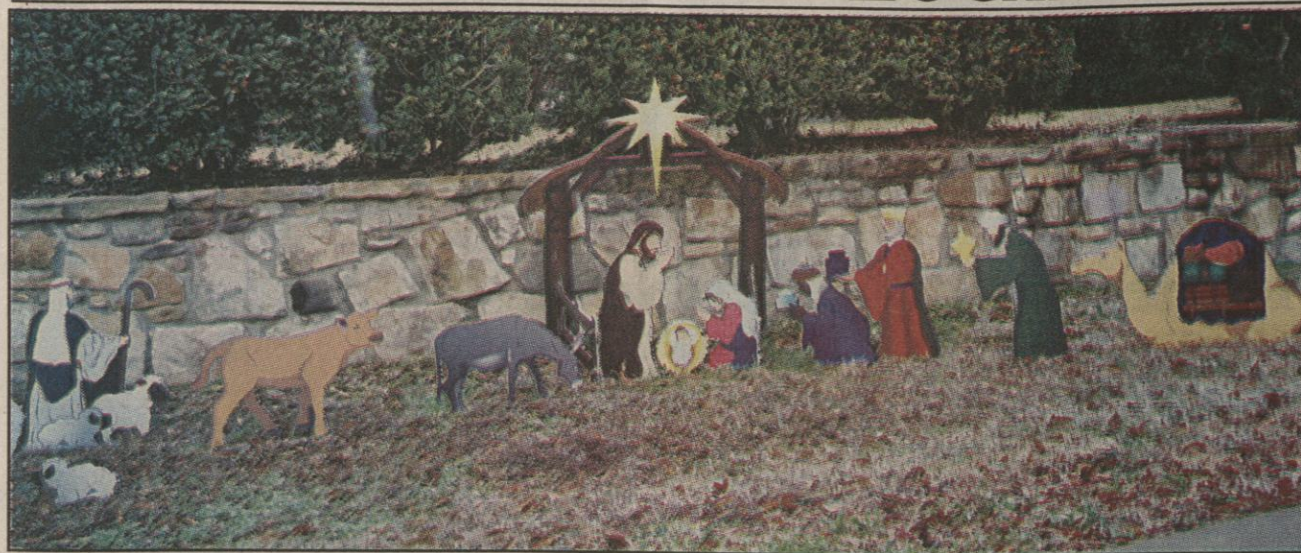

No Bake Peanut Butter Blossom

Ingredients

26 HERSHEY'S HUGS Brand Candies
1-1/2 cups REESE'S Peanut Butter Chips
1 cup HERSHEY'S SPECIAL DARK Mildly Sweet Chocolate Chips
1/2 cup honey
2 tablespoons unsalted butter
5 cups cornflake cereal

Directions

1. Line cookie sheet or tray with parchment paper. Remove wrappers from candies; set aside.
2. Place peanut butter chips, chocolate chips, honey and butter in large microwave-safe bowl. Microwave at HIGH (100%) 1 minute; stir. If necessary, microwave at HIGH an additional 30 seconds at a time, stirring after each heating, until chips are melted and mixture is blended when stirred. Gradually stir in cereal flakes, stirring until cereal is completely coated with the chip mixture.
3. Scoop 26 equal portions (about 1 tablespoon each) onto prepared sheet; shape into mounds. Place candy piece in center of each mound. Allow to firm about 30 minutes before serving. Store, covered in dry, cool place. Makes 26 cookies.

Routine Call Leads To Felony Arrest

On December 8th 2019, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies were at a local business and were checking a female for outstanding arrest warrants. The deputies noticed the boyfriend of the female was acting as if he was under the influence of some type of substance. Deputies checked Algirdas Kazlauskas and found a "pipe" that is commonly used to smoke methamphetamine in his pocket.

Kazlauskas was immediately arrested and a further search yielded a bag of alleged methamphetamine in the vehicle that was being driven by Kazlauskas; he was then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Algirdas Kazlauskas, 28-year-old, white male of Corinth, Mississippi was officially charged with the felony possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Kazlauskas' bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$2,800. Kazlauskas is currently on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) for a Felony drug conviction.

Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over

Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department to Participate in the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over Christmas/New Year's Campaign.

