Legislative leadership is also working on establishing protocol for working within and visiting the Capitol as shelterin-place restrictions begin to be lifted. Their goal is to allow as much access as possible while prioritizing the health and safety of those in the building.

Candidates will be required to have a petition signed by at least 50 registered voters living in the District which election is sought. The Petition is now available at the Circuit Clerk's Office. 




Practice on your favorite instrument. Listen to the radio. Dance. Sing a little.







Ecclesiastes 10:3 gives us Solomon's words concerning the fool: Yea also when he that is a fool walketh by the way, his wisdom faileth him, and he saith to every one that he is a fool. It seems so strange that a man as wise as Solomon, who gave such good advice, should

in later life turn from the very things that he once proclaimed as being good and true! 





I Remember

By Ruth Dawson

The classes of 1944 experienced some of the same things the classes of 2020 are experiencing today except, their problems are totally different.

A freshman group of 39 in 1940 graduated 18 in 1944. World War Two was really taking a toll in lives as well as in all activities and the economy.

We still could meet if there was gas to spare. All our field trips and school activities were canceled but not school and the buses continued to run.

The senior class of 1944's senior trip was out to the Tishomingo State Park. Dennis Gray, one of the seniors, drove a bus and all eighteen seniors boarded a school bus for our senior trip. The girls carried picnic lunches to spread and eat together. I guess the boys furnished drinks. I don't recall that.

We crossed the Swinging Bridge and walked until we found just the right spot to spread our lunch. We sat around on the rocks and talked of what the future held for us. We shared what the past four years had been like. Several of our boys had volunteered so they could choose the branch of service they wanted: Army, Navy, Marines, or Coast Guard. Several had already finished boot camp and were on the front lines.

Several of our qualified teachers left the school along with possibly half a dozen of our girls and were working in



defense plants. The salary was better than teaching.

Our classmates wrote when they could and we shared our letters.

During this time, 1940-1945, three of the junior boys were killed in action. Several other students had been wounded, or were in concentration camps. We really didn't have anything to celebrate but shared as to what we planned to do. The boys all except one went to service.

We graduated with no big trips like some of the classes before us, no prom, no year books (school annuals) for future enjoyment, no class pictures to hang in the hall, but we did have a graduation cer-

After graduating Mr. and Mrs. L. D. Edwards carried us on a school bus to Booneville to the Nunley Studio for pictures and afterwards we ate at a restaurant, Mrs. Marie was our class sponsor. Mr. L. D. taught agriculture.

With all these restric-

tions I'm guessing we were one of the closest knit classes who ever walked the hall of T.H.S.

I will probably get some flack on the above statement and it will probably come from the Class of 1976. (A compliment intended)

The class of 1944 still has four members: Christine Deaton Morgan, Peggy Deaton Hoover, Betsy Ross Deaton (we really don't know) and myself. We lost Jimmy Vanos and Stella Sarkey Worhurst last year.

Just a little history to share as to what was going on in 1944: Highway 25 was being completed. It was straightened from Tishomingo to Iuka. I don't recall who the Highway Commissioner was but it could have been Roy Adams.

Mr. W. R. Nettles was serving on the Draft Board. When he was away, I was the substitute teacher for him. I don't recall ever having to report a discipline problem and I was just their age.

Seniors of 2020, I'm sorry you have had to give up all the fun times of graduating, but look at it this way and count your blessings.
