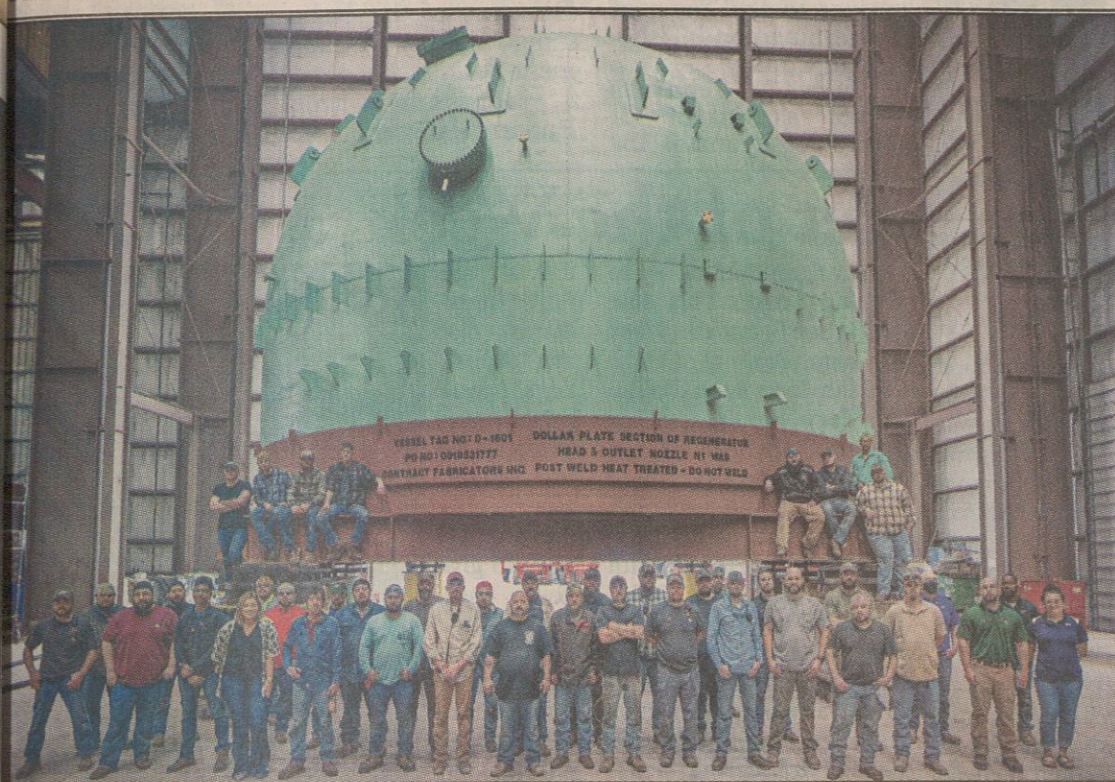

NC Teen Dies in Hunting Accident in Tishomingo County

A North Carolina teen died when his hunting stand shifted and he fell onto his rifle barrel, Mississippi authorities report.

Justin Lee Smith, 17, of Supply, North Carolina, was in a ladder stand Saturday afternoon in a tall thin tree in the northwest part of the county near the Alcorn County line, Tishomingo County coroner Mack Wilemon reported.

According to Wilemon, the stand apparently turned to one

side, Smith fell 10 feet and was impaled by his gun. Smith was able to call 911 on his cellphone, but died shortly afterward, Wilemon said. Justin was on a hunting trip with other members of his family from North Carolina. His body was returned to NC and there was no indications of any family connection with this area.

A state wildlife agent is investigating.

Local Care Worker Charged For Theft

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office along with the Adult Protective Services (APS) has been investigating an incident involving a care worker, Alicia Nichole Horne, who had worked for a facility that provided services through a Medicaid Waiver program.

Investigators for the sheriff's office along with the APS, received a complaint that large sums of cash had been taken from an elderly client's residence that Horne was assigned to in Tishomingo County. During the investigation, Horne became the main suspect and was later questioned; she also had a small portion of the alleged stolen cash with her at the time of being interviewed. Horne was then arrested and charged with the crime.

