of Corrections and Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies. The alleged suspect then transported to Tishomingo County Jail. Brandon Stacy, 26-year-old, white, of Iuka, Mississippi, was officially charged with felony taking of a vehicle. Stacy's bond set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court is \$2,500. Stacy may face further charges as the investigation continues.

Among those recognized as a Spring 2019 President's Scholar is James Gattis of Tishomingo.

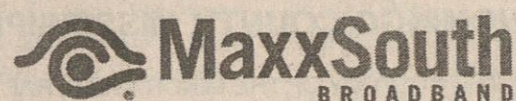

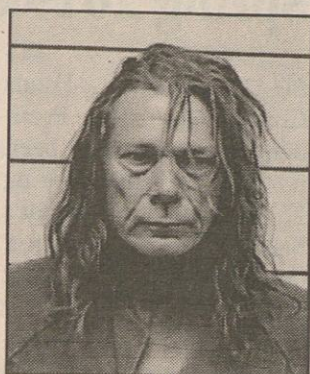

## United Daughters of the Confederacy Met at Iuka Library

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone Chapter 394 met May 21st, 11 am at the Iuka Public Library. There were four present, Gail Smith, Jean Works, Vicky Durham and Sharon Hairrell. We completed the Salutes to the United States, State and Confederate flag and the UDC rituals. Sharon Hairrell read the minutes, there was no old business, new business. We were proud that our Memorial Service for Ms. Eunellanner Handy, went well, also our Confederate Memorial Services. Sharon Hairrell stated that she had mailed out four cards for the month of May. Vicky Durham gave the treasurer report and all was approved, Vicky gave our Co-Registrar's Gail Smith and Jean Works names of two ladies that may be interested in joining.

Sharon Hairrell presented the program "David Owen Dodd, boy Confederate Hero".



David Owen Dodd (1846-1864)

During the Civil War, seventeen-year-old David Owen Dodd of Little Rock (Pulaski County) was hanged as a spy by the Union army. He has been called the "boy hero of Arkansas" as well as a boy martyr of the Confederacy.

David Owen Dodd was born on November 10, 1846, in Lavaca County, Texas, to Lydia Schols Owen Dodd and the merchant Andrew Marion Dodd; he had two sisters, Leonora and Senhora. They moved to Little Rock to be closer to Senhora's school, and young Dodd attended St. John's College, located on the grounds of present-day MacArthur Park. After less than a year, Dodd left St. John's when he became ill with malaria, but he hoped to return. Meanwhile, he worked as a clerk and learned Morse code at the telegraph office.

When the Union army occupied the city in 1863, the Dodd family evacuated south to Camden (Ouachita County), be-

hind Confederate lines. On December 24, 1863, Dodd's father sent him to Little Rock on business, thinking he would be safe since he was underage for the army. Confederate General James F. Fagan issued the boy's pass and supposedly said, in what may or may not have been a joke, that he would expect a full report upon Dodd's return.

Dodd rode a mule to Little Rock, carrying a birth certificate showing he was underage along with his pass. He attended holiday parties, where he met the teenage Mary Dodge, described by one of her descendants as an "ardent little Rebel." Union officers were quartered in the Dodge home, which Dodd was invited to visit.

Dodd left Little Rock on December 29. Union sentries took his pass, as he did not expect to return. After spending the night with his uncle Washington Dodd southwest of Little Rock, Dodd traveled through the woods and found himself back behind Union lines.

He was stopped in what is now west Little Rock, near Ten Mile House on Stagecoach Road, and discovered to be without a pass. When he was asked for identification, Dodd showed his small leather notebook, where Union soldiers found not only his birth certificate but also a page with dots and dashes. A Union officer had worked for the telegraph office and easily read the Morse code message, which contained exact information about Union troop strength in Little Rock.

Dodd was arrested, convicted by a court-martial of being a spy, and sentenced to execution by hanging. He was taken to the Little Rock Arsenal, where, according to the legend that has built up around the event, Union General Frederick Steele repeatedly offered to release Dodd in exchange for the name of his informant, to which Dodd is said to have replied, "I can give my life for my country but I cannot betray a friend." However, Dodd's sister, Senhora Dodd Booth, claimed in later years that her brother likely acted alone, "inspired only by the hope of serving his country."

THERE are more monuments to David O. Dodd in Arkansas than to

any other of its war heroes, including Gen. Douglas MacArthur. A monument marks the spot of Dodd's hanging, now in the corner of the parking lot of the University of Arkansas at Little Rock's School of Law. Dodd's grave is marked by an eight-foot marble monument, engraved "Here lies the remains of David O. Dodd. Born in Lavaca County, Texas, Nov. 10, 1846, died Jan. 8, 1864." Nearby is a marble scroll with the words "Boy Martyr of the Confederacy." David O. Dodd Elementary School in southwest Little Rock is located on land that was once a part of Washington Dodd's farm. A stone marker on school grounds, believed to be the place where he was captured, was erected by the David O. Dodd Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, Pine Bluff, Arkansas, and is dedicated to "Arkansas' Boy Hero of the War Between the States."

In 1908 the Arkansas Division of the United Daughters of the Confederacy started raising funds for a stained-glass window in Dodd's honor. The window was made by the Charles F. Hogeman Co. in New York City and depicts Dodd as a Southern saint and martyr with curly blond hair, even though the only known photograph of him shows him with straight black hair. The David O. Dodd window was unveiled at the Museum of the Confederacy in Richmond, Virginia, on November 7, 1911, where it was displayed for several years. In 1988 it was found in storage and moved back to Arkansas. The window debuted at the Arkansas Museum of Science and Industry in January 1990, and was returned to Richmond in 1998. In January 2004 the Museum of the Confederacy again loaned the Dodd window to Arkansas to commemorate the 140th anniversary of Dodd's trial at the renamed MacArthur Museum of Arkansas Military History (formerly the Little Rock Arsenal).

