



Tishomingo County Community Coalition Opens "Safe Haven" in Burnsville for those in Need of Addiction Treatment

January 31, 2020, Burnsville, Mississippi

A ribbon cutting was held for Safe Haven, a community service project of the Tishomingo County Community Coalition.

Coalition Director Kathy Best reported that the community has come together to meet the needs of people in transition in their lives. We provide housing and food for men and women as well as help preparing for work and finding a job. Safe Haven is a labor of love that depends solely on

volunteers and donations from churches, businesses, social organizations, and individuals. We do not accept government assistance. We especially like to thank Rusty Johnson, Tony Blakney, and Shane Woodruff for the wonderful work they did renovating and building the facility. We also thank Families First and Modern Woodmen for their donations to Safe Haven."

Mayor David Nixon stated that "Safe Haven is a result of volunteers coming together to meet a need in the community. I thank Director Kathy Best,

the Coalition board of directors, and other volunteers for their dedication to helping those most in need."

Safe Haven has a number of bedrooms, a kitchen, bathroom, common area, and laundry. Staffing is on duty 24/7. Safe Haven also contains the office of the Tishomingo County Community Coalition.

Coalition Director Kathy Best stressed that "Safe Haven still has lots of needs such as operating funds and donations of groceries, gift cards, silverware, knives, welcome bags with

Tishomingo County Chancery Clerk Document Management Project

Tishomingo County sits on the borders of Tennessee and Alabama in the northeast corner of Mississippi. Its topography more closely resembles the land found across the state line in southern Tennessee. Since its formation in 1866, the Chancery Clerk office in Tishomingo County has built a substantial archive of documents.

As their court and land record collection grew, the county faced the perpetual challenge of providing citizens fast and convenient access to records. To better serve his constituents, Peyton Cummings, Tishomingo Chancery Clerk, turned to Revolution Data Systems to convert his collection of land records to digital files.

"Like a lot of Chancery Clerks in Mississippi, my deeds and deeds of trust books were frequently used as they were the source of record for over a century's worth of land transactions. It is critical to ensure the long-term safekeeping of the historical records."

Peyton Cummings, Chancery Clerk, Time to move away from old books.

In 2008, Tishomingo County began electronically managing deeds and deeds of trust records in their County Records Management System (CRMS). It created two silos of land records - one on paper and one digital.

Beginning in 2016, Cummings started a digital initiative to make his most-accessed historical records readily available to staff and constituents. To unite his historical collection with records to those in CRMS, Cummings contracted Revolution Data Systems to begin the

process of digitizing his collection.

Working backward to move forward

The project started with Revolution Data Systems setting up high-speed scanners onsite at Tishomingo County. Our document conversion team started at the most recent book from 1998 and scanned all books back to the year 1926.

Each book was prepped for scanning by removing them from their original binders and fixing any damaged or folded pages. Images were then scanned at 300 DPI to ensure the best possible image quality.

Over a decade's worth of books from the 1960s and 1970s were photostatic images. These images were reversed, de-speckled, and cleaned up during the conversion process.

Indexing land records is key. All books back to the year 1926 were fully indexed to enable researchers to perform a full title search. Revolution Data Systems worked with Tishomingo's staff to gather a uniform set of indexing rules to make the documents easily retrievable.

Also critical to the success of the project was ensuring the documents were formatted properly for ingestion into Tishomingo's CRMS document management system. Revolution Data Systems consulted with Three Rivers and Mississippi State University's NSPARC to create a process to upload all records to the system.

"RDS worked with my office and Three Rivers to ensure my deeds and deeds of trust records were scanned and indexed correctly. Having digital access to my older records makes life better for everyone that walks into our office and prevents wear and tear on the historical books."

Up next

Over the course of the last few years, our team has worked side-by-side with Mr. Cummings to digitize his collection of land records. Managing land records is just one of many hats that Chancery Clerks in Mississippi wear. They also record the official minutes for the Board of Supervisors; manage the claims docket and payroll; serves as official record manager of the county and clerk of the Chancery Court.

Next, Tishomingo will work systematically to eliminate paper across other departments to reap the benefits of a fully digital record collection.

Tishomingo County Job Growth Among The Highest In The USA

In January 2020, Tennessee Valley Authority Research Services issued its economic assessment of TVA valley counties.

Jobs in Tishomingo County during the last five years grew by 956 and are projected to grow by 591 over the next five years. The local job growth rate is more than double the job growth rate for the nation (15.4% for Tishomingo County and 6.9% for the USA).

