College and Career Readiness Students Visit Local Industries

Iuka, Mississippi. Tishomingo County High School College and Career Readiness Students Addison Hamm, Gracie Curtis, Bailee Bonds, Courtney Byrd, Haylee Compton, Ashton Hewitt, Kelsey Owens, Chloe Holloway, Jonathan Price, Instructor Amy Dotson, and Counselor Ken Nunley visited Iuka Automotive and Skyline Steel on November 1.



Iuka Automotive located in Tishomingo County in 2015 is the first Iuka Automotive manufacturing facility outside of Germany. Iuka Automotive manufactures stamped metal parts for the transportation industry, primarily BMW.

Iuka Automotive began its apprenticeship program in 2018. Joshua Johnson, Tristan Daniel and Dakota Tucker, all graduates of Tishomingo County schools, have signed a four year agreement with Iuka Automotive to begin as apprentices in order to learn highly technical trade skills for industry. Joshua will apprentice in the area of Tool & Die Making while Tristan and Dakota will join the Industrial Maintenance & Me-

chatronics department.

In conjunction with fully paid course study at Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville, each apprentice will receive paid on-the-job training under the direction of seasoned journeymen at Iuka Automotive. They will also be given opportunities to train at various related businesses throughout the US and abroad as relevant to their department. Upon successful completion of the program, each participant will have obtained a minimum of an Associate Degree and a nationally recognized certificate from the Department of Labor for their accomplishments.

The newly formed Youth Apprentice Program at Iuka Automotive was organized as a

workforce development initiative to encourage students between the ages of 16 - 23 years old to pursue careers in the areas of Tool & Die Making, Quality Management, or Industrial Maintenance & Mechatronics. David Quigley, Iuka's COO, states: "We understand that the success of our business is largely dependent upon the employees and are excited to be implementing this apprenticeship program within the organization. A strong curriculum in conjunction with practical experience in the automotive industry is invaluable to both the student as well as the organization. We look forward to being an active

Local Student Named Semifinalists in the 2020 National Merit Scholarship Program

Officials of National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) announced the names of approximately 16,000 semifinalists in the 65th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. Belmont High School senior, Sam Horn, has been chosen as a National Merit Semifinalist. These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for some 7,600 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$1 million that will be offered next spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship award, semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the finalist level of the competition. About 90 percent of the semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and about half of the Finalists will win a

National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholarship title. NMSC, a not-for-profit organization that operates without government assistance, was established in 1955 specifically to conduct the annual National Merit Scholarship Program. Scholarships are underwritten by NMSC with its own funds and by approximately 400 business organizations and higher education institutions that share NMSC's goals of honoring the nation's scholastic champions and encouraging the pursuit of academic excellence.

This distinction is achieved when students taking the PSAT score in the top 1% of students nationally. Semifinalists are then eligible to apply for National Merit Final-

Iuka Man Arrested With Heroin and Meth

On November 9th Tishomingo County Sheriff Deputies along with the Mississippi Highway Patrol (MHP), set up a Safety Check-Point on highway 72 in the Iuka area. Clyde Richardson was arrested at a driveway near the checkpoint.

During the check-point, a vehicle pulled into a driveway before reaching the check-point and the subjects got out of the vehicle. Deputies then pulled up and observed some used needles inside the vehicle and the occupants claimed the paraphernalia and were arrested.

A search was then conducted on the vehicle which turned up a large amount of alleged heroin. This alleged heroin appeared to be laced with fentanyl. Deputies also discovered a bag of alleged methamphetamine in the vehicle as well. After interviewing the occupants, the owner of the vehicle, Richardson was

arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Clyde Richardson, 49-year-old, white male of Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (heroin) and the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Richardson's bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$30,000.

Richardson is currently under another felony bond for a previous drug charge from the end of October. Investigators are currently in the process of having Richardson previous bond revoked by the District Attorney's Office.

Pet of the Week

Congratulations to Prince Pookie Jones! This handsome guy is our Pet of the Week here at Iuka Animal Clinic. Prince Pookie's proud parents are Robert and Carol Jones and here are a few things they have to say about him. Pookie is a Maine Coon and we got him in Arkansas. Pookie is 3 1/2 years old and is a real joy to us. He's very smart and understands commands very well. Maine Coons are often referred to as the dog of the cat world. He even growls like a dog when he feels threatened. Maine Coons are considered one of the largest domestic cats there is. He weighs close to 20 lbs. He is also a polydactyl which means he has extra toes. Seven on each front paw and five on the back paws. In other words he has big feet. He likes to ride in the car sitting on the middle console so he can see out better. His favorite toy is a stuffed bear which he carries around like a kitten. He loves to be chased and will chase you back. He's lots of fun and we love him lots.

