Trash and Treasures along the Tenn-Tom is happening on Friday and Saturday, October 4 and 5th. This annual event features 50+ miles of yard sales spanning over several counties in multiple states. If you have been planning a yard sale now is the time to do it. There will be designated locations across the county where sellers can set up. This will also be a great opportunity to get out there and see what treasures you can find.

There is no charge to participate in this event at the designated sites; however some private property owners may charge a fee. Place your signs or ads as you prefer, but please observe all ordinances about signs or ads on public property. Also please respect our community and the landowners by cleaning up all trash & debris from your property prior to departing each day. The 50+ mile route of this massive yard sale starts on Highway 25 north of Iuka and continues along and adjacent to the

Tenn-Tom Waterway all the way to the Belmont/Golden areas. It also includes Highways 72 and 172 to Burnsville. Thousands of sellers and buyers participate in this annual event. Organizers report that people can sell Trash & Treasures for pocket money or to raise funds for civic or church groups, individual or group collections are welcome as well.

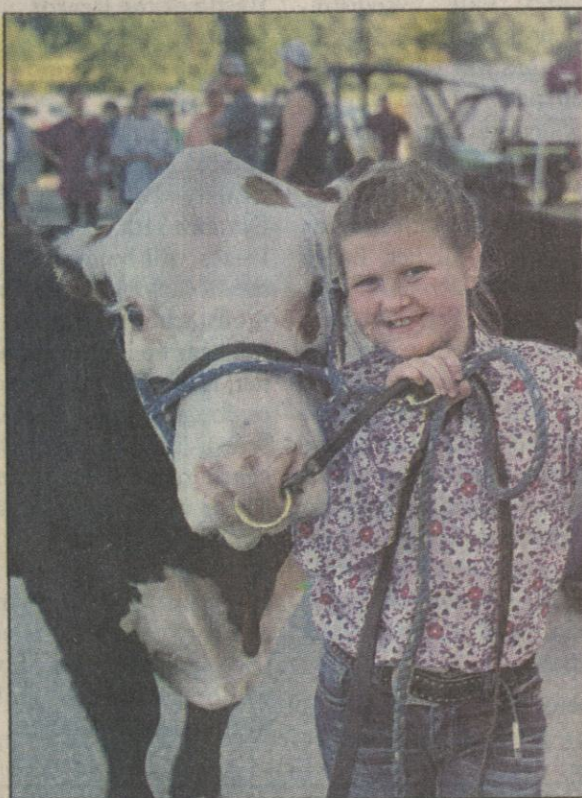
## The 2019 Tishomingo County Fair is Coming to Town

## Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley to Hold Iuka Town Hall Meeting

Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley will address citizens in the Iuka area on Tuesday, October 8th at 6:00 p.m.

The meeting will take place in the Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk Courtroom located at 1008 Battleground Drive in Iuka. The purpose of this meeting with Commissioner Presley

is to discuss public utility service, broadband internet service, cellular phone service, among other issues. Commissioner Presley will also take questions and concerns from the local community during the meeting.

"One of the most important things an elected official can do is go out and listen to the peo-

ple. This Town Hall meeting will give the citizens of Tishomingo County the chance to personally meet with me to ask questions or share concerns," Commissioner Presley said.

This meeting is free and open to the public.

## Ronnie Joslin Helps Team Win World Championship

"Hey, boy, wanna play some softball?" Thus began a friendship that spans almost 40 years.

The SSUSA World Championship Softball Tournament was held in Las Vegas, Nevada from September 22-29, featuring 612 teams from 30 United States, Guam, and Canada in various age divisions.

DT Express, a 60 AAA team based in Blairsville, Georgia had qualified for the tournament by winning the Valdosta, Georgia tournament. The team defeated teams from Colorado, California, Arizona, Hawaii, and Panama to secure the title. Play-

Other team members are: Ronnie Rogers (TN), John Hanson (TN), Kevin Hogan (FL), Ralph Davenport (GA), and Weldon Hughes (TN).

Who could have known the impact of Royce Howie's question to a young man? Joslin began his career playing with the Howie brothers: Royce, Frankie, and Stanley, in the 70's. They were successful and played together on many winning teams like McDonalds in the 80's and Redd's in the 90's. Royce and Ronnie continue to play in the league at Corinth as well as on teams that travel throughout the



country.

