Absentee Voting For the March 10th Primary Election Underway

Cash McNatt, Circuit Clerk, would like to remind voters that absentee voting for the March 2020 Primary Election is ongoing. You may come to the Clerk's office to vote by absentee in person Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Clerk's office will be open Saturday, February 29th, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and on Saturday, March 7th, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting. We encourage those who wish to vote absentee by mail to come to our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee

mail process. Voting absentee by mail usually takes a week to complete the process. When an absentee ballot is requested by mail, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone. Saturday, March 7th will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in person at the Clerk's office for the March 10th, 2020

Primary. All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, March 9th in order to be eligible to be counted for the March 10th 2020 Primary Election. The March Primary Elections will include Democrat & Republican Primary's for President, US Senator, and US Congressman. A sample ballot for each party will be published in this issue of the paper. Fatal Accident Claims the Life of Tishomingo County Man

On Thursday, February 13th a fatal one motor vehicle accident in Belmont claimed the life of Jerry Wayne White, 26, and caused another, Andrew Alexander, 26, to be airlifted to the hospital in Tupelo.

The accident was reported around 9 p.m. on New Bethel Road near the cemetery in Belmont. The vehicle left the roadway and struck a tree, White was pronounced dead on the scene by Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack Wilemon.

Belmont, Golden, and Dennis emergency crews were paged to the scene where the jaws of



life were used to extract the men from the vehicle.

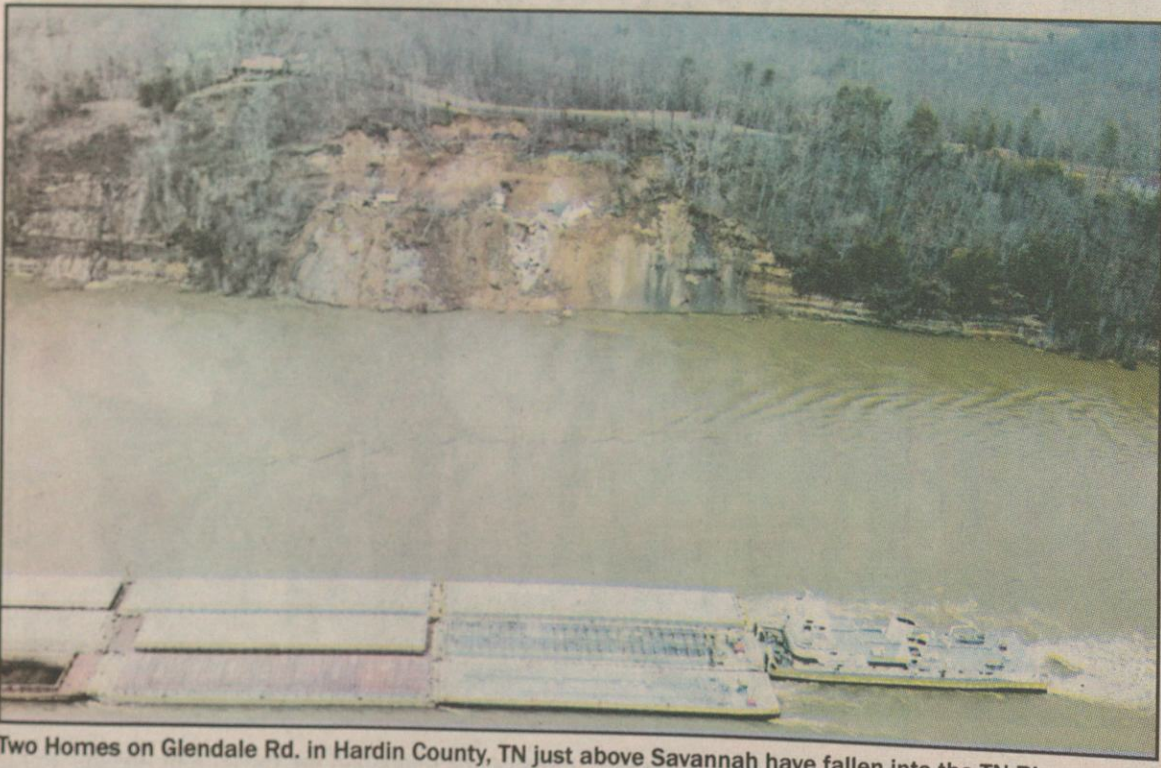

Rainfall Causes Flooding in Area Rivers

Excessive rainfall this winter has been the source of major flooding throughout the south. In Tishomingo County and surrounding areas the rivers and bodies of water are on the rise, this flooding

