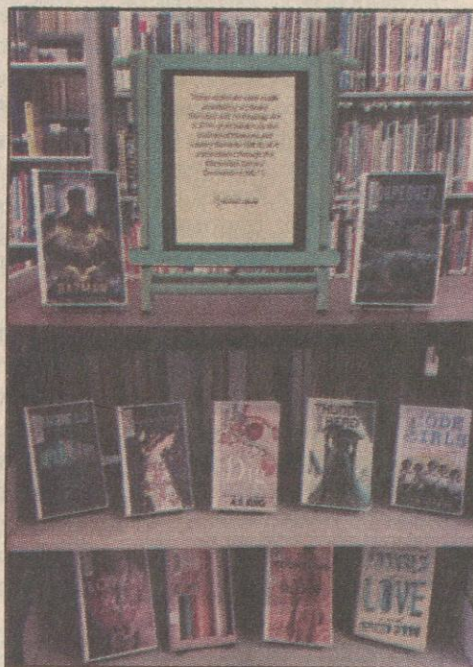

"The Gestalt Gardener"

A garden is good for many things, including amusement, especially for those who have an appreciation of the absurd.

Mine is more than a never-ending Mobius strip of chores for keeping flowers, herbs, and vegetables coming all year, though this week I'm planting more summer veggies for fall harvest.

But this week I don't know which was funnier to me, having a water garden turn so pea-soup green even the frogs wouldn't swim in it, or rescuing a baby opossum that I found trapped waist deep in a bucket of over-ripe figs.

My main water garden is a large antique cast-iron sugar kettle with a central fountain and sculpture.

No plants, no fish, just an attractive, splashy white noise focal point in the garden, set amongst Spanish moss-draped stumps and lots of ferns and hostas.

By day there's a queue of thirsty birds and butterflies, and lizards poised to pounce; it also attracts dragonflies, which I learned to catch by my young daughter who I found wandering around the garden with one perched on a stick like they do on the ends of fishing poles. After dusk it becomes a crucial watering hole for 'possums and raccoons, and a courting place for toads and noisy little tree frogs.

The water feature's only maintenance is an annual cleaning to remove settled gunk from fallen tree leaves, a twice-yearly rinsing of the pump filter, and an occasional topping off to replace evaporated water.

That is, until it got hot recently. Because it's in a mid-day sunny spot, the heat, coupled with no plants to shade the water, fomented an algae bloom, turning it green as a leprechaun's waist coat. It was so vivid I wanted to celebrate it.

I could have bought some algacide from the pond supply store, but wanted fast results, so instead I poured in some chlorine bleach (which had I any fish they would have gone blind), but it just turned the water brown. So I ended up just bailing it all out and starting over with fresh water. Fish would have needed to be kept overnight in a bucket of water until the tap-water chlorine evaporated.

One of the easiest ways to reduce algae is to plant lots of aquatic plants that cover most of the water surface, but why go to the trouble to create a water scene and then hide it? Might as well just stick regular plants in dirt in the first place.

I recently set up another water feature beside a backyard deck where I spend a lot of time staring into a fire, even on warm evenings. It was easy, just a smaller iron cooking kettle with a water pump and fountain to make splashy sounds closer to



where I sit. Because it's in the shade, there's no algae, and the moving water from the fountain prevents mosquito larvae.

The other humorous incident followed my cooking down a couple dozen jars of preserves from fresh-picked home-grown figs. To me they are worth their weight in gold - one of the prime benefits of summer gardening in the South.

But that night I set a plastic bucket of overripe figs and trimmings outside the door, and the next morning I was surprised by a hissing baby 'possum that was all but swimming in the sticky muck churned up by his going around and around all night. I had to fish out the possum and hose it down in a separate bucket to get the fig goo and fruit flies out of his fur.

Maybe I shoulda just chucked the 'possum into the fountain.

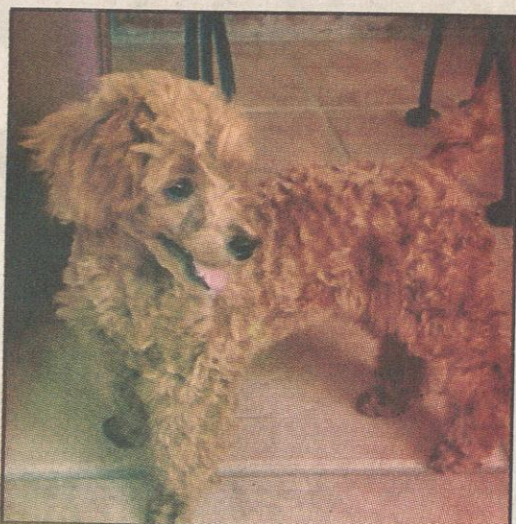

from onset of illness (or from the date of a positive test for those who are asymptomatic)."