This Holiday season, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office will work around the clock to keep vehicle drivers and passengers safe as they search for drunk drivers. From Friday, December 13, 2019 to Wednesday, January 1, 2020, law enforcement is partnering with the Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) in the Christmas/New Year's Blitz Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over. This campaign focuses on getting drunk drivers off the streets and to spread the word about the dangers of impaired driving.

During this campaign, drivers will notice increased enforcement watching closely for any

one waho is driving paired," said Tishomingo County Sheriff John Daugherty "It is vital we keep our roads traveler's safe, not just the holidays, but every day. During this holiday season we will likely see an increase in drunk driving. We're resting anyone who has this life-saving law.

With today's campaign for getting home safe there's no excuse for driving behind the wheel paired as it endangers and everyone else on the road. Law enforcement recommends these alternatives to impaired driving: Designate a sober driver. If you're a drunk driver on the road, contact 911 or the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office at 662-423-7000.

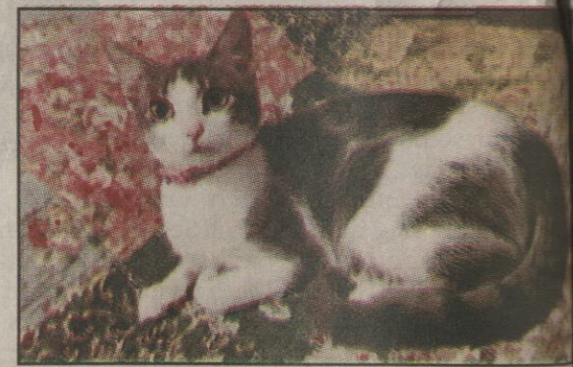

Pet of the Week



Congratulations to Gypsy Benefield! This pretty girl is our Pet of the Week here at Iuka Animal Clinic. Her owners are Morgan and David Benefield. Here are a few things they have to say about her: Gypsy came by her name very honest. She was just a little gypsy making her way around town until my husband found her and we decided to take her in. She was the tiniest of tinies. I didn't want a cat inside at first, but she stole my house key right off the ring and now I'm one cat short of crazy! We love her so much!

Spaying or neutering your animal is one of the best things you can do for your pet's health. Both surgeries are very routine and can be performed by a veterinarian on a cat as young as eight weeks of age depending on weight. Spaying or neutering your cat has many health benefits. Female cats are less likely to develop mammary gland tumors if they have been spayed. You can easily prevent mammary

tumor cancer by spaying your cat before her heat, which usually occurs around six months of age. Regular heat increases the amount of stress on your female body also, making her more prone to a variety of other illnesses, such as respiratory disease, pest infestation, and bacterial infection.

Neutering male cats before six months of age provides the greatest health benefit as well as male cats are aggressive and tend to fight other males, increasing the likelihood of getting serious injuries. Because neutered males are less likely to fight with other males they are at less risk of contracting contagious potentially fatal diseases such as feline leukemia and feline AIDS.

Russell - Henry Plan December 28th Wedding Vows

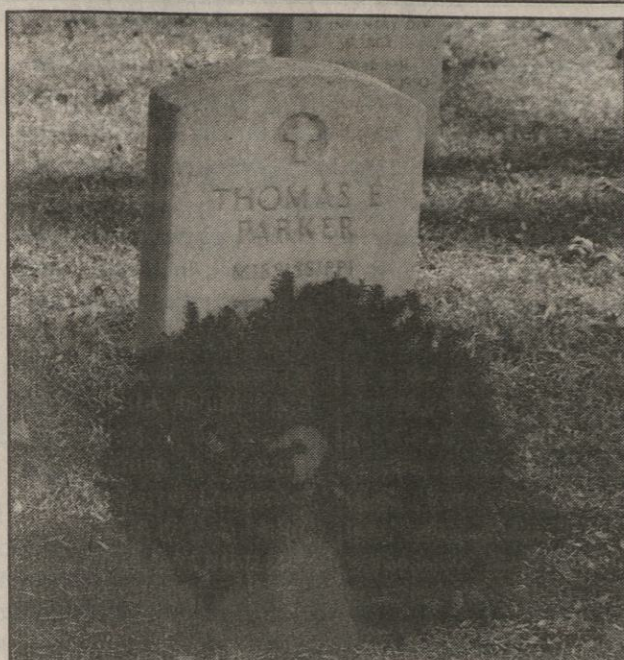

Shiloh National Cemetery to Participate in National Wreaths Across America Day

On December 14th, Shiloh National Cemetery will participate in the national Wreaths Across America day. The ceremony will begin at 11:00 a.m. in the National Cemetery.

