THOR Announces Acquisition of Luxury RV Manufacturer Tiffin Motorhomes

THOR Industries, Inc. announced the acquisition of Tiffin Motor Homes, Inc. and related companies (collectively, the "Tiffin Group") for \$300 million, funded with a combination of available cash and a draw on the Company's existing asset-based credit facility. The Purchase Agreement was executed and effective at the close of business on December 18, 2020. Tiffin Group, LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of THOR, will own the Tiffin Group, which will continue to be managed by the Tiffin family and existing senior management team.

Tiffin is a premium manufacturer of luxury recreational vehicles known for its excellent product quality, outstanding customer service and brand loyalty. Purchase includes Tiffin Motorhomes, Vanleigh RV and other associated operating entities. The Tiffin Group generated approximately \$800 million in revenue from the sale of RVs for the fiscal year ended February 28, 2020. The sales of the associated operating companies are primarily made to Tiffin Motorhomes and Vanleigh RV. Transaction is consistent with THOR's long-term strategic growth plan. Tiffin Group will operate as stand-alone operat-

ing company within the THOR family of companies.

"The Tiffin brand is synonymous with quality and customer satisfaction in our industry. For many decades, Tiffin has set the standard for the luxury class A market. Its strong presence in the luxury class A segment makes it very complimentary to THOR's current North American portfolio. I have known of and respected Bob Tiffin and the Tiffin brand for many years. Bob and his family have built Tiffin into an industry leader, well known for its Class A motorhomes, quality workmanship and outstanding customer service. Skeletal Remains Found Near Hwy. 25 South of Iuka

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack Wilemon, a decomposed body was found last Friday, December 18 around 10:00 a.m. by hikers just 2 miles south of Iuka.

The body was found some 250 yards from Hwy. 25 on the east side of the highway across from the Murrah home place. Residents of the area were walking down an old logging road when they spotted the remains. Wilemon described the findings as a partial skeleton, clothing, a man's cap, pants, x-large jacket with a hood, and men's size 10D boots. The body was covered mostly with pine straw that ap-

peared to have been there for some time (possibly more than a year). He stated that he plans to do a more thorough search of the area, weather permitting, this week or next. No identification was found and the remains were spread over approximately 100 yards around the initial area where the clothes were found.

The remains will be sent to the crime laboratory in Pearl, MS with hopes of a DNA match. Any information about a missing person should be reported to the Coroner or the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department.

safety.

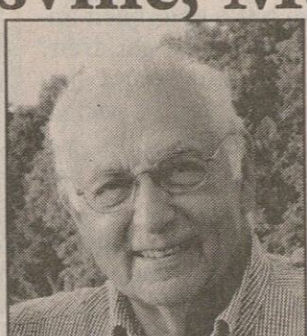

Former Iuka Doctor Dies in Collinsville, MS

Editor's Note: Mary
Sue Wright sent this obit
by the office this week to
share with our readers.
If you are old enough
and lived in Iuka most
of your life, you will re-
member this remarkable
"good looking" man,
Lewis "Buddy" George.
In 1957 he came to Iuka
and started Iuka Clinic
in downtown Iuka, in the
now empty lot by city
hall. The clinic later be-
came the building for First
American Bank as the
clinic office was moved
across from the Iuka Hos-
pital. After opening the
office in downtown Iuka,
Doctor George was later
joined by his friend, Dr.
Bobby King, then Dr.
Kelly Segars and Dr. Ken-
neth Draper. They came
to the small town, built a
thriving business and gave
Tishomingo County four
new doctors. All four of
the men have sadly passed
away in 2020, but they
left their marks on many
achievements in the small
town and their warm
memories in the hearts of
many patients.

Collinsville, MS
- Lewis Watson "Bud-
dy" George, loving hus-
band of Louise Ferguson
George who predeceased
him, died on November
6, 2020 at his home in
Collinsville, MS. He was
born in Collinsville, MS
on April 15, 1929, son of
Lewis and Jewell Jackson
George. Stephens Funeral
Home has been entrusted
with his service.

Known to his friends
and family as Buddy or
Doc, he was a loving hus-
band, father, grandfather,
great-grandfather, brother
and friend who was
known for his generosity,
kindness, good humor,
keen wit and spirited con-
versation. His mind was
always working, whether
on the day's crossword
puzzle or a deep analysis
of his family's genealogy.
He read voraciously and
regularly quoted his fa-
vorite passages. His smile
was contagious; he made
friends everywhere he
went. He had a playful
and mischievous side, es-



pecially when his grand-
children were around, and
would be known to break
into an old country west-
ern song at any occasion.