Previous to softball, Joslin played baseball at Burnsville High School and was coached by Jerry Harrelson. His senior year they had only two losses. He continued his baseball career at NEMJC and was coached by Billy Southward. His love of the game has been shared many times with youth by coaching baseball and softball teams through the Dixie Youth and Babe Ruth Organizations.

## Presley to Host Hire Mississippi Event in Tishomingo County

**In 2016, 70% of the \$810,000,000 spent by the state's five largest electric and gas companies on operations and maintenance went to companies outside of Mississippi.**

Mississippi Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley will host an event in Tishomingo County to allow businesses to sign up to do work with the state's largest utilities. The Hire Mississippi event will take place October 10th at 8 a.m. at the Burnsville Chamber of Commerce, 322 Highway 72, Burnsville, MS 38833. The event is free, open to the public, and breakfast will be served.

In 2017, Presley passed the Hire Mississippi rule that requires the state's largest public utilities to give extra notice, attention, and support for Mississippi businesses looking to bid on public utility projects. Hire Mississippi requires the largest utilities to give notice to each company on their Hire Mississippi Supplier List when any job is available for bid that a Mississippi company is qualified to perform. The program requires each business to sign up and

provide certain information.

"I am sick and tired of seeing out-of-state companies on construction sites in Mississippi when I know that Mississippians are footing the bill for those projects. I have zero doubt that our companies could be doing at least some of that work, if they were given the chance. It's past time that we put our state's businesses first and that is what the Hire Mississippi program does," said Commissioner Brandon Presley. "Hire Mississippi allows Mississippi businesses to get a bite at the apple and be considered first for contracts that they are qualified to do. If we don't look out for Mississippi businesses and workers, no one else will."

"This is a casual event, but one where I want every business owner to leave there signed up for the Hire Mississippi Supplier List and with knowledge about the program," said Presley.

