Tishomingo State Park Voted Mississippi's "Best Park"

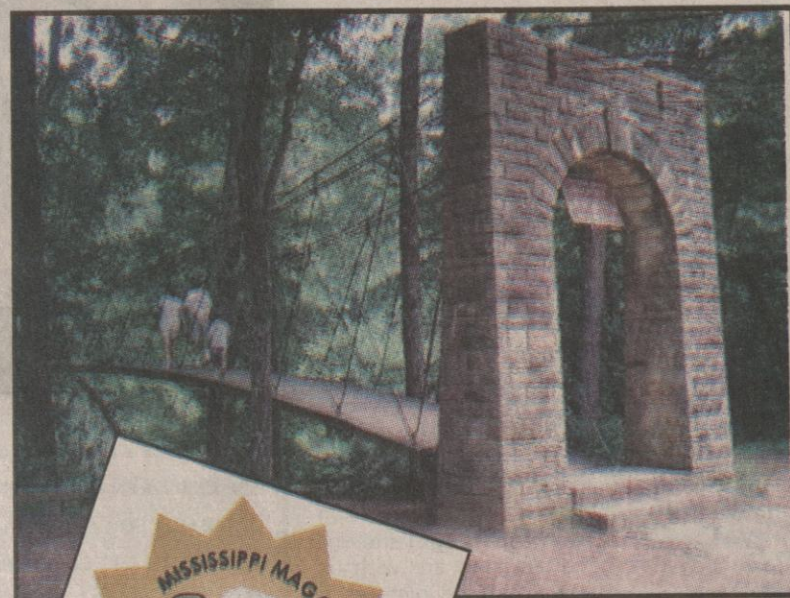

Letter from John Adams Abigail Adams, 3 July 1776 concerning Independence Day:

I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival. It ought to be commemorated, as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with Shews, Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this one forward forever more.

There are many local 4th of July events planned for this weekend to celebrate our nation's independence. Here are some of the firework displays scheduled.

Pickwick Landing State Park will host its annual fireworks display on Thursday, July 4th at 9 p.m. The Friends of Pickwick Landing State Park will be hosting an all-day celebration event around the Inn

and at the Pickwick Circle Beach area on the 4th as well. One Vehicle Accident Claims the Life of Iuka Woman

A one vehicle accident claimed the life of April Christine Mook, age 40, of Hiatt Circle; she was pronounced dead at the scene of the crash by the Tishomingo County Coroner Mac Wilemon on Saturday, June 29th.

Mook was driving a 1998 Toyota Tacoma and lost control while heading westbound on highway 350; about 5 miles from the highway 25 intersection near Pickwick.

The vehicle appeared to have rolled over several times during the accident; Mook was ejected from the vehicle. The accident was reported early Saturday morning when a passing motorist placed a call to 911 at 2:38 a.m. after they noticed the Mook's vehicle overturned. This accident is currently being investigated by the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

Circuit Clerk's Office to be Open Saturday

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that the Circuit Clerk's Office will be open on Saturday, July 6, 2019 (8 a.m. to 12 noon), for voter registration. The last date to register to vote in the clerk's office for the August 6, 2019 Primary Elections will be Monday, July 8, 2019.

All mail-in voter registration forms must be postmarked on or before Monday, July 8, 2019 in order to be eligible to vote in the Primary Elections.

This registration period is for anyone who has NEVER registered to vote before. You do not have to re-register if you have been voting on previous election days. If you have a question as to whether

you are registered, please call 423-7026 to check on your registration before July 8, 2019.

Absentee Ballots will also be available for those who wish to vote an absentee ballot for the August 6, 2019 Primary Elections on this date.

You may come to the circuit clerk's office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, July 27, 2019 (8 a.m. to 12 noon) and on Saturday, August 3, 2019 (8 a.m. to 12 noon) for absentee voting.