Alicia Nichole Horne, 33-year-old, white female of Dennis, Mississippi was official-

ly charged with exploitation of vulnerable person. Horne's bond was set by the Tishomingo

County Justice Court at five thousand dollars (\$5,000). Also, due to the situation, the Mississippi Department of Child Protective Services (MDCPS) was also brought in for a separate investigation.

This is still an ongoing investigation between the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office and the Adult Protective Services. Further charges / arrests may be pending as this case progresses. This case will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.

Sarah Robinson was Named a 2020 Semper Fidelis All American

Tishomingo County senior Soccer player Sarah Robinson of Iuka was recognized as a member of the 2020 Semper Fidelis All American Team at a pregame ceremony on November 17th. She was selected last spring and was scheduled to go Washington DC in July to meet with the rest of the team. The trip to Washington was cancelled due to COVID 19. So the Marine Corp asked all of the schools with players on the All American Team to hold ceremonies at a local school event. At the November 17th event Sarah received her All American award. Former Brave Soccer player and TC Alum Clay Knupp was on hand to assist with awarding her with a beautiful plaque. Clay served in the Marines. Principal Pete Howell was awarded a plaque for his mentorship to Sarah. The school also received a plaque to display. Sarah is the only recipient from the state of Mississippi and one of only 96



nationwide. She was nominated by TCHS Head Soccer Coach Lyndon Cain. "Sarah is a great young lady and such a positive leader on the Lady Braves Soccer team. She has played for us since 7th grade and continues to be a great influence on our younger players." Nominees must play a varsity sport, show character and scholarship, and serve in their community. The sponsor of the award is the U.S. Marine Corp. Sarah is the daughter of Heath and Melanie Robinson. Her sister Madelyn also plays for TC Soccer.

20 Remember

"Over the river, and through the woods, to grandfather's house we go." Not so. During my youth, as you recall, I grew up during the Great Depression. When Thanksgiving Day arrived, my family stayed at their home and celebrated. I lived within hollering distance of my parental grandparents, but we never got to visit on a holiday. There were too scarce to

Daddy would cage a long rooster and feed him corn for about two weeks before he was bled and turned over to Mom to take care of. We had the fat rooster for Thanksgiving we usually had some form of turkey for Christmas. Just the big rooster to waste. Eggs were usually killed between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Then there were lots of choices: ham, pork chops, spare ribs, roast meat and a side of chocolate pudding (we always had plenty of eggs) mince, greens, sweet Irish potatoes, turnips and greens for collards. Maybe a stove-oven full of sweet baked potatoes. We used all this and were healthy. I never knew how poor we were. Daddy worked hard and Mom would cook and sew. So I survived where many families suffered.

Sometimes we had Thanksgiving programs with the children at church and school. The same group attended both school and church and many were kin.

During this time there were four months of school. The teacher boarded at Grandpa Grandma Page's and taught at Cripple Deer, one teacher, one-room school. We made it fine, by the time I was ready for high school (1940) the school had increased to eight months. "80" years ago. Digress: I feel so sorry for the students today. I have eight great-grandchildren today. They seem to be achieving in subject matter, but the fellowship with each other? Not supposed to. The lower grades where the foundation is laid/made in education like building a house. If the foundation is a firm, did rock or soil? Success in the results. Parents must work with their children in lower grades to see that a future is completed. Review, Review, Review.

Back to Thanksgiving and a little history of this special day.

The first English settlement was at Jamestown, VA, in 1607, but the history of Jamestown for another time. I am going to concentrate on the Pilgrims who settled at Plymouth Rock, Mass.

The Pilgrims came to America so they could worship God according to the dictates of their convictions. They were known in England as separatists. They were persecuted and many moved to other nearby countries.

A group, (called Pilgrims) boarded the Mayflower and headed for America for religious freedom. The ship was loaded with a love for God and abundance of common sense. Unlike the colonists of Jamestown in 1607, there came no great artists or politician but a group who had a zest for God and each other. Many others followed as the years went by.

