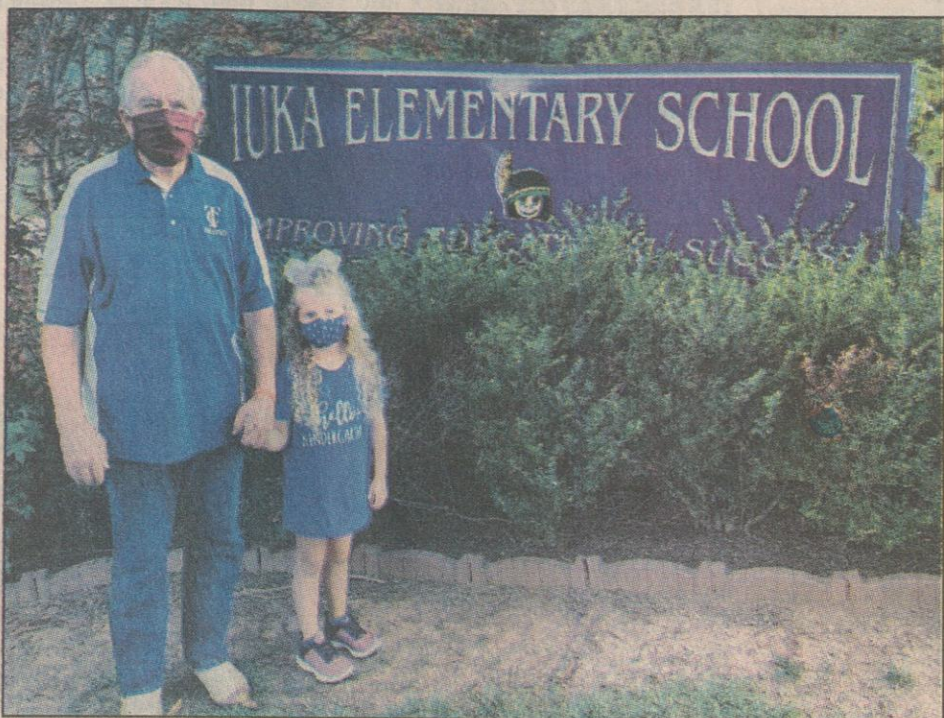

Two Vehicle Crash
Claims the Life of
Burnsville Woman

A two

According to Tishomingo County Cor-
oner Mack Wilemon, 28 year old Brittany
Jackson of Burnsville was pronounced
dead at the scene of the accident from
her injuries sustained during the wreck.

On August 15th around 7:50 a.m.
the collision was reported to 911 and
emergency crews responded to the scene.
Jackson was traveling to work in a 1995
Oldsmobile when the crash occurred; she
was employed at the Tishomingo County
Living Center in Iuka.

The other vehicle involved in the ac-
cident was a 1999 Ford F250, driven by
Axel Cortez Vega, 19, of Dennis who
was reported to have moderate injuries from the crash.

The Mississippi Highway Patrol is still investigating the
accident which they described as a head on collision. Accord-
ing to Sergeant Gary Stanton, Public Affairs Officer of Troop
F, "it appeared that Brittany Jackson was traveling east when

port as I seek to serve you.

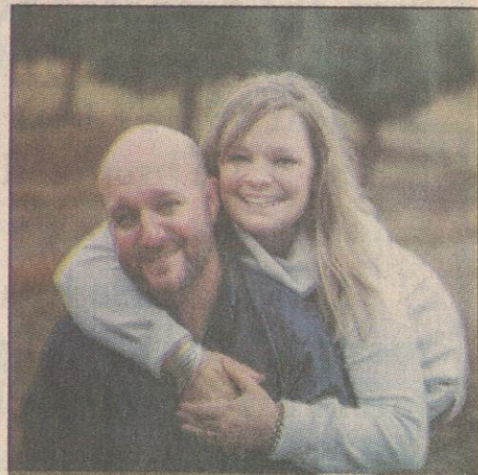

Presley Announces \$5.9 Million in Second Round of Broadband Grants for 13 North MS Electric Co-ops

Jackson, Mississippi (August 10, 2020) - Today, Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley announced that thirteen North Mississippi electric cooperatives have received more than \$5.9 Million in a second round of funding from the MS Electric Cooperatives Broadband COVID-19 grant program. The program was established by the Mississippi Legislature to increase expansion of high-speed internet service to areas which lack service.

