15-Year-Old Girl Missing From Belmont

The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation has issued an Endangered/Missing Child Alert for 15-year-old Monica Leeann O'Bryan of Belmont, MS, in Tishomingo County.

She is described as a white female, five feet and two inches tall, weighing 200 pounds with blonde/red hair and blue eyes.

She was last seen Tuesday, February 25, 2020, in the 100 block of Old Highway 25 in Tishomingo County.

Family members say Monica Leeann O'Bryan suffers from a medical condition that may impair her judgement.

monuments, and all things TISHOMINGO COUNTY!!! Since the inception of the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society, preservation has been one of our prime objectives. We want/need to renew our efforts in this endeavor. Sadly, gone are the days of grant monies to help preserve buildings and historic places, so, we are aware of limitations. However, this does not mean that we cannot succeed in completing preservation projects. This just means we must make ourselves more aware of what is part of our historic heritage and help maintain it. We must become more proactive to preserve the history we currently have.

Wonderful research has been done on many of the houses and buildings throughout our county. A great deal of information has been gathered on the history and architecture of the ante-bellum homes in Tishomingo County. A great deal of research has been done on many of the

homes that were moved from Eastport to Iuka. Iuka even has a historic district in which most of the buildings are on the National Register of Historic Places.

However, work is about to begin on a new set of homes. Many of the homes in our county are now 100 years old. Here at the Old Courthouse Museum, we would like for the history of these homes to be documented. We would also like to have current photographs of these homes so they can be publicly recognized. This will be a multi-phase endeavor, requiring detailed efforts from many different sources. We will begin this program with compiling a list of all homes or structures within the county that are at least 100 years old. If you have such a home or structure, please contact the Museum. You will be asked a series of questions including the physical location, mailing address, current ownership, age of the structure to the best

of your knowledge, and other such routine questions. We know there will be a certain amount of duplication because so many of our structures are already noted, but the questions will also glean new information, such as current ownership. Please remember this does not only apply to houses. It could be a barn, smokehouse, shed, outhouse, well house or any other structure that is of historical note. After this step, we will photograph the structures. We will then begin researching the history of the location. Museum staff would also love to film the building's owner telling the history of the structure. As we stated earlier, this will be a work in progress. It will require a great deal of research, time, and effort. We feel it is very important project to begin.

The Museum is open Wednesday thru Saturday, from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. and on Saturday, 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon. Our phone number is 662-423-3500.

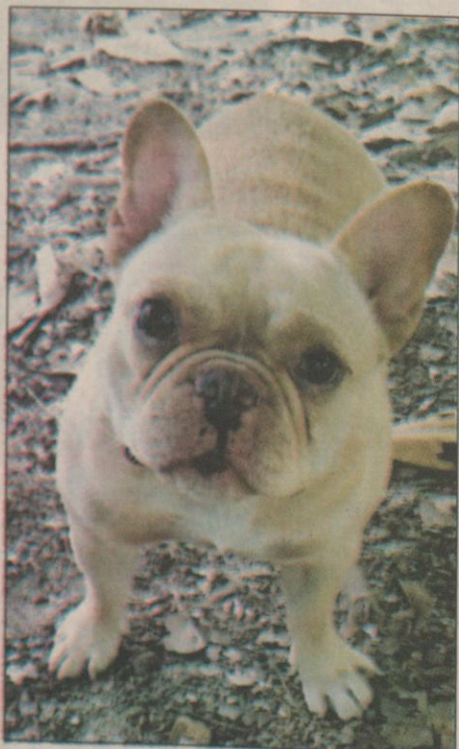

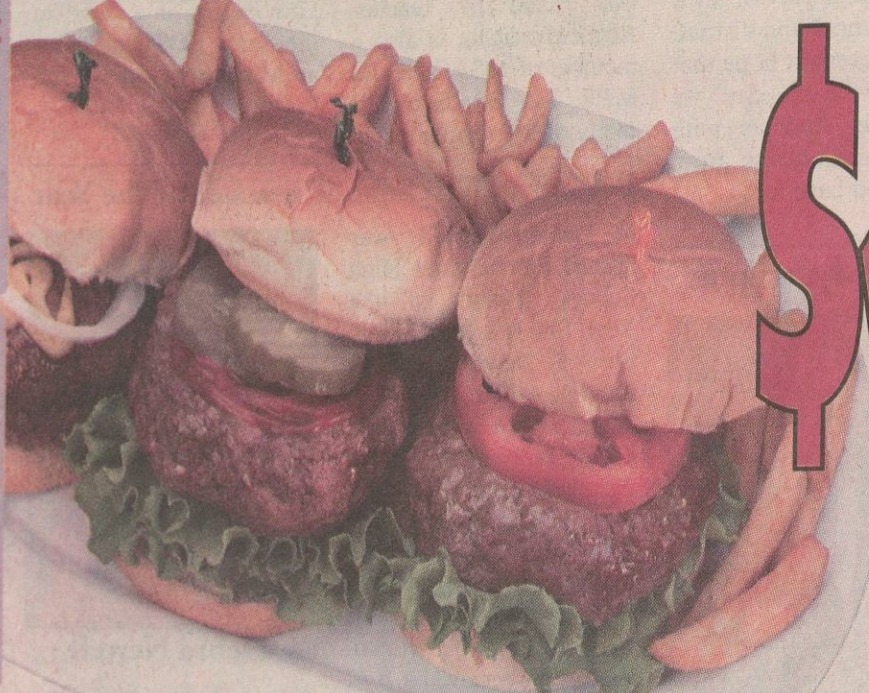

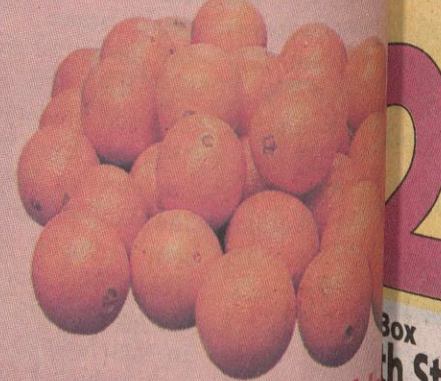

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 55)