The labor force participation rate for Tishomingo County increased from 47.6% in 2014 to 55.5% in 2019. This means that 44.5% of working age persons in Tishomingo County are not in the workforce.

Manufacturing is the largest employer in Tishomingo County, five times the national average. Average earnings per manufacturing worker in 2019 were \$48,524.

However, population in Tishomingo County grew by only 52 over the past five years and is projected to grow by only two over the next five years.

How can a county with one of the highest percentage job growth rates in the USA continue to attract few, if any, new citizens?

Tishomingo County has the highest percentage of age 65

and older in the state, a percentage higher than most Florida counties. An older population means a higher death rate.

The birth rate in Tishomingo County is at a historic low.

Tishomingo County still loses many of its young people to the glitter and glamour of urban areas. Some new employees of Tishomingo County industries that move to this area prefer living in larger communities.

Many of the new jobs go to persons who live in surrounding communities.

The majority of new job holders who desire to move to Tishomingo County cannot due to the lack of affordable housing. Yet, Tishomingo County has a residential vacancy rate double the national average although most of the vacant units may be deteriorating or dilapidated.

The most significant impact of industrial recruitment is the increase in incomes of resident workers and the attraction of new customers and taxpayers into the community.

Tishomingo County has not been able to attract significant numbers of new customers and taxpayers due in large part to the lack of affordable rental and owner housing.

Absentee Ballots Now Available for the March 10th, 2020 Primary Elections

Josh McNatt, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the March 10th 2020 Primary Elections. You may come to the circuit clerk's office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Circuit Clerk's office will be open on Saturday, February 29th, 8 a.m. to 12 noon and on Saturday, March 7th, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting. All voters who vote by absentee in the clerk's office will be required to show a photo ID. Also, all voters who go to the voting precincts on Election Day will be required to show a photo ID.

Because this is a Primary Election, you will be required to tell the election officials the political party that you wish to vote in. You will choose the Democratic Party or the Republican Party. Should there be a run-off election, you will be required to vote in the same primary in the run-off as you did in the March 10th primary. Mississippi Law does not allow any crossover voting in Primary Elections.

We encourage those who need to vote absentee by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only

five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are: (1) A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older; (2) A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county; (3) A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and or; (4) A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day. (5) All registered voters who are members of the Armed Services, their spouses, dependents, and overseas citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older.

Saturday, March 7th will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in person at the clerk's office for March 10th, 2020 Primary. All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, March 9th in order to be eligible to be counted for the March 10th 2020 Primary Election. The March Primary Elections will include Democrat & Republican Primary's for President, US Senator, and US Congressman. Burglary Suspect Arrested and Stolen Property Recovered

On January 16th Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies received the report of a stolen 2020 Forest River Camper from the Pickwick Pines Resort area. Deputies were informed by the resort security that some individuals had gained entry into the property and went to a staging area for the resident's campers and took one of the campers. Joshua Neil Malone was arrested as a suspect in this crime.

Surveillance footage from the resort showed the alleged suspects and the vehicle, which matched the description of an individual and vehicle stopped by Tishomingo County deputies a few days earlier. The alleged suspects were found in Alcorn County a few nights later and those suspects were transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. Tishomingo County Sheriff investigators were able to obtain the location of the stolen camper from the alleged suspects and the camper was recovered in Benton County with the assistance of local property owners where the alleged suspects placed the stolen camper.

Joshua Neil Malone, 39-years-old, white male of Tishomingo, Mississippi is officially charged

with grand larceny. Malone's bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$10,000. Also, Malone is currently on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) for a previous felony drug crime. Malone currently has a warrant placed on him by the MDOC for violating his terms of probation.

Sheriff Daugherty would like to thank Sheriff Robbie Goolsby and the Benton County Sheriff's Office in assisting us in recovering the stolen property.

Tennessee Man Charged with Felony Drugs

On January 27th Tishomingo County Sheriff deputies went to a residence on Martha Lane in Iuka to serve an arrest warrant on a female who lives at the residence.

When the deputies arrived they confronted the female associated with the warrant and a male at the residence. The female was detained and arrested.

Deputies then began running a check on the male, Jason Lodes, and learned that he was currently on felony probation from the state of Tennessee for previous drug and burglary convictions. Deputies obtained consent to search the vehicle

of Lodes and found a bag of alleged methamphetamine. Lodes was then arrested and both were transported to the Tishomingo County Jail.

