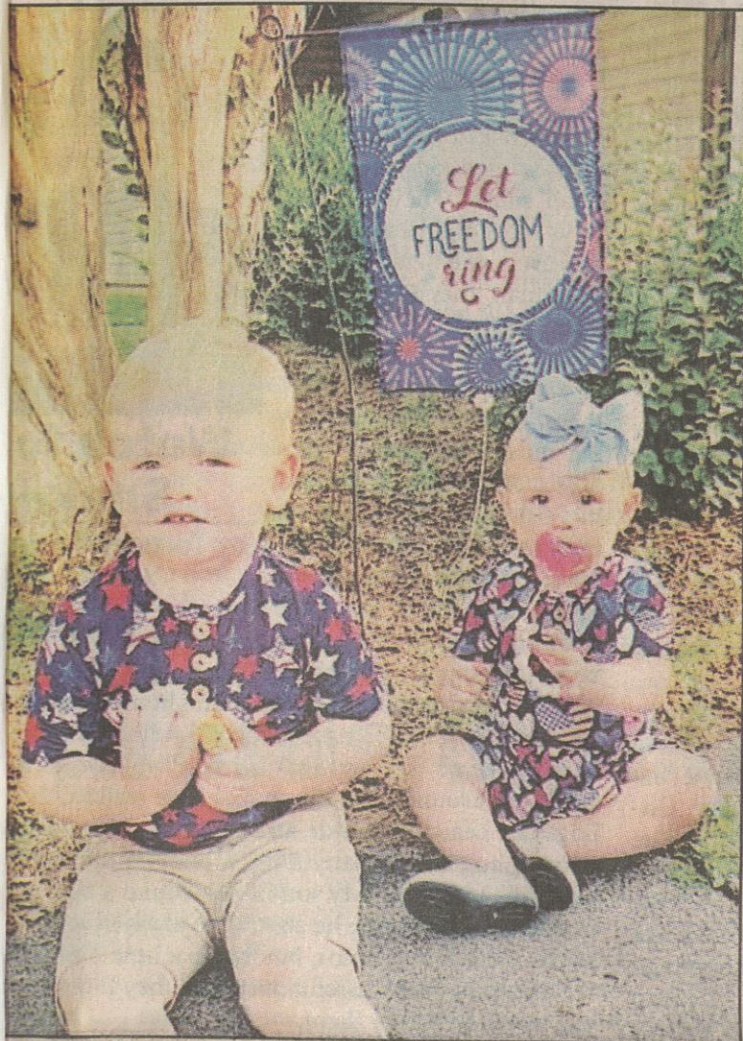

Tour Hardin County announces plans for the annual 4th of July Fireworks Show to be held on Saturday, July 4 beginning at dark.

"We are excited to be able to co-host the celebration along with Grand Harbor," shared Tourism Director Beth Pippin, "the coronavirus pandemic has turned our events calendar upside-down, we decided to move forward and find a way for people to safely celebrate the fourth in Pickwick."

Best viewing will be from the water. Boaters and spectators are encouraged to practice safety as a large number of boaters will be on the water over the holiday weekend.

The Iuka Hilltop Fireworks Show has been canceled. The providers of the annual show felt that "with the way 2020 has been going so far, blowing up a bunch of stuff in the yard doesn't seem like a good idea." Hopefully this fun community tradition will be able to continue next year.

Both Millcreek Marina and the Town of Tishomingo have canceled their annual 4th of July events.

School District Plans for Traditional Reopening

The Tishomingo County School District is making strategic plans for the reopening of schools for the 2020-2021 school year. The Mississippi Department of Education and Mississippi Department of Health have issued considerations for district to use in planning for the upcoming school year. Each district (at this point in time) will make its own decision as to what school will look like for students in August. The district recently sent a parent survey out for feedback in order to take family concerns and ideas into consideration. "The survey overwhelmingly shows our families want a traditional start for students in August," stated superintendent Christie Holly. "At this time, we are planning for a fully traditional start for our students on August 6, 2020, with our teachers beginning professional development on August 3, 2020." Holly also stated that while it will be a traditional start, there will be precautions

around social distancing, limiting movement during the day for students, considerations for online learning, and extra cleaning protocols. "We are in the process of completing our reopening plan and will have documents available for our families and communities no later than July 17, 2020," stated Holly. The district is seeking feedback from different groups of stakeholders in order to get ideas and address concerns. "As everyone knows, this is a fluid situation. No plan is going to be perfect. We want our students to have the full experience of school, but we also have to balance that with protecting their health and the health of our staff. We are planning for each learning model because we know we may have to switch to hybrid learning or distance learning at some point during the year," said Holly. Arrest Made After Violent Domestic Incident

Law enforcement officers in West Memphis Arkansas apprehended a man accused of violently stabbing an Iuka woman before fleeing the scene. Hanna Hudson was allegedly stabbed multiple times on Sunday morning by her former boyfriend Felix Gonzales Perez, age 28.

