monuments, and all things TISHOMINGO COUN-TY!!! Since the inception of the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society, preservation has been one of our prime objectives. We want/need to renew our efforts in this endeavor. Sadly, gone are the days of grant monies to help preserve buildings and historic places, so, we are aware of limitations. However, this does not mean that we cannot succeed in completing preservation projects. This just means we must make ourselves more aware of what is part of our historic heritage and help maintain it. We must become more proactive to preserve the history we currently

Wonderful research has been done on many of the houses and buildings throughout our county. A great deal of information has been gathered on the history and architecture of the ante-bellum homes in Tishomingo County. A great deal of research has been done on many of the

homes that were moved from Eastport to Iuka. Iuka even has a historic district in which most of the buildings are on the National Register of Historic Places.

However, work is about to begin on a new set of homes. Many of the homes in our county are now 100 years old. Here at the Old Courthouse Museum, we would like for the history of these homes to be documented. We would also like to have current photographs of these homes so they can be publicly recognized. This will be a multiphase endeavor, requiring detailed efforts from many different sources. We will begin this program with compiling a list of all homes or structures within the county that are at least 100 years old. If you have such a home or structure, please contact the Museum. You will be asked a series of questions including the physical location, mailing address, current ownership, age of the structure to the best

of your knowledge, and other such routine questions. We know there will be a certain amount of duplication because so many of our structures are already noted, but the questions will also glean new information, such as current ownership. Please remember this does not only apply to houses. It could be a barn, smokehouse, shed, outhouse, well house or any other structure that is of historical note. After this step, we will photograph the structures. We will then begin researching the history of the location. Museum staff would also love to film the building's owner telling the history of the structure. As we stated earlier, this will be a work in progress. It will require a great deal of research, time, and effort. We feel it is very important project

We didn't know who they belonged to but felt sure they wouldn't mind a couple of hungry boys eating a few of their tomatoes. 





bodies cannot live extended periods of time without food. Solomon, however, is saying more than the fact that food is a necessity, but that food should also be an enjoyment. Gluttony is condemned in the Scriptures. Actually the words "glutton" and "gluttonous" are the only words used on this subject, and then only in four Bible references, with one being the same words repeated in two gospels (see Deuteronomy 21:20: Proverbs 23:21; Matthew

11:19 & Luke 7:34). The Old Testament word for Glutton means: "to be loose morally, worthless, or prodigal". It is translated: "blow down, glutton, riotous (eater), vile." The New Testament word for "gluttonous" means: "to eat". So, the idea of the glutton is not just that of overeating, although we should not do that, rather it is the idea of a "riotous eater" in the Old Testament, who is also a vile person with few scruples about what he does. The

New Testament does not say enough to draw that conclusion but it could be inferred from the Old Testament. Some have said that it was understood in Bible times as: eating until one was full, regurgitating, and then eating more.

Now we come to a more serious idea, that of drinking wine, for Solomon says that one should drink wine with a merry heart. At least two things can be said about this verse. First, the drinking of grape juice that was to a low degree fermented was a practice in the days of the Old Testament. Proverbs 23:29-32 says, how-"Who hath woe? Who hath sorrow? Who hath contentions? Who hath babbling? Who hath wounds without cause?

Who hath redness of eyes? They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine. Look not on the wine when it is red, when it giveth his colour in the cup, when it moveth itself aright. At the last it biteth like a serpent, and stingeth like an adder." We could hear arguments both for and against the drinking of any kind of wine from now on, but I always like to mention Romans 14:21: "It is good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor any thing whereby thy brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak." I have never tasted any alcoholic beverage for two reasons: my father told me not to do so, and I do not want to offend others. (I will say more in the next article.)


