Mid-South Food Bank Feeding The Need Is Bringing The Mobile Pantry Food Distribution To Iuka

Mobile Pantry Food Distribution will take place on June 25th, 2020 from 10 a.m. to 12 noon at 1701 Paul Edmondson Drive in Iuka.

A photo ID or other proof of residency is required for service. The mobile pantry is open and free to all residents of Tishomingo County who qualify for SNAP benefits (food stamps), Home Energy Assistance, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Public Housing, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicare/Medicaid, or those willing to complete and sign a Self-Declaration of Income Statement showing total household income is below the poverty level.

No more than 3 households per car, and no walk-ups, only vehicle traffic is allowed.

UNA Commencement to be Hybrid Ceremony in Norton Auditorium

FLORENCE, AL. The following ceremonies at the University of North Alabama will take place following a hybrid format in Norton Auditorium on Friday, July 31 and Saturday, Aug. 1. The event will include graduates from Spring 2020 as well as Summer 2020.

"After much research and careful consideration, the University determined that this hybrid approach to commencement both appropriately celebrates our graduates and protects the health and safety of all participants," said Dr. Ross Alexander, Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs.

The hybrid model will allow graduates and essential University staff in Norton Auditorium during commencement. The ceremony will be live-streamed for family and friends to watch online on the UNA YouTube channel.

"We've always live-streamed our commencement ceremonies for the benefit of families and friends who are physically unable to attend," said Mitch Powell, Interim University Registrar. "As we move to hybrid ceremonies where only graduates will be in attendance, the live stream will be even more beneficial for families and friends to be a part of celebrating their graduate's

accomplishments." The following precautions will be taken: Graduates and essential staff will be screened by University Health Services before entering Norton Auditorium. Anyone who answers 'yes' to a question on the health screening or has a temperature of 100.4 or above will not enter the auditorium.

Graduates will be seated six feet apart in accordance with guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Alabama Department of Public Health.

Details on arrival times, parking, and check-in will be sent to graduates during the next few weeks. Updates regarding additional Covid-19 precautions will also be distributed accordingly.

On Friday, July 31, at 6 p.m., commencement ceremonies will include graduates from the Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions and the College of Education and Human Sciences. Graduates from the College of Arts and Sciences will have their ceremony at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Aug. 1, and at 2 p.m. Aug. 1, the ceremony will take place for the graduates in the College of Business. Participants will be asked to wear a face covering, and Norton will be sanitized between each ceremony.

we, six girls, got to the log, it was kindly moving up and down but when one stepped on it, it was steady. I crossed first and the girls began saying they couldn't cross. We'd hear a car and I'd tell them if you don't cross we are going to miss our trip.

Finally, across, we hurried to the store. We were "a sight for sore eyes". Mud, wet feet, and had on our best dresses and Sunday shoes. When Mrs. Nila saw us she got pans of water and rags and with her help made us presentable before the bus arrived. When the bus arrived, we boarded and for the time, this dangerous exploit was forgotten.

Today, I shudder to think what would have happened if one of us had slipped off the log.



(we could have gone the road but this was a short cut and it was too far to turn back). Even though I could swim, I could not have saved them. The water was too swift. At this time, Cripple Deer Creek stayed in its banks usually. Today, slews, underbrush, etc. covered the ground. Beavers have really taken a toll. Back when I was growing up, the creek was a good place to fish and swim.

In my memories, I can just see myself urging my classmates to cross a swollen creek on a footlog. Fear of falling? No thought of it. All I could think of was...we are going to miss the bus.

Oh, to be young and not see danger. God has been so good to me. Today, I know it was He who walked with each girl across an unknown, wet, slippery footlog across a swollen creek.

At this time, I'm sure we didn't stop to say "Thank You, God, for protecting us," but I'm sure our parents did when they learned what we did. They would never have let us take the short cut to the highway. Stay in the road.

At 95, I really see what a dangerous thing I urged my classmates into doing. Ain't God good and He's given me the memories to share with you parents today. As one in my family said of

her sons, "I know what my sons are doing when I'm looking at them". My parents thought we would stay in the road. Youth are carefree and life is wonderful. Age brings boundaries because of experience. We learned and so will our youth of today. The 2020 seniors have just had a life-learning experience. They have handled it well. This disappointment will make them wiser and stronger as they face the future.

