### Public Service Commissioner Presley and TCEPA Discussed Future Internet Service

Tuesday night, Mississippi Public Service Commissioner, Brandon Presley, and TCEPA General Manager Tim Wiggington, addressed a crowd of over 50 TCEPA members at the Tishomingo County Courthouse. The subject of topic- Internet and the future of the TCEPA's broadband project. Also in attendance was Tishomingo County Supervisors - Brandon Grisham and Nikki McRae - Vice Mayor For The City Of Iuka Kenny Carson - Tishomingo County Sheriff John Dennis Daugherty and First District MS House member Lester "Bubba" Carpenter.

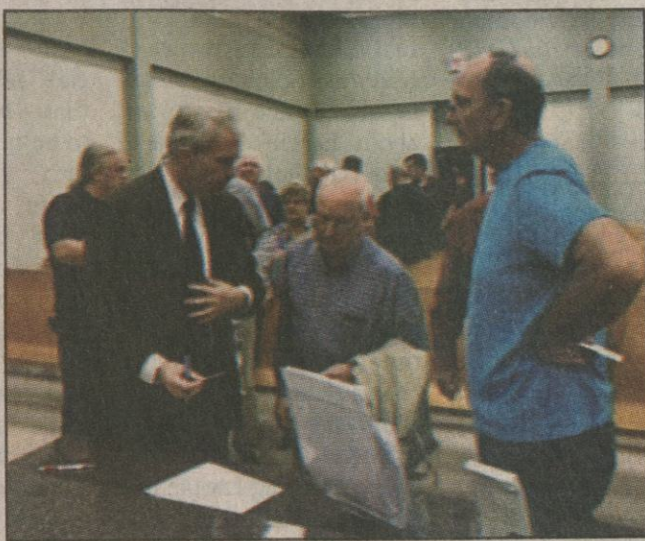
In the coming month TCEPA will be sending out surveys with monthly bills. The purpose of the surveys is to attain more information from the members of the cooperative and to attain members' interest. Mr. Wiggington discussed several topics

relating to the upcoming broadband project.

One topic was the proposed monthly cost and available speeds. The proposed services will range from

100 mb/s to 1 gb speeds. These are just proposals at this time; speeds and prices have yet to be set or determined.

TCEPA has conducted 2 feasibility studies and is currently waiting the result of a 3rd study

and the member surveys before moving forward.

The project is expected to cost in excess of 28 Million Dollars and the proposed time frame to complete is around 2-3 years.

## Presley to Host "Hire Mississippi" Event in Tishomingo County

In 2016, 70% of the \$810,000,000 spent by the state's five largest electric and gas companies on operations and maintenance went to companies outside of Mississippi.

Burnsville, Mississippi (September 27, 2019) - Mississippi Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley will host an event in Tishomingo County to allow businesses to sign up to do work with the state's largest utilities. The Hire Mississippi event will take place October 10th at 8 a.m. at the Burnsville Chamber of Commerce, 322 Highway 72, Burnsville, MS 38833. The event is free, open to the public, and breakfast will be served.

In 2017, Presley passed the Hire Mississippi rule that requires the state's largest public utili-

ties to give extra notice, attention, and support for Mississippi businesses looking to bid on public utility projects. Hire Mississippi requires the largest utilities to give notice to each company on their Hire Mississippi Supplier List when any job is available for bid that a Mississippi company is qualified to perform. The program requires each business to sign up and provide certain information.

"I am sick and tired of seeing out-of-state companies on construction sites in Mississippi when I know that Mississippians are footing the bill for those projects. I have zero doubt that our companies could be doing at least some of that work, if they were given the chance. It's past time that we put our state's businesses first and that is what the Hire Mis-

issippi program does," said Commissioner Brandon Presley. "Hire Mississippi allows Mississippi businesses to get a bite at the apple and be considered first for contracts that they are qualified to do. If we don't look out for Mississippi businesses and workers, no one else will."

"This is a casual event, but one where I want every business owner to leave there signed up for the Hire Mississippi Supplier List and with knowledge about the program," said Presley.

