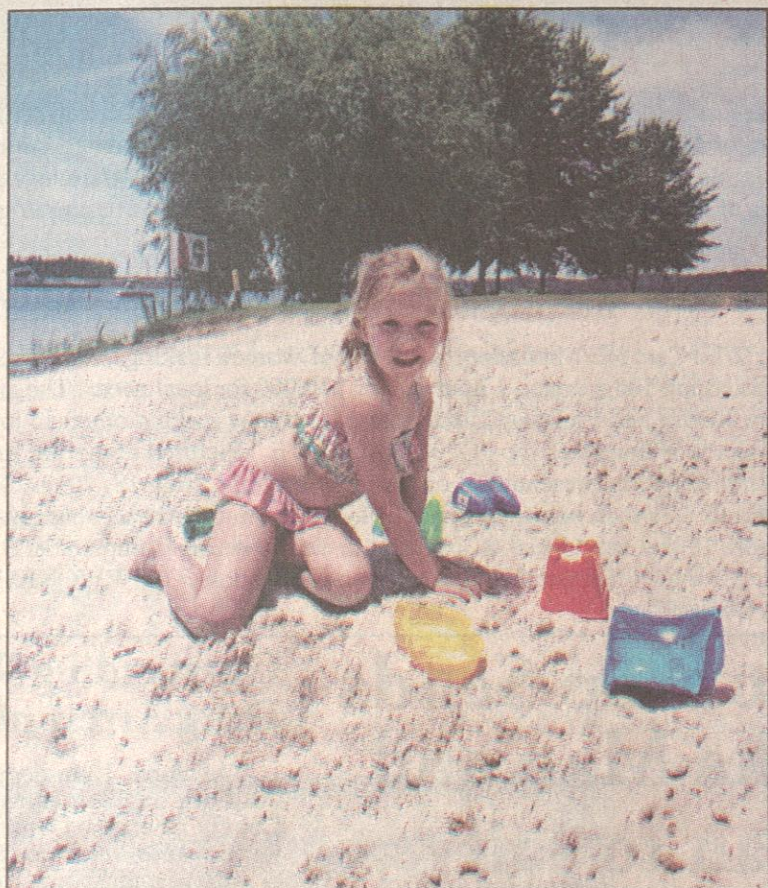
## SUMMER FUN

## MDEQ Awards Solid Waste Assistance Grant to Tishomingo County

(Jackson, Miss.) -- The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) awarded the Tishomingo County a solid waste assistance grant of \$14,391 that will be used by the county for an unauthorized dumpsite cleanup program.

"The Solid Waste Assistance Grants support a variety of useful solid waste management activities for cities and counties, and this grant will assist Simpson County's efforts in improving their management of solid waste," said Gary Rikard, MDEQ Executive Director.

Cities and counties may apply for Solid Waste Assistance

Grants through the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality. These grants are used by local communities for programs to prevent and clean up unauthorized dumps; to aid in hiring local solid waste enforcement officers; for public education efforts on solid waste disposal and recycling; and to establish programs for the collection of white goods, bulky wastes and recyclables.

## Iuka Man Charged with Possession and Failure to Register as Sex Offender

On June 18th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies went to a residence on County Road 196 in reference to individuals having continuous drug activities reported along with outstanding warrants.

When the Deputies arrived and knocked on the door and several people ran through the house. One individual was captured as they were running out the back door; they had an outstanding warrant for their arrest from the City of Iuka.

Another individual, John David Sparks, was apprehended and found to be in possession of some alleged methamphetamine; more alleged methamphetamine was later found hidden under the floor in the bedroom.

An ambulance was dispatched to the location and transported an individual who had fallen through the floor dur-

ing the officer's arrival to the local hospital.

Sparks was arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

John David Sparks, 40-year-old, white male, of Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). It was discovered that Sparks is also a registered sex offender and Sparks failed to provide his new address to local and state authorities. Sparks was then charged with failure to register - sex offender. Sparks remains in the custody of the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting bond to be set both charges.

Airmen who complete basic training also earn four credits toward

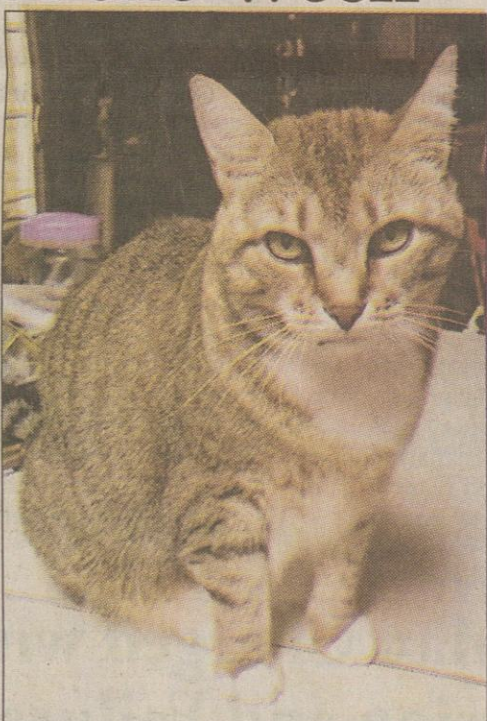
an associate in applied science degree through the Community College of the Air Force.