It's almost Thanksgiving, and for pet owners that means in addition to thinking about how we'll handle our own activities over the holiday, we need to be aware of how our pets will deal with it too. This can be a hectic time, with more people in the house than usual, so it's important to think about these things beforehand. Always be careful about giving turkey to your pet. If you decide to give your pet a little bit of turkey, make sure it is completely cooked and has no bones. Do not offer raw or undercooked turkey, which may contain salmonella. If your pet is on a

diet or has food allergies, avoid giving any "people" food to them and keep them on their regular feeding schedule so it will not upset their stomach. Be aware of what's not safe to feed your pet. Just because it's okay for you to eat doesn't mean it's okay for your pet. For instance, onions, garlic, sage, and grapes aren't good for pets; uncooked bread dough can expand in the stomach and cause abdominal pain; and things like corn and bread are difficult for them to digest.

Ask your vet for lists of what foods your pet can and can't have, and when in doubt, don't let them have it. If you feel bad about depriving them of a treat, have extra pet-friendly treats on hand. 

One night, I awoke in the middle of the night when car lights shone into my bedroom window. It was Alta and Lou and they awoke everyone when they announced they had a swimming pool. It wasn't a little wading pool. They began setting it up in the back yard. Did I tell you it was the middle of the night? It took hours to fill it with water, but the wait was worth it all.

Once they took four of us girls home with them after Christmas. It took us 10 hours to get there in the snow. We stayed in a hotel in Downtown Memphis. We spent a whole day shopping for complete outfits at Goldsmith's, going to Enchanted Forest, and having dinner at the Peabody. We equally spent time dancing on Lou's feet, eating flaming desserts, and tipping the lady in the restroom for hiding us a warm towel.

They sent our parents money for the three youngest girls to come visit them in Phoenix. We left Iuka on a bus on Tuesday afternoon and arrive Friday morning at the Phoenix bus station. I spent my tenth birthday in Nogales, Mexico. They took us to amusement parks, ice-skating, swimming, water rafting, movies, a play, and so much more. Unselfishly, Alta, Lee, and Shirley exposed us to as many great experiences and travel as possible! We

were most richly blessed thanks to all of you!

Several years ago, Alta married Cliff and they now reside in Iuka, where they have become a staple in the community. Cliff was a veteran, (Thank you for your service) and a firefighter. He also had traveled the world as the owner and operator of an eighteen-wheeler. They can now often be enticed to visit us at the beach, but it can't usurp firefighters' monthly dinners, the Red Hat meetings, or visits from their many neighbors, children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.

Alta, or Mrs. Alta, as I heard many locals call her, has had many illnesses throughout her life. She was diagnosed with small veins and had to have first one leg and then another amputated. For years after that, we spent much time on the phone. She calls me or I call her almost daily. I often teased her about being the "bionic" woman because she's had so many surgeries. I accused her of getting all new parts, so she could outlive me, jokingly, since she's the oldest and I'm the youngest in our family of eight children. Sometimes, I just call her to hear her smiling voice and upbeat spirit.

Most recently, she frequents a senior center in Cherokee. There are fewer phone calls and visits these days. She calls her trips to the center her "JOB". She has accumulated many new friends. For months, I avoided her many invitations to the center, thinking that I wouldn't enjoy a place like that. I was so wrong. This summer, I joined her and Cliff there for lunch, and I didn't want to leave. I've been back since and I will go again. The people are wonderful and make one feel really welcome as soon as you enter the door.

My sisters' "new job" is playing pool. When she first began, they were the recipient of someone's older table, I supposed, had been hand-me-

down, or something like that. Now they have a new pool table, and Alta is the only woman who plays while the others quilt or make wreaths or other such activities. Her husband, Cliff, and the guys alternate playing games with her, and she is often the winner! Imagine that, a woman pool champ from Iuka! The guys have an advantage over her. They can stand and walk, but she can still beat them, sometimes! Isn't that cool?