The failure or refusal to obey the lawful order of a health officer is, at a minimum, a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$500.00 (41-3-59) or imprisonment for six months or both. If a life-threatening disease is involved, failure or refusal to obey the lawful order of a health officer is a felony, punishable by a fine of up to \$5,000.00 or imprisonment for up to five years or both (41-23-2).

Persons infected with COVID-19 should limit exposure to household contacts. No visitors should be allowed in the home. Please stay in a specific room away from others in your home. Use a separate bathroom if available. If you need to be around others in your

home, you should wear a face mask. Please see <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/hcp/guidance-prevent-spread.html> for guidance on preventing transmission in the home. Follow MSDH by e-mail and social media at HealthyMS.com/connect.

What about the daughter Angie?

Gardening is just not her thing and I understand why. When she was growing up she was very allergic to stings. Really any stings or bites from any insect. So Angie did the household chores and I worked in the garden which I would rather do and still would.

This year that little corner of the garden has just outdone itself. Everything Kim and the girls caged, I can gather. Those that are low on the ground Kim has to pick and he does. I've heard no complaint, but he probably thinks it's easier to pick peas and cucumbers than it would be to pick me up. Thank God for obedient children. They never outgrow their raising.

As I was walking around the garden this week (yes, with a four pronged cane) I prayed an unusual prayer coming from me: "Lord, please instill within my very being that I don't still need a garden." 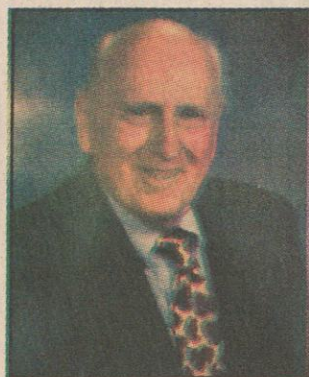

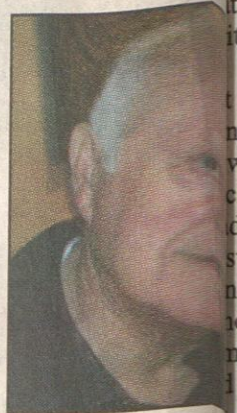
Ira Waudell Harber William A. Dexter

In Ecclesiastes 11:7-8, we read: "Truly the light is sweet, and a pleasant thing it is for the eyes to behold the sun: But if a man live many years, he will not rejoice in them all; let him remember the days of darkness: for they shall be many. All that cometh is vanity." These two verses will seem very pessimistic to some people, but they are in fact, only calling us to face reality! 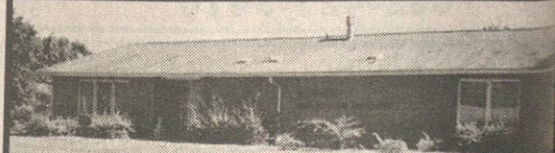