The grant program will enable awardees to begin construction in some of Mississippi's most isolated and disconnected areas. Areas that received funding are certain census blocks not covered with broadband service as defined by the FCC (25 mbps download, 3 mbps upload). To be awarded the grant, the electric cooperatives must first agree to spend the monies in areas that lack service, match every dollar of grant funds with private funds and provide

symmetrical speeds of 100 mbps upload and download to locations in the area. The portion of each project funded by the grant program must be operational by December 30th.

"The last round of grants completes the package to accelerate broadband expansion in some of our most disconnected communities," said Commissioner Presley. "Many of the electric co-ops are already off and running on broadband expansion and these additional funds will help their mission of getting to the last house on the most rural road. Again, I want to thank Lt. Governor Hosemann, Speaker Gunn, Sen. Joel Carter, Rep. Scott Bounds and the members of the Legislature that fought so hard for this funding."

"NOTICE OF TAX INCREASE—

TISHOMINGO COUNTY"

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget for fiscal year 2020-21 Tuesday September 8th 2020 at 9:00 AM at the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors Office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase in the proposed budget will be considered.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors is operating with projected total revenue of \$14,646,035 and \$ 6,258,442 (43 percent) of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$14,773,976. Of that amount \$5,881,050 (40 percent) is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

This increase in ad valorem tax revenue means that you will pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures, and equipment and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase in the budget and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken."

The county and school millage rate will remain the same as 2019/2020 fiscal year.

MDEQ Awards Solid Waste Assistance Grant to Tishomingo County

(Jackson, Miss.) -- The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) awarded Tishomingo County a solid waste assistance grant of \$17,495 that will be used by the county for an unauthorized dumpsite cleanup program.

"The Solid Waste Assistance Grants support a variety of useful solid waste management activities for cities and counties, and this grant will assist Tishomingo County's efforts in improving their management of solid waste," said Chris Wells, MDEQ Interim Executive Director.

Cities and counties may apply for Solid Waste Assistance Grants through the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality. These grants are used by local communities for programs to prevent and clean up unauthorized dumps; to aid in hiring local solid waste enforcement officers; for public education efforts on solid waste disposal and recycling; and to establish programs for the collection of white goods, bulky wastes and recyclables.

INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON CENTRAL PURCHASING SYSTEM, INVENTORY CONTROL SYSTEM AND PURCHASE CLERK SCHEDULES

(REQUIRED BY SECTION 31-7-115, MISS. CODE ANN. (1972))

Members of the Board of Supervisors
Tishomingo County, Mississippi

We have examined Tishomingo County, Mississippi's (the County) compliance with establishing and maintaining a central purchasing system and inventory control system in accordance with Sections 31-7-101 through 31-7-127, Miss. Code Ann. (1972) and compliance with the purchasing requirements in accordance with the bid requirements of Section 31-7-13, Miss. Code Ann. (1972) during the year ended September 30, 2017. The Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi is responsible for the County's compliance with those requirements. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the County's compliance based on our examination.

Our examination was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and, accordingly, included examining, on a test basis, evidence about the County's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe our examination provides a reasonable basis for our opinion. Our examination does not provide a legal determination on the County's compliance with specified requirements. The Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, has established centralized purchasing for all funds of the County and has established an inventory control system. The objective of the central purchasing system is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that purchases are executed in accordance with state law.

Because of inherent limitations in any central purchasing system and inventory control system, errors or irregularities may occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any current evaluation of the system to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

The results of our audit procedures disclosed a certain instance of noncompliance with the aforementioned code sections. This instance of noncompliance was considered in forming our opinion on compliance. Our finding and recommendation and your response is disclosed below:

Inventory Control Clerk.

