## Run-offs Send Oaks and McNatt into General Election for County Circuit Clerk

Tuesday's run-off elections in both the Republican and Democratic Primaries in Tishomingo County is sending Rebecca Oaks (D) and Josh Mc-Natt (R) to meet two Independents, Kenny Carson and Beth Booker White, in the November General Election for the position of Tishomingo County Circuit Court Clerk. This was the only local position to be decided during Tuesday's run off elec-

Rebecca Oaks defeated Randy Stringer by a vote of 716 to 507 while Josh McNatt defeated Jerry Leon Patterson, 1291 to 1242. Unofficial returns can be found on page 9 of this issue of the newspaper.

Also decided on Tuesday were several state candidates in the Republican run offs. Tisho-

mingo County voted with the rest of the state to put Tate Reeves as the Republican candidate to meet Jim Hood (D) in November in the race for Governor. Lynn Fitch (R) will go on to face Jennifer Riley Collins (D) for Attorney General. It was also determined that John Caldwell (R) will be on the ballot running against Joe T. (Joey) Grist (D) for Transportation Commissioner-Northern Dis-

The General Election will take place on Tuesday November 5th 2019. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. If you have any questions regarding voter registration please contact the Circuit Court Clerk's office in the Tishomingo County Courthouse.



### **Burnsville Man Arrested Again For Drugs**

On August 22, Tishomingo Sheriff's deputies along with officers for the Burnsville Police Department, responded to a call on Jefferson Street in Burnsville. When law enforcement arrived, they were able to identify an individual with the outstanding warrant as Bobby John Voyles. During the course of the arrest, deputies searched the residence and found some alleged methamphetamine as well as other items used to package, weigh, and sale drugs. Deputies then transported Voyles to the Tishomingo County Jail and once there Voyles attempted to hide some more alleged methamphetamine. Deputies along with the Corrections Officers were able to retrieve the alleged methattempted to be destroved.

## Traffic Stop Leads To Felony Drug Arrest

August 16th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that was swerving into oncoming traffic on County Road 23.

During the traffic stop, deputies checked both the driver and passenger and learned they both had prior drug arrests. Jeffery Gober, and Mark Daves were arrested after being found to be in possession of Methamphetamine.

Deputies noticed that both the driver and the passenger appeared to being hiding something in the vehicle, so deputies asked for both of them to step out of the vehicle at this time.

A search of the vehicle was then conducted and deputies found some alleged methamphetamine hidden in the console of the vehicle. Both the driver and the passenger were then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.



The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for fiscal year 2020on Tuesday September 3<sup>rd</sup> 2019 at9:00 AM atthe Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors Office.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors is now operating with projected total revenue of \$14,174,785 and \$6,204,418 (44 percent) of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$14,646,035. Of that amount \$6,258,442 (43 percent) is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

The decision to not increase the ad valorem tax millage rate for fiscal year 2020 above the current fiscal year's ad valorem tax millage rate means you will not pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures, and equipment and rental real property, unless the assessed value of your property has increased for fiscal year 2020.



The City of luka will hold a public hearing on a proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase for fiscal year 2019 -2020 and on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for fiscal year 2019-2020 on September 3, 2019 at 6:30 p.m., in the Boardroom at luka City Hall.

The City of luka is now operating with projected total budget revenue \$5,616,000.00. (5.4 percent) \$283,000.00 of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$5,916,000.00. Of that amount, (5.19 percent) or \$307,000.00 is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

If we can get the meaning of the picture presented in our verses above, we will be far ahead of the game that most people play in life. Solomon is telling us a story of two kinds of births and two kinds of death. He is also contrasting the life that is lived with no purpose with that of a child born dead from the womb. Notice the language in our verses to see what I am say-



ing. First we see the man who might have a huge family and might live to a ripe old age. Then we see that his life is not filled with anything good, and his burial is not a burial with honors. Next we see a baby that is born as an untimely birth, or early, and does not live to see life outside the womb. Then we see that this baby comes into this world in darkness, or withwhen it is born. So he enters life in vanity, meaning emptiness, and darkness. His name is covered in darkness, for he never lives to make any kind of name in society. Moreover, he has never seen the sun, or the light of day; he has not known anything, yet he is better off than the man who lives to be old, has many children and dies without ever realizing any goodness or purpose in life.

Our writer, Solomon, has told us that the child born dead is better off than the person who has a big

out sight, for it is dead family and lives to on earth. Our two be old, yet has never seen the goodness of God in his life. That man, Solomon says, could live a thousand vears two times, or two thousand years, yet they would all be useless, for he has never learned the purpose of life. Then our writer says all go to one place. We might question this, but he is speaking only of natural human existence, thus all go to one place when they die, that is, to the grave. Ecclesiastes was not written as a treatise on heaven or hell, rather it was written to teach us about life







Dove season opening day is one of the most anticipated days of the year and is a great time for outdoor fun with friends and family. Mississippi's dove hunting season will open on Sunday, September 1 at 2:00 p.m. in both dove zones.

The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, and Parks' Fisheries, (MDWFP) primary objectives for dove season are to conserve and enhance our migratory bird resources, to provide opportunities for quality outdoor recreation, and to make sure everyone has a safe hunting experience. Dove fields on MDWFP Wildlife Management Areas may have different hunt days and starting times, depending on the specific area's regulations. Shooting hours for all migratory game birds, including doves, end at

Hunters should take serious notice of how a location was prepared prior to hunting. It is the hunter's responsibility to know if the area is legal for hunting or not. To assist with this determination, a brochure on dove field preparation and hunting regulations can be found online www.mdwfp.com/ dove. Three questions hunters should be able to answer regarding how the area was prepared before

dove hunting are: Did I know the area was baited?

ing migratory game birds in each state hunted. To complete HIP registration, hunters must use any of the methods or vendors available for purchasing hunting licenses. During the HIP process, hunters are asked questions about their migratory game bird hunting activity and harvest from the previous

The most frequent citation written in Mississippi during dove season has been no hunting license. This violation has a direct negative impact on conservation due to the loss of Federal Aid dollars to the state. Dove hunters should ensure their shotguns are not capable of holding more than three shells. The total combined bag limit for mourning and white-winged doves is 15 per person per day, with no more than 45 in possession. On opening day, the possession limit is the same as the daily bag