## Large Amount of Meth Found on Traffic Stop

On October 3rd Tishomingo County Narcotic Investigators and deputies from the sheriff's office, conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle leaving a business in the Town of Tishomingo. This particular vehicle and its occupants have been part of an ongoing drug investigation being conducted by the Narcotic Investigators. During the course of the traffic stop, deputies discovered that

the driver and passenger had alleged methamphetamine on their persons. It was also discovered that the passenger had an amount so large for an enhancement charge to be brought against him by the investigators. Both the driver and passenger were transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

# Morris - Page Wedding Set for October 12th

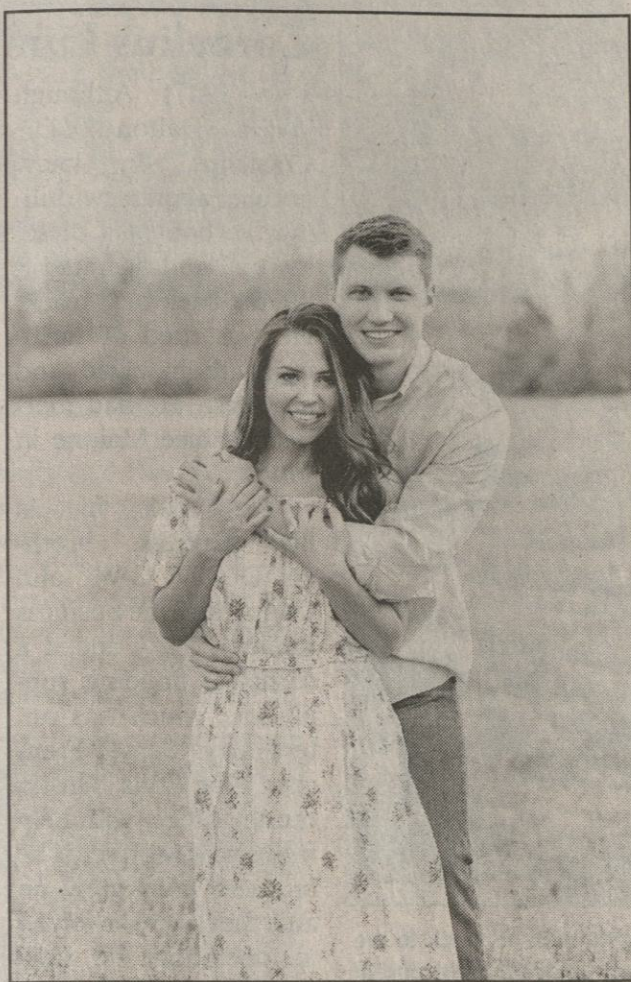

## Cornelius Lumber Company a Thriving Business in Margerum, Alabama

If you are old enough to remember going to Cherokee on the old one lane Hwy. 72, then you remember seeing Cornelius Lumber Company in its hey day. Martha Couch of Cherokee is sharing these wonderful photos from the early years at Cornelius. She said most of the info and photos came

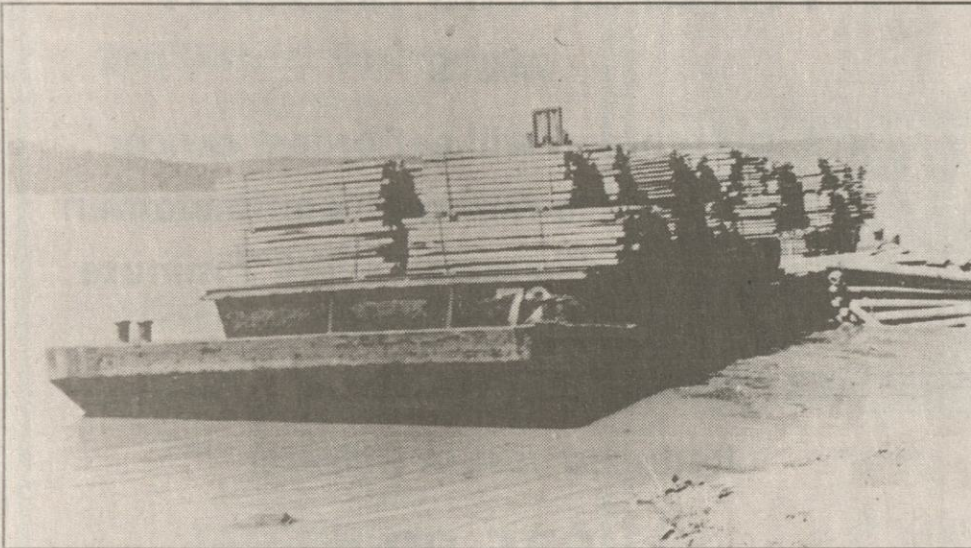
from Bernice Cornelius.