A couple of the Indi-

ans lived with them and helped them survive the first winter. Something like we are faced with today hit the Pilgrims the first year and killed one half of the group. They learned from their Indian friends that the same disease had hit the Indians two years before their settlement of 1620. They had had a great harvest of corn and pumpkins. The Indians had taught them how to raise corn, fish, and hunt and learned of several natural foods and berries.

They taught them to put a fish where the corn seeds were put and this gave a great harvest of corn, for these blessings. Gov. William Bradford and the Pilgrims were happy with the harvest and he proclaimed a day for celebrating. The ladies cooked, boiled, roasted and baked. The children were kept busy turning roasts on spits or rods in front of an open fire. More than eighty friendly Indians came and brought wild turkey, venison or deer meat.

The tables were set up outside with benches where they sat and fellowshiped together. They had a program of prayers, preaching, and singing to their Heavenly Father. Yes, there was lots of dancing praising God for all their blessings. They had survived two years.

Digress - A few years ago my baby sister, Ann Wilson and husband Bill, carried his mother Cordelia Wilson, and me on an eight-day tour of the most northwestern states. We flew from Memphis to Boston, rented a new family-sized Cadillac and toured over 2,000 miles up and down the east coast. We also spent one day in Canada visited a fort and ate with a farm family.

Good memories and interesting, too.

Back to Plymouth, Mass. We toured where the Plymouth Rock is located. Surprise. A huge rock, very smooth, lying under a granite canopy. In moving the rock it was broken and that part is stored somewhere else but the big part is under this canopy lying in white sand, a tourist attraction today, coins are thrown in the sand. I suppose to retrieve the coins. Smile.

I want to comment on the Mayflower Compact. This Compact was the first group of laws made in America. The Pilgrims made the laws and then nearly all signed them before they were allowed to leave the Mayflower. When they stepped off the ship they were governed by this compact. Wise. The people made the laws to govern themselves. A democratic form of government.

A list of important people at the time would be interesting to read about: Miles Standish, Massaisort, Samoset, Squanto, Puritan, etc.

Down through the years we have celebrated with church programs and special music. We have cooked all the special food our family enjoys. God has been so good to America, I'm afraid we have gotten spoiled. We have always celebrated together. This year it will be so different. I'm old and I have five fairly young great grinds. We can't all get together this year at one time. We all need to wear our masks, practice distance and refrain from hugging. Certainly kiss-



ing. I'm going to miss all that this year. Maybe not!

Angie and I made Thanksgiving turkey dressing ahead of the holidays but we won't all get it together. That's ok. Rules are rules and we need to follow them and look forward to the day, hopefully when a vaccine for prevention will be found. As we thank God for the past year's blessings (and there have been many) let's pray that He will give someone the knowledge to discover a vaccine for a cure, and our posterity will always remember to give God praise and thanksgiving for life. We are coming to the end of the Book of Ecclesiastes, so King Solomon seeks to conclude with a clenching statement, so he writes Ecclesiastes 12:13-14: "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep His commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be bad." The ending of plays, books or stories are always important, for it is there that writers or storytellers seek to draw to a proper close the things they have presented. Solomon concludes by telling his readers that the most important thing in the world is to fear and obey God, for in these are wrapped

up the whole responsibility of men toward God. To fear God does not necessarily mean that we are afraid to approach Him, rather it means that we respect Him enough to desire to obey Him. There is an awesomeness about God that is different than that of any of His creatures or creation. It is interesting that many in our day, as well as in previous ages, who do not seem to have much respect for God, but that will change as soon as they meet Him in judgment! When Solomon desired to bring his story of life on earth to an end, he desired to convey the whole purpose of the telling of the story, and thus he did.

Yes, there will be sins that have been committed that will never be named or brought up before the Just Judge, but those will be the sins that have been forgiven through the offering of the body and blood of Jesus Christ on the cross. It will be as if these sins were never

committed, for they will never appear at the judgment seat of Christ where believers are judged. They actually do not exist, for they have been stricken from the record! King Solomon did a great job in writing Ecclesiastes, chiefly because God inspired him concerning what to write, but the actual life of King Solomon did not end well, for he turned away from the very things that he wrote in the Book of Ecclesiastes. Many others have followed the same path that Solomon walked in his later years, for they too have forgotten what they once knew, that is, that God's way is the best way!

