



forward by providing our officers with body cameras and Tasers. These items were purchased with moneys from grants or through the drug fund, not costing the taxpayer. We have also upgraded our vehicles, and by doing this it helps us to patrol more of the county and do our jobs more efficiently. Deputies are all provided uniforms, and I feel that this makes the department look more professional and helps you to more easily identify them as officers. We also have a new upgraded computer system that has a central server that all jail information and Deputies reports go on. This helps us to report to the FBI which is required by law. This system has helped us to stay in compliance with state and federal law. It also helps us to be eligible for grant programs. We have a new system called Leads on Line that has access to pawn shops and metal recycling businesses. This helps us to find stolen items that may have been sold or pawned locally or out of state. This system has helped us solve several cases already.

We have worked hard to have a great relationship with all the police departments, the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics, the FBI and many others, including neighboring Alabama and Tennessee. We are moving the Sheriff's Department in the right direction. We have Deputies who truly care for the people, and treat the citizens with the respect that they deserve. We work with the neighborhood watch programs in the county by presenting programs for their meetings when requested. We also sponsor and support the DARE program that is in all of our schools. This is education about drug use. It is priceless.

We work on the drug problem with almost every call we go on, so every officer in the department is trained in handling drug cases. We have been able to obtain a K-9 to assist us in finding drugs. We also work hand in hand with the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics to try and stop the sale of drugs in this county. We also work with Churches and local programs and the drug court system to help people that are addicted to drugs that are charged with simple possession to get treat-

We have worked hard to regain your trust in our Without department. your help we cannot be successful. I strive to be a Sheriff that you can be proud of, by working hard, and treating people fairly and with respect, and using common sense law enforcement for everyone. #### Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 37)

Ecclesiastes 7:13-14 says, "Consider the work of God: for who can make that straight, which He hath made crooked? In the day of prosperity be joyful, but in the day of adversity consider: God also hath set the one over against the other, to the end that man should find nothing after him." I never cease to be amazed at the thoughts of men, for many seem to think that God is some soft, easy going push over God, with no ability to change the things that men determine to do. Nothing could be further from the truth. While it is true that God does give men many choices, and even allows them to make choices that are against His will, yet there are certain things that God has decreed, or determined, to do, and men can-

not change these. This is what King Solomon had in mind when he wrote the things that we are reading here. There is no way that men can determine the outcome of their own sins, for God has already determined that those who never repent of their sins will wind up in the lake of fire, and nobody can change that. On the other hand, God has determined that all who put their trust in Jesus Christ for salvation will have a home with Him in His heavenly kingdom forever, and none can change that! So, we are called upon to con-

sider the work of God and the fact that men cannot change what God has done, or determined to do. We would be wise to keep considering the work that God is still doing today.

Now we come to a verse that says we should rejoice in the day of prosperity, so this lets us know that it is not wrong for one to prosper, as long as he is allowing God to be the One Who directs him in the times of prosperity. God has not determined that everybody should forever be poor, but He has allowed some to be poor, and yet be godly. On the other hand, God has allowed some to be rich, and yet to be godly. The problem that men have is that some seek to judge others for their great wealth, while others judge men for their poverty. Both judgments are wrong, for wealth is not necessarily wrong, and poverty is not necessarily a sign of God's judgment, or a lack of faith on the part of the poor. We are called upon to consider also that days of adversity may come, and likely will, so that we should seek to learn more about God's ways during such times. Moreover, we should understand that God Himself has determined to set prosperity and adversity one beside another, so that we will learn that man really has no wealth that is lasting, unless he has decided to trust Christ for salvation and to make his investments in heaven's bank, where neither moth nor rust can corrupt them, and thieves cannot break in and steal them (Matthew 6:20). So, should some of my readers be having a good time in life, I would say, "Hold on, for bad times will finally come". those having a bad time, I would say, you know Christ, hold on, for good times are bound to come at some point in the future" By J. Here are a few things I would like to implement that would benefit us one of the first things we need to work on is a fair division of the budget. The manner in which each district gets there working capital is stacked against us as we have the most miles to maintain in the lowest budget to work with, I would like to propose a division obudget based on the miles served, this is the only fair way to determine he funds are distributed our roads are a major concern to mostly everyone in the district and rightfully so, we have a major problems with our road systems. Asphalt is nice for sure, but this district first of all can't afford the price of the pr

per mile that it cost to lay asphalt, not with the condition and miles we have in need of repair. Asphalt cost approximately \$120,000 per mile. We should using the chip and seal method in order to cover the most miles possible, because we sure

have many miles in need. We could cover approximately 3 miles with chip in seal compared to the cost of 1 mile of asphalt.

I think it would be better to have the entire road in a new fresh topcoat all the way through than to just have short patches of asphalt here and there. Location and cost are always an important factor in choosing where and what to build. I would have repaired/replaced the three bridges we have that are unusable which are: Joel cemetery and the two on Crows Neck Road, before installing a very expensive bridge where the existing bridge is still usable. If elected, I will start our year out with a clean ditch project, this is very much needed and way past due. The dormancy of the grass during the winter months should make it much easier for us to clean out the debris so when the weather permits it, that would be a priority. We would also maintain service and maintain records on every piece of equipment the district owns.

These records would show tire rotations, oil changes, part replacements, etc. would also like to keep a file of anyone in the district who is looking for a job so I can contact them when jobs become available. I will work hard to make sure our Volunteer FIREFIGHTERS have good safe equipment. We have a great group of guys that work hard and give their time unselfishly to protect us and I completely support them. As you can see from this list there is much work ahead and many challenges for this district. I did not take my choice to run for supervisor lightly I know the job is vast, but I am ready to accept this challenge. I will be completely dedicated to serving the 4th district in every capacity, to build better roads, makes certain our bridges are safe, apply for a grant money and work closely with our State Representatives in our State and National Senators to ensure we get any and everything available to assist us in making our community the very best it can be. 


