You may also vote by absentee ballot in person at the Clerk's office Monday - Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The last day to vote absentee in person at the Circuit Clerk's office for this runoff is Saturday, November 21, 2020. For those who may need to vote absentee by mail, please call our office as soon as possible so you will have ample time to go through the absentee by mail process.All mailed absentee ballots for the runoff must be postmarked by November 24, 2020, and received within five business days in order to be eligible to be counted.

On Tuesday, November 24th, 2020 the Runoff election

for Justice Court Judge, North Half will take place, and the polling locations will be open on that day from 7a.m. to 7p.m. The Circuit Clerk's office along with the Election Commission will deploy the same risk reduction measures for COVID-19 at the polling locations, as we did during the General Election. We encourage you to wear your mask or face shield when going to the polls to vote in this runoff on 11/24, however face mask or face shields are not required to vote.

Please get out and exercise your right to vote in this upcoming Runoff Election for Justice Court Judge, North Half. Don't forget to take your photo identification with you when voting at the polls or at the Clerk's office. As a reminder, this runoff election is for North End Justice Court Judge, therefore only voters who are registered in the North End District are eligible to vote in the runoff.