A couple of months ago, Alta called to tell me my son, Paul, had sent her a new pool cue! (WOW, I thought, and why didn't I think of that and I'm so proud my son did that nice deed!) Alta wanted me to order her a matching cover on Amazon, which I did. A few days later, she called and asked me to order her some chalk, hot pink, of course, to match the pool stick and the cover! What a lady! What a picture! What a reinvention of her life!

Yesterday, my sister, Alta, turned 83! She still has her high energy and high spirits! I told her we must celebrate every year alike we did when she was 30, 40, etc. (Excuse me, I forgot that she was "29" for several decades.) She's a beautiful soul who has reinvented herself with each new decade. In this, her fourth season of the game, I consider her an asset in my life, in our family, in her church, in her club activities, and also in the lives of all she has touched in Iuka and in the world.

I love you, Alta, my sister, who sends me multiple cards for my birthday and silly gifts all year long! Thank you for being my sister and my friend. You have taught us love of family, community, and spirit.



Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 40)

Perhaps more sins are committed by the words that our tongues speak than any other thought or action in our lives. Ecclesiastes 7:21-22 will give us some help concerning this matter: "Also take no heed unto all words that are spoken; lest thou hear thy servant curse thee. For oftentimes also thine own heart knoweth that thou thyself likewise hast cursed others." I remember visiting as a pastor in a hospital in Illinois where I heard a young man crying in the hallway. When I asked him what was wrong, he said, "My father just told me off and talked to me like I was a dog". I asked, "Is your father

under medication? He replied, "Oh yes, he is under strong medication." Then I assured him that this was the "medicine talking", for he had told me that his father had never talked to him in this way. Our problem, however, is that we have likely spoken unkind words when we were not medicated! When I told the young man what I thought, he did what our writer here said, for he "took

no heed to all words that had been spoken". We can let some words just "roll off our backs" and go on with our business. First, because all of us have said some things that we really did not mean, and would not have said them, except we were hurt and looking for someone to blame for our hurt. Our writer, Solomon, said that one might even hear his servant curse him, thus if he took heed to

such words, there might be a confrontation with the servant that would bring more harm than good.

Now Solomon "plows closer to the corn", as an old adage says, for he comes to apply his teaching to his readers, which would include you and me. Notice that Solomon says that our hearts know that we have sometimes cursed others. We may hide things from other people, but we cannot hide them from God, nor can we hide them from our own hearts and minds. When our writer uses the word "curse", he is not necessarily speaking of the wrong use of God's

name, or some other word that is commonly called a curse word, although we should not use these, of course. The word "cursed" is a word that means in the Hebrews language: "to make light; (to speak sharply or swiftly)". It is translated: "to bring into contempt, despise, lightly esteem or to revile". So, one may curse others by simply saying words that make the other person seem less or insignificant in the eyes of others. Our hearts know that we have sometimes spoken inappropriately of others, and perhaps thought little about it, until another person who might know the

"cursed" better we, might speak up and put us in our place. The best thing for any of us to do is to refrain from speaking badly about others, rather we should go to the person who may have a rift with us and tell him about the problem. This was taught clearly in Matthew 18:15-18. Perhaps the best practice would be for us to find a good thing in the person whom we might be tempted to "badmouth" and to tell the good thing to someone else.



Some people go back and forth like an on-again-off-again relationship until they finally break the habit, and some people plan to quit. They pick a day and make a conscious decision to make that day the last day they use tobacco again.

Getting help through counseling and medications doubles or even triples your chances of quitting smoking successfully," said Amy Winter, Director of the Office of Tobacco Control at the Mississippi State Department of Health. "Research shows that people who smoke are most successful in their efforts to stop smoking when they get support."

The American Cancer Society marks the Great American Smokeout Thursday, November 21 (the third Thursday of November each year) as a time for tobacco users to quit, not just for 24 hours but forever. It's a time for tobacco users to receive encouragement from community groups, businesses and health care providers. If that encouragement is accompanied by tools to help make the journey easier, they're more likely to be successful in quitting, but more likely to stay tobacco-free.

Some of those support methods to quit smoking include: the Mississippi Tobacco Quitline, the American Cancer Society Freshstart Program, nicotine anonymous groups, self-help books and materials, smoking counselors or coaches, and encouragement and support from friends and family members.

Using multiple methods to quit smoking works better than only using one," said Dr. Palmer Director of the Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties. "Some people use a prescription along with nicotine replacement. There are others that may use as many as three or four of the methods. Consult your doctor to choose an approach that works for you."