He grew up in Col-
linsville and graduated
from Collinsville High
School. After high school
he went west working the
wheat harvest in Texas be-
fore heading to San Diego
where he joined the U.S.
Navy. After three years
in the Navy, he attended
Tulane University, gradu-
ating with B.A. and M.D.
degrees. While at Tulane,
he was a member of Kap-
pa Sigma fraternity. After
graduation, he interned
at Midstate Hospital in
Nashville, TN for a year,
practiced Family Medi-
cine in Iuka, MS for five
years, and then completed
his anesthesia residency at
University of Mississippi
in Jackson. Dr. George
practiced anesthesia in
Memphis, TN from 1964
to 1995, when he retired.
He was a founder of the
first private practice anes-
thesia group in Memphis,
which he led for many
years. Over the years, he
was on staff at various
Memphis hospitals, in-
cluding Baptist Memorial
Hospital, Methodist Hos-
pital, St. Francis Hospital
and Le Bonheur Child-
ren's Hospital. He served
as President of the Mem-
phis Anesthesia Society
and the Tennessee Society
of Anesthesiologists. Dr.
George also made two
medical mission trips to

Peru in 1993-1994 serving
children.

He kept the family
farm in Collinsville where
he raised cattle for a time
and grew pine timber. He
was actively involved at
Prospect Church as a child
and in his later years. He
treasured spending time
with his family and friends
in the place where he had
grown up.

Dr. George was an
avid outdoorsman; he es-
pecially enjoyed hunting
quail and turkey, as well
as fishing, and always
seemed to have at least
one bird dog in training.
He served on the Missis-
sippi Game & Fish Com-
mission from 1962-1964.
He hunted and fished in
Alaska and Canada multi-
ple times. He loved spend-
ing time with his children
and grandchildren, espe-
cially teaching them to
hunt and fish.

Surviving Dr. George
are two sons, Dr. David
Lewis George (Edie) of
Memphis, TN and Bob-
by Clayton George of
Germantown, TN; and
two daughters, Carolyn
George Plummer (Den-
nis) of St. Louis, MO, and
Elizabeth George Hein-
rich (Rob) of Prescott,
AZ; and seven grandchil-
dren, Lindsey Herzog Shi-
pley (Colin) of St. Louis;
Claire Catherine Herzog
of Denver, CO; Lewis
Watson George II (Miran-
da) of Chapel Hill, NC;
William Adams George
of Nashville, TN; Hen-
ry Rankin George and
Mary Broughton George
of Memphis, TN; and
one great grandchild, So-
phia Grace Shipley of St.

Lessons On Life From The Prophet Isaiah (part 3)

I will give Isaiah 1:4 again, because I did not comment on it in the last article: "Ah sinful nation, a people laden with iniquity, a seed of evildoers, children that are corrupters: they have forsaken the LORD, they have provoked the Holy One of Israel unto anger, they are gone away backward." I used to hear a good preacher on radio whom I enjoyed, but I heard him say a number of times over the air to a general audience: "God is not angry with you". I love this preacher and think he is a good man, but I think he overlooked Isaiah 1:4! God does get angry with His people sometimes. May I ask you who are

parents whether or not you have ever been angry with your children? Yes, I understand that none of us is perfect in parenting skills, yet we may still have had good reason to be angry with our children at times. The anger of God would make a good study for all of us, for He does get angry with His children sometimes. Notice the charges that God brings against His Own people, Israel. First, He says that they are a sinful nation. I wonder when, and why, most preachers have stopped preaching against sin, when God has given us scores of examples of His anger against sin? The whole nation of Israel had missed the

will of God, and yet they were not seemingly even upset by what they had done.

If we who are preachers do not get back to naming sins and telling people that God is angry at sin, we may kiss our freedom in America goodbye, for we are headed down the drain!

God's second indictment against Israel was that they were laden with iniquity, which means all kinds of sins. They were actually covered over with their sins, so that nothing else could be seen. If we who are believers do not live as we should, the world is not going to see or hear our testimony, because of the "covering over"

of our cloak of sin! The next thing God said against Israel was that they were a seed of evildoers, so these are not sins of the "new generation"; they have come from parents and perhaps grandparents who have followed the same sins. Sometimes people seem to think that the things they do are just fine, simply because generations before them have done the same things. My dear friends, we have a "rule book" that we call the Bible, and it gives in minute details what God expects of us concerning the way we live. We have come to a time in American "Christianity" where we do not think too much about what the

Bible says, but rather what other people think. Do you realize that most of the Bible is fairly easy to understand? One man said, "It is not the parts of the Bible that I do not understand that troubles me; it is the part that I do understand". Israel had no reason to fail to know what God expected of them, so that was not the problem. The real problem was an outright rebellion against what God had said in His Word and through His prophets. I always tell people not to listen to my messages without checking them out in the Bible, and I say the same to my readers.