Cats are considered senior at the age of 7 years. One of the blessings of cats is that age seems to creep up on them gently, so much so that it may be difficult for us to notice that they really are getting older and have developed some of the common health problems of old age. Though some conditions are in-

evitable with advancing age, there are ways that you and your veterinarian can work together to help your cat stay more comfortable and contented for as long as possible. One common sign of aging is arthritis. If your cat no longer wants to go up or down stairs or jump on or off furniture, has difficulty grooming himself, urinates outside of litter box, because it's difficult for him to climb inside, or seems stiff after standing up, arthritis may be the reason. ## Traffic Stop Sends an Iuka Man and Woman to Jail

On June 17th deputies from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department conducted a traffic stop on County Road 200 in the Iuka area for running a stop sign. Albert Powell and Amanda Smith Hare were arrested during the stop for possession.

During the stop, it was determined that the driver, Albert Powell had a warrant for their arrest from the Iuka Police Department. The passenger, Amanda Smith Hare had an open container of alcohol and both Powell and Hare were immediately arrested, placed in separate patrol vehicles and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

While in route to the jail, Powell attempted to hide some alleged methamphetamine in the deputy's patrol vehicle and was caught in the act.

Once at the jail, Hare attempted to hide drugs after she entered the jail and a female corrections officer retrieved two bags of alleged methamphetamine from Hare during a search of her person.

Albert Powell, 49-year-old, black male, of Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony tampering with evidence and the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Powell remains in the custody of the Tishomingo County Jail where he awaits his bond to be set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court.

## Outstanding Warrant Leads to Drug Arrest of Corinth Man

On June 12th deputies from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department were conducting a safety checkpoint on County Road 944 in the Burnsville area. Jared Weber was arrested for possession and a warrant.

A vehicle approached the checkpoint and the deputies discovered that the driver of the vehicle, Weber had a warrant for his arrest from the Town of Burnsville.

The deputies immediately placed Weber under arrest and during a search

the deputies found an alleged methamphetamine on Weber. Weber was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Jared Weber, 29-year-old, white male, of Corinth, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and also has a misdemeanor FTA warrant for the Town of Burnsville. Weber remains in the custody of the Tishomingo County Jail awaiting his bond to be set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court.

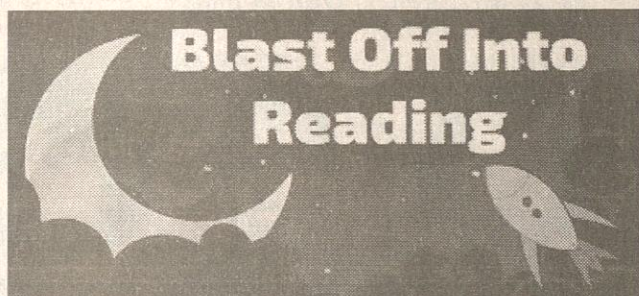

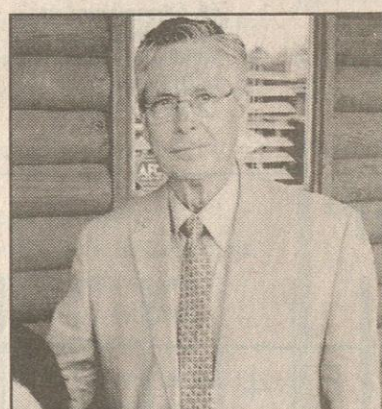

# Charlotte's Attic

## My Friend Gerald Grisham

I went to another funeral Sunday at Hubbard Salem Church. This one was very special to me in so many ways! Gerald and I attended school together across the road at the church/school, Gerald was in the 4<sup>th</sup> grade, I was in the 1<sup>st</sup> grade! The year was 1945, the last year for school in the church! Next year was a sad year for many of us. We rode a huge monster, yellow and black with metal rim seats. It was called a school bus! It was horrible, we were prisoners being hauled to a brick jail! They called the place Central Consolidated School! Gerald was the most timid, bashful person at this awful place. At Salem everything was wonderful, one metal water bucket with one long handled dipper.