"Look out world" here comes a group that has met and conquered their first big hurdle.

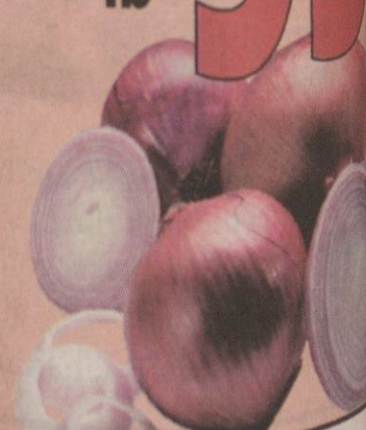

as I John 2:15-17 plainly says.

Our word "slothfulness" comes from a word that means: "to lean idly". I remember hearing the old adage: "An idle mind is the devil's workshop", but the mind is not all that can be useless by being idle. In fact, some might question whether or not the mind is ever completely "idle". Our verses above show that idleness, or laziness, can allow a building to decay, because no one makes the effort to fix leaks or problems.

Idle hands actually can allow a house to fall down. Perhaps Solomon has much more in mind that decaying or falling buildings, but also the loss of opportunities by slothfulness. My father used to say to those of us who were working for him: "let's do something, even if it is wrong". I did not at first know what he meant, but he was not speaking of doing anything morally wrong, rather he was saying, "Let's make an effort to get a job done, even at the risk of making a mistake".

The idea was that immobility would not get anything done, so making a mistake while trying to do what was needed was better than no effort at all. Besides all that, the effort might not even involve any mistakes.

Now we come to a very interesting note in Solomon's "discourse", for he says that feasts and wine make for merriment, but money is the answer to all things. We need to "chew on this" for a moment, for Solomon is not necessarily condoning all that he says here, rather he is stating the way things are. Merriment follows feasts, but money answers all things, yet money does not answer all things. I have heard many people in our day say that "money answers all things".

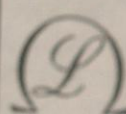
Perhaps they had read this in Ecclesiastes, but perhaps they were simply looking at how "money talks", but, in fact, it does not literally talk. The point that Solomon, and also many others in various eras, is saying is that the use of money will change people's minds and actions, even if those changes are not necessarily right. How many criminals have gotten off "scot-free", because

enough money bought the "best lawyers"? Solomon knew that people and things could be moved by money, therefore he said, as God inspired him, that money answers all things. Thank you to Rose Hayes for sharing photos of the funeral of her uncle who was killed in World War II. They had a letter from her mother that stated he had a beautiful little girl, but she never got to see her.

In the Dec. 1944 Vidette Killed in Germany

Notified of November 22nd James A. Dixon, 3, and husband Thorne Dixon, died in action in on November 1944 according to the Secre-

Dixon was born 1923 in Alcorn and lived most of his life in Mississippi. He graduated from Luka High School and married in 1942. He joined the Army July 1943, trained at Fort Monmouth, N.J., and was in the 88th Central Postal Directory in the 8th Air Bn.

In January he spent some time at home before being sent to Fort Meade, Md., from where he was sent to Europe in February. He was stationed in Germany some time before he was killed in action. Sgt. Dixon was a much loved man, and showed great courage during his military career.

He is survived by his wife and daughter, Brenda, and twenty months old sisters and one brother and many other

Sid Dixon worked with the railroad; his son Buddy Dixon was an engineer

with the railroad; Elizabeth Woods Dixon was from Georgia; Lula Grace Dixon Denton's husband, Paul Denton, worked with the railroad.

Pearl Dixon Watkins (looking down) always had the family together at her house. Rose Hayes

(d/o Jewell) said they all would meet at Aunt Pearl's house. At Easter, she would make all the kids something special, like a crepe paper covered shoebox to put their Easter goodies in.

and in the Dec. 21, 1944

James Dixon

was killed in action in Germany, November 1944. He was born in Creek, Alabama, and died at an early age. He leaves a wife and daughter, his parents, and Mrs. S. J. and seven sisters.

(the first obituary had some errors as it was probably written in haste after receiving the death notice.)

He was killed during the war and was buried on foreign soil, and later at the request, after the remains were brought home. James' daughter was reported to be 4 or 5 years old.