1. The Inventory Control Clerk should maintain an inventory control system that includes correct values for all assets.

Finding

Section 31-7-107, Miss Code Ann. (1972), requires the Inventory Control Clerk to maintain an inventory control system. This system should include all additions and deletions to capital assets in the system including Construction in Progress. Audit procedures indicated that due to failure to add and delete assets correctly, the following asset classifications were misstated:

- Construction in progress was overstated by \$1,374,909
- Improvements Other Than Buildings were understated by \$285,851
- Leased property was understated by \$81,462

Failure to record assets at the proper values resulted in a material misstatement in the financial statements. Audit adjustments were proposed to management and made to the financial statements with management's approval.

Recommendation

The Inventory Control Clerk should ensure that all asset additions and deletions are recorded in the County inventory records at the proper values.

Inventory Control Clerk's Response

Inventory Control Clerk will comply with recommendation.

In our opinion, because of the noncompliance referred to in the preceding paragraph, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, did not comply, in all material respects, with state laws governing central purchasing, inventory and bid requirements for the year ended September 30, 2017.

The accompanying schedules of (1) Purchases Not Made from the Lowest Bidder, (2) Emergency Purchases and (3) Purchases Made Noncompetitively from a Sole Source are presented in accordance with Section 31-7-115, Miss. Code Ann. (1972). The information contained on these schedules has been subjected to procedures performed in connection with our aforementioned examination and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in relation to that examination.

Tishomingo County's responses to the findings included in this report were not audited, and accordingly, we express no opinion on them.

This report is intended for use in evaluating Tishomingo County, Mississippi's compliance with the aforementioned requirements, and is not intended to be and should not be relied upon for any other purpose. However, this report is a matter of public record and its distribution is not limited.

While cooling after a taking a shower, which I did to get rid of the business after an hour of summer gardening, I mused about the hard decisions just made.

Not to get all Zen, it's accepted by most that phenomena of the world, including solid and experiences everything in between, seen in different times conflicting, by different people on other factors.

his doesn't mean I'm , or capricious; it's just logic as I approach ng circumstances, as sed to being stubborn dheaded. As Ralph rson put it, "A sh consistency is the

hobgoblin of small minds."

I make hard decisions every time I go into my garden. Do I thump away caterpillars, or let them grow into big beautiful butterflies? Is this Bermuda grass a lawn plant or a flower bed weed? Are

tomatoes more important than possums? Should I learn to love my neighbors' free-roaming cats even though they eat songbirds and lizards, then relieve themselves in flowerbeds? Should I leave some out-of-the-way poison ivy for its wildlife benefits and striking fall colors?

This week I took advantage of our long growing season by planting some fall vegetables, including corn, squash, and new tomato and pepper plants. But to do it I had to pull up some equally valid others such as crabgrass, which is both a serious weed to some gardeners and a host plant for the larvae of frenetic little "skippers" which, neither butterfly nor moth, are fascinating pollinators.

To compound the affront, I found some "bush killer" vine, a new invasive plant that is potentially more destructive than kudzu; I tried pulling it, but it keeps returning from tiny bits of roots left in the ground. So, I got rid of it completely and safely by squirting a little Roundup



on the little plants.

Before any of you go off on my using Roundup, let me assure you that I am aware of the concerns, and decided it's safer to me and my garden than the alternatives. As a matter of dosage over time, there's danger in overusing it, just like consuming too much red meat, fried food, and that occasional glass of wine. This is all true, but as I mentioned in the opening to this column, a lot of perception comes from our world views, not reality.

By the way, kudzu has beautiful wisteria-like flowers that smell like grape bubblegum. And all parts are edible, unlike like the tamer vegetables I just planted. And there are many more acres of high-maintenance, monocrop Asian turfgrass lawns in Mississippi than kudzu. Not making a value call, just a statement of fact, which you can interpret according to your own mind set.

Tomatoes or butterflies? Weeds or wildflowers? Darned if I do or don't.