Jason Lodes, 44-year-old, male of Tennessee was charged with the possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine). Lodes' bond was set by the Tishomingo County Justice Court at \$5,000.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office has been made aware of some recent phone calls to residents of Tishomingo County claiming to be from the "Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department / Drug Task Force" informing residents that they may have a warrant, the callers are attempting to verify this by asking the individuals for their Social Security Number.

We would like to inform the public that we DO NOT call anyone to

inform you of an arrest warrant. Furthermore, we will show up to you in person with the proper credentials which identifies us as a Professional Law Enforcement Officer for the state of Mississippi and a member of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office. Also, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office does not have a "Drug Task Force" nor is assigned to one.



SAVANNAH, TENN. – The Hardin County Convention and Visitors Bureau is pleased to announce that ticket sales for the 8th Annual Generals Breakfast at the Cherry Mansion have begun.

The event will be held on Saturday, April 4, beginning at 9 a.m., on the lawn of the historic home in Savannah.

Cherry Mansion came of note during the Civil War when General Ulysses S. Grant made his headquarters at the home during the Battle of Shiloh.

Tickets for the event are \$17 each and include breakfast, a storytelling program by the attending Generals, a tour of Cherry Mansion. Tours are for breakfast ticket holders only and are immediately following the breakfast performance.

General US Grant, portrayed by renown historian Curt Fields, will be joined at his headquarters by his Confederate General P.G.T. Beauregard, portrayed by historian Larry McCluney, Jr. These first-person live history portrayals are a unique and fun recounting of historical events and famous people, making for some great storytelling! Visitors will also have the opportunity to tour the mansion, that is now a private home, and see the history inside and out," said Tourism Director Pippin.

Pippin added that this event has grown each year over the last eight years and there is a limited number of tickets available sold in advance only. The breakfast is an outdoor venue under a heated tent enclosure.

This event is one of many being held during the 150th anniversary of the Battle of Shiloh. The day concludes by offering a visit to the Tennessee River Museum in downtown Savannah and then you are encouraged to follow in Grant's footsteps taking the trip across the river to Shiloh National Military Park.

Battlefield ranger-led hikes, car caravans, interpretive events, cannon-firing and even a vintage baseball game will be presented during the anniversary celebration of April 4-7 at Shiloh National Park.

these special people who at one time made the pages of The Vidette. Please forgive me if I remember some of the details incorrectly, I am now old myself! Way over!








Road and Peabody Road, finishing in front of Shiloh Church. All runners get to enjoy the beauty of the Park and the majestic Tennessee River in springtime.

Ecclesiastes 9:1 says: "For all this I considered in my heart even to declare all this, that the righteous, and the wise, and their works, are in the hand of God: no man knoweth either love or hatred by all that is before them." Solomon was a very wise man, yet he did not understand the future, so I wonder why so many self-proclaimed prophets in our day suppose that they know the future. Certainly, some things about the future are clearly revealed in the Scriptures, but even with that, none of us understands everything that has been recorded in the Word of God. Certainly Solomon in

his later years got away from the right fellowship with God and set up altars to idol gods (I Kings 11:1-8), but that does not negate the fact that in earlier years he served God and was inspired of God to write the Book of Ecclesiastes. So, in writing this book he admitted that he had considered in his heart and could declare that the righteous and the wicked, along with their works, are in the hand of God. This does

not mean that God approves all that either the righteous or the wicked do, but it does mean that He can stop what they are doing, or He can cause it to continue. The whole idea is that God is in control, even if He does still give freedom to men to make either right or wrong choices. Some people are so bent on the point that God must control all things, or else He is not sovereign, but that cannot be the case, or

else God would be the author of sin and everything, whether good or bad.

Solomon's whole point is that no man can do anything, or know anything, apart from the permission of God, yet God does permit humanity to do both that which is good and that which is bad. God is not helpless, so that men do what they determine to do, whether God allows it or not. It is good to understand that God has the final control of the universe, yet within that universe He allows freedom to make right or wrong choices. When the final span of earth life is finished, then God will

bring into play the action of His sovereignty that will cause all being to submit to His complete authority. So, we may say that for now God allows some freedom for men, good angels, bad angels and demons to do what they will, at least to a point. But there is a "day of reckoning" coming when all will have to give an account of their actions and be rewarded accordingly. This does not mean that anyone is saved by his works, but rather by the grace of God, yet saved humanity will still give an account for their service to the Lord (I Corinthians 3:10-15; II Corinthians 5:10), while the un-

saved will give an account of all their sin. Revelation 20:12-15 says that the actions of men do not create a coming day, either love or hate come to them.