T.C.E.P.A. Taking Nominations For Board of Directors

In accordance with the Bylaws of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, nomination for positions on the Board of Directors are now being accepted. There will be four positions open for election. One director is to be elected for a three (3) year term for each of the following supervisor's districts: 3rd, 4th, 5th, and an area at large position.

Members of the Association may make nominations by either of the following methods.

1. By petition bearing the signature of at least fifteen (15) members: Petitions must be received by the Secretary of the Board of Directors at least seven (7) days prior to

the day of the Annual Meeting. Petitions may be presented for qualification at the Main Office of the Association during regular business hours, Monday thru Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

2. From the floor of the Annual Meeting to be held August 10th, 2019: The Bylaws require that five (5) percent of the membership be physically present in order that nominations may be made from the floor.

Nominees must be residents of the supervisor's districts which they will represent. Any member, regardless of place of residence, may be nominated for the area at large position.

MHP Fourth of July Enforcement Period / Drive Right Mississippi

The Mississippi Highway Patrol will begin the 2019 Fourth of July Holiday Enforcement Period on Wednesday, July 3, at 12:01 a.m. and conclude Thursday, July 4, at midnight. All available troopers will be assigned to saturation patrols and checkpoints to promote traffic safety. In conjunction with the holiday period, MHP is launching the new traffic safety initiative "Drive Right Mississippi" which will run through the month of July.

The initiative will focus on the left hand lane law, distracted and impaired driving, speeding, and seatbelt usage. During the Fourth of July holiday period in 2018, MHP investigated 61 crashes with 2 fatalities and made 41 DUI arrests on state and federal highway systems. We are asking motorists to have a "Drive Right" mentality while traveling this summer and to join with us in making roadways safer in Mississippi.

In order to register, all parents/guardians **MUST** bring 2 proofs of residency for each student. Proofs of residency that will be accepted include:

- Apartment or Home Lease (hand written receipt must be notarized)
- Current (within 30 days) Utility Bills: Water, Electric, TV, Phone (no cell phones-must be land line or internet service)
- Driver's License or Firearms Permit (only one can be accepted)
- Current Automobile Registration

American Legion to open membership on Tuesday, June 11, the first step was taken to open membership to ALL Veterans serving since Pearl Harbor in 1941, to join the American Legion.

This bill, S-504 (Senate Bill), was unanimously passed, and is the first step to right the membership requirements for Veterans wanting to join the American Legion Organization. In the past, membership requirements were restricted by Congress to dates of conflicts. This bill would remove the current dates and open the membership to all honorary discharged veterans from December 7, 1941 forward. The bill has now been sent to the House of Representatives, where it in all probability, it will be approved. NOTICE OF PROPOSED AD VALOREM TAX EFFORT TISHOMINGO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for fiscal year 2019-2020 on July 18, 2019, 6:00 p.m., at the Superintendent's office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort shall be considered.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$29,428,407. Of that amount, 26% or \$7,559,952, of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$31,154,486.17. Of that amount, 26% or \$8,150,531, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal year, the proposed increase in ad valorem tax effort by Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District may result in an increase in the ad valorem tax millage rate. Ad valorem taxes are paid on homes, automobile tags, business fixtures and equipment, and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax effort, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