### Cornelius Lumber Company

(1947) Although William Dalton "W.D." Cornelius, Jr. knew nothing about saw milling, he bought a diesel sawmill and operated it off the back of a truck. He was tired of farming with his Dad and brothers. He had married Bernice Malone in 1946.

He took in as his partners, brothers Dewey, C.W., and Glenn, and the business thrived. They added a complete building supply line, which was run by Harry "Sarge" Francis. Flor Edna Vinson ran the office, with help from Jane McKee. The brothers' sons grew up and they were involved in operating the sawmill. When W.D. died, his son Sonny and Dewey's son, Danny bought out the business in the 80's and ran it. Then Danny's son, Lee even worked at the mill. So many of the Cornelius family, including cousins worked there. It was at one time a large operation. Trucks of logs would line up on the side of the highway, waiting for their turn to unload. They ran the mill two shifts, working late into the night. When they cranked those saws up in the early mornings,

people in Margerum knew it was time to get up. Then at night the sound of the saws running would lull them to sleep.

The mill is still in operation, but on a much smaller scale. It is operated by Sonny Cornelius and his son Dee (William D. Cornelius IV) They have abandoned the old building and have a smaller office building in the corner, next to the elementary school. Jane McKee is there to help with office work and just retired recently.

A worker from the beginning was Goodloe, who lived in the blue house just off the old Sonic spot. He helped with everything that needed to be done at the mill. He was a grade lumber operator, looking after the workers, and could be seen at the mill taking the children to their school activities. He never retired. He cut back his hours to help take care of his ailing wife, Frankie.

## Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 34)

Ecclesiastes 7:9 says, "Be not hasty in thy spirit to be angry: for anger resteth in the bosom of fools." This short verse has volumes of good information in it, if we will only study it closely and follow it carefully! We all have likely heard the old adage: "Haste makes waste", but most of us have likely failed to follow the advise of Solomon concerning haste in our spirits. Our verse says that we should not be hasty to become angry. That very thought brings up another matter; it is that we seem to think that we cannot control anger, but that is a wrong thought. If God inspired the writer of Ecclesiastes to tell us not to be hasty in our spirits to be angry, then there has to be a way that

we can keep from being hasty in our spirits. We are looking at the spirit of man, not the Spirit of God, in our verse. Now we know that we can have something to do with whether or not we are "short-fused" in our tempers. If God tells us, through Solomon, not to be "quick tempered", or "hasty in our spirits to be angry", then we can find a way to stop "flying off the handle" at things people say or do. I read a statement years ago that said we should count to ten very slowly before we become angry.

That might sound like an impossibility, but it is not, for I have tried it. The problem most of us have is that we become angry sometimes without even thinking about what we are doing, but we do not have to do that. Perhaps much of our anger comes from a fear that someone is about to take advantage of us, so we try to stop the problem before it starts by becoming angry. The admonition is that we should learn to think before we act, which may give most of us a challenge, but it can be done.