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF IUKA, COUNTY OF TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI, PLACING REQUIREMENTS ON THE OWNERSHIP AND TREATMENT OF ANIMALS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka do hereby FIND, DETERMINE AND ADJUDGE as follows:

1. That animals, whether wild or domestic, must be handled with a specific level of care appropriate for both animal and public safety.
 2. That the City and public safety would be served levying reasonable requirements and restrictions regarding animals found within the municipal boundaries.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

Definitions.

As used in this ordinance, the following terms are defined below:

- Animal:** Every nonhuman species of animal, both domestic and wild.
- Animal-at-large:** Any animal not under the restraint of a person capable of controlling the animal and/or off the premises of the owner.
- City Official/Employee:** Any person employed by the City in the course of his or her employment.
- Owner:** Any person, partnership, or corporation owning, keeping, or harboring one (1) or more animals. An animal shall be deemed to be harbored if it is fed or sheltered for three (3) consecutive days or more.
- Pet or companion animal:** Any animal kept for pleasure rather than utility; an animal of a species that has been bred and raised to live in or about the habitation of humans and is dependent on people for food and shelter.
- Public nuisance:** Any animal or animals that unreasonably annoy humans, endanger the life or health of other animals or persons, or substantially interfere with the rights of citizens, other than their owners, to the enjoyment of life or property. The term "public nuisance animal" shall mean and include, but is not limited to, any animal that:
1. Is found at large;
 2. Damages the property of anyone other than its owner;
 3. Molests or intimidates pedestrians or passersby;
 4. Chases vehicles;
 5. Excessively makes disturbing noises, including, but not limited to, continued repeated howling, barking, whining or other utterances causing unreasonable annoyance, disturbance, or discomfort to neighbors or others in close proximity to the premises where the animal is kept or harbored;
 6. Causes fouling of the air by odor and thereby creates unreasonable annoyance or discomfort to neighbors or others in close proximity to the premises where the animal is kept or harbored;
 7. Causes unsanitary conditions in enclosures or surroundings where the animal is kept or harbored;
 8. Is offensive or dangerous to the public health, safety, or welfare by virtue of the number and/or types of animals maintained.
 9. Attacks other domestic animals; or
 10. Has been found by the board of mayor and aldermen, after notice to its owner and a hearing, to be a public nuisance animal by virtue of being a menace to the public health, welfare, and safety.
- Restraint:** Any animal, except a vicious animal, secured by a leash or lead under the control of a responsible person and obedient to that person's commands, or within the real property limits of its owner.
- Veterinary hospital:** Any establishment maintained and operated by a licensed veterinarian for surgery, diagnosis, and treatment of diseases and injuries of animals.
- Vicious animal:** Any animal that attacks, bites or injures human beings or domesticated animals without adequate provocation, or which because of temperament, conditioning, or training, has a known propensity to attack, bite, or injure human beings or domesticated animals.
- Wild Animal:** Any living member of the animal kingdom, including those born or raised in captivity, except the following: human beings, domestic dogs (excluding hybrids with wolves, coyotes or jackals), domestic cats (excluding hybrids with ocelots or margays), farm animals, rodents, any hybrid animal that is part wild and captive-bred species of common cage birds.

Section 1 When Animals to be Restrained, Confined, Muzzled, Etc.

- (1) All dogs shall be kept under restraint by their owners.
- (2) No owner shall fail to exercise proper care and control of his animals to prevent them from becoming a public nuisance.
- (3) Every female dog or cat in heat shall be confined by its owner in a building or secure enclosure in such a manner that such female dog or cat cannot come into contact with another animal except for a planned breeding.
- (4) Every vicious animal, as defined herein, shall be confined by the owner within a building or secure enclosure. If the enclosure has no bottom secured to the sides, the sides must embed in the ground no less than two feet. All vicious animals shall be securely muzzled or caged whenever off the premises of the owner.
- (5) No vicious animal may be kept, by its owner or any other person, on a porch or patio or any part of a house or structure when the windows are open or when screen windows or doors are the only obstacle preventing the animal from exiting the structure.
- (6) All owners, harbors, or keepers of vicious animals within the city limits shall display in a prominent place on their premises a sign easily readable by the public using the words "Beware of Dog". In addition, a similar sign shall be placed on the kennel or pen of such animal.