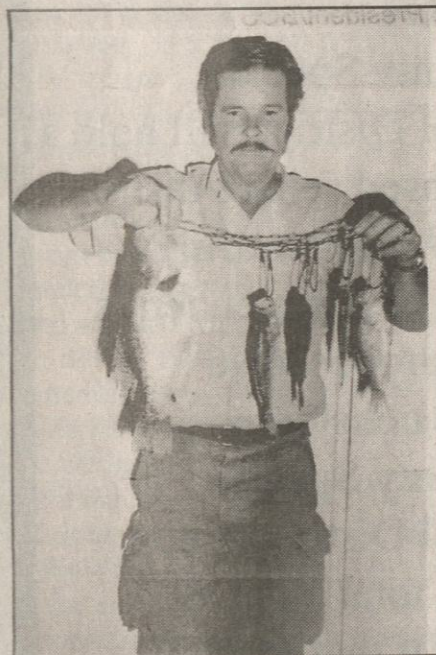

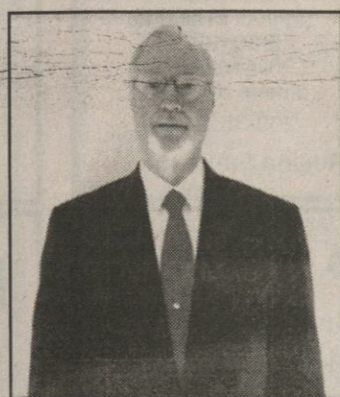

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 20)

We are looking at Solomon's writings in the Book of Ecclesiastes, which basically concern life on earth and not life in eternity. Ecclesiastes 4:5-6 says, "The fool foldeth his hands together, and eateth his own flesh. Better is an handful with quietness, than both the hands full with travail and vexation of spirit." There is much to be said for the value of work, and also about the desire to gain riches that causes some to work themselves to death for very little benefit or pleasure! We notice first the fool who is too lazy to work therefore his physical body suffers to the extent that his body is thin, as if he had eaten his own flesh. No, there is nothing wrong with keeping the body as thin as possible for the sake of health, but it is another thing when one is more willing to be

frail than to work for sufficient food. This is the person Solomon has in mind. By the way, the word "fool" is used twelve times in Ecclesiastes, with different Hebrew words. The first Hebrew word means: "fat, (or figuratively) stupid or silly"; the second word means: "silly". Ecclesiastes also uses the word "foolish" three times, employing the same two Hebrew words. Solomon is not pointing a finger at those who may be overweight, rather he is saying that some people are "fat" with silliness or stupidity. So, silliness is the idea that is basic for the Hebrew words that

are used in Ecclesiastes. Some might want to point out that Jesus said we should call no man a fool (Matthew 5:22); the Greek word used there means: "dull, headless, blockhead or absurd". The idea seems to be that we should not condemn others by thinking of them in this way, yet Jesus used the word "fool" several times, but He was simply saying that men are not thinking straight when they refuse God and His salvation.

Solomon continues his words and lets men know that a life of quietness and peace is better than a life of plenty, if

the abundance brings a wearing out of the spirit and travail in life. Many people do not seem to have learned the lesson taught here by the wisest king before Jesus, for they beat themselves to death to "have more", yet they never really enjoy it; some do not live long enough to enjoy it! It is not wrong to be industrious and seek to earn a good living, but it is wrong to allow one's work to consume him to the extent that he has time for nothing more than work. This is what Solomon means by one having both hands full, yet living a life that has no pleasure in anything except work. Ecclesiastes 4:7-8 continues the thought of our verses above: "Then I returned, and saw vanity under the sun. There is one alone, and there is not a second; yea, he hath neither child nor brother: yet is there

no end of all his labour; neither is his eye satisfied with riches; neither saith he, For whom do I labour, and bereave my soul of good? This is also vanity, yea, it is a sore travail." Notice that Solomon is looking at vanity on earth, and vanity means emptiness. So he sees a man who works night and day to gain more,

with none to whom to leave it. He is never satisfied with the riches he has, so he seeks to gain more. He enjoys nothing good in life, for he has to work more, thus Solomon says that he is empty inside and lives for no good reason, not even really enjoying the work he does. I would agree with Solomon that such people are not wise in the things that really matter!