That water was the best on the planet. It was so much better than drinking out of the long road tracks when it rained, or the bitter wood water out of stumps!

That 7 mile ride of the bus was awful for Gerald, Elmer and Thelma Murray, Jennie Osborn, and others who would wail and cry in the most awful way. I was enjoying some of this daily new life. But one thing I can't forget was a big bully named Jim Kirk. The bus would stop each day at a small, little store owned by Jim's parents. My Mom said I was born in that store building, that used to be a sharecrop house. We who were blessed with some money could buy drinks for a nickel and candy for one penny. One day I bought a chocolate

Milky Way bar, my favorite. That big bully smashed it in my mouth. I could talk ugly talk I had learned from big kids, so I let him have a few of my choice bad words, included a threat, that when I got big enough, I would whip his butt. Well, life went on for Gerald and the rest of us Hubbard Salem people.

As I said before, Gerald was the most timid and bashful person I have ever known. He always walked looking down at the ground. In 1986 he came to Amory to our country church, Faith Chapel. Bess and I built the church and were part of the elders. My two aunts, Mrs. Paul Osborn and Mrs. Ben Osborn came to visit. It was such a great day. Gerald preached to us and I was shocked, amazed, and in-

spired beyond measure. This man preaching with such a great anointing of the Holy Spirit is NOT the same Gerald Grisham I have known all my life.

The last week of Gerald's life was a challenge for him. His little ATV was stolen. Gerald was the most upset I ever saw him. I told him, Gerald, I will put a new switch on the scooter and get it running. But, it didn't happen. Gerald left this scooter and the rest of his earthly possessions behind. These things did not mean much to Gerald. Gerald Grisham was one of my best friends. He was the most Christ like person I have ever known.

# Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 19)

Ecclesiastes is one of the most interesting books I have ever read, yet we must understand that the very first chapter of the book lets us know that Solomon is writing about life on earth, or "life under the heavens", or "under the sun". So, eternity is not considered in this book, in any clear detail until we reach the last chapter, and even then eternity is seen only at a glimpse. Ecclesiastes 4:1-3 continues our story of "life under the sun", "So I returned and considered all the oppressions that are done under the sun: and behold the tears of such as were oppressed; and on the side of their oppressors there was

power; but they had no comforter. Wherefore I praised the dead which are already dead more than the living which are yet alive. Yea, better is he than both they, which hath not yet been, who hath not seen the evil work that is done under the sun." If Ecclesiastes were the only book of the Bible that we had concerning life on earth and death, we would get an incomplete picture of the value of earthly life.

Solomon considered the oppression that is done on earth and saw that the oppressed had no comforter, yet the oppressors had power to continue to increase their oppression, should they choose. Is all of life

a time of oppression? It certainly is not for many people, yet there are millions of people living today who live constantly under oppression, for they live under oppressive governments and with people who take advantage of them, because the governments of such countries allow it. Does life have some oppression for all of us? I would say that it does, yet many of us have good opportunities to get relief from oppression. I thank God that we do have some free-

dom left in our nation, and I recognize that most of us, or all of us at some time, have likely taken our freedom for granted. Since Solomon saw oppression without comfort or relief, he said that the person who has died is better off than the living, or that the person who has never been born is better off than those who have been born. His reason for saying this was that he had seen the oppression of many people, yet he had not seen any relief for them.

Ecclesiastes 4:4 continues with Solomon's thoughts on the "negative side" of earthly life: "Again, I considered all travail, and every right work, that for this a man is envied of his neighbour. This is also vanity and vexation of spirit." Now we see that our writer considers those who work hard to earn an honest living, and yet they are envied of those who do not. Envy is a "green-eyed monster", for it breaks apart friendships and relationships, yet many continue to envy those who are prospering more than they. The word "vanity" means: emptiness, as it is used in Ecclesiastes, so Solomon has said that life

is empty for those who are envious of those around them. We are not looking at heaven here, rather we are looking at the things around us on earth. Many things have changed since the time of Adam, so many people continue to envy those who seem to be doing better than they. It is worth noting that God does not necessarily give all people the same things or opportunities. The important thing is that we use what we have for His glory.

## World War II Veteran, Zeth Hill, Honored with Artifact Display at Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum

The Second World War was a war of epic and global proportions that changed the world. Some of the most spellbinding stories of the war came from the everyday men and women who found the strength and courage to accomplish the extraordinary. The Old Courthouse Museum in Iuka currently has on display artifacts belonging to one such man—Zeth Ray Hill. Hill was born in Tishomingo County in 1910 to Sydney and Emma Hill. He registered with the Selective Service in 1940 at Iuka, Mississippi, and was conscripted into the United States Army in December of 1942 at Camp Shelby, Mississippi.