Next Solomon tells us that anger rests in the bosom of fools. The idea here is that some people simply allow anger to remain in their minds, thus often coming out in their actions. It should be understood that some of us may have "short fuses", but the question is: do we have to be short-fused? I am 75 years old and bumping 76 pretty hard, and I will readily admit that I have had too many times that I have "flown off the handle" about certain things, but as I have become older I have learned that I did not necessarily have to allow my temper to rage. I have learned that there are better ways to handle situations. I am not saying that we should never become angry about anything,

for that is not true, for God Himself becomes angry at some things. I am saying that we often get angry when there is no need to do so. We sometimes are angered at statements that are not meant the way we take them, or even situations that are not really like we suppose them to be. Our writer is telling us also that we should not allow anger to "rest in our bosoms", or we should not hold onto anger and give it a place of residence in our minds and hearts. We can turn things over to God and let Him handle even our enemies and the things that they have done to us, after all, He is better at handling our problems than we are!

## Are You Stressed Out?

The American Psychological Association reports Americans are stressed about money.

Stress about money and finances appears to have a significant impact on Americans' lives according to the Association. Nearly three quarters (72 percent) of adults report feeling stressed about money at least some of the time and nearly one-quarter say that they experience extreme stress about money (22 percent rate their stress about money during the past month as an 8, 9, or 10 on a 10-point scale). In some cases, people are even putting their health care needs on hold because of financial concerns.

Nearly one in five Americans say that they have either considered skipping or skipped going to the doctor in the past year when they needed health care because of financial concerns.

The United States is the world's richest country, with a gross domestic product nearly double that of the runner up, yet our economic inequality is among the highest in the world. The Great Recession may have officially ended, but most American households face stagnant wages and increasing debt - many Americans are actually considered to be poorer than they were a decade ago.

Our worries over money are creating a more stressful nation. Americans are working for wages sometimes as low as \$7.50 an hour as one person recently reported to me. Thus, many Americans are working longer hours and sometimes two jobs to just pay the rent and buy food. Many senior adults are working into their eighties so they can buy groceries and pay on their medical bills.

Our stress level is detrimental to our health. Bad health does not make us feel like working more, leads to depression, inactivity and drug and alcohol dependency.

According to Dr. Robert Waldinger, a psychiatrist at Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard University, stress causes anxiousness, nervousness, distraction, excessive worry, internal pressure and changes in sleep patterns. These emotional states can then begin to affect a person's outward appearance. Someone who is stressed out may appear unusually anxious, distracted, self-absorbed, irritable or angry. If stress lasts a long time the results are excessive fatigue, depression, thoughts of suicide, headaches, nausea and vomiting, chest pain or pressure, heart racing, dizziness, restlessness, shortness of breath and more.

If you are chronically stressed, Waldinger, has some suggestions for one, exercise. Federal health officials recommend 30 minutes of moderate aerobic activity every day.

Daily prayer or meditation can make a big difference. An old song says, «Oh what peace we often forfeit, oh what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer.»

Waldinger also states the importance of breathing. «Watch your breathing; people who get upset a lot breathe very rapidly and shallowly and it creates more anxiety. Breathing slowly from the abdomen helps slow the stress response,» he says.

Waldinger said, «Don't overdo alcohol. An extra drink seems to relax you but will only disturb your sleep and will act as a depressant.»

Since money is such an American issue be on the lookout for a better paying job and be willing to prepare, train, educate and even relocate in order to move up in the financial pay scale. Do not take your financial situation as being final. Many senior adults into their eighties work 10 to 30 hours a week to stay active and to keep food on the table.

Be aggressive and don't let stress rob you of a quality life.