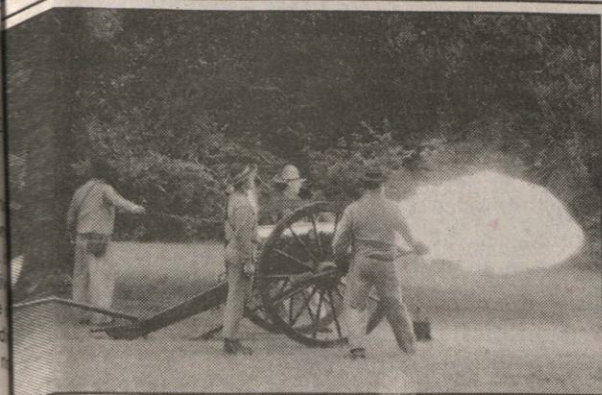

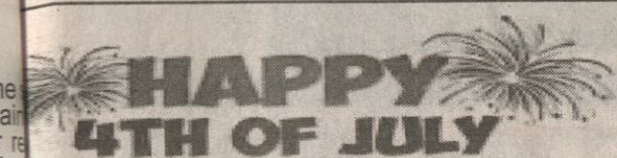


Cannon to Roar Again at Shiloh Battlefield

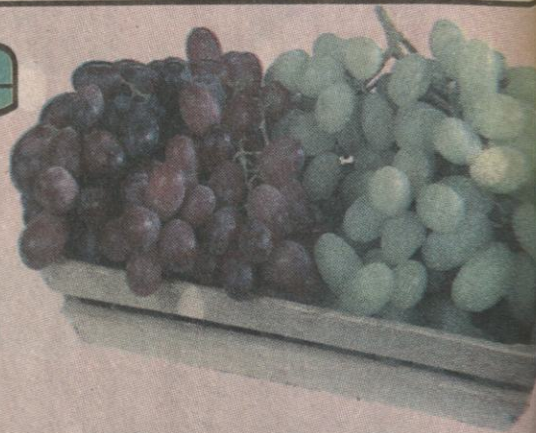

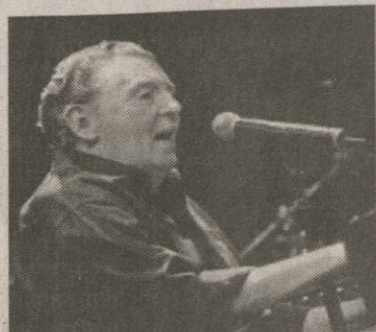

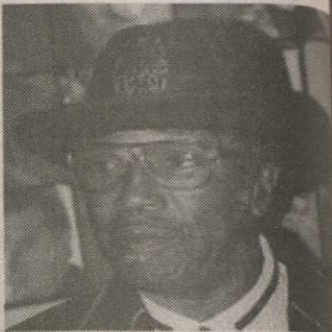

Five Legends Named to The MAX Hall of Fame

Tammy Wynette, Bo Diddley, Jerry Lee Lewis, Margaret Walker Alexander and John Lee Hooker

MERIDIAN, Miss. (June 13, 2019) – Five iconic Mississippians have been named to the Hall of Fame at The Mississippi Arts + Entertainment Experience (The MAX) in Meridian. The new Hall of Fame honorees are country music artist Tammy Wynette, singer/songwriters Bo Diddley and Jerry Lee Lewis, poet and writer Margaret Walker (Alexander) and bluesman John Lee Hooker.

The new designees join 23 existing Hall of Fame members and will be featured in the spectacular Hall of Fame rotunda at The MAX. The state-sanctioned Hall of Fame recognizes influential men and women who have had an extraordinary and lasting impact as musicians, actors, media personalities, visual artists, culinary artists, authors and other talented artists and entertainers who trace their roots to Mississippi.

"These five individuals have enriched our culture through their talents as performers and writers, and we are proud to honor them in this way," said Mark Tullos, Executive Director of The MAX. "They join a very distinguished group as Hall of Fame members of The

MAX."

