Governor Reeves Amends Executive Order - New Regulations to go into Effect

The City of Iuka will follow
Executive Order 1478 and re-
cognize the amendments which
will go into effect beginning on
Thursday May 7th at 8:00 a.m.
Just some of the new regula-
tions allow for outdoor gather-
ings of more than 10 people and
the reopening of dining rooms
in restaurants.

"Now, therefore, I, Tate
Reeves, Governor of the State
of Mississippi, by the authority
vested in me by the Constitution
and laws of the State of Missis-
sippi do hereby order and direct
as follows: The statewide Safer
at Home instituted in Executive
Order 1477 shall remain in full
force and effect until 8:00 a.m.
on Monday, May 11, 2020, ex-
cept as follows."

Restaurants and Bars

From and after 8:00 a.m.
on May 7, 2020, Paragraph 1(h)
(vii) of Executive Order 1477 is
amended to allow restaurants
and bars to resume in-house
(indoor or outdoor) dining sub-
ject to the following limitations:
Prior to resuming in-house din-
ing, the entire restaurant and
bar, including areas not open
to the public, shall be deep
cleaned, disinfected, and sani-
tized. Restaurants and bars shall
set hours of operations to close
to the public no later than 10:00
p.m. Pursuant to Paragraph 1(h)
(ii) of Executive Order 1477,
restaurants shall take all rea-
sonable steps to ensure compli-
ance with the Mississippi State
Department of Health's and
CDC's regulations, orders and
guidance to prevent the spread
of COVID-19, including, but

not limited to: social distanc-
ing, sending sick employees
home, actively encouraging
sick employees to stay home;
separating and sending home
employees who appear to have
respiratory illness symptoms;
adopting and enforcing regular
and proper hand-washing and
personal hygiene protocols; and
daily screening of employees for
COVID-19 related symptoms
before beginning their shifts.

Restaurants and bars shall
conduct a daily screening of all
employees at the beginning of
their shifts. Such daily screen-
ing shall include the following
questions, and any employee
answering any question in the
affirmative shall be sent home:
Have you been in close con-
tact with a confirmed case of
COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
Are you experiencing a cough,
shortness of breath, or sore
throat? Have you had a fever in
the last 48 hours? Have you had
new loss of taste or smell? Have
you had vomiting or diarrhea in
the last 24 hours?

All employees shall be re-
quired to report any symptoms
of COVID-19 to their super-
visor, and any employee who
exhibits any of the symptoms
of COVID-19 during their shift
shall be sent home immediately
and advised to consult with their
physician. Appropriate PPE
shall be worn by all employees
based on their duties and re-
sponsibilities and in adherence
to state and local regulations

and guidelines. Every employee who comes into direct contact with customers shall be provided a cloth mask and required to wear that mask while on duty. All employees shall be provided training regarding minimizing the spread of COVID-19, including the importance of frequent hand washing and personal hygiene, proper sanitation, cough and sneeze etiquette, use of PPE, and safe food-handling procedures.

Where possible, workstations should be staggered so employees can avoid standing next to each other. Where separation of workstations is not possible, the frequency of surface cleaning and sanitizing should be increased. Break rooms shall be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized, and the number of employees in the break room shall be limited to allow for strict social distancing (a minimum of six feet between employees and no gathering of more than ten employees).

The number of customers in the restaurant or bar shall be no greater than 50% of seating capacity. Floor plans shall be updated to ensure at least six feet of separation between each party/group whether dining indoor or outdoor. Party sizes shall be limited to a maximum of six customers per table. Bars or bar areas that do not offer food services shall remain closed and live music shall not be permitted.

The use of technology solutions to minimize person-to-person contact is encouraged, including mobile reservations systems, text upon arrival, mobile ordering, and con-

tactless payment options. Signage shall be posted at each entrance stating no customer with a fever or other symptom of COVID-19 is permitted in the restaurant or bar. Customers shall be screened for illness upon their entry into the restaurant or bar.

Customers shall not be allowed to congregate in the waiting area or bar area. The restaurant shall adopt a process to ensure that a minimum of six feet separation is maintained between customers while waiting to be seated or in the bar area.

All front-of-house high contact surfaces shall be sanitized, at a minimum, every two hours. The use of disposable menus is encouraged. All non-disposable menus shall be sanitized between each use. Tables, chairs, and tabletop items shall be sanitized after each table turns.

Buffet Service: Self-service buffets, food stations, and drink stations are prohibited.

Cafeteria style (worker served) buffets and food stations are permitted with appropriate barriers in place.

Hand sanitizer shall be placed at all points of entry and exit, the hostess station, in or near the bathrooms, and at the cashier station. All food service areas shall be deep cleaned daily.

Parks and Outdoor Spaces

From and after 8:00 a.m. on May 7, 2020, Paragraph I(h)(viii) of Executive Order 1477 is amended to allow parks to open subject to the following limitations.

