Justin Lee Smith, 17, of Supply, North Carolina, was in a ladder stand Saturday afternoon in a tall thin tree in the northwest part of the county near the Alcorn County line, Tishomingo County coroner Mack Wilemon reported.

According to Wilemon, the vestigating. stand apparently turned to one

Local Care Worker Charged For Theft

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office along with the Adult Protective Services (APS) has been investigating an incident involving a care worker, Alicia Nichole Horne, who had worked for a facility that provided services through a Medicaid Waiver program.

Investigators for the sheriff's office along with the APS, received a complaint that large sums of cash had been taken from a elderly client's residence that Horne was assigned to in Tishomingo County. During the investigation, Horne became the main suspect and was later questioned; she also had a small portion of the alleged stolen cash with her at the time of being interviewed. Horne was then arrested and charged with the crime.

Horne, Alicia Nichole 33-year-old, white female of Dennis, Mississippi was officially charged with exploitation of vulnerable person. Horne's bond was set by the Tisho-



mingo County Justice Court at five thousand dollars (\$5,000). Also, due to the situation, the Mississippi Department of Child Protective Services (MDCPS) was also brought in for a separate investigation.

This is still an ongoing investigation between the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office and the Adult Protective Services. Further charges / arrests may be pending as this case progresses. This case will be presented to the next available Grand Jury.



William Bradford and the Pilgrims were happy with the harvest and he proclaimed a day for celebrating. The ladies cooked, boiled, roasted and baked. The children were kept busy turning roasts on spits or rods in front of an open fire. More than eighty friendly Indians came and brought wild turkey, venison or deer meat.

The tables were set up outside with benches where they sat and fellowshipped together. They had a program of prayers, preaching, and singing to their Heavenly Father. Yes, there was lots of dancing praising God for all their blessings. They had survived two years.



For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be bad." The ending of plays, books or stories are always important, for it is there that writers or storytellers seek to draw to a proper close the things they have presented. Solomon concludes by telling his readers that the most important thing in the world is to fear and obey God, for in these are wrapped

sibility of men toward God. To fear God does not necessarily mean that we are afraid to approach Him, rather it means that we respect Him enough to desire to obey Him. There is an awesomeness about God that is different than that of any of His creatures or creation. It is interesting that many in our day, as well as in previous ages, who do not seem to have much respect for God, but that will change as soon as they meet Him in judgment! When Solomon desired to bring his story of life on earth to an end, he desired to convey the whole purpose of the telling of the story, and thus

It is because God will bring every work and every thing previously a secret into judg-When humanity faces God, there will be no levity in the meeting; it will only be a time of revelation of the deeds and thoughts of men. The judgment of God will be just, so there will be no plea bargaining, or bargaining of any kind. Every person will receive justice at the hands of the all-wise, all knowing, completely just God! Some may suppose that

excuses for disobedience can by made and accepted, but such will not be the case. Some will perhaps think that the secret things cannot be known or revealed, but there are no secrets that can be kept from God. Yes, there will be sins that have been committed that will never be named or brought up before the Just Judge, but those will be the sins that have been forgiven through the offering of the body and blood of Jesus Christ on the cross. It will be as if these sins were never

committed, for they will never appear at the judgment seat of Christ where believers are judged. They actually do not exist, for they have been stricken from the record! King Solomon did a great job in writing Ecclesiastes, chiefly because God inspired him concerning what to write, but the actual life of King Solomon did not end well, for he turned away from the very things that he wrote in the Book of Ecclesiastes. Many others have followed the same path that Solomon walked in his later years, for they too have forgotten what they once knew, that is, that God's way is the best







The Jesse Samuel Biggs and Nancy Francis Dexter Biggs Family

(I feel like folks get tired of seeing my family in the paper, but this week a cousin, Lois Biggs Salvo brought this old photo by to share with our readers. Lois is the daughter of Earl and Claire Biggs and was raised in Detroit. She is the granddaughter of Albert Biggs shown as a child on the photo, who married Pearl Johnson of Iuka and lived in Oklahoma. My grandfather is Charley Biggs, also shown as a little boy)

The following information was taken from "The Jesse Tree" written by my aunts, Rayma and Louise Biggs.

Jesse Samuel Columbus Waite Biggs, second child of Jesse and Nancy M. (Patrick) Biggs, was born October 20th, 1867, died January 17th, 1929. He was always called Bud Biggs. Many people didn't know his name was Jesse. We didn't find a middle name for Jesse Biggs I but Jesse II was born during that period when children were given more than one middle name. Maybe that was an Irish custom from the Patrick family. Jesse married January 11th, 1886, Mary Francis Dexter, born September 22, 1863, died March 9, 1921, daughter of Daniel and Salina (Medley) Dexter.

When Jesse and Mary married, they lived on his father's estate in a house across Indian Creek west of the Biggs family home. When he bought the 140 acres (1888) there was a small house on this land. Two elderly men by the name of Shippy had at one time lived there, we are not sure when Jesse built the house we grandchildren loved so much (nor are we sure who tore down and hauled away bit by bit this house). Jesse Biggs and Mary, his wife and children lived in the Biggs "old homeplace" in 1890. Grandfather farmed and managed the land and operated the gristmill. Before 1907 he moved to his house and lived there until his death in 1929.


