

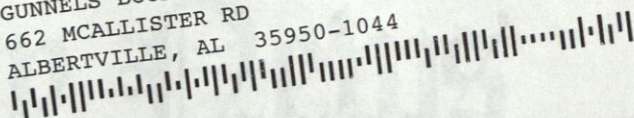

Tishomingo County School District Earns "A" Rating for 2nd Year in a Row

Tishomingo County School District has received one of the state's highest honors by earning an "A" rating once again under Mississippi's Accountability System. Districts and schools receive ratings from A through D each year based upon student performance on Mississippi's state assessment (MAAP) and other factors including graduation rate, ACT performance, acceleration courses. Luka elementary received an "A" ranking as well for its performance. Belmont, Burnsville, Luka Middle, and TCHS received "B" rankings, and Tishomingo received a "C."

"We are so proud of this achievement for our students, teachers, staff, administrators, board members, parents, and communities. Our faculty and

staff work very hard each day to ensure we are reaching our students academically, socially, and emotionally. We know our students are much more than a test score. Our commitment to help students be successful in each area of their lives is what ultimately drives us to success. The 'A' rating is validation of our efforts in the academics we want to provide for our students, families, and communities. It is difficult to get to an 'A' and really difficult to maintain the ranking. We are very blessed to have dedicated staff and students that strive for excellence each day and gives us the opportunity to be an 'A' each year," stated Superintendent Christie Holly.

Tishomingo County Man Sentenced to 60 Years in Prison without Parole

After a trial by jury, a Tishomingo County man was found guilty of firing a weapon at law enforcement during an incident which occurred in May of 2018. Brian Russell Turner, 46, of Tishomingo was sentenced to 60 years in prison without the chance of parole due to his past history of offenses.

The sentence was handed down by Judge Kelly Mims on Tuesday, September 23rd after a four day trial which ended last Thursday. "Turner's habitual offender status means he is not eligible for early release or parole," said District Attorney John Weddle. "The sentence makes sure Turner will no longer be a threat."

Turner was convicted of firing some 30 rounds at officers

during an attempted traffic stop which took place on May, 3 2018 around 9:30 p.m. It was reported that he struck a patrol car and fired a rifle towards the officers during the pursuit. Turner was not immediately arrested due to fleeing from the officers but was eventually apprehended by sheriff's deputies in Wayne County, Tennessee.

Turner was found guilty of two counts of aggravated assault on an officer, felony fleeing and possession of a weapon by a felon.

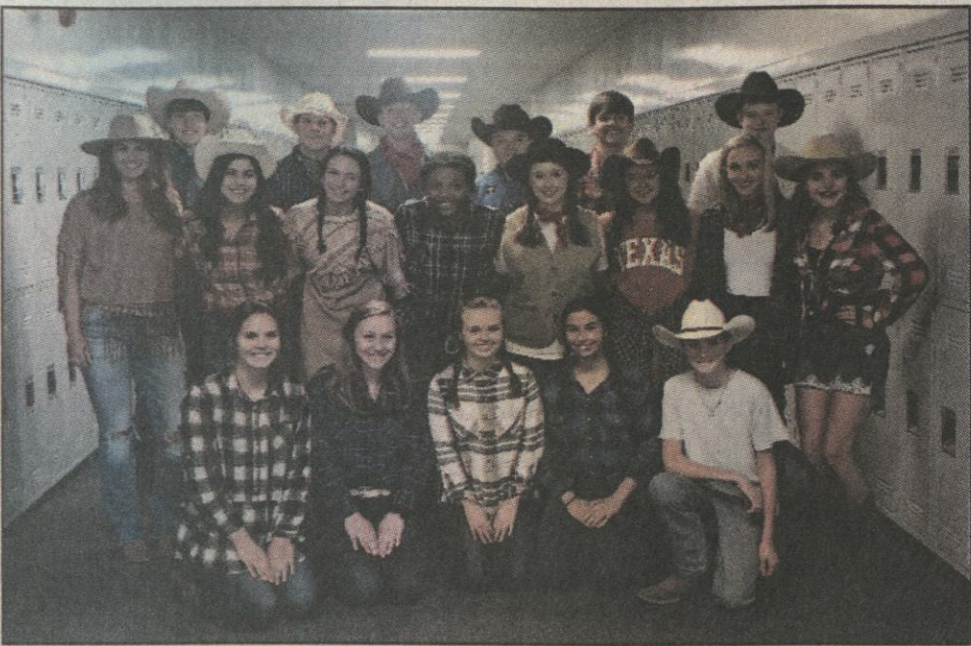

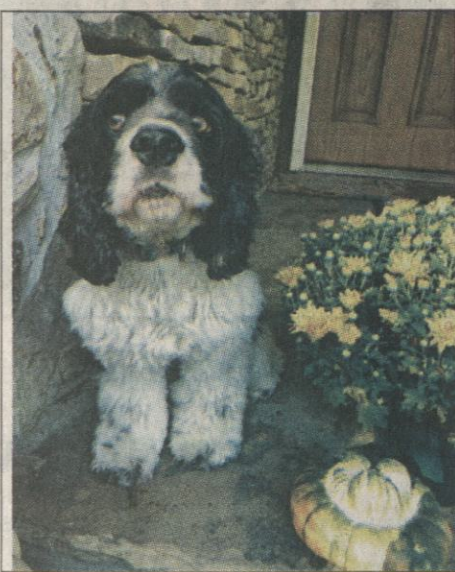
Pet of the Week

Explore Hydroponic Gardening at Tishomingo County Fair Lunch & Learn

This year's free Lunch & Learn talk at the Tishomingo County Fair, presented by Tishomingo Master Gardener, will feature a type of growing experience that spark new garden interest for some who want to know more about growing vegetables in water.