hasn't been as problematic for our local readers as it has for those in nearby counties.

Areas of the TN River have reached high levels particularly in Hardin County, TN, and in

Northwest Alabama. Several communities in TN and AL were evacuated early last week.

There is also major flooding along the Pearl River in Jackson MS, where many are being

forced to evacuate their homes. As more rain is in the forecast for next week it is unclear whether there will be relief in the flooded areas anytime soon.

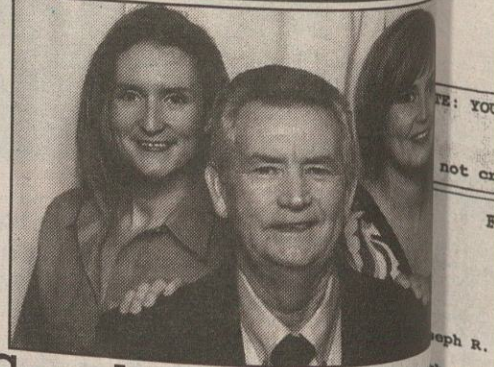

Producers counties who suf- fered physical damage and caused by straight- ts that occurred 26, 2019, may be eligible for U.S. De- partment of Agriculture Farm Service (FSA) emergency

placement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganiza- tion of a farming opera- tion or the refinancing of certain debts.

Producers in the con- tiguous Mississippi coun- ties of Alcorn and Tisho- mingo are also eligible to apply for emergency loans.

The deadline to apply for these emergency loans is September 21, 2020.

FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security avail- able and repayment abil- ity.

FSA has a variety of additional programs to help farmers recover from the impacts of this disaster. FSA programs that do not require a di-

aster declaration include: Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees and Farm-Raised Fish Program; Emergency Conser- vation Program; Livestock Forage Disaster Program; Livestock Indemnity Program; Operating and Farm Ownership Loans; and the Tree Assistance Program.

Farmers may con- tact their local USDA service center for further information on eligibil- ity requirements and ap- plication procedures for these and other programs. Additional information is also available online at <https://www.farmers.gov/recover>.

A new rule proposed by the U.S. Department of Transportation would permit airlines to stop accepting emotional support animals on planes allowing only service dogs that are professionally trained to perform tasks or assist passengers with disabilities, including psychiatric disorders.

I'm all for this as airplanes have started looking like Noah's Ark or flying zoos. Who wants to ride on an airplane with birds, cats, pigs and whatever anyone imagines to be their emotional support creature? Maybe you do. A lot of us do not.

This has developed into a lot malarkey over the years. Carolé and I were traveling back from Maine several years ago. We had bought tickets well in advance so we could have the two front bulkhead seats. This was a small plane and our seats weren't considered first class, but we had three or four more inches of leg room. Before boarding our flight, we heard our names called on the airport public address system. We went to the check-in counter and were almost told that we needed to give up our seats for a man with a disability and his wife who had service animals. We were young, naïve and gullible so being tenderhearted people we said okay.

The agent assigned us to the two seats directly behind our old seats which meant no extra leg room that we had planned for months in advance. The guy gets on the plane and he and his wife appear healthier than we are. He was wearing a hearing aid, but he was seeing and getting around fine as was his wife. With these people were «three» dogs. Yes, three dogs! The only thing I could tell that these dogs could do was stink up the area where we were sitting. To add insult to injury we had to ride now behind our original seats with these dogs occasionally starring at us.