State parks may open to the public between the

hours of 9:00 a.m. through 7:00 p.m. for recreational outdoor activities, subject to the rules and guidance promulgated by the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks. Pursuant to Paragraph I(b)(iii) of Executive Order 1477, individuals using state parks shall maintain social distancing of a minimum of six feet separation between each individual. Group gatherings/activities shall be limited to a maximum of 10 participants indoor and a maximum of 20 participants outdoor.

Municipal parks and private parks may open to the public between the hours of 9:00 a.m. through 7:00 p.m. for recreational outdoor activities as determined by local authority and under such limitations and restrictions as may be imposed by local authority. Such restrictions at a minimum must require maintaining a minimum of six feet distance between each individual and limiting group gatherings/activities to a maximum of 10 participants indoor and a maximum of 20 participants outdoor.

Outdoor recreational activities, including swimming in pools, shall be permitted between the hours of 9:00 a.m. through 7:00 p.m. Group gatherings/activities shall be limited to a maximum of 10 participants (including coaches, lifeguards and parents) indoor and a maximum of 20 participants outdoor.

This Executive Order shall remain in effect and in full force from 8:00 a.m. on May 7, 2020, until 8:00 a.m. on Monday May 11, 2020, unless it is modified, amended, rescinded, or superseded.

UDC To Meet by Phone in May

The April 20th meeting was cancelled due to the COVID-19. The May 18th meeting will most likely be cancelled, however we will be meeting by phone. I will send out copies of the UDC monthly magazine recommended program topic for our members to review.

For the month of April the topic is, "How Did the War Really Begin?" by Corinne M Hoch.

The August 2019 issue of UDC Magazine focused on the true cause of the war between the states being economics, the South felt like it was being over and unfairly taxed. The South provided more resources to the North. The North's main resource was its manufactured

products while the South was agriculture. The North was beginning to feel the effects of Labor forces without work and their dissatisfaction with the central government. South Carolina requested the removal of the US Regulars (the north) from Fort Sumter, which took 30 years to complete, and Fort Mautrie. During this upheaval Anderson moved his men to Fort Sumter.

Jefferson Davis was inaugurated provincial president of the Confederacy on February 4. While, on March 4, Abraham Lincoln was inaugurated as president of the US States; at that time Lincoln would not recognize the

Confederacy.

While in office Lincoln's Republican Party suffered severe internal problems which worsened each day and caused conflict within the party. The South realized they had been betrayed, they did not intend to abandon Fort Sumter. Lincoln stated that if Beauregard (the south) tried to blockade, he would send in soldiers and weapons.

On April 2nd Davis decided to take action and inform Beauregard that they did not have assurances that Fort Sumter would be evacuated. The North continued to promise evacuation. Beauregard was told to hold the

Forts mail and demand evacuation and if they refuse to open fire. The first shots were fired April 12th 1861 at 4:20. Boston Harbor was bombarded with the sounds of gunfire and cannons. The fighting ceased with surrender by Anderson at 2:30pm. Approximately 4000 shells had been fired.

On April 15th Lincoln called volunteers to fight against the South. He also called for a blockade against the Southern states. He had to find a way to end the unemployment and the continued shutting down of businesses. Anderson stated that Lincoln started this war; Lincoln did not want the war but saw no other way for the North to regain financial stability.

a right use of this verse also. When Peter and the other apostles were commanded not to teach in the name of Jesus (Acts 5:27-28), Peter gave the words of Acts 5:29 above. I have often said to some who seemingly were looking for a reason to rebel against authority, and who used Acts 5:29 as their justification: "We must be sure that we can put our fingers on the Bible passage or verse that

gives us right to rebel against authority." We cannot afford to base our failure to submit on personal whims or preferences. The problem, however, is that we have many leaders in governments today, both in our nation and around the world, who give no credence to the Word of God! When this continues to be the case in any nation, that nation's downfall is already on its way!

Solomon was

writing under the inspiration of the Spirit of God, so what he wrote is correct. His main point in Ecclesiastes 10:4 is that those living under the authority of ruler should submit to that authority for his own benefit. Those who yield will come out better than those who rebel, as long as God's Word is not being violated by the ruler, for God Himself has set up governmental authority (Romans 13:1-7). When one can yield to any authority without violating God's authority as clearly spelled out in His Word, he will gain through his submission. I have preached

in jails for twenty-eight years, along with pastoring churches, and I have never told an inmate to rebel against the authority over him. Yet there is another side to this equation, for the person in authority also has an Authority over him, no matter how high his position may be, for God is the final Authority over all of us. Our nation was founded on this principle, as were some other nations, but when we begin tearing out the foundation on which our society stands, we are making a very foolish move. In my estimation we are doing this exact thing in our day. Perhaps God will use

present day problems to bring us to the recognition that we have overlooked the One Supreme Authority over all of the universe, God Himself. Yes, I understand that not everybody believes there is a God, so he has to have some "unknown force or energy to be his god. He may wind up saying that mass is eternal, as some scientists say, but that makes no sense. Every design has to have a designer! 