Section 2 Additional Responsibility of Owners of Vicious Animals.

All owners of vicious animals, as defined herein shall be required to maintain an insurance policy in the amount of at least twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00), issued by an insurer authorized to transact business in this state, insuring the owner of the vicious animal against liability for any personal injuries inflicted by the vicious animal or a surety bond in the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) or more, issued by a surety company authorized to transact business in this state, payable to any person or persons injured by the animals that may be defined as vicious.

Section 3 Impounded and Redemption

1. Unrestrained dogs, vicious animals not restrained, confined, muzzled, etc. in accordance with this ordinance, and nuisance animals shall be taken by any city employee and impounded in an animal shelter and there confined.
2. Impounded animals shall be kept for not fewer than five (5) full working days.
3. If, by a tag or other means, the owner of an impounded animal can be identified, any city employees shall immediately upon impoundment notify the owner by telephone, mail, and/or posting on the property.
4. An owner reclaiming an impounded animal shall pay a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each day the animal has been impounded. Subsequent impoundments occurring within twelve (12) months are charged a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00), plus fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each day the animal is impounded. Owners of vicious animals will only be allowed to reclaim an impounded animal after showing they are in complete compliance with this ordinance. Owners of a vicious animal will be subject to the same fees listed above when reclaiming their animal.
5. Any animal not reclaimed by its owner within five (5) full working days shall become the property of the local government authority.
6. The owner of an impounded animal may also be charged for violation of this chapter.
7. Any animal that bites a person shall be confiscated and confined until a hearing in City Court.

Section 4 Care and treatment of animals - Generally.

No owner shall fail to provide his animals with sufficient wholesome and nutritious food, water in sufficient quantities, proper air, shelter space and protection from the weather, veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering, and humane care and treatment.

Section 5 Abuse, abandonment prohibited.

1. No person shall beat, cruelly ill-treat, torment, overload, overwork, or otherwise abuse an animal, or cause, instigate, or permit any dogfight, cockfight, bullfight, or other combat between animals or between animals and humans.
2. No owner of an animal shall abandon said animal.

Section 6 Cropping, Docking Ears or Tails, Etc.

No person shall crop a dog's ears or dock a dog's tail, except a licensed veterinarian. No surgery shall be performed upon any dog, cat, bird, or horse except by a licensed veterinarian.

Section 7 Exposure to Poisonous Substances.

No person shall expose any known poisonous substance, whether mixed with food or not, so that the same shall be liable to be eaten by any animal with the exceptions of such substances being used for purposes of insect or rodent control as directed.

Section 8 Keeping of Wild Animals.

1. No person shall own, possess, or have custody on his premises any wild or vicious animal.
2. No person shall keep or permit to be kept any wild animal as a pet unless a valid state or federal wildlife permit is held.

Section 9 Animal Waste.

The owner of every animal shall be responsible for the removal of any excreta deposited by his animal(s) on public walks or other public areas, recreation areas, or private property.

Section 10 Penalties for Violations.

Any person violating any provision of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00). If a violation continues, each day's violation shall be deemed a separate violation. If any person is found guilty by a court of violating sections 4, 5, 7, and 8 his privilege to own keep, harbor, or have custody of animals within the municipal boundaries of Iuka, Mississippi shall be deemed automatically revoked and if he is subsequently found in possession of another animal he would be guilty of a misdemeanor an automatic fine of \$25 per day.

Section 11 Inoculation for Dogs and Cats Required.

Every person in the city who owns or has in his possession or who keeps or harbors any dog or cat of the age of six months or over within the limits of the city shall have and keep such dog or cat inoculated against rabies, as provided by state law and the rules and regulations prescribed and promulgated by the state board of health. Such dogs and cats shall be vaccinated a minimum of every three years

thereafter. It shall be unlawful for any person to own, possess, keep or harbor any dog or cat within the limits of the city unless such dog or cat has been so inoculated against rabies. Failure to do so shall result in a fine of no less than \$100.00 and no greater than \$200.00. The fine shall increase for each subsequent offense (2nd offense: \$200 to \$300; 3rd offense \$300 to \$400 and so on).

