Macie Walker Signs with the University of North Alabama

Macie Walker will try to carry on her winning tradition at the next level. The Lady Cardinals' senior guard has signed her national letter of intent to play basketball at the University of North Alabama next season.

"They've always believed in me the last few years," Walker said of UNA. "It's close to home, and it's a perfect fit for me."

The University of North Alabama has excelled in women's basketball under the direction of Coach Missy Tiber. Tiber led North Alabama as the school began its transition to NCAA Division I basketball in the 2018-19 season as a member of the ASUN Conference.

"UNA will be fortunate to have Macie on their team next season," said Coach Chris Higginbottom. "Any time a team can inherit a player with an 80% winning percentage, it is a win for both the player and the program."

Macie has been a starting guard at Belmont for the past three years. She helped lead the team to the quarterfinals of the state tournament during her freshman and junior season, and 3A State Runner-Up during her sophomore season.

Macie has been selected as 2020 Clarion Ledger Dandy Dozen. She has also been an All State selection the past three



seasons. Macie led her team last season with some very impressive statistics. She averaged 20.1 points per game, 5.4 rebounds per game, and 3.8 assists per game.

"It's very exciting to see her rewarded for her hard work," said Coach Chris Higginbottom.

"Macie's a great basketball player, and I look forward to seeing her continue her basketball career at UNA."

Macie is the daughter of Matthew and Melissa Walker and the granddaughter of Becky and Earl Walker of Iuka.

North Half Justice Court Judge to be Decided

Circuit Clerk's Office Open Saturday for Absentee Voting in the North Justice Court Judge Runoff Election

The Circuit Clerk's office will be open on Saturday, November 21, 2020 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. for absentee voting in the North Justice Court Judge Runoff Election. You may also vote by absentee ballot in person at the Clerk's office Monday - Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The last day to vote absentee in person at the Circuit Clerk's office for this runoff is Saturday, November 21, 2020. For those who may need to vote absentee by mail, please call our office as soon as possible so you will have ample time to go through the absentee by mail process. All mailed absentee ballots for the runoff must be postmarked by November 24, 2020, and received within five business days in order to be eligible to be counted.

On Tuesday, November 24th, 2020 the Runoff election

for Justice Court Judge, North Half will take place, and the polling locations will be open on that day from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The Circuit Clerk's office along with the Election Commission will deploy the same risk reduction measures for COVID-19 at the polling locations, as we did during the General Election. We encourage you to wear your mask or face shield when going to the polls to vote in this runoff on 11/24, however face mask or face shields are not required to vote.

Please get out and exercise your right to vote in this upcoming Runoff Election for Justice Court Judge, North Half. Don't forget to take your photo identification with you when voting at the polls or at the Clerk's office. As a reminder, this runoff election is for North End Justice Court Judge, therefore only voters who are registered in the North End District are eligible to vote in the runoff. Ricky Cornelison Seeks Your Support in Next Tuesday's Run-off Election

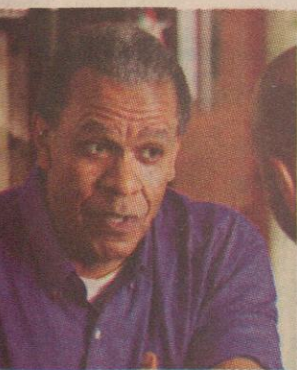

I've been at a loss for what to share with you this week. After going to vote last week, the way we vote is so different. It was my son's idea for me to write about things I share with him of voting long ago.

The campaigning this year has certainly been different. Since it was not an election for county officials could be one reason, but we know the corona virus COVID19 has made many of us old recluses. Especially elderly.

Some of the things I'm going to share have been handed down by word of mouth and have not been done with voting.

It seems to me I have written about political campaigns but I try to stay neutral because I want to keep reading my article.

Sitting here wracking my brain for memories, a telephone rang. It was Jimmy Oaks, Jess and Zeke's son, he spent his life in the military. He was born in county and had really enjoyed the beautiful mountains. Just take a trip down Hwy. 25 to Tishomingo County and you might travel to Boone on Hwy. 30, if you need to see more. I feel like I remember who said, "Lord, I fear you have made the year beautiful this year" as I sit here and look out the window, the leaves don't fall slowly. They rainers of leaves with a light breeze. How beautiful works of God. I don't remember the author just she also prayed "let no leaf fall," and bet my son who had me for literature could tell me, but I'll up when I have time. Even at my age, "Time is my most commodity." Where does it go? It's like the passes but we sure can't hold it.

Having a birthday recently made me think of my nephews, Jimmy Page, Harrisburg, AR, a S. Marine. He said, "If I didn't know my age, would I be?" so true.

The following is a poem I really like. I hope it reads many times. It tells it like it is.