The program, planned for 12 noon on Friday, September 20, 2019, will feature a presentation by David Cooper Tire retiree who has been exploring hydroponic gardening during the past

year. He took the master gardener's course last year and was always intrigued by hydroponics and the idea of growing vegetables in water," Day said. "I've followed videos on Youtube and learned more and more about it. I'm no expert by any means, but I'm happy to share what I've learned." Day said he started with a couple of tomato plants and has had tremendous success.

Mississippi State Uni-

versity Extension says tomatoes are the most common vegetable grown hydroponically in Mississippi, but some other vegetables that also can be successfully grown using this water method include cucumbers, eggplant, peppers, lettuce, eggplant, spinach, melons, a variety of herbs, and some other specialty crops.

Some flowering plants and certain fruits like strawberries and raspberries also can be successfully grown hydroponically, Extension literature says.

"At first I was just tinkering to see if I could do it," Day said. "It's easy to build a hydroponic setup like I use, and you can buy everything locally except I order the nutrients online. That's what I'll be telling people about at the Fair program."

Day's setup uses a table where the setup gets morning and early afternoon sun, but he said any location with southern exposure will work. And you can extend your growing season if you use a greenhouse or basement for growing.



"I have some back and knee problems, so another thing I like is you can have it at a height that you're comfortable with," he said.

Setting up a hydroponic garden doesn't mean spending less time in the garden, however.

"Your garden needs to

see you every day, but the work is less labor intensive," Day said. "It's amazing the kind of growth you can get just from water."

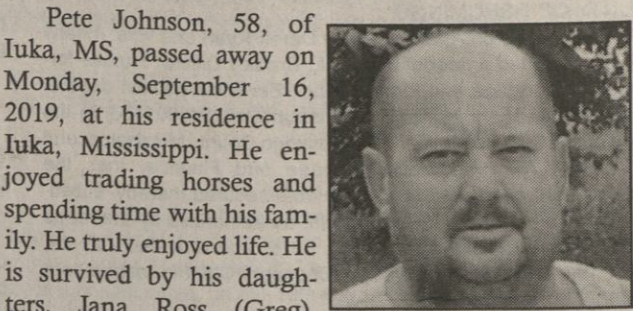

PASTOR'S TIDBITS

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 32)

Solomon, the writer of the Bible Book of Ecclesiastes, continues his treatise on the value of wisdom over pleasure in Ecclesiastes 7:3-5: "Sorrow is better than laughter: for by the sadness of the countenance the heart is made better. The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning; but the heart of fools is in the house of mirth. It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise, than for a man to hear the song of fools." I doubt that any of us would choose to have sorrow, for it just does not seem to fit with what we desire to accomplish in life. The fact, however, is that sorrow will do more to bring us to sensible thinking than pleasure (mirth) ever will. When we face sorrow, we usually try to find comfort from some source, and if we are wise we will look for that comfort from God! When we are having pleasure, we tend to think that everything in life is fine, when actually many things may need to be fixed. The heart that considers why sorrow comes and reaches the right conclusion will be better, because it has learned to trust God during the hard times. When we simply trust our own ability to make us what we should be, we are in a bad spot, for our natural side will never produce anything supernatural and lasting! Solomon says that wise people accept sorrow and mourning, while foolish people have a party and try to "forget about their troubles". The wise thing is to face our problems and to cry to God for strength to do the right thing when we are hurting.

Now we come to a verse that speaks about rebuke and says that the rebuke of a wise person will do us more good than the songs of fools. I have thought about this verse many times as I have considered the themes about which people write songs and sing them. Some people seem to think that they will be helped by attending some concert of a famous singer, or singers, who sing about all of the hard times, the blues and the dead end roads of their own lives. I guess many of them are singing about their own lives, for their records speak loudly about the way they live! Rebuke is not likely enjoyable to any of us, but it is sometimes necessary. This brings to mind the cry of our day for "positive preaching" on the part of many people. It seems that such folks have never noticed that the Bible has more negative information than positive. They have not thought about the fact that sins have to be faced before men will repent and be forgiven. Perhaps a review of the law that God gave to Israel, namely the ten commandments, will give more insight on the negative nature of those laws, for most of them have the word "not" in them, which is a negative word! Yes, I believe in the positive side of things, but the negative has to be faced before we will ever know any distinction between the two words. Life has many negative things in it, especially because of the fall of man through Adam, but God wants to make things positive for us by our reception of Christ, the only remedy for our problem!



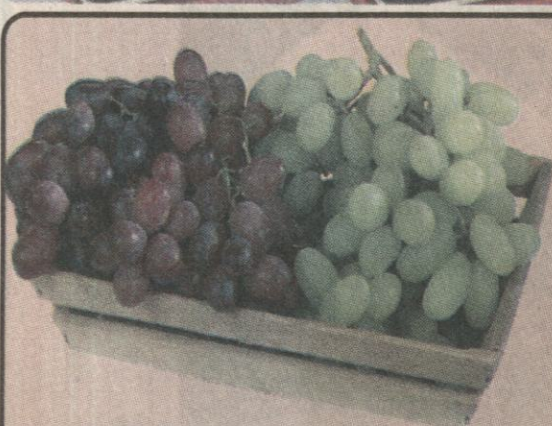
