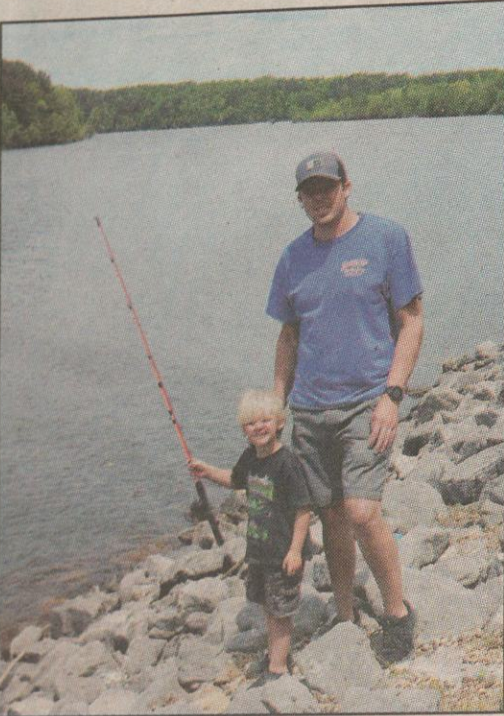

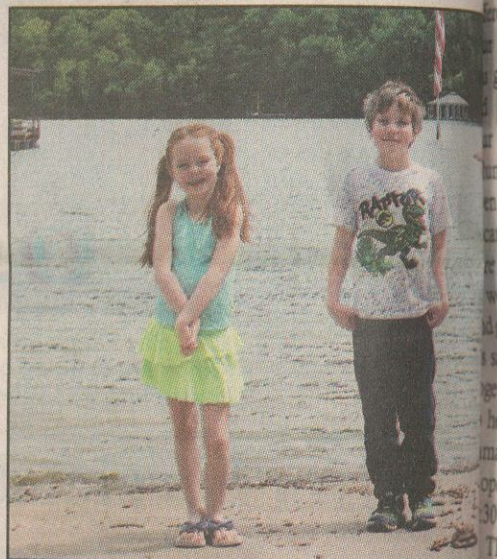
## Pet of the Week

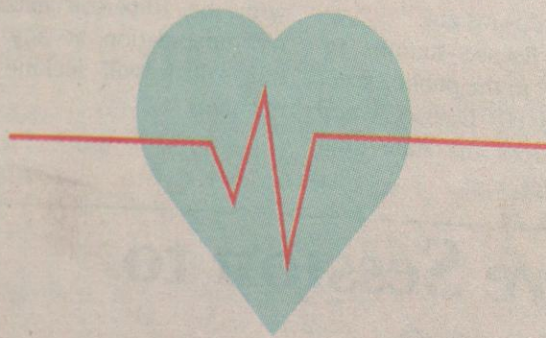
## When to Stay Home

## United Daughters of the Confederacy Place Wreaths in Honor of Confederate Memorial Day

Confederate Memorial Day was held on April 27<sup>th</sup>. John Marshall Stone, Chapter 394, Daughters of the Confederacy placed three wreaths throughout Iuka to honor those who served. The UDC placed one wreath at the grave of the UN-KNOWN SOLDIERS (263), located at Shady Grove Cemetery in Iuka; and one at the Confederate

Memorial located at the Tishomingo Historical Archive Museum. Another was also left on the grave of JOHN MARSHALL STONE, located at Oak Grove Cemetery. He was a Captain of the Iuka Rifles, and Colonel of the 2nd Regiment. He was also the longest serving Governor in the state of Mississippi.

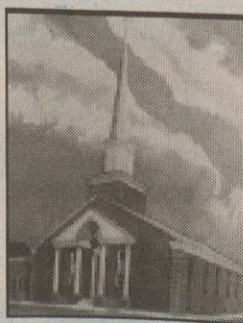

## Shiloh National Military Park Cancels All Planned Memorial Day Weekend Events

Shiloh, TN - Shiloh National Military Park and the National Park Service are taking extraordinary steps to implement the latest guidance from the White House, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the state of Tennessee, on the process for Up America Again.