"How Old are you?"

"Age is a quality of mind,
If you have left your dreams behind,
If hope is cold,
If you no longer look ahead,
If your ambitions fires are dead
Then you are old."

"But if from life you take the best,
And if in life you keep the jest,
If love you hold,

No matter how the years go by,
No matter how the birthdays fly
You are not old."

Thank you H. S. Fritsch. I love to read poetry keep reminding me "I'm not that old."

I'm sure not sticking to my subject, but this is assignment for a literature/English grad.

I could just write about the political machine then, I'd not be able to share with you some of the that have made life interesting to me.

Every Saturday elderly men sat on the loaves along the west side of hwy. 25 in Tishomingo. That place where horses and mules could be packed. Watering troughs were provided.

Candidates when I was very young let you by visiting in the country and by telephone if you had one. I really remember Roy Adams, who we were hoeing cotton. I can just see him stepping through plowed ground with those white shoes and pen striped summer suit. Go gooding.

As I remember there was an all day picnic candidate speaking once a year at Iuka at the Springs. It was filled with the candidates and mostly men. I couldn't vote. Correction. In 1920 the Constitution the U. S. ratified the 19th Amendment giving women, man or woman, the right to vote. Removing restrictions that had hindered many of the men voting. To keep poor people and the African Americans from voting they imposed a "poll tax." Then you show a receipt for the poll tax or you couldn't vote.

I was old enough to vote before my mother voted. Poor people were not able to pay the fee. I didn't get to vote. The 19th Amendment gave us freedom to vote, but for years they were not able to give this freedom because of restrictions.

No with all restrictions removed, (except the three) in Tishomingo County we have only 70% registered voters voting. This is more than we have, but 30 out of every 100 did not honor the No jury duty.

Growing up we were in the Third District. I remember the names of Wade, Epps, Pace, Wynn and married when I turned "21" Big Daddy (W.F. D.) couldn't wait until I got to the courthouse to register. I wasn't used to my dad taking me in politics. I had been married only two when the 2nd primary of the General Election was in 1943. We spent the day hauling voters to the precinct. I bathed sweaty, dirty-faced children who mom's readied themselves presentable to go to work, busy day, but it paid off.

I remember the influence the elderly men had on their children. My Grandpa Page would visit his children in the fields. It would be hot but he'd go remember him getting all fired up taking his shirt off, rubbing his gray hair and saying, "By God boys this is how it is. We must all go vote." He Bilbo man and is the only Governor I recalled. I was interested in viewing his little stature in the Capitol. We Betas visited the Capitol building as long as we in Jackson for the convention. Such a little stature but he was heart.

Grandpa Page couldn't read but he had a great memory. Grandma read to him and he was well versed. Continued on next page.

scripture. There were few other reasons he supported the Sheriff, especially when it was a "Face." His niece Verda Page married Clarence Page, ex-sheriff. Scine Page's son, blood runs thicker than water.

Verda was the daughter of John Page, Grandpa's brother. Speaking of John Page reminds me of an incident that happened about this time. Grandpa Dee Dawson and John Page were lifetime friends. Grandpa Dee would stop and pick Uncle John up on Saturday when he went to Tishomingo. They shared all the news sitting in the loafer's bench each Saturday. Sometimes they talked more than news. If one of these younger men stopped by, gave them a "swink", they would grab their walking sticks and never say a word. They followed the young man

down the opening between the stores, got out of sight behind the stores, and relished a good "Snort!" They were too stingy to buy it, usually but went home, pretty fired up on the working-classes' loot.

On the way home from Tishomingo one Saturday, Uncle John and Dee got into a big argument about something probably politics. Uncle John said to Grandpa Dee, "Dee, we better stop this argument right now or we will be in a fight in a minute."

"By 'xxxxx' John, in half a minute" they rode on home quieter than usual. By the time they got home, they had forgotten their anger. Great friends for life - no carrying grudges.

Tomorrow is Veteran's Day. A National Holiday and justifiably should be. I was reading and ran across the following state-

ment accredited to Voltaire, a great French writer. "I disapprove of what you are saying, but I will defend to the death your right to say it."

Veterans and all citizens should feel this way. A two party government has kept America a free nation since July 4, 1776. If we as Americans expect to leave this type of government for our posterity we need to wake up and be, like Grandpa (W.H. Page). Tell it like it is and go vote. We will lose this great freedom (duty) if we get too complacent about exercising one of our greatest freedoms. Our veterans and those that gave their lives for our freedom and they expect us to "take the torch and hold it high." If we don't use it we will lose it. As long as we are able to vote - we are able to choose. Exercise this right. It's our duty.


American Legion Auxiliary Unit 15 Sponsoring Wreaths
