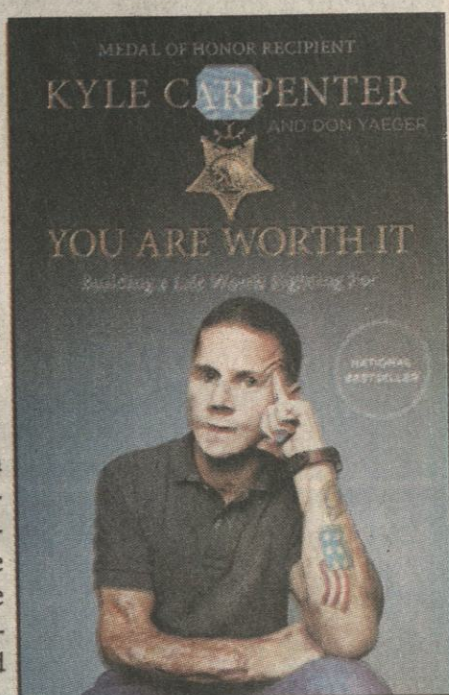

WHAT THE LULA McNUTT FAMILY DID DURING WORLD WAR II. Article 10

Jerrell L. McNutt

Introduction. Our family of seven boys and three girls were born and raised in Tishomingo County, Mississippi. I am Jerrell the youngest and only surviving member of the family. I will be writing an article about each one of us.

I am Jerrell Lester McNutt and I was born in 1926 at Dennis, Mississippi. My Aunt Sara Byrum Blunt the oldest sister of my father was a Midwife. Her daughter in law Geraldine Byrum drove Aunt Sara from her home in Tishomingo to our farm home near Dennis in a model "T" Ford car. It was said that I gave a prophetic Yell when she



whacked me. I made my living yelling from the pulpit.

During World War II nineteen of us boys from Tishomingo Count got on a Bus at Iuka, Miss. Claude Curtis stood at the door of the bus and gave each one of us a Sil-

ver Dollar. We were sworn in the Army and sent to Camp Gordon at Augusta, Georgia for infantry training. I developed measles and sent to a hospital. I let Carl Medley have my silver dollar because I needed tooth paste. Carl was an all-state basketball player but a terrible CRAP shooter. He lost my dollar in a crap game.

Our troop ship was taking the northern route across the Pacific. Several soldiers were on the bow of the ship enjoying the warm sun when a huge wave hit the ship. Two men were washed overboard. We circled the area for about two hours but

never found them. Then our ship had to alter its course and go to Pearl Harbor and let the ten injured men get off.

After the Atomic Bombs were dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki the Japanese surrendered. General McArthur sent the 6th and 7th Divisions to Korea to round up the Jap soldiers and civilians in order to send them to Japan. Later on I was assigned to the 6th Infantry Division with headquarters at the port city of Pusan. I had not finished high school until I knew a little bit about typing. So sitting in a warm hut with a typewriter was much better than pulling guard duty in all kinds of cold

weather.

I was 6 months old when my father got killed. A wicked loan shark cheated our mother and us 10 children out of our farm at Dennis, Miss. All of us learned that it was not a sin to work. We rented three different farms and finally purchased a small farm at Midway, Miss in 1941 for \$1,200. I did the farming for two years by myself because my older brothers were in the military.

I got a high school Diploma by taking the GED test while in the Army. I earned a BA Degree at Mississippi College and two graduate Degrees from Southern Seminary and New Orleans Semi-

nary. I earned cation to teach

level theology.I was of Mt Joy Baptist Church in 1952. The greatest thing in my life was Vera Elizabeth Davis a Registered Nurse came my wife. two daughters and son; six grandchildren six great grandchildren will soon be 93 years and I am legally blind. Vera and I are very nate in that we live our daughter Linda Jones and her family are just a short distance from a gate that leads to Fort Gordon where my training during War II.