Section 12 Tag Required to Be Worn

It shall be unlawful for any person who owns or has in his possession or under his control or harbors any dog or cat within the limits of the city to keep or permit such dog or cat to be at large within the city unless and until the dog or cat bears a suitable tag, which may be attached to the collar of the dog or cat, which tag shall have stamped on it that the dog or cat has been vaccinated against rabies. The fact that any such dog or cat fails at any time to bear such prima facie evidence that the owner of the dog or cat has failed to have it inoculated against rabies. Such dog or cat shall be taken up and impounded by any city employee of the city. Failure later proven to have proper vaccination Section 3, shall be a \$25.00 fine per instance plus any housing costs as described in Section 3.

Section 13 Destruction of Rabid Dogs or Cats at Large.

If any dog or cat suffering from rabies is caused or permitted to be at large within the limits of the city, such dog or cat (or other animal) may be killed by any city official without being required to impound such dog or cat.

Section 14 Confinement of Dogs or Cats Suspected of Having Rabies.

If any dog or cat within the city shall be suspected by a city employee of having rabies, or been exposed to rabies, such dog or cat (or other animal) shall be safely confined until a decision can be made. If the animal has or develops rabies, it shall be immediately put down.

Section 15

If any Section, subsection, sentence or phrase held within this document is found to be otherwise unenforceable, then the remaining enforceable portions shall remain in full effect herein.

Whereupon, said proposed ordinance was duly read and considered paragraph by paragraph, and voted upon section by section, and the said motion for adoption by Alderman Joel Robertson, thereof having received the second of Alderman Johnny Southward, the same was voted first section by section, and then as an entirety, whereupon the following vote was recorded:

LEGAL NOTICE

Approved Amendments to the Current Zoning Ordinance of the City of Iuka

The City of Iuka Board of Aldermen, to better serve the people of Iuka, to protect property and offer clarification to its existing Zoning Ordinance, does amend said Ordinance in two parts as follows:

1)

ARTICLE VIII MISCELLANEOUS

801.01 Penalty

[Any person, firm, corporation or other entity who violates, neglects or refuses to comply with the provisions of the ordinance shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) or more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each offense.

Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

801.01 Enforcement

801.01 Any municipal employee so empowered by the Iuka Board of Aldermen shall have the power to write or otherwise issue citations under this Zoning Ordinance. Regardless of whether by the Board, the City of Iuka Zoning Administrator, any officer of the Iuka Police Department or Iuka Building Inspector are granted the power to issue citations under this Zoning Ordinance.

802.01 Challenges to Citations

802.01 Any challenge to citations in this Zoning Ordinance where not specifically detailed may be made to the Iuka Municipal Court and in any other manner permitted by law.

803.01 Repealer

803.01 All other existing ordinances and parts of the ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

2)

SECTION 702: PARKING AND STORAGE OF CERTAIN VEHICLES AND JUNK

702.05 No junk or junk yards on properties zoned Residential

702.05 Notwithstanding any section of this ordinance no junk yards - which include but are not limited to, the storage of junked, abandoned, or otherwise chronically inoperable and excessive trash, other junk or as defined elsewhere in this Ordinance - shall be allowed on any property within the City of Iuka that is zoned Residential.

3)

SECTION 200: REQUIRED CONFORMANCE

200.01-07 Size of single family dwelling requirement

200.01-07 Any building constructed after the passage of this amendment that is a single-family dwelling, such dwelling shall be defined and required to be: "A site-built structure with a minimum of 500 square feet of heated area, built in compliance with all applicable International Building Codes.