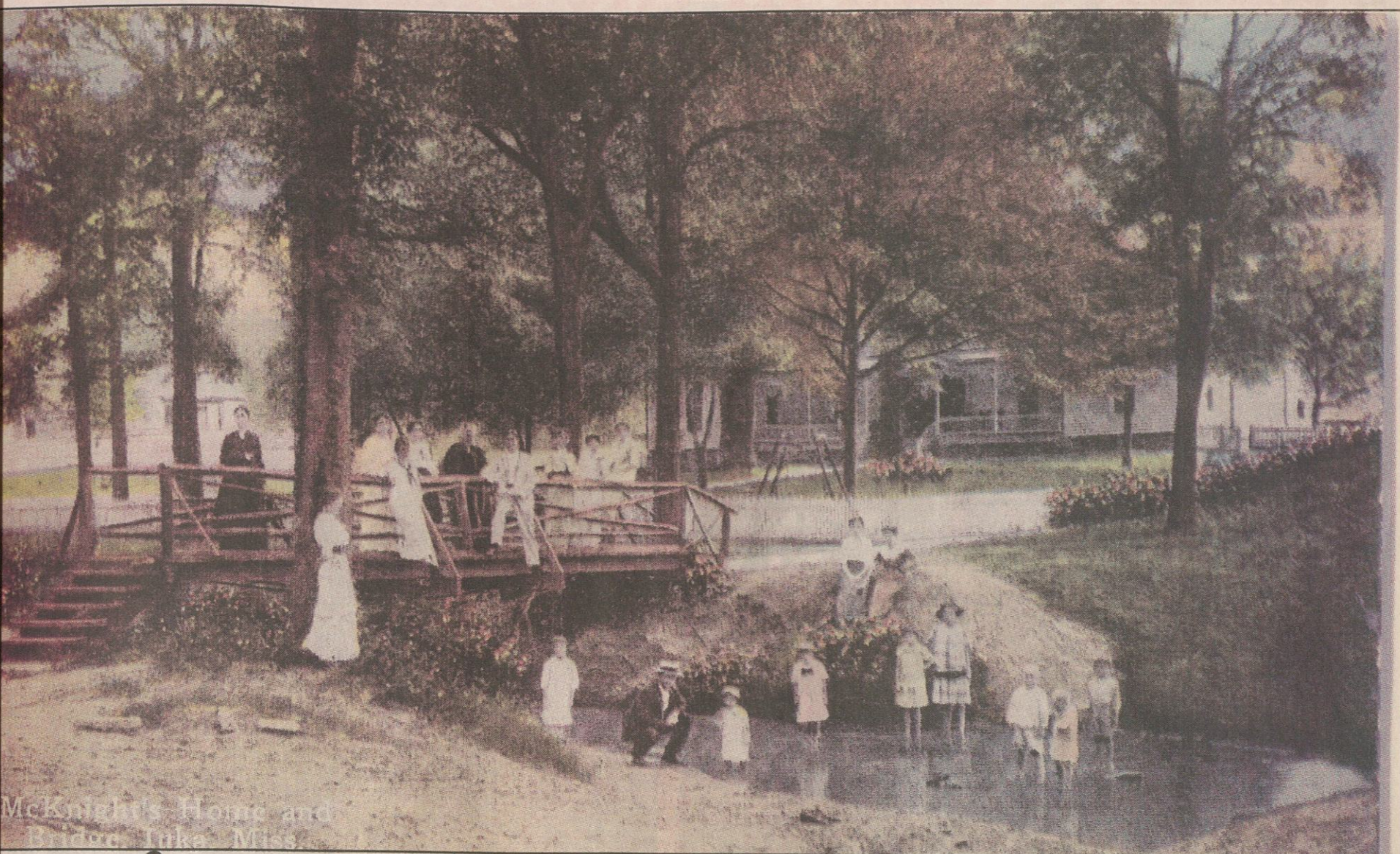

This photo was taken at the Iuka Mineral Springs Park on the east side of the park. This is the bridge

which today is the covered bridge. In the background can be seen the McKnight home and McKnight family is shown on the bridge

and in the water of Indian Creek. William McKnight and his wife Eloisa moved to Eastport and opened

a mercantile business in the 1850's. Their children were Malinda J., James O., Summerfield and Charles, all born in Tennessee. In

the year 1857 the McKnight family moved to Iuka. Mr. McKnight tore down his large house at Eastport and rebuilt it east

of the Park. The McKnight family opened a grocery store in Iuka and built up a reputable business. They were also very involved in church activities.

Rev. William McKnight died on January 31, 1883, and is buried in Oak Grove Cemetery in the family plot.

Photo at left:

Indian Creek which runs beside the Iuka Mineral Springs Park was once a swimming and wading paradise to cool off in the summer. This photo probably taken in the early 1900's shows to the left the Spring Park which appears to have a wire fence around it. In the far background you can see the railroad trestle and you can also see the old wooden bridge that went to the McKnight home.

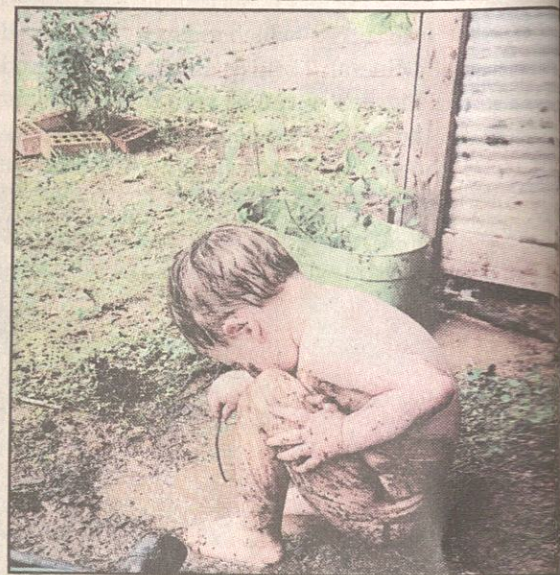