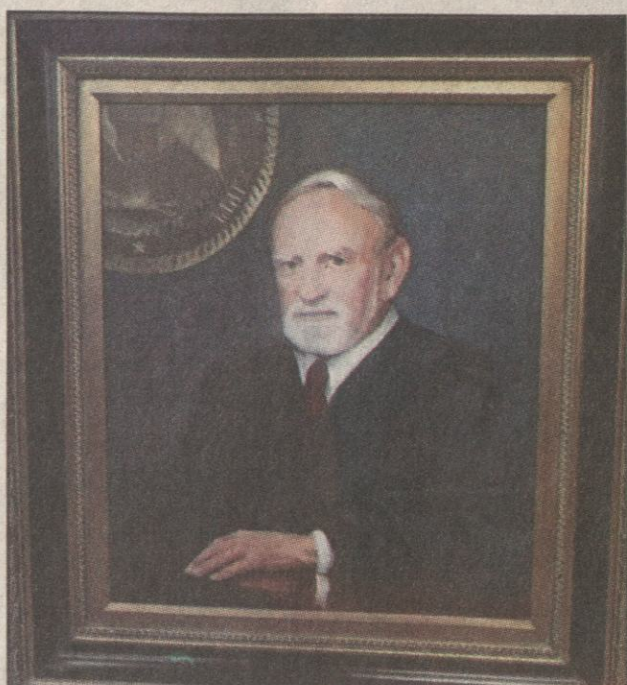


# A Recollection about the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse

During the course of my sixth grade school year, our teacher, "Miss Mamie" Clark, instilled in our class several things, including a love of literature, a disciplined approach to grammar, and an abiding interest in what was going on outside the walls of our classroom. These first two components of our education were centered around classroom work, but the third one required attention to what was going on in the wider world. We were encouraged to follow the news and to attend events beyond the school grounds. One thing in particular that Miss Mamie said we should do was to attend some sessions of law court.

Consequently, during the following summer, I spent several days at the old Tishomingo County Courthouse observing a term of circuit court. Because there was no air conditioning in the building at that time, the windows in the upstairs courtroom were kept open while the ceiling fans did their best to stir the heavy summer air in the large room. Highway 72 passed in front of the courthouse and the Southern Railroad lay a short distance behind it, so between the car and truck traffic on one side and freight and passenger trains on the other, it was often difficult to hear what was being said by the

judge and lawyers.

The circuit judge at that time was N.S. "Soggy" Sweat. As I came to learn much later, Judge Sweat was a legend in his own time, having received the Distinguished Flying Cross for military service in World War II and then serving in the state legislature and as district attorney before assuming the judicial bench. He held a master's degree in law from George Washington University (an academic achievement virtually unheard of at that time in Northeast Mississippi) and had studied internationally at The Hague as well as in France and England. After his tenure as judge, Soggy (as he later insisted that I address him) would

go on have a distinguished teaching career at the Ole Miss Law School where he was instrumental in developing several new programs.

From my perspective though as a twelve year old, I just thought Soggy was cool. At that time, he drove a snazzy convertible (with the top down, weather permitting) and his attractive court reporter traveled with him around the district. He was, in my estimation, the cat's meow. With bushy eyebrows, a shock of blond hair that matched the color of sorghum tassels (hence his nickname "Soggy"), and a mien that ranged from a stern judicial scowl to a charming smile, he was quite impressive.

Yet while he stood favorably in my estimation against any make-believe judge on television, the setting for his holding court was not up to par with what I had seen on television. The judge's bench looked to be a small wooden desk over which hung a single unadorned light bulb, suspended from

the ceiling and providing scarce illumination to the judge and litigants. The bare wood courtroom floor squeaked even when tiptoeing newcomers tried to quietly find a seat, constantly providing an additional distraction to the participants in the hearings.

The most disappointing part of my trying to observe the goings on that summer was the quiet conversations around the judge's bench that were inaudible to my young ears, especially considering the competing noises of traffic, trains, and squeaking floors. Yet even though the courtroom was not what I expected from having been groomed on "Perry Mason," it was for me a place of dignity, steeped in history, and it continues to rest secure in a special corner of my memories.

Just a few years after my visit, the county built a new facility, allowing the old courthouse to become a well-maintained museum preserving

various parts of local history. Fortunately, the building is now heated and cooled, but the courtroom exists very much as I remember it from that summer of 1963, with creaking floor boards and vintage furniture. The building's ground floor, which housed county offices originally, now offers a number of different displays about local history, several of which are rotated on a regular basis.

## Old Courthouse Museum

The museum is open 9:30 to 4:30 Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and 9 to 12 on Saturdays. The Tishomingo

County Historical Society, which maintains the old courthouse, is sponsoring a production of "Twelve Angry Men" by Reginald Rose. The play will be staged in the old courtroom at 7 p.m. on Thursday, October 19. Advance tickets are available by calling 662-421-1111 anytime during business hours. Ticket price is \$5 for students and \$10 for adults.