In Tennessee, the stay at home order ends May 30, with no extension expected. In compliance with the president's 3-phase opening guidance, Phase One, for "all individuals, WHEN IN PUBLIC outdoor recreation areas, shopping areas), to maintain physical distance from others. Social settings with more than 10 people, where appropriate distancing measures are observed."

Memorial Day activities planned for Shiloh National Military Park included cannon firing demonstrations, a Saturday morning outdoor concert, and the annual Memorial Day service in the Shiloh National Cemetery. The cemetery service, one of the oldest continuous Memorial Day services in West Tennessee, easily draws more than 1,200 people annually. Due to the restrictions on crowd size, which were determined could not be adequately managed, all events scheduled from May 23 - May 25, 2020 have been officially cancelled.

"This is not a decision we made easily, but the safety of the public and our employees is our top priority, and we feel this is the best action to take," said Interim Superintendent Randy Martin. "We hope events planned for later in the summer will go forward as scheduled."

Outdoor spaces remain open and accessible to the public in accordance with the latest federal, state, and local health guidance and include Shiloh National Battlefield, Contraband Camp, National Cemetery, Shiloh Indian Mounds National Historic Site, and auto tour route.

The NPS encourages people who choose to visit during this pandemic to adhere to: guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; state and local public health authorities to protect visitors and employees. As services are limited, the NPS encourages visitors to continue to practice: Leave No Trace principles including pack-in and pack-out, to keep outdoor spaces safe and healthy.

2020 Homecoming at South Crossroads Baptist Church on May 3rd will be changed this year due to the Coronavirus.

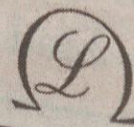

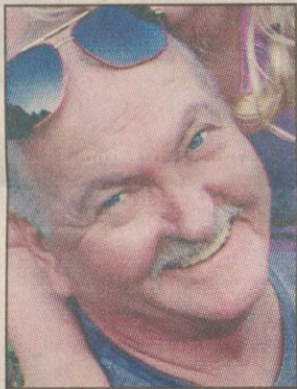

Ecclesiastes 10:3 gives us Solomon's words concern- ing the fool: Yea also when he that is a fool walketh by the way, his wisdom faileth him, and he saith to every one that he is a fool." It seems so strange that a man as wise as Solo- mon, who gave such good advice, should

in later life turn from the very things that he once proclaimed as be- ing good and true! # I Remember

By Ruth Dawson

The classes of 1944 experienced some of the same things the classes of 2020 are experiencing today except, their problems are totally different.

A freshman group of 39 in 1940 graduated 18 in 1944. World War Two was really taking a toll in lives as well as in all activities and the economy.

We still could meet if there was gas to spare. All our field trips and school activities were canceled but not school and the buses continued to run.

The senior class of 1944's senior trip was out to the Tishomingo State Park. Dennis Gray, one of the seniors, drove a bus and all eighteen seniors boarded a school bus for our senior trip. The girls carried picnic lunches to spread and eat together. I guess the boys furnished drinks. I don't recall that.

We crossed the Swinging Bridge and walked until we found just the right spot to spread our lunch. We sat around on the rocks and talked of what the future held for us. We shared what the past four years had been like. Several of our boys had volunteered so they could choose the branch of service they wanted: Army, Navy, Marines, or Coast Guard. Several had already finished boot camp and were on the front lines.

Several of our qualified teachers left the school along with possibly half a dozen of our girls and were working in



defense plants. The salary was better than teaching.

Our classmates wrote when they could and we shared our letters.

During this time, 1940-1945, three of the junior boys were killed in action. Several other students had been wounded, or were in concentration camps. We really didn't have anything to celebrate but shared as to what we planned to do. The boys all except one went to service.

Just a little history to share as to what was going on in 1944: Highway 25 was being completed. It was straightened from Tishomingo to Iuka. I don't recall who the Highway Commissioner was but it could have been Roy Adams.

Mr. W. R. Nettles was serving on the Draft Board. When he was away, I was the substitute teacher for him. I don't recall ever having to report a discipline problem and I was just their age.