In the early morning hours of June 28, 2020 the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call concerning a possible stabbing which occurred at a residence belonging to the victim's mother located on Snowdown Rd. in Iuka. The deputies arrived on the scene and met with Hudson who was conscious, and according to the responding officers, needed immediate medical attention.

Hudson appeared to have several alleged stab wounds to her upper torso area and head. She was able to inform the deputies of the identity of the alleged attacker, who was her prior boy-

friend. The alleged suspect had left the scene before the deputies arrived. Hudson was taken to the local hospital and treated for her injuries before being released.

Deputies on scene were able to collect several pieces of evidence to the assault and investigators were able to locate the alleged suspect several hours later in the West Memphis, Arkansas area. An arrest warrant had been issued for Perez and he was arrested and detained by the West Memphis Police Department. Perez will be transported at a later date back to the Tishomingo County Jail and will be formally charged. This is still an open investigation and more charges may be pending.

Covered Bridge Dedicated to the Memory of Mayor David Nichols

On Saturday, June 27th, the City of Iuka proudly dedicated the covered bridge at Mineral Spring Park in memory of former Mayor David Nichols, who served three terms as Mayor in the 1990's.

The unveiling ceremony was held at 4 o'clock following a memorial service which was held at the Iuka Baptist Church. Mayor Nichols passed away in March following a hard fought battle with cancer. Because of the virus pandemic, services were postponed and were held on Saturday.

Mayor John Castleberry presided at the ceremony at the old wooden covered bridge and Harold Lopez made remarks concerning how then Mayor Nichols was instrumental in getting the wooden covered bridge as well as the Indian Creek Watershed project, which included a combination of flood mitigation measures that now prevents Mineral Springs Park and the area from flooding. The creek was widened and the new covered bridge was added.

The bridge was installed by the city employees in early 2001 and was ordered from Wheeler Lumber Company of St. Paul, Minnesota in July 2000 and cost \$45,500.00 for the kit and materials.

Habitual Offender Brian Berryman Sentenced to Life Without Parole

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office along with the 1st Judicial District Attorney's Office would like to announce the conviction of Brian Scott Berryman, to life in Prison without the possibility of parole after his trial that convened on June 24th 2020 in Tishomingo County. 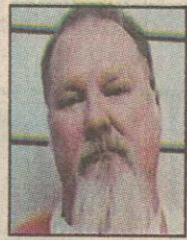
IUKA, MS - Circuit Court Judge Kelly Mims sentenced Brian Scott Berryman of Iuka, Mississippi to Life without the possibility of parole or release for the February 6, 2017 felony charge of Felon in Possession of a Weapon. The sentencing capped off a trial this week

that began on Monday. After a jury verdict of guilty, the State of Mississippi presented proof that Berryman is a violent habitual offender. Berryman's violent crime history caused him to be sentenced to Life without parole instead of the statutory maximum of 10 years for this kind of felony offense.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff John Dennis

Daugherty, Deputies responded to a residence of County Road 344 after a call of someone shooting inside a residence on that road. Sheriff Daugherty stated that Deputies arrived on scene and spoke with the victim who explained that a man that lives down the road had discharged a rifle inside the home. No one in the home was struck by the bullets. Investigator Greg Mitchell's investigation revealed Brian Scott Berryman as a suspect in the case. The deputies were able to recover a .22 rifle and a .380 pistol along with narcotics in close proximity to the weapons. Berryman was charged and arrested.

District Attorney John Weddle said it was fortunate no one was hurt during the shooting. Weddle said habitual laws are in place to separate violent offenders such as Berryman from law-abiding citizens. The case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorneys Kyle Robbins and Ray O'Neal.

Berryman had previously been granted parole after he was convicted of Capital Murder in Tishomingo County in April of 1990. Berryman, age 25 at the time, was indicted of capital murder in the death of 90 year old Tishomingo County resident William Solomon of the Rutledge-Salem Community. Berryman was additionally charged with armed robbery, and

breaking into an inhabited dwelling while armed in the 1989 incident. He was also convicted of assault in Lee County, MS in the late 1980's.