"The laying of wreaths on the graves of honored dead has been done since the time of Ancient Greece," said Superintendent Dale Wilkerson. "The circular shape of the wreath represents eternity, for it has no beginning and no end, and the greenery represents everlasting life. Laying a wreath is an act of remembrance for someone's life and service, and we invite everyone to come and help place the wreaths."

Wreaths Across America, a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, was founded by Mr. Morrill Worcester of Harrington, Maine. When Mr. Worcester was 12 years old he visited Arlington National Cemetery, an experience

he would never forget. Decades later, in 1992, he sent his company's surplus of 5,000 wreaths to be placed at Arlington, and he continued sending wreaths every year. In 2005, a photo of the stones at Arlington, adorned with wreaths and covered in snow, circulated around the internet. Suddenly, the project received national attention. Today the event has expanded to the placement of over 1.2 million wreaths in over 1,400 locations across the nation.

The event will begin at 11:00 a.m. with a short patriotic ceremony. Following the ceremony, everyone in attendance will be invited to come forward and assist with laying the wreaths on the graves. In case of rain, the ceremony will be held in the Visitor Center auditorium.

Shiloh National Military Park to Hold Public Meeting on Redesign of Visitor Center Exhibits

SHILOH - Shiloh National Military Park invites the public to attend a public meeting on the major redesign of the exhibits and exhibit area at the Shiloh Visitor Center. The meeting will be held on December 17th from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. in the visitor center auditorium.

In September, 2018, the National Park Service's Harpers Ferry Design Center awarded a contract in the amount of \$639,700.00 to Formations, Inc., of Portland, OR, to provide planning, design, fabrication, and installation services for the visitor center. The goal of this contract is to develop new exhibits that feature artifacts from the park's collection, interactive and tactile experiences, and audiovisual presentations that provide visitors with opportunities to make meaningful connections to the park and its story. The designers will also provide recommendations for any architectural changes in the facility that will be needed to accommodate the new elements.

"Shiloh National Military Park preserves the Civil War battlefield where the first major battle in the Western Theater took place in April 1862," said Superintendent Dale Wilkerson. "New exhibits will provide interpretive approaches that are based on park themes, reflect current scholarship and multiple perspectives, and will be accessible. As part of the design process, we are holding public meetings to provide the community with opportunities for learning about the development of the new exhibits and for providing input. It is important for us to include the local community in the process as we move forward with the revisions

to the center."

This is the third public meeting associated with the project. At this meeting, the designers and park staff will present a combined design developed from preliminary conceptual ideas, which emphasizes major details and planned content. The public will have the opportunity to view the design and to provide comments regarding the new exhibition to the designers. The entire project is slated to be completed by April 6, 2021.

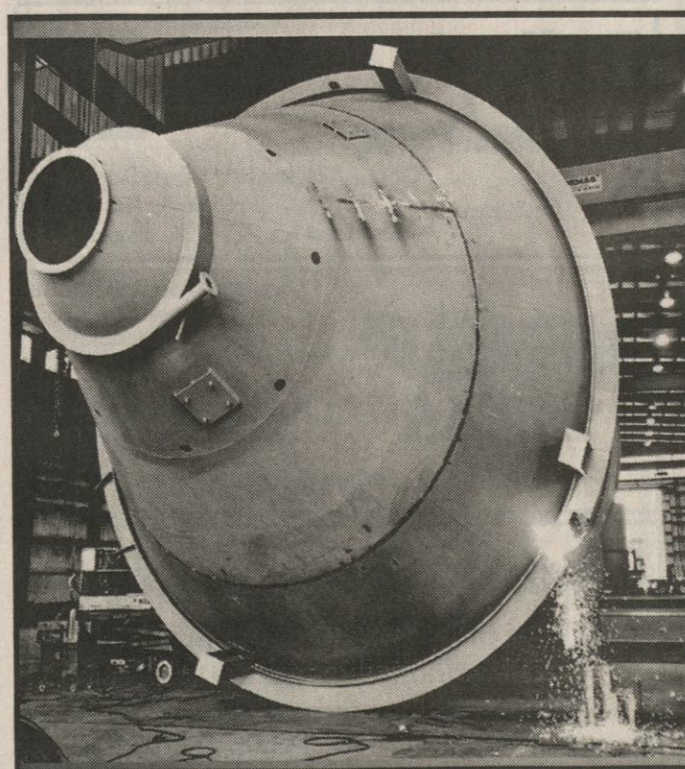

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 43)