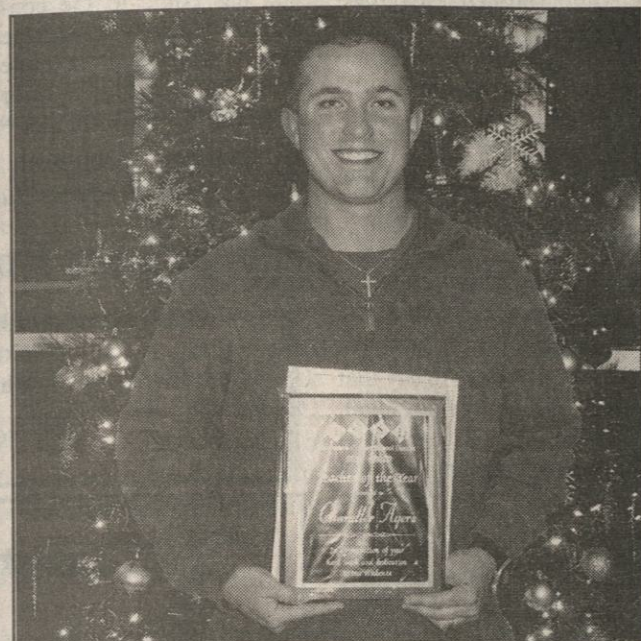

Adams County Man First to be Convicted of Possession of Dogs for Fighting Under Strengthened Mississippi Statute

Natchez, MS

In Defense of Animals has become a historic ruling on animals in Mississippi.

Thursday, November 7, 2018, court judge Debbie Blackwell presided over the felony case charged under

2018, strengthened Mississippi dog fighting (§ 97-41-19. Dog fighting.) Adams County Sheriff Travis Patten and his deputies made history with the conviction of Tommie Queen on three of the nine counts of dog fighting that he was charged with.

Speaking at the conclusion of the case, Sheriff Travis Patten said, "This case was actually historical for the state of Mississippi because it's the first time... that multiple counts of dog fighting has been charged and somebody has been found guilty of it. We don't want to see anybody go to jail, but at the end of the day people need to know that there are consequences for their actions... We are sworn to uphold and protect the rights of all, and that includes the animals as well... I hope it sends a message."

In November 2017, the Adams County Sheriff's Department responded to an early morning call to 129 1/2 Miracle Road concerning barking dogs. The call led to a three-day investigation culminating in the seizure of 54 dogs and the arrest of Tommie Queen for possessing dogs with the intent to fight them. The statute now allows for a count for each dog involved in a case of dog fighting, training dogs for fighting, and, or possession for dogs for fighting.

Testimony in the case Adams County

deputies involved in the case, ASPCA Criminal Investigator Kyle Held and Dr. Robert L. Savant of Natchez Veterinary Clinic, who aided with the on-site investigation, sealed Queen's fate.

After a two-day trial and four hours of deliberation by the jury, Tommie Queen was found guilty of possessing dogs for the intent to train and to fight them. There were 42 pieces of evidence introduced, including 12 15-lb. chains, medical supplies used for enhancing the strength of a fighting dog, and graphic photos of nine of the 54 dogs who were so seriously injured that they had to be euthanized, one with her lower jaw torn off, leaving little but necrotic flesh.

After sentencing, Queen was immediately taken into custody to begin his sentence of three three-year terms of imprisonment to be served consecutively.

In Defense of Animals' Justice for Animals Director Doll Stanley attended the two-day trial. Stanley was instrumental in aiding Senator Bob Dearing in the passage of his 2018 bill increasing the penalties for dog fighting and enabling law enforcement to charge suspects with multiple counts of cruelty. Stanley previously awarded the Adams County Sheriff's Dept. with **In Defense of Animals'** Humanitarian of the Year Award for

its role in dog fighting busts and other justice for animals cases.

Stanley said, "This was a truly horrific case and we thank Judge Blackwell for passing a meaningful sentence for so many dogs who suffered at Queen's hands for dog-fighting. More than 12,000 **In Defense of Animals** supporters have made it clear that they want to see justice done for dog fighting victims in Natchez. We are delighted to see strong animal laws enforced in Mississippi."

Sheriff Patten told Stanley, "They have to see the law get it right for the animal rights. Because the animals, they can't care for themselves; as people, we have to be better stewards over our animals. And if not, there are people like me and you (Doll Stanley) who are put in place who are going to demand and make sure that justice is sought out and today I think we saw that happen first hand."

In Defense of Animals has served in Mississippi for 26 years working with law enforcement, the judicial system, fellow advocates, advocates, and the public to strengthen Mississippi's animal protection laws and to provide training and resources for the betterment of Mississippi's animals.

