Tishomingo County School District Announces 2020 Graduation Details The Tishomingo County

School District has set plans for the county's high school graduation ceremonies. Due to CO-VID-19, the ceremonies will not be open to the general public. Seniors will be given 6 tickets each to give to family members to attend the ceremony. This is to help reduce the number of people in attendance as the community continue to deals with COVID-19. Other precautions, such as social distancing and accessible hand sanitizer stations, will be followed as well. Faculty will be present to assist with spectator seating and dismissal. in order to follow social distancing guidelines. Every effort will be made to have the ceremony outdoors on each high school's football field. For this reason, guests are encouraged to bring appropriate rain gear in case a passing shower occurs. The ceremony will only be moved to each school's gymnasium in the case of heavy/persistent rain. If the ceremony has to be moved indoors, each graduate will only be allowed 2 guests due to capacity guidelines with COV-

ID-19. Students and guests who exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 or who have knowingly been exposed to a person who has CO-VID-19 within 72 hours should not attend the ceremony. Families may visit the pantry up to five times in a year, with 30 days between visits. The average family size is 3 to 4 members and the retail value of a box that a family will receive is between \$40 and \$50. In 2019 the pantry helped 1,423 families of which 1,057 were children, 488 seniors and 1,928 adults!



Northeast was well-suited when switching to fully online classes in March when the corona-virus hit the United States.

Ranked as the top online education institution in the state of Mississippi and the second-best online education institution in the nation by OnlineColleges.com, a subsidiary of QuinStreet, Inc., North-east was able to place a majority of its classes online in just a few days and continue the semester with limited disruption. "Northeast is very ad-

vanced with the usage of technology in the delivery system we have in place," Ford said.



we, six girls, got to the log, it was kindly moving up and down but when one stepped on it, it was steady. I crossed first and the girls began saying they couldn't cross. They were afraid they'd slip off. I began coaching the girls one at a time until it finally got everyone across. Digress. have always been a puddle duck. I was raised near Cripple Deer Creek where Mom and Dad carried us swimming at the Page Swimming Hole. I was the only one who could swim in the group.

We'd hear a car and I'd tell them if you don't cross we are going to miss

Finally, across, we hurried to the store. We were "a sight for sore eyes". Mud, wet feet, and had on our best dresses and Sunday shoes. When Mrs. Nila saw us she got pans of water and rags and with her help made us presentable before the bus arrived. When the bus arrived, we boarded and for the time, this dangerous exploit was forgotten.

Today, I shudder to think what would have happened if one of us had slipped off the log,



(we could have gone the road but this was a short cut and it was too far to turn back). Even though I could swim, I could not have saved them. water was too swift. At this time, Cripple Deer Creek stayed in its banks usually. Today, slews, underbrush, etc. covered the ground. Beavers have really taken a toll. Back when I was growing up, the creek was a good place to fish and swim.

In my memories, I can just see myself urging my classmates to cross a swollen creek on a footlog. Fear of falling? No thought of it. All I could think of was ... we are going to miss the bus.

Oh, to be young and not see danger. God has been so good to me. Today, I know it was He who walked with each girl across an unknown, wet, slippery footlog across a swollen creek.

At this time, I'm sure we didn't stop to say "Thank You, God, for protecting us," but I'm sure our parents did when they learned what we did. They would never have let us take the short cut to the highway. Stay in the road.

At 95, I really see what a dangerous thing I urged my classmates into Ain't God good and He's given me the memories to share with you parents today. one in my family said of



their first big hurdle.

Donald "Don" Glenn Landrum

On Saturday, June 13, 2020 we said goodbye to a special man, Donald "Don" Glenn Landrum, 94, most affectionately known to many as Paw Paw. 

Our word "slothfulness" comes from a word that means: "to lean idly". I remember hearing the old adage: "An idle mind is the devil's workshop", but the mind is not all that can be useless by being idle. In fact, some might question whether or not the mind is ever completely "idle". Our verses above show that idleness, or laziness, can allow a building to decay, because no one makes the effort to fix leaks or prob-

How many criminals have gotten off "scot-free", because

enough money bought the "best lawyers"? Solomon knew that people and things could be moved by money, therefore he said, as God inspired him, that money answers all things. 