4)

SECTION 201: NONCONFORMING USES

201.04 No camper trailer may be utilized as dwelling

201.04 It shall be unlawful for any individual or entity to use any camper trailer, or other unit typically utilized or moved either pulled behind a motor vehicle or by the power of a motor as a dwelling..

I made no distinction because of race, and as I look back, I am reminded that all teachers who treated their students in like manner gave them an incentive to achieve. And, they did!

By the way, Eric Powell, our newly elected senator from Alcorn, Tishomingo, and Tippah counties, was one of my students in grades 7-9 English. He was a good student, from a good family, an outstanding athlete and proud of



his color.

I could name many, many students I taught from Tishomingo County who are successful adults because they took advantage of the many opportunities available to them in our Mississippi schools.

I, like Freeman, relish my life here in Mississippi. I was born here, but I also live here by choice. Those who have had to move away to support their families almost always return to their home state for their retirement years. I am proud of my Heritage, and I thank God that I am a Mississippian!

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX LEVIES FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR FOR THE TOWN OF BURNSVILLE

The Town of Burnsville will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for fiscal year 2021 on September 1, 2020, 6 p.m. at Burnsville City Hall.

The Town of Burnsville is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$1,145,200. 4.8 percent or \$70,000 of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$1,899,900. Of that amount, 3.68 percent, or \$70,000 is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

The decision to not increase the ad valorem tax millage rate for fiscal year 2021 above the current fiscal year's ad valorem tax millage rate means you will not pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental real property, unless the assessed value of your property has increased for fiscal year 2021.

Any citizen of the Town of Burnsville is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed budget and tax levies for fiscal year 2021 and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

Words From The Wisest King Before Jesus (part 78)

It is interesting that people do grow more gracefully with more health and vigor. 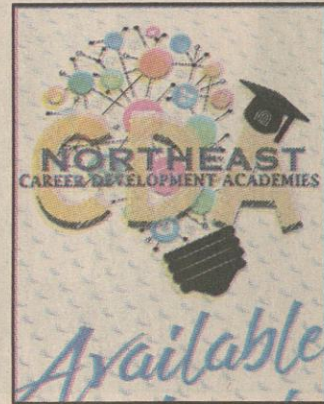

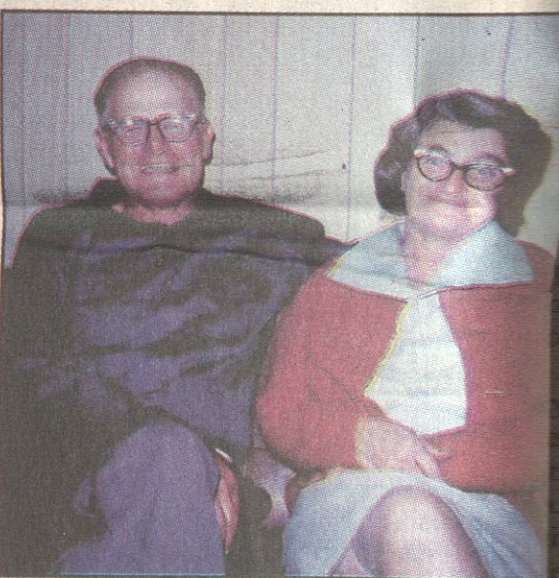

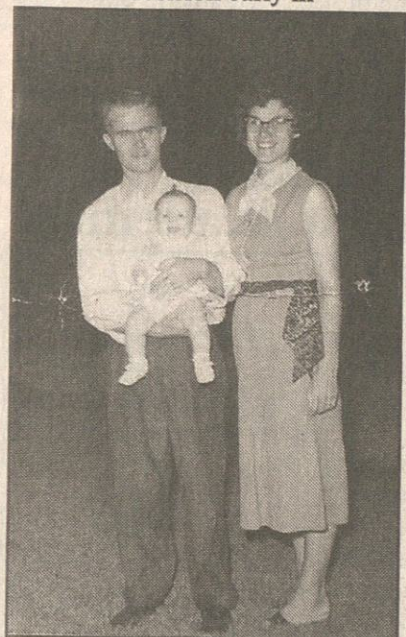