I was asked recently to write an article about voting when I was growing up. To a little tom boyish girl it was just another day.

But, I do remember local, state and national elections about as long as I remember anything else. Bilbo, Huey Long, LA, George Wallace, Franklin Deleanor Roosevelt, (I have toured his home and there was no comparison to the Vanderbilt Mansion there on the Potomac River side in Hyde Park, N.Y.)

My grandpa Page would take off his hat, scratch his head and talk to the boys about voting for Bilbo (Loud Mouth Little Man.) His name is the first governor I remember hearing about. I, too, remember the name Roy Adams, and of course, the Hoover Days. Peddler Bonds ran a route once a week and with a few eggs Mom could buy pretty material for 5 cents a yard and sew me up a dress for 10 cents.

Sorry to digress, but to write of the Great Depression Days, or Hoover Days one has almost got to!

While we stood around each morning waiting for the dew to dry off, my Grandpa Page didn't work

but he always came and talked to his boys about voting and usually they listened. At this time, little did I know just how important the role of the legislatures, governor and President were.

My Dad always had an interest in the local politics. He did not make a big deal about it but we kids knew the names of Walter Wynn, S. Pace, Roy Adams, Bunch Stringer, George Strickland, the Epps and later Clarence Pace, Henry Marlar and O. T. Eaton. My Dad was honored by his brothers, Millard and Olen Page. If "Rob" said for them to vote for "such and such" they did.

The women didn't vote when I was growing up. Oh, maybe a few but the average middle class couldn't afford \$2.00, which was the poll tax fee - Remember; \$2.00 would buy lots of material. I was a freshman before I had a ready-made dress. Why? I was receiving the gold watch for the highest grade in Home Economics at graduation - 1940-1941.

Communications? No radio, no TV, no daily paper. We received the Vidette and my brother sold the weekly Grit. He peddled it out on his bicycle for 5 cents a copy.

He rode a bicycle at this time - yes, he rode in a lumber truck with Dad's first cousin for a week. The pay? A bicycle. He though he had earned it. No jealousy among the other children at all. He had worked to earn it.

When in Grade 8, Mr. Carl Hendrix at Cripple Deer, a little one-room teacher school with a teacher with a great zeal to teach, taught us the importance of voting, about our state and nation's leaders. Then in Mr. W. R. Nettle's class in high school these gems were reinforced. Of course, by this time, we were in World War II. By then, we had radios but the Vidette was what had kept the people of Tishomingo and surrounding counties informed on what was going on in our county as well as important state news as well for over 130 years it has keep people informed!

I couldn't leave out that a popular novel was imbedded in us each week. Also, different newsletters telling of what had happened in the various communities. Sometimes, it was hilarious, but we still took, read and enjoyed the Vidette.

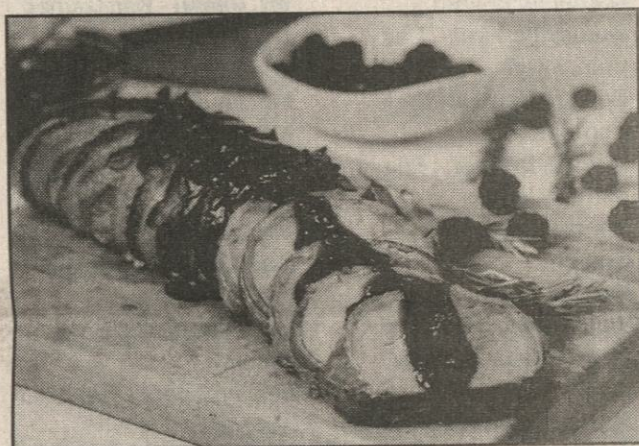

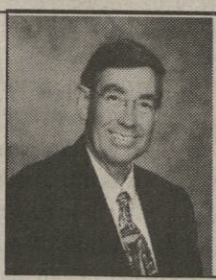


Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 42)