My class has had good,

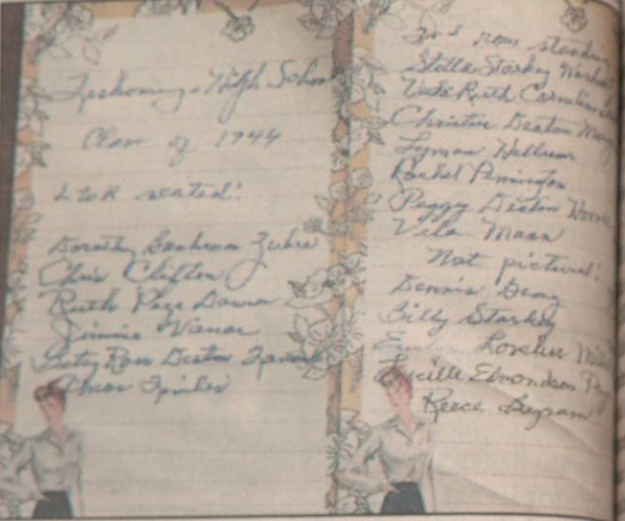

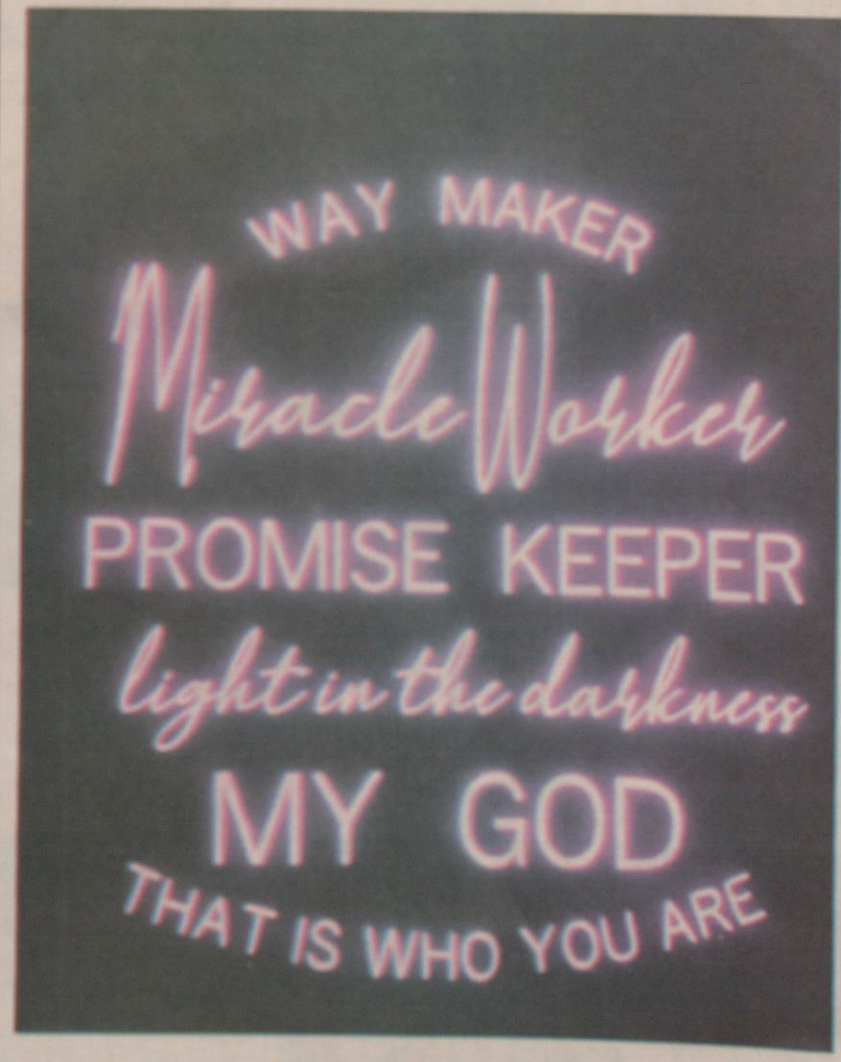
Seniors, who are graduating in 2020, you don't have all the things the classes before you have had just trust God. He is still in control. As you enter the work-place