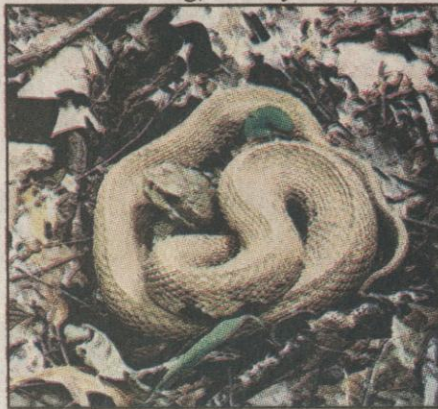
## Watch for Snakes

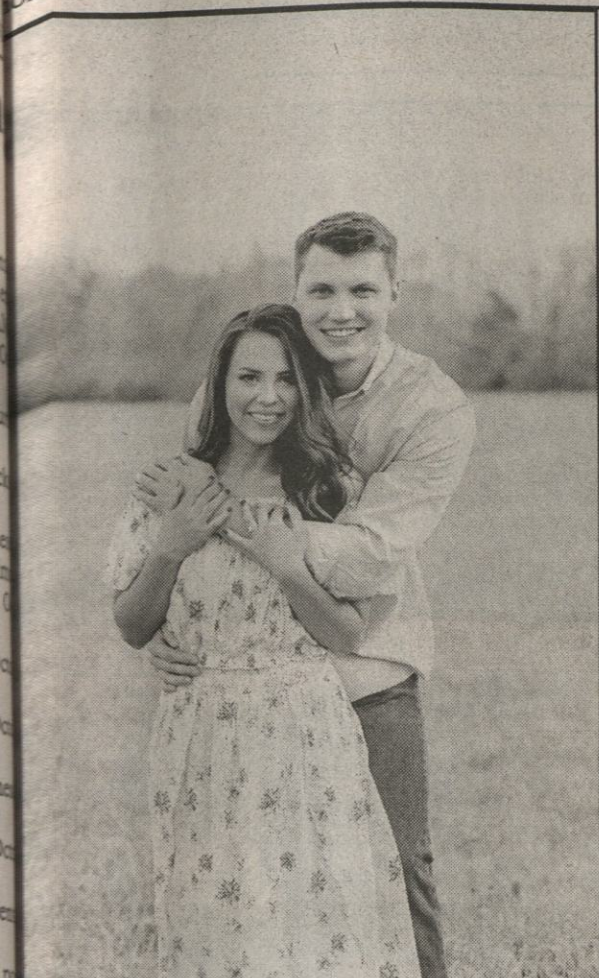

## UDC Met at Iuka Library

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone, Chapter 394 met September 16th, at 11 a.m. at the Iuka Public Library. There were three members present, Jean Works, Gail Smith and Sharon Hairrell. We completed the UDC Rituals, and the saluting of the US flag, the State flag and the Confederate flag. The minutes were read and approved and the meeting was declared open. The new business was the collecting of dues and the old news was working on increasing membership. There was no treasure report at this time and Co-Registrar's Gail and Jean stated that they had one new application almost ready to send in and we had one past application that needed to be re-typed and it would be ready to send in.

Sharon Hairrell presented the program on: The Code for the Correct Use of Our Confederate Flags, "How to Display and Respect Our Flags." The flag should not be displayed in bad weather and if displayed at night it needs to be illuminated. It is customary to display flags from sunrise to sunset.

On Memorial Day, the flag should be at half staff until noon and at the peak of staff from noon until sunset. When the Confederate Flag is displayed it should always be with the United States Flag. The U.S. must always be on the right (the left of observer). The Confederate must be to the left of the U.S. Flag (observer right). When use on a table the U.S. Flag will in the middle at the highest point, the Confederate Flag on the left and the state Flag right.

When used on a car or

float, the U.S. Flag on the right and Confederate Flag on the left and always on the front. The flags should never be draped over the hood, top or displayed on the sides of a vehicle. IT SHOULD NEVER BE ON THE BACK OF A VEHICLE.

The flags should always be aloft and free and should never be dipped to a person or thing. It should never touch the ground, the floor, water or anything beneath it. It should not have advertising signs fastened to staff or pole. The Flag should not be used on clothing, mugs, napkins, boxes, beach equipment or etc. An eagle should be used as the standard on the staff of the U.S. Flag. A spear should be used as the standard on the staff of the Confederate and State Flags.

When the Flag is in such a condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, it should be destroyed in a dignified manner, preferably by burning.

Sharon went over the September program "The Cause of the War Between the States was Economics". After more than 150 years, there is still a need for all Americans to study and understand the complex economic cause of the revolution that shook this young nation. The major differences between the North and South were in their diverse economies. The South with its wide-open and milder climates developed an agricultural economy and the North had the industrial economy. The North had

factories and a lot of immigrants to work in the factories and the South was known as the "Cotton King" and the south grew rice and the government was increasingly placing heavier tariffs on the South. By 1860, cotton comprised 60 percent of the total exports from the United States. The true fact was that the North needed the South and the South could exist without the North. Seven states seceded from the Union and Lincoln was afraid there would be more. The factories in the North were on the brink of closing. The North didn't really want war and the South

stated from the start that they didn't want war. The South just wanted freedom from exceedingly high tariffs, the loss of states' rights, and the lack of protection from its own government, the very reason the United States seceded from England. Eleven states seceded from the Union by June 1861, but the war was waged in an attempt to force the seceding states back into the Union. Secession was allowed at that time by both Constitutions.

### Asphalt Rock Mine, Once a Thriving Workplace in North Alabama

The Asphalt Rock Mine near Cherokee in Colbert County, Alabama, 1 mile south of Margerum was once a busy, thriving business hiring locals and enriching the local economy. Martha Couch is sharing these wonderful old photos of the plant site which was just off of what is now Hwy. 72 just over the Mississippi/Alabama State Line.

Over the years there were many owners of the Asphalt Rock Mine: Alabama Asphaltic Limestone, Birmingham, Alabama ran the mine until 1967; Southern Stone - Southern Industries, Mobile, Alabama; DRAVO, Pittsburgh PA purchased the land and plant site 1982 - 1995; and Martin-Merritt purchased the land in 1995.

When the mine first opened, they used T-Model trucks to haul the rock out to the railroad at Margerum. Steam shovels were used to load the rock. Later a railway spur was made, crossing Highway 72 (Originally HWY 20), connecting the mine with the main railroad. A steam engine was used to take the cars of crushed rock to the main railroad. It was called the "Doodle Bug" and

later, "Dinky". Traffic would be stopped on the highway, then here came the little engine, blowing clouds of black smoke. You could see the smoke and hear the distinctive train whistle all over Margerum. Also heard was the clanking sounds as cars and trucks went over the "Dinky tracks".