My title for these articles might seem out of place when one considers that Solomon did not "end well" in his life as Israel's king, yet his wisdom did exceed that of any other king before Jesus. When we consider the word "wisdom", we must also consider that Solomon's great wisdom in many areas did not prevent him from making some "dumb mistakes" in other areas. My last article showed that Solomon had one thousand wives and concubines, yet he had no meaningful marriage with any of them, according to Ecclesiastes 7:26-28. I Kings 11:4 says, "For it came to pass when Solomon was old, that his wives turned away his heart after other gods: and his heart was not perfect with the LORD his God,

as was the heart of David his father." I Kings 3:29 gives God's word to Solomon: "And God said unto him, Because thou has asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself long life; neither hast asked riches for thyself, not hast asked the life of thine enemies, but hast asked for thyself understanding to discern judgment; Behold, I have done according to thy words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an understanding heart; so that there was none like thee before thee, neither after thee shall any arise

like unto thee." With all that God gave Solomon, and with Solomon's wisdom in writing the Book of Ecclesiastes, Solomon still failed to use wisdom in many choices he made, namely in the matter of choosing 700 wives and 300 concubines.

I have called Solomon the wisest king of Israel before Jesus, because God gave him greater wisdom than anyone before or after him, until we come to Jesus' perfect wisdom. The Book of Ecclesiastes shows us that wise men

can still make some dumb mistakes, which Solomon did. His writing of the Book of Ecclesiastes should keep others from making the same mistakes Solomon made, but it does not necessarily always work that way, for some read Solomon's words and go "as straight as a martin to his gourd" and do the same thing that Solomon did. Ecclesiastes 8:1-2 will help us to see what Solomon wanted to do: "Who is as the wise man? And who knoweth the interpretation of a thing? A man's wisdom maketh his face to shine, and the boldness of his face shall be changed. I counsel thee to keep the king's commandment, and that in regard of the oath of God." Solomon, like many other men, has

sometimes given great counsel and failed to follow it himself. Solomon asks: who is wise enough to know the interpretation, or meaning of a thing? It is really worthless for any of us to read great information, if we fail to understand its message. Wisdom can make one's face to shine and cause boldness to be changed to humility. So, our wise king, who did some dumb things also, counsels us to do what we have promised the king. Although Solomon had in mind earthly kings, we can also apply this to Jesus our eternal King!

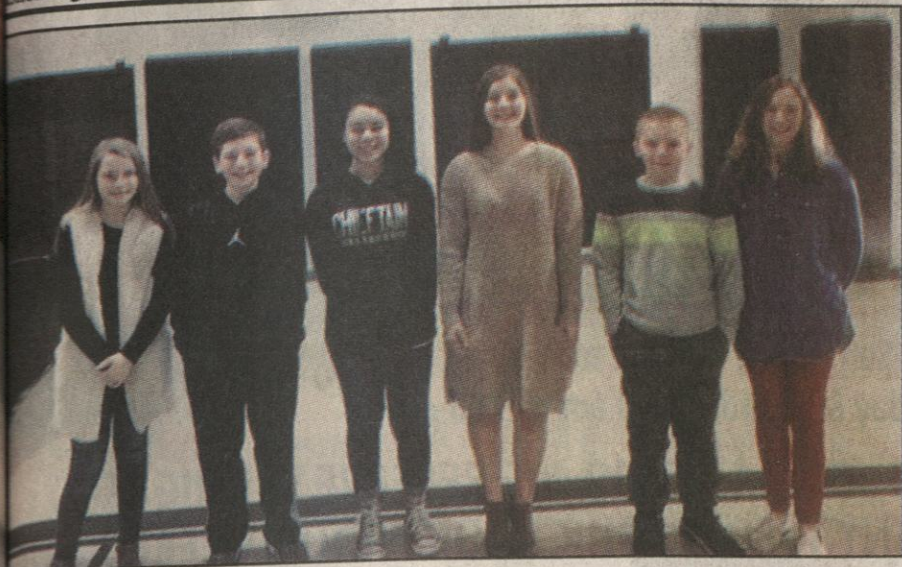