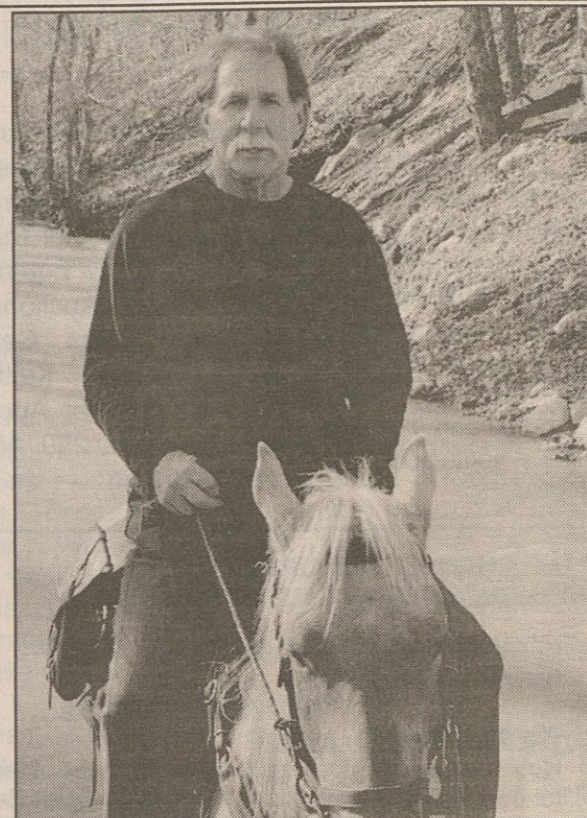

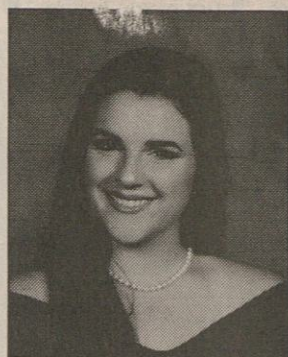
Swader is pursuing a B.A. in Biochemistry within the College of Liberal Arts.

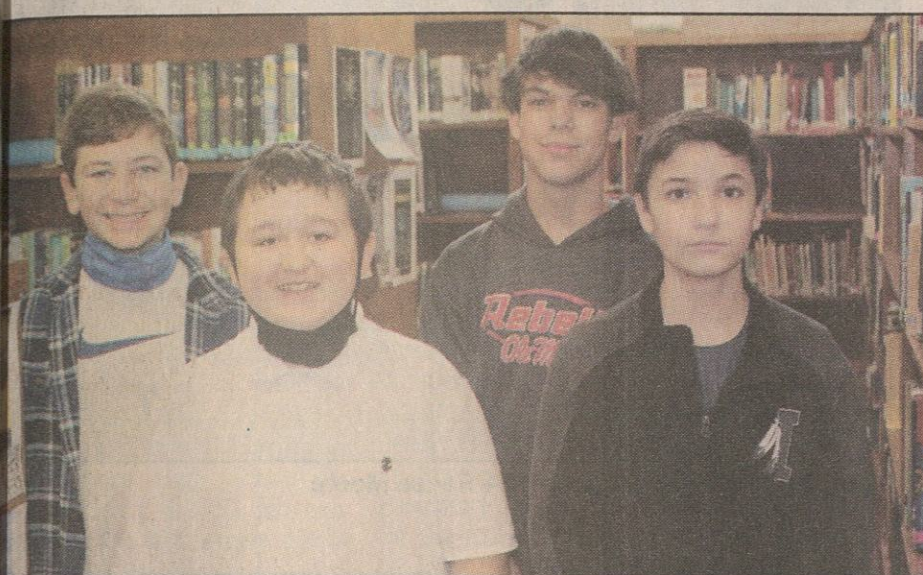