The Company built houses for the workers, and took rent payments out of their earnings. It was known as the Mine Village and was about 14 houses. The Company also had a Commissary near the village where the workers could use their "clackers" for food and

other items they needed. The company paid their employees with coins which they could use only at the Company Commissary.

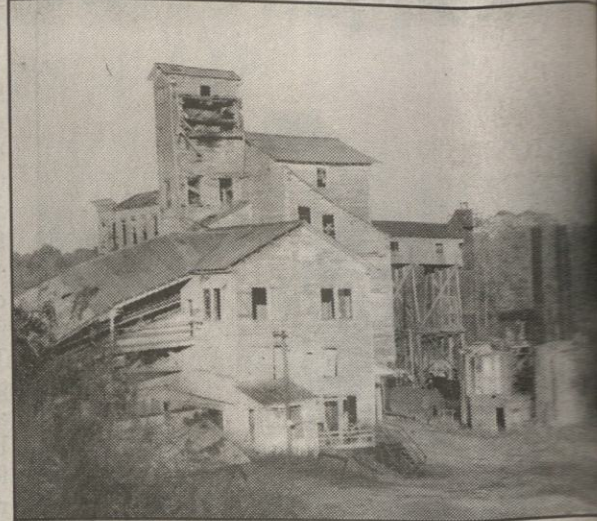
The mine closed down for a short time during the

Depression. Hub Hayes said that men would show up early and stand on the hill by the site, waiting to see if they needed extra workers for the day, at fifty cents a day. Melvin Simpson said he was 18 years old when he went to work there, and made 27 1/2 cents an hour.

According to a book, Rock Mine Time Book, Melvin Simpson listed these workers at the mill:

## Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 33)

For some who may have just begun reading my articles, I need to say that I am speaking about King Solomon and his writing in the Book of Ecclesiastes. We will look at Ecclesiastes 7:6-8 in this article: "For as the crackling of thorns under a pot, so is the laughter of the fool: this also is vanity. Surely oppression maketh a wise man mad; and a gift destroyeth the heart. Better is the end of a thing than the beginning thereof: and the patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit." If thorns are used for kindling under a pot that has food to be cooked, the outcome is not very good, for the thorns may crack and pop, but not much more comes from their burning. The idea here

is that some people may crack and pop with foolish laughter, while being consumed in the fire and adding nothing useful to life. The most dreadful thought to me is that one should live life with absolutely no purpose, and Solomon's entire Book of Ecclesiastes is a discourse on this very thing! Here we see a very wise man seeking to learn the real purpose of life, which he will do by the end of Ecclesiastes. Empty laughter is said to be a thing of vanity, which means empti-

ness, and much of the world is riding on this "train".

The wise man is maddened by oppression, for he sees that certain people are being misused by those who do not mind oppressing their fellowmen. Gifts can take away the real meaning of life, for they are often used as bribes to gain support for a wrong cause. Such things did not cease to exist in Solomon's day, sad to say, but they are still a part of the weaponry of wicked people who seek ways

to use others for their own gain. When we think of how life, or other things, will end, it is likely hard for us to agree with Solomon when he says the end of a thing is better than the beginning. The end of life is not the only thing that Solomon seems to have in mind, but he does indeed say that the end of life is better than the beginning. Perhaps he says this because he knows that life does have many problems and disappointments, yet his book will end on a positive note. We can also apply this logic to things that we seek to accomplish in life, for the end results often brings more joy than the beginning, because a dream has been accomplished. Solomon also speaks of the pa-

tient person who is better than the proud person. I often wonder if we are really teaching the proper view of self-accomplishment, if we praise the one who has met a goal and laud that person so greatly that he comes to think himself really better than anyone else. Perhaps some are better at the one thing they have done more quickly or more efficiently than any others, but it could be that they are also too wrapped up in their own importance. More than that, was the thing they accomplished really more important than personal integrity, character and concern for others who may not have had the same opportunities in life as they?

Everybody does not enter the "playing

field" with the same advantages!