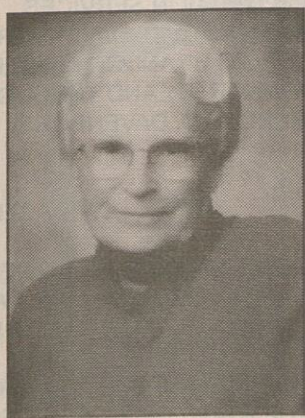

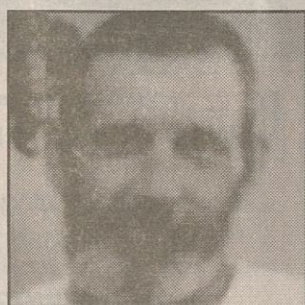

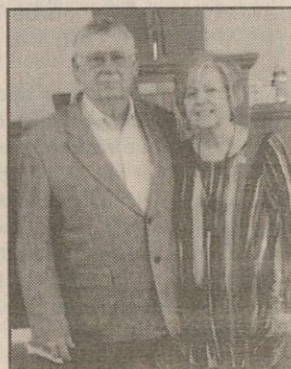

Wyatt Emmerich's Christmas Message

Back in the Old Testament days, God spoke directly to his people. His reaction among all who experienced it was the same: they were all terrified. There were several causes and this terror. The first was physical. God's physical manifestations: blinding, being the most

is no God, then we are God and our will can be done. This is a recipe for mankind's disaster. On numerous occasions throughout history, God has become so frustrated with mankind that he came close to wiping us out entirely. Thankfully, God's mercy is bountiful, or I wouldn't be writing these words.

The First Commandment is to have no other Gods before the real God. I can understand this. If I had created mankind, I'd be really irritated if my very creation refused to acknowledge me. My children may not do everything I say, but at least they acknowledge that I am their father (but not their creator which I am quick to remind them.) Back in the days of the Old Testament, "other gods" were truly other gods - golden calves that were worshipped, the sun and various other engraven idols.

Today, the worship of other gods is more subtle and far more invidious. We worship money. We worship our appearance or our career or our hobbies or children or a thousand other material things that we put before God. Truly, we are as disobedient in our material idolatry as those who worshipped

graven images back in the old days. We must be careful about this. You see it in the way the rest of the nation puts down Mississippi for having the lowest per capita income (even though it's as high as England, France and New Zealand.) Yet Mississippi has more churches and more believers per capita than the rest of the nation, maybe the world. As Jesus told us: What good does it do for a man to gain the whole world and lose his soul?

Ah, Jesus. The whole point of Christmas. God terrified and puzzled man. He was too great, too mighty, too sizzling to approach. But not so the baby Jesus. Here was God made man, a baby in a manger who could be held and rocked to sleep in the arms of his mother Mary. For the first time in human history, man could come face to face with God. We could touch God, talk to God and listen to God. God was able to show us and tell us all we needed to know.

And what a show and tell it was. The life of Jesus was perfectly spectacular. He taught us how to love, how to live, how to forgive, how to raise our children, how to treat our spouses, our enemies, our church. He taught us how to eat,



how to work, how to trust, how to die and even how to conquer death. God made man, Jesus Christ, taught us everything we could possibly need to know. Now that is the gift that keeps on giving! What is man that God is mindful of us? Why should he care? There is a lot about us that is awful, sinful and unredeemable. Yet he does. He cares about each and every one of us. How joyful to know of his love.

God could have made us obedient robots, but he didn't. We are made in his image, which is a hard concept to grasp given our sinful nature. And he makes each one of us unique, like snowflakes each have their own unique crystalline lattice structure. Out of all the trillions upon trillions of snowflakes, no two are identical. And so it is with us. This is God's immense power of creation.

I have written 30 Christmas columns. I could just rerun the old ones and no one would ever know the difference. But it gives me joy to write one fresh, each slightly different from the rest. So it is with God and man. Each new birth starts a unique journey.