Each January the Sons of Confederate Veterans honor Dodd in a ceremony at his gravesite. The organization awarded their 22nd Confederate Medal of Honor, created in 1977, to Dodd in 1984.

# Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 16)

King Solomon, writing under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, tells us much about how to live life in this present world. Often we are concerned about life in the next world, and rightly so, but we must also be concerned about life in the present world. Ecclesiastes 3: 9-10 says, "What profit hath he that worketh in that wherein he laboureth? I have seen the travail, which God hath given to the sons of men to be exercised in it."

The question and the answer that Solomon gives to the world of Bible readers is quite interesting and much needed! Notice that he asks the question concerning what profit man gains from his labors. Most people would likely say, "Oh man gains much profit from his labors, for he can buy nice houses, cars, boats and other things to enhance his 'joy' while on earth." May I ask whether or not "things" really enhance joy? Yes, it is good, and even necessary, for us to work and earn our livelihood, but there

are many who cannot do this because of some physical malady, so what do they do? It is right for the nation and the rest of us to help those who are helpless, yet many have made themselves helpless by wrong actions. It is not wise to "throw money" at bad problems if that money only makes the problems worse. Solomon asks what profit man has of his earthly labor, then he gives a partial answer to our dilemma. He says that God also gives travail (meaning employment in our context) to men to be exercised (meaning to abase or humble) therewith. So, God has given labor to humble us, yet most people never seem to realize this truth. There is no room for pride in the lives of human beings, although we seen it bursting out in every facet of labor

or play.

Ecclesiastes 3:11 says, "He hath made every thing beautiful in His time: also He hath set the world in their heart, so that no man can find out the work that God maketh from the beginning to the end." This verse has more truth in it than most people realize. First we see that God has made everything beautiful for its time, meaning that the creation of God in its original state was more beautiful than anything that men of our day have ever seen. Second, we see that God has set "eternity" in the hearts of men. The word "world" is not the usual word for the world, but the word that means: eternity. The same Hebrew word is translated "eternal" in Isaiah 60:15. So the gist of the meaning is that God has set eter-

nal longings in the hearts of men, even to the point of their searching out as much as they can about the future. Then we hear Solomon saying that no man can really "find out the work that God maketh from the beginning to the end." This means that man cannot exhaust the knowledge that God has displayed in the things that He has created. I do not think it is wrong for men to search after the things of God in examining what He has made, but none will ever know it completely as God does. Now Solomon draws the conclusion in Ecclesiastes 3:12: "I know that there is no good in them, but for a man to rejoice, and to do good in his life." He is saying that better than seeking to know all about what God has made in the universe, men should seek to rejoice in Who God is and what He has made, so that he learns to do good all the days of his life, because he has placed his faith in God the Creator of all things! Verse 13 says that it is a gift from God for man to enjoy the fruits of his labor.

Participating law enforcement agencies will be taking a no-excuses approach to seat belt law enforcement, writing citations day and night. To help

prevent crashes, we need to up enforcement crack down on who don't wear seat belts.

The aim of It or Ticket is — to reduce the number of preventable and injuries that when unbelted drivers passengers are involved in traffic crashes.

During the Memorial Day holiday, about 100 law enforcement agencies nationwide will be on the roads from May through June 2 to remind drivers and passengers to buckle their seat belts. The annual Click It or Ticket campaign aims at encouraging seat belt use to keep travelers safe as they drive to their summer destinations.

According to NHTSA, 10,076 people were killed in passenger vehicle crashes in 2017, weren't buckled. Fifty percent of those fatalities happened at night (6 p.m.-5:59 a.m.). Law enforcement will be taking a no-excuses approach to seat belt law enforcement during the Click It or Ticket campaign, writing citations day and night.

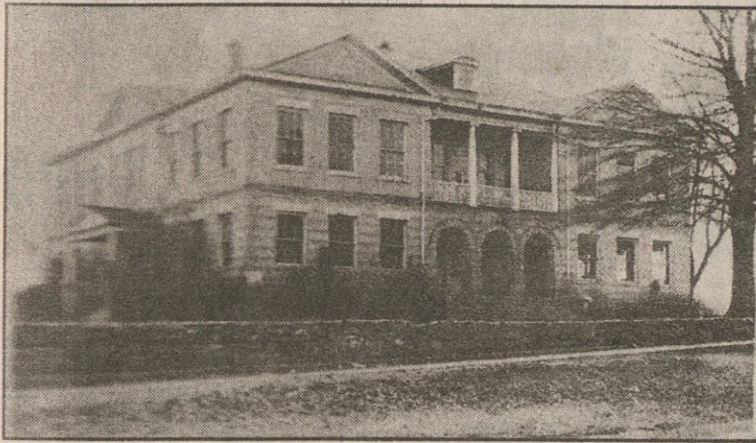
# Charlotte's Attic

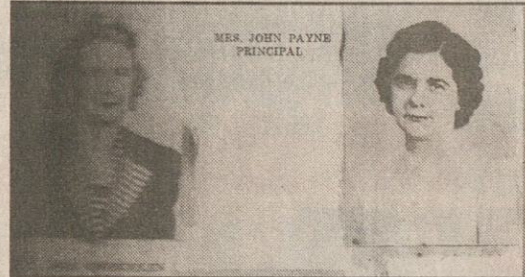