The man who had 700 wives and 300 concubines, according to I Kings 11:1-3, wrote some interesting words in Ecclesiastes 7:26-29: "And I find more bitter than death the woman, whose heart is snares and nets, and her hands as bands: whoso pleaseth God shall escape from her; but the sinner shall be taken by her. Behold, this have I found, saith the preacher, counting one by one, to find the account: Which yet my soul seeketh, but I find not: one man among a thousand have I found; but a woman among all those have I not found. Lo, this only have I found, that God hath made man upright; but they have sought out many inventions." With all of his marriages to wives and concubines, Solomon came to disappointment with his relationships to these, for he said that their hearts were simply traps

to catch the unsuspecting. Their hands were like bands that bind those who have relationships with them. Then he said that those who please God will escape the traps that such women have set. The total picture of marriage is not as dark as Solomon painted it, for he did say that God had made a way of escape from such wrong relationship, but sinners would be taken by them. God did not intend for marriage to be with more than one man for one woman, but Solomon disobeyed this command. Genesis 2:24 says, "Therefore shall a man leave his

father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife; and they shall be one flesh." God could have made dozens of wives for Adam, but He made only one, thus setting the pattern for the rest of us. I realize that some people have missed God's will on this point, yet there is forgiveness. Yet I want to say to those now married that God wants you to stay married.

Solomon did not give "the last word" on marriage, for he was in a position to have poor insight into marriage and a bad taste in his mouth for it, because he had missed God's plan for

marriage! When Solomon "sifted through" his marriages and faced what they had netted him, he concluded that he had not found one woman among a thousand who was really loyal to him, but he did say that he had found one man in a thousand who was loyal as a friend. He was not speaking of any marital relationship with a man, but rather the trustworthiness of a man. This is not to say that many women are not loyal, trustworthy and godly, it is just that Solomon was not married to any who had these virtues! What he did learn was that even though God had originally made man (Adam and Eve) upright, they had sought out many inventions. This means that man has contrived many things that are not necessarily within the will of God. Though originally created without sin (Adam and Eve), yet man

has fallen from that state and has come to the conclusion in his mind that he can "work things out quite well" without any help or

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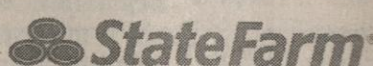

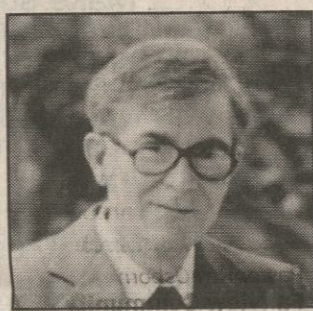

VIDEO SHOWS DANGER OF CHRISTMAS TREE FIRE

JACKSON, Miss. - Fire safety is important year-round, but there are specific tips to keep in mind at Christmas to protect you and your family.

On Tuesday, December 3, 2019, State Fire Academy officials and State Fire Marshal Mike Chaney demonstrated how fast a Christmas tree fire can get out of control. Smoke quickly fills the room, temperatures rise, and the fire spreads to nearby flammable material. Video of the fire may be viewed and downloaded here: <https://youtu.be/TmmCGOkGwI>

In 2019, 57 people have died in fires in Mississippi. That's compared to 66 at this time last year. In 84% of the cases in 2019, there were no working smoke alarms. A working smoke alarm cuts your risk of dying in a fire in half. If you need smoke alarms, ask your local fire department.

The State Fire Marshal Office, along with the Mississippi Insurance Department, recommends the following fire safety measures:

- Use holiday decorations made with flame-retardant or non-combustible materials.

- Carefully inspect new and previously used light strings and replace damaged items before plugging lights in.

- Use lights approved by Underwriter's Laboratories.

- Do not overload extension cords.
- Keep children and pets away from light strings and electrical decorations.

- Turn off all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

- Never use lit candles to decorate a tree, and make sure any lit candles in the room are placed away from tree branches.

- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.

- Try to keep live trees as moist as possible.

- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source.

- When entertaining, provide large, deep ashtrays for smokers. Wet cigarette butts with water before discarding.

- Take the tree down when it becomes dry. e by giving them plenty of water daily

- Recycle it, use it as a fish shelter in a farm pond or put it out with the trash.

- Do not burn a tree in the fireplace. Heat may explode the wood and set the room on fire.

- Unattended cooking is the leading cause of home fires in the United States, so stand by your pan when cooking.

- Have an approved fire extinguisher handy.

- Remove pans from the stove when not in use.

- Turn handles in so pots cannot be pulled off the stove.

- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even for a short amount of time, turn off the stove.

- Keep anything that can catch fire — oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from your stovetop.