The trial started with jury qualification on Monday and was held in the Iuka Middle School to allow social distancing of jurors and court personnel. The Court worked with Circuit Clerk Josh McNatt and his staff to set up a functional courtroom in the auditorium of the school.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office would like to thank the Tishomingo County Circuit Clerks office in the preparing of the trial and its location. Also, the sheriff's office would like to thank the Tishomingo County School District and Iuka Middle School Principle, Mr. Jeremy Reece, in providing the court a safe location to conduct the trial. Due to COVID-19 and abiding by the CDC and the State of Mississippi's recommendations for safe distancing, the trial was held in the gym of the Iuka Middle School. We believe this is the first time in the history of our county that school property was used to conduct a criminal trial. This could not be done without the cooperation between the Circuit Clerks Office, the District Attorney's Office, and finally the Tishomingo County School District.

Mildred Maxine Strickland McMillion died on Saturday, June 20, 2020, at the age of 96 in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. She was born on January 28, 1924 in Holcut, Miss., to Andrew and Ludie Lambert Strickland. One of nine children, she was raised in Tishomingo, Miss.

After high school, she worked briefly as a telephone operator and was then recruited by the federal government to go to Washington D.C. and work for the FBI. It was in Washington that she met her future husband, Ovid Miller McMillion, an Army intelligence officer and college geography professor. They moved to Murfreesboro in 1966, when her husband joined the faculty at Middle Tennessee State University.

Once settled in Murfreesboro, she joined the

Women's Club of Murfreesboro and became a member of the MTSU Dames Club. She was also an active member of the First United Methodist Church, where she taught Sunday school and co-founded the church's Book Talk. She came to her love of books naturally, since she grew up in a family of imaginative storytellers. She used this skill to entertain her children and later her grandchildren with her tales of small-town life and her adventures growing up with eight brothers and sisters.

In addition to books, she also enjoyed traveling, and over the course of her 42 years of marriage she made frequent trips across the United States, Europe, and Latin America. After her husband's death in 1992, she continued to travel with her grown children, visiting the Mediter-



anean, Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii, Alaska and elsewhere. She moved to Adams Place in 2000 and resided there until her passing.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Ovid Miller McMillion; her sisters Inez Chittom, Montez Trimm, Quay Rushing, Vera Parnell, and Ruth Jenkins; and brothers Waymon Strickland, R.C. Strickland, and Eural Wayne Strickland.

Jeffrey Powell, Northeast's First African American Head Coach, Passes Away

BOONEVILLE, Miss. - A universally beloved figure on the campus of Northeast Mississippi Community College and a significant figure in the tradition-rich annals of the athletic department has passed away.

Jeffrey Powell, who became the first African American head coach of any sport in school history, died on Tuesday, June 23 at the age of 44.

"The Northeast family is heartbroken from the passing of Jeffrey," said Northeast president Dr. Ricky Ford. "Jeffrey was a huge face of Northeast and will be missed tremendously. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Jeffrey's family and friends."

Powell made history in 2007 after he was asked by Ford, who was then serving as athletic director along with his duties as women's basketball headman, to resurrect the tennis programs following a brief hiatus away from competition.

He wasted little time in piecing together a competitive schedule that featured road trips to East Central Community College, Holmes Community College, Itawamba Community College, Jones College and Meridian Community College.

Powell made his home debut on March 29, 2007 when the Tigers battled visiting Holmes. Northeast also welcomed Itawamba and Jones to the City of Hospitality for matches later that season.

The Tigers featured a co-ed roster with five male athletes and two female players during his lone year at the helm of the program. Will Ramsey was Powell's team captain while Jeremy Ozborn garnered the Tiger Award.

Powell's impact at Northeast reached far beyond the tennis court. He returned to his alma mater in 2001 as the college's webmaster before rising to the position of instructional technology specialist.

The Tishomingo native was named an Apple Distinguished Educator in 2013 and four years later received the inaugural Olon E. Ray Leadership and Innovation Award from the Mississippi Community College Board (MCCB).

Powell was instrumental in helping Northeast become one of just eight higher education

institutions in the entire the world to gain the prestigious title of an Apple Distinguished School earlier this year.

He was the founder of the widely popular Mobile Learning Conference, which celebrated its 12th year last week with over 2,000 online attendees from 38 states and 22 different countries. The Mobile Learning Conference aids instructors in better understanding the value of technology and how to leverage it in the classroom.

Powell's positive influence on local children is undeniable. He was a member of the executive board for the Boys and Girls Clubs of Northeast Mississippi and developed the Career Development Academy at Northeast.