While in the army, he was assigned to the newly christened 82nd Airborne Division's 325th Glider Infantry Regiment.

After training in North Africa, the 325th Glider Regiment entered the European theatre of the war on September 15, 1943. As part of the 82nd Airborne's invasion of Italy, the 325th Regiment participated in Operation Avalanche, the amphibious assault on Salerno. With the beachhead secured, the combined Allied forces made their push through German forces to the northwest city of Naples, Italy.

This would not be the 325th's only engagement of the war, however. During the Allied Invasion

of Normandy, the 325th Glider Regiment made an airborne assault on German forces. Suffering heavy casualties during their landings, many of the members of the 82nd Airborne were forced to group together in small bands to accomplish the objectives of their mission. The 325th fought the Germans for over a month in Normandy. The 325th made another airborne assault with Allied forces in Holland during Operation Market Garden, and fought against the final German offensive of the war during The Battle of the Bulge.

Zeth Ray Hill was awarded the European-African-Middle Eastern



Service Medal, along with the 325th Glider Infantry Regiment's receipt of the Presidential Citation for the Salerno offensive. He is survived by his daughter, Jettie Hill Ozborn; and three grandsons, Michael Ray Hill, Timothy Wayne Hill, and Kevin Ozborn.

## Turtles at the Old Courthouse Museum

Did you know that some species of Mississippi turtles can live to be 100 years old? Or, did you know that moving a turtle even a few miles from its natural habitat can result in the death of the animal? Turtles are one of the most often encountered but least understood animals in our region. They are also animals most likely to come to harm from those who don't understand their benefits or even those who think they are acting in the animal's best interest.

This Saturday at 11 AM, founders of Central Mississippi Turtle Rescue Christy and Luke Milbourne will be on-hand at the Old Courthouse Museum to explain more about the turtles of our area, how they benefit us, and how we can best help

them when we encounter them. They will be bringing with them a number of live turtles to help in this explanation.

The Central MS Turtle Rescue got its start in 2006, not long after Christy and Luke were married, when a neighbor brought over a three-legged box turtle he'd found in a brush-pile. In a short time, they became an official rescue operation for local turtles, the Milbourne's funding the operation out of their own pockets. Over time the labor of love grew to something much larger. Today, CMTR is a registered 501-c3 and the only dedicated turtle rescue in the state. The outfit reaches out to save injured turtles from all over the state (and at least in one case from Arkansas) and

offers programs for sponsorship and adoption, especially for educational institutions such as zoos, aquariums, and museums. Private adoption of rescued turtles is possible, but requires a process for approval.

The Old Courthouse Museum encourages you to come out Saturday at 11 to learn more about turtles and the efforts of the CMTR. This program is totally free to the public and requires no registration, but interest has been high for this presentation, so you should probably come early for best seats.

The museum has been thankful for the interest and support show so far for its series of educational programs. The staff and board encourage you to submit any suggestions and requests you have for future programs you'd like to see, and they remind you to check courthouse-museum.com for more upcoming events.

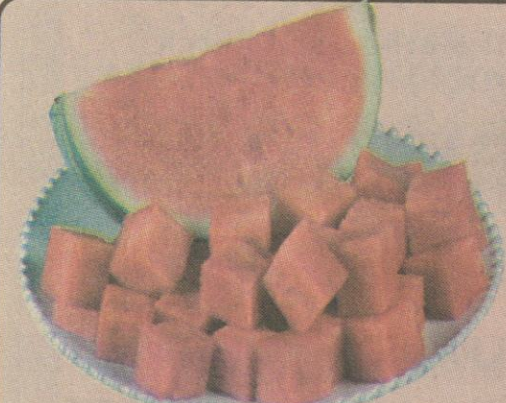

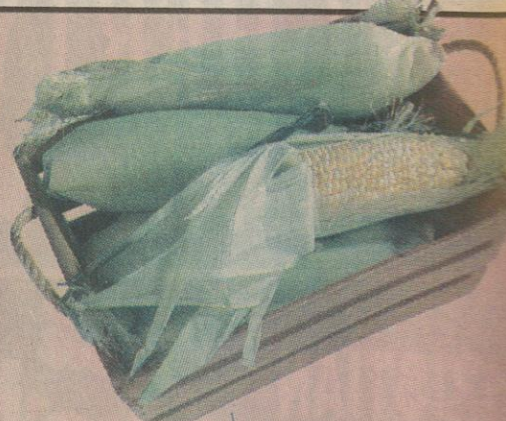