Ecclesiastes 9:7-8 says, "In thy day, eat thy bread with joy, and drink thy wine with a merry heart; for thou knowest that thou shalt not eat nor drink after that manner." The Book of Ecclesiastes was written by Solomon, according to the commentary that I have read, more than that, the language of the book certainly fits the occasion, and nobody would give counsel that would eat our bread. The idea here is that we should enjoy the things that we eat, especially when we have worked to earn it. Eating is the most important thing in our lives, but it is not, for our physical

bodies cannot live extended periods of time without food. Solomon, however, is saying more than the fact that food is a necessity, but that food should also be an enjoyment. Gluttony is condemned in the Scriptures. Actually the words "glutton" and "gluttonous" are the only words used on this subject, and then only in four Bible references, with one being the same words repeated in two gospels (see Deuteronomy 21:20; Proverbs 23:21; Matthew

11:19 & Luke 7:34). The Old Testament word for Glutton means: "to be loose morally, worthless, or prodigal". It is translated: "blow down, glutton, riotous (eater), vile." The New Testament word for "gluttonous" means: "to eat". So, the idea of the glutton is not just that of overeating, although we should not do that, rather it is the idea of a "riotous eater" in the Old Testament, who is also a vile person with few scruples about what he does. The

New Testament does not say enough to draw that conclusion but it could be inferred from the Old Testament. Some have said that it was understood in Bible times as: eating until one was full, regurgitating, and then eating more.

Now we come to a more serious idea, that of drinking wine, for Solomon says that one should drink wine with a merry heart. At least two things can be said about this verse. First, the drinking of grape juice that was to a low degree fermented was a practice in the days of the Old Testament. Proverbs 23:29-32 says, however: "Who hath woe? Who hath sorrow? Who hath contentions? Who hath babbling? Who hath wounds without cause?

Who hath redness of eyes? They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine. Look not on the wine when it is red, when it giveth his colour in the cup, when it moveth itself aright. At the last it biteth like a serpent, and stingeth like an adder." We could hear arguments both for and against the drinking of any kind of wine from now on, but I always like to mention Romans 14:21: "It is good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor any thing whereby thy brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak." I have never tasted any alcoholic beverage for two reasons: my father told me not to do so, and I do not want to offend others. (I will say more in the next article.)

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TISHOMINGO COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, INC., TO ISSUE ITS WATER SYSTEM REVENUE BOND OF THE DISTRICT IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION FIVE HUNDRED FORTY SEVEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,547,000) TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO ACQUIRE, CONSTRUCT, IMPROVE, BETTER, AND EXTEND THE WATER SYSTEM OF THE DISTRICT, CONSISTING PRIMARILY OF CONSTRUCTION, ACQUISITIONS, IMPROVEMENTS, BETTERMENTS AND EXTENSIONS TO THE SYSTEM; AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Tishomingo County Water District, Inc. (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of the District, hereby resolves, and declares as follows:

Burnsville 8th Graders Visit G & G Steel

Friday, February 21, 2020, Iuka, Mississippi. Forty eight (48) eighth graders from Burnsville Middle School toured G&G Steel, Mississippi Works Plant. Superintendent Eric Daniel reported that "we welcome students to tour G&G Steel as well as other businesses and industries to learn what career options are open to them in their home county. Most students don't realize and are not taught that, most of the time, a job in manufacturing doesn't require a college degree and often pays more than jobs that do require a college degree."

Human Resource Representative Jason Southward added that "many manufacturing jobs have become automated and computerized and hard labor is no longer required. Some manufacturing jobs and trades still require hands on skills that can only be learned by doing. With a one or two year career and technical course during high school and even further at a two year community college, a

student has a head start and is well prepared for learning a hands on job, or more technologically advanced job. Educators need to guide students on career options in Tishomingo County. Manufacturing jobs drive Tishomingo County's economy."

In January 2020, Tennessee Valley Authority issued an economic assessment of TVA valley counties. Jobs in Tishomingo County during the last five years grew by 956 and are projected to grow by 591

over the next five years. The local job growth rate is more than double the job growth rate for the nation (15.4% for Tishomingo County and 6.9% for the USA) and many times the job growth rate for Mississippi. The vast majority of these new jobs are in manufacturing. Currently, there are lots of job openings in manufacturing and trades in Tishomingo County.

Tishomingo County School Superintendent Christie Holley stressed that "we are working hard to prepare our students for

the jobs and careers of the future. Manufacturing and trades are an excellent career choice and we pledge to work closely with business and industry to prepare high quality job applicants ready and willing to learn new skills."

Nadara Cole, Vice President of Workforce Training and Economic Development, Northeast Mississippi Community College, reminds students and parents that "tuition for Tishomingo Count

graduates to Northeast Community College is paid by grants from the federal government, state, and local sources. Tishomingo County has a training program book state, NEMCC is a member qualified to English students for good jobs in manufacturing trades."

Other schools are touring G&G Steel and other industries at the end of the school year.