Northeast's Career Development Academy benefits kids by providing after school and summer academic and enrichment programs that focus on tutoring, scholastic work and life skills lessons.

One of Powell's greatest achievements was the 1:1 iPad initiative in 2018. Northeast became the first two-year college in the nation to successfully implement this program and as a result has saved its students thousands of dollars in textbook fees.

Jeffrey was a networker and dreamer. In his position as Educational Technology Specialist, he created his own niche in connecting all offices in a technology initiative to help Northeast Mississippi Community College become an Apple Distinguished School and a Top 10 Digital College.

Jeffrey was recognized for the Olon E. Ray Leadership and Innovation award for his work in furthering technology in Mississippi Community Colleges. As an Apple Distinguished Educator, Class of 2013, Jeffrey loved pushing the boundaries of what was possible in education and always promoted the student-first mentality. His work with Career Development Academy, an after school program, helped to guide young minds to better themselves in academics. Jeffrey's leadership and drive helped a team of students win the first in web design, third in spirit and sportsmanship and ninth overall in the BEST Robotics competition last year.

Jeffrey was also on



the Executive Board for the northeast district and the Booneville Board for Boys and Girls Club. He was a member of Carter's Branch Missionary Baptist Church, Tishomingo, MS.

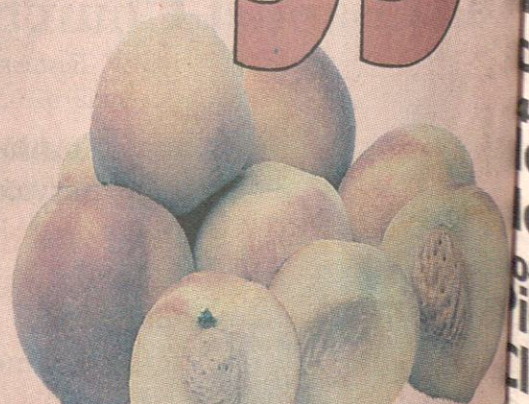

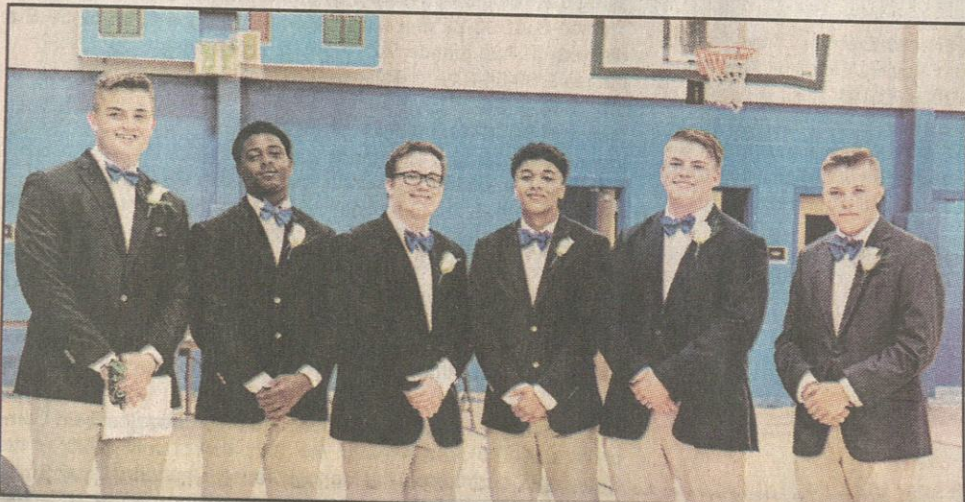

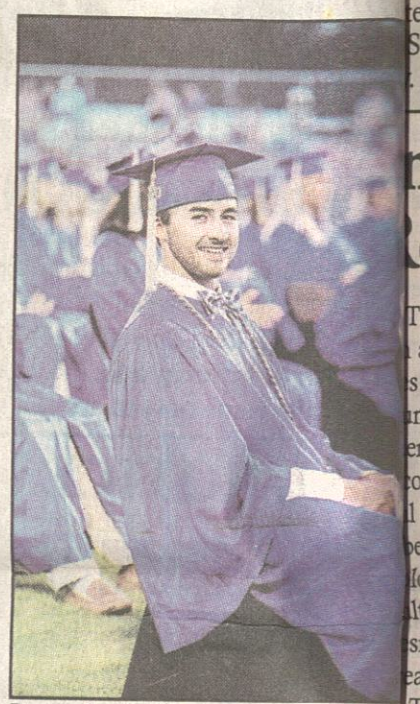