Tammy Wynette (Tremont, MS) was a country singer and songwriter. Called the "First Lady of Country Music," she is among country music's best-known and best-selling female singer-songwriters. Her iconic hit "Stand By Your Man" is one of the best-selling singles in the history of country music. She was named by CMT as one of the three Greatest Women of Country Music (with Patsy Cline and Loretta Lynn). For nearly two decades, Wynette held the record for winning consecutive awards from the Country Music Association (CMA). She was the first female country artist to sell a million albums and is in the Country Music Hall of Fame.

Bo Diddley (McComb, MS) was a singer, songwriter, guitarist and producer who played a key role in the transition from the blues to rock and roll. His signature rhythms became the cornerstone of modern hip-hop, rock and pop music. Many artists have named him as a musical inspiration including Elvis Presley, The Beatles and the Rolling Stones. He is a Grammy winner,

member of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, Rockabilly Hall of Fame and the Blues Hall of Fame. He received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Rhythm and Blues Foundation. One of Diddley's musical inspirations was John Lee Hooker, also a 2019 honoree.

Jerry Lee Lewis (Nesbit, MS) is a singer-songwriter, musician and pianist and known as a pioneer of rock and roll and rockabilly music. He developed his signature musical style during his younger years in Mississippi as part of the new and emerging rock and roll movement. His most iconic hits include "Whole Lotta Shakin' Goin' On" and "Great Balls of Fire." Lewis began his career at Sun Records (Memphis) and became one of Rolling Stone Magazine's "100 Greatest Artists of All Time." He is a Grammy winner, recipient of the Recording Academy's Lifetime Achievement Award, and has been honored with a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. He is a member of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, Rockabilly Hall of Fame, and Memphis Music Hall of Fame.

Margaret Walk-

er Alexander (Jackson, MS) was a poet and author. She is best known for her 1966 novel Jubilee and her award-winning poem "For My People," written as part of her involvement in the Chicago Black Renaissance, an African-American literary movement. For 30 years, she served as a literature professor at Jackson State University where she founded the Institute for the Study of History, Life, and Culture of Black People (now the Margaret Walker Center) and served as the institute's director. She is also the namesake for the Hinds County system's Margaret Walker Alexander Library. Her works are considered among the most influential and important in African-American literature. She received a Candace Award from the National Coalition of 100 Black Women in 1989.

John Lee Hooker (Clarksdale, MS) was a blues singer, songwriter and guitarist. The son of a Delta sharecropper, Hooker developed a unique style of guitar playing prominently featured in some of his best-known songs such as "One Bourbon, One Scotch and One Beer" and "Boom Boom." Hooker

is a five-time Grammy Award winner and an inductee in both the Blues Hall of Fame and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. He has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. He was awarded the Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000.

The 2019 Hall of Fame inductees were nominated by a statewide committee comprised of arts and entertainment experts representing various genres and art forms. Nominees are selected to represent music, writing, cultural arts, performing arts and visual arts. To be considered, candidates must have a connection to the State of Mississippi, either by birthright, moving to the state at an early age, or living in Mississippi for a significant portion of his/her career. Nominees are then voted on by a panel

of electors (18) appointed by The MAX Board of directors and fans who votes as part of a nationwide election.

Since its opening, previous Hall of Fame classes (2017 and 2018) have been designated.

The five new inductees join current Hall of Fame members Jimmy Buffet, Willie Morris, Charley Pride, William Eggleston, Howlin' Wolf, Walter R. Rife, William Faulkner, Morgan Freeman, Grisham, Jim Hemminger, Robert Johnson, Janis Joplin, Earl Jones, B.B. King, George Ohr, Elvis Presley, Leontyne Price, Loretta Lynn, Sela Ward, Muddy Waters, Euday Welby, Tennessee Williams, Oprah Winfrey, and Richard Wright.

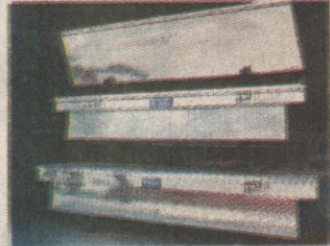
