available in initial areas by December 2020. While this might seem like an extensive amount of time, the board wishes to offer encouragement by stating their plans to have service available throughout all of the territory within the next 20 months.

Fiber internet transfers data along thin glass or plastic wires which are housed inside the larger protective cables. One benefit of this is that internet is less likely to be effected by a power outage; the lines are specifically dedicated to the transfer of internet data which should provide more consistent service. This is a vital service for our area which will benefit local citizens, students and businesses.







### Shiloh National Military Park to Begin Phased Reopening

SHILOH, Following guidance from the White House, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and state and local public health authorities, Shiloh National Military Park is increasing recreational access and services. The National Park Service (NPS) is working servicewide with federal, state, and local public health authorities to closely monitor the COVID-19 pandemic and using a phased approach to increase access on a parkby-park basis.

Beginning this Friday, May 29, 2020, Shiloh National Military Park will reopen access to the:

Visitor Center parking area.

Restroom in the

Picnic area and restroom.

In addition, the following spaces continue to be available:

Shiloh Battlefield,
Corinth Battlefield,
National Cemetery, Shiloh
Indian Mounds National
Historic Landmark, trails,
tour roads, and the Corinth
Contraband Camp.

With public health in mind, the following facilities remain closed at this time:

Visitor Center and the Corinth Interpretive Center

"The health and safety of our visitors, employees, volunteers, and partners continues to be paramount. At Shiloh, our operational approach is to examine each facility function and service provided to ensure those operations comply with current public health guidance, and will be regularly monitored," said Superintendent Acting Martin. "We Randy continue to work closely with the NPS Office of Public Health using CDC guidance to ensure public areas and workspaces are safe and clean for visitors, employees, partners, and volunteers."

While these areas are accessible for visitors to enjoy, a return to full operations will continue to be phased and services may be limited. When recreatingfollow local area health orders, practice Leave No Trace principles, avoid crowding and avoid high-risk outdoor artistries.

Some of the nicest people Ive known have been police officers from county to state to city cops. I have some dear friends who wear badges and they are good people. The police officers who killed George Floyd on May 25th in Minneapolis at that moment and time were not good people. There was nothing good about that scene of a defenseless man being choked to death.

When we moved to Memphis in 1960, I felt like it was time to burn all of them.

Now, in my latter years how I wish I had kept them, but I have memories. They were in their teens fighting for our country.

Tishomingo County lost forty-three killed in action, not to mention those wounded or missing

Digress. In the hall of T.H.S. where I taught the last twenty-plus years there was a list of those killed in World War II hanging at the front entrance. I read it nearly every day because it held names of young men I knew who gave their lives for our freedom. We lost 3,555 from Mississippi killed in action and 353,187 in the U.S.A.