I'm not doing it again. Many years ago, I developed a blood clot from extended travel and I'm not giving up my seat for some person who needs to sit and pet their dog. I'm not an animal hater. I love animals. I had a dog in my house for sixteen years. For people who truly are disabled and need a documented trained service dog then that's okay but plan and buy your ticket in advance instead of bumping someone else out of their seat for your «dogs».

Most real trained service dogs are better behaved than some passengers. It's just finally time that our airlines can get some control over the zoos flying through the sky.

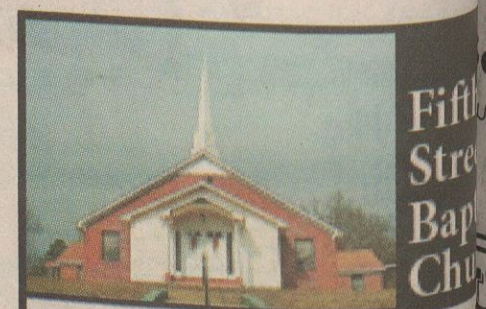

I said in the beginning of the articles on Ecclesiastes that there were two phrases that were important to remember concerning this book? Those two phrases are: "under the sun" and "under the heaven", for they both describe life on earth and nothing more. I am saying this because we have one of those phrases, "under the sun" in our verses above. If we will all remember that Solo-

mon is writing about earthly life in the Book of Ecclesiastes, not about heaven or hell, even though they may be alluded to in certain verses.

So, we are looking at earth life in our verses above, and the understanding of that will help all of us to identify those who teach otherwise. Notice that Solomon said that there is hope for those who are "among the liv-

ing". He also says that a living dog is better off than a dead lion, signifying that in death there is no strength, position or prowess. Keep in mind that our writer is not speaking of what happens after death, but only about life on earth and death at the end of life on earth.

Now we come to the words that "the living know they will die, but the dead know not anything". Some religions use this verse in an attempt to prove that both soul and body lie lifelessly in the grave until the time of resurrection, but the Bible teaches nothing of the kind. Check Philippians 1:21-24 for the proof of what

I am saying. The teaching of Ecclesiastes 9:5 is that a dead body does not know anything, which is the correct view. If this were speaking of what lies beyond death, either in heaven or hell, it would be saying that no one who dies has any reward anywhere, nor will anyone ever remember him anywhere. It would be saying that all love and hatred have been forever forgotten; that all envy perishes at death; that there is never any "portion" in anything after death, ever forever. This will fit earthly life, but it will not fit life in eternity! If the teachers of this philosophy of "death ends all until

the resurrection" would look at the context of the verses they use (our verses above) to prove their teachings, they would come to understand their error! WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Tishomingo County Water District, Inc. (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of the District, hereby finds, declares, and declares as follows:

1. The District has existing water, sewerage, and sewage disposal systems which have been operated as the Water System of the District (the "System").

2. It is necessary, advisable, and in the best interest of the District and its customers to issue a Water System revenue bond of the District in the maximum principal amount of Two Million Five Hundred Forty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$2,547,000) to provide funds to acquire, construct, improve, better, and extend the System (the "Authorized Purpose"), consisting primarily of construction, acquisitions, improvements, betterments, and extensions to the System (the "Project"), for which purpose there are no available funds on hand not already being used for the Project and the Project.

3. The Governing Body has employed McRae Engineering, Inc., Iuka, Mississippi, a competent engineering firm (the "Consulting Engineer"), to study the System, the nature and extent of the Project, and to make an estimate of the cost thereof.

4. The engineers have determined the extent of the Project and have made an estimate of the cost thereof which estimate is the aggregate amount of Three Million Four Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$3,498,000).

5. The Project is necessary, economically feasible, and would be in the public interest and of benefit to the community, and the findings of the engineers are hereby adopted, and the estimate of the costs of the Project.

6. Under the provisions of Sections 13-3-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), the District is authorized to accomplish the Project and to provide for the payment of the costs thereof, or any portion of such costs, through the issuance of its Water System revenue bonds in the principal of and interest on shall be payable from the System.
