



Joint Agencies **Make Felony** Arrest

On January 4, 2020, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office assisted the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) in the charging of Nicholas Lewis Boulden of Los Angeles, California. Boulden approached the westbound scales on HWY. 72 and was asked to pull to the side where he consented to a search of his tractor and trailer.

A small amount of alleged marijuana was discovered in the cab of the tractor as well as a firearm. A background check on Boulden was ran and discovered that he was in fact a felon with several charges from the state of California. Boulden was then arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. A further check on the firearm was ran and was discovered to be a reported stolen firearm from the Las Vegas, Nevada area.



Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 49)

It is interesting, if not actually amazing, to hear people talk about others with these words: "He must be doing something right, just look at all the good things that are happening to him." Then we also hear these words: "He must be doing something wrong, just look at all the bad things that are happening to him." Ecclesiastes 8:14 will help us to rightly evaluate both of the above statements: "There is a vanity which is done upon the earth; that there be just men, unto whom it happeneth according to the work of the wicked; again, there be wicked men, to whom it happeneth according to the work of the righteous: I said that this also is

vanity." Even the wise King Solomon stood puzzled at the way things happen to men, so it is not likely that we will figure it all out in our day! Solomon, who wrote the Book of Ecclesiastes, according to many good Bible scholars, has given us his thinking concerning things that happen to people. First, he had seen righteous people who had bad things happen to them, things that we would think should happen only to



wicked people. Then seen Solomon had wicked people getting all of the breaks, which seemingly should be reserved for the righ-The fact is: teous. we do not know why things happen to people, at least not in many cases, so we would be wise to stop speculating about why so and so had a bad accident, or why so and so received a large gift from an unknown giver.

First, I need to say that we do not ers, even though we do sometimes see some good actions that lead us to believe that a certain person is a good person. We must keep in mind that the eleven apostles of Jesus, other than Judas, never suspected that Judas would betray Jesus, for he looked like a benevolent fellow who wanted to give of the treasury of Jesus and the apostles to the poor. On the other hand, we may have seen one action of someone that seemed to characterize them as being "bad", when actually the usual actions of that person were good. Only God knows the hearts of men, so we should not set ourselves up as judges as to who is good or bad. We can, of course, get a good idea on this, if we observe a person for some time and see the usual way of life that he follows. The second thing that I would say in regard to Solomon's consternation about why things happen to people is that we have not seen the "final reports" on the actions of others, nor do we know their hearts as God knows them. Then there is the point that God does sometimes use things that we call "bad" to bring out a desired "good" reaction of the person to whom these things happen. Moreover, he allows good things to happen to those who are not following Him to show that He still cares about

has been able to help lo-The Hubbard Salem cate the burial place. My Hubbard and Johnson ancestors were some of the first land owners afpeople were also my anmother was Nancy Caroline Coon.

Once, an old timer cemetery. He said it ain't no cemetery, it's a place where a bunch of Indians are buried! The land is now a free playground for out of county people that have done so much damage, the off-road vehicles dig ditches, giant mud holes, dumping trash, causing erosion, and other bad behavior, such as drug dealing and stealing, large gang style parties, alcohol bottles and cans littering land and water!. There is about 20-30 dump sites in this area. Law officers have done a lot of work to combat this problem,

but it still exists. There are hundreds of local people who are decent, law abiding, career trained, business owners, who love to ride these trails. Most of them do not go there anymore. If anyone would like to join in and help with boots on the ground, fill up ditches and mudholes, remove dead trees, maintain the cemeteries, give donations, it will be greatly appreciated. God loves a cheerful giver. We have received enough donations to rebuild the Hubbard Fence and gates that were stolen last year. This project needs 10-100 people who have relatives or friends connected to this area who want to see this sacred land restored to the wonderful and beautiful place it should be.