God knew from day one that Jesus would reconcile him to mankind. He knew we would be unable to keep the laws of the Old Testament. He knew we would require a savior. Surely, we are supposed to learn something from this magnificent process. It's all there in the Bible. The whole story. Perfectly planned and executed. Start to finish. Do yourself a favor and learn it.

Collectively, all that is under the production-oriented hat of horticulture science, which is calculating, efficient, quantified...and can be hired out.

But while just knocking around the yard, we also experience related emotions and thoughts important to our well-being. We may not reach the final goal, but we can savor the processes and little sweet or alarming things that crop up along the way.

These usually-unexpected pleasures or pains, though fleeting and usually inconsequential, are worth considering. Examples include stopping to listen to birds singing or frogs croaking. Waltzing with a leaf rake. Seeing the season's first lightening bug flashes. Savoring smells of wood smoke, steamy compost, or an approaching rain. Scrubbing fingernails and marveling at the tingle. And yeah, getting stung.

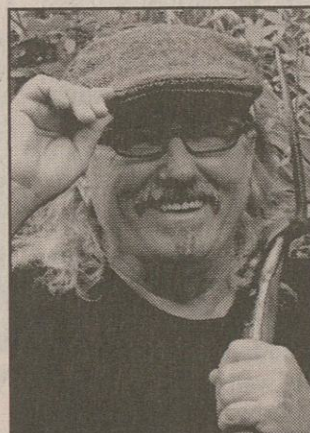
Those sensory parts of gardening are not horticultural competencies. Back to the Nandina. I pride myself in employing the super-efficient ball-and-burlap methods learned so long ago while working at a commercial field-grown tree and shrub nursery, the how-to that I use every single time I dig a shrub.

First I sharpen my shovel, which is an important first step in proper digging, and satisfying in its own right. Slice straight down in a circle, a foot or so from the trunk, a foot or so around. Cut a second circle just

out from the first, and neatly excavate the soil between the two leaving a tight cylindrical root ball standing in a trench. Skipping that second cut and not digging a trench is where most folks mess up.

Using the trench for a better angle, cut underneath the shrub, all the way around, making sure all the roots are cleanly severed. To keep the root ball from breaking when lifting, roll up a towel and unroll it underneath, just like changing a bed with someone in it. Lift by the towel, not the plant. Replant immediately in an already-dug new hole, same depth as the root ball but twice as wide, with nothing added to the dirt. Cover the new planting with mulch and use the leftover dirt to fill the old hole.

Efficient, yes. But



I also enjoyed the light crunch as I dug through roots, the smell of moist soil, and the hope that disrupted earthworms fared well in the aftermath. And keep a wary eye out for wasps.

Remembering the Old Fire Tower on Woodall

COMMENTS CONCERNING AN ARTICLE THAT WAS POSTED IN THE "TISHOMINGO COUNTY NEWS" TITLED "Recent Visit to Woodall Mountain Shared with Readers."

My name is Virgil Belue, son of Lealon Belue of the Holcut Community, and I read with great interest, the above titled article that was posted in the October 15, 2020, edition of the Tishomingo County News. Reading this article brought back many memories and experiences that I had and have about the Woodall Mountain.

In the late 1940's and early part of the 1950's, my father worked for the Mississippi Forestry Commission (MFC) as a watchman in the tower that was built on the very top of the Woodall Mountain by the MFC. When he accepted the job, he had to trade his old Model T-Ford car because it was not capable of climbing up the mountain.

Those of you who are old enough to remember know that the Model-T had three floor pedals. The left one for shifting gears, the middle one was to go backwards, and the right one was for breaking. On the inside there was a lever called the spark that had to be set in the right position before the engine would respond to the cranking lever that was located outside the car below the radiator. There was no starter inside the car. It was not uncommon to see men with an arm in a sling because they did not release the cranking lever fast enough.

My father traded for a late 1930's two-door Ford coupe with a sixty-five horse power engine. Thereafter, he found out that the sixty-five-horse power engine was capable of going up the last part of the mountain only if he had gained enough speed by going very fast down the small hill that approached the last bigger hill that ended on the

top of the mountain. This required a special skill because between the small down hill and the larger hill, there was a curve that could be dangerous if the driver was going too fast. Dad soon learned to judge his speed and seldom had to make a second run to make it to the top.

As a new employee of the MFC, my father was entitled to and required to have an MFC telephone connected to the special telephone line that was built by the MFC for its employees. We were one of a few people who had a telephone. Our phone was attached to the wall, and the receiver and microphone were very large when compared with today's telephones. Instead of a dial, it had a cranking lever on the right side that was used to create the number of rings indicating to whom the call was being made. The rings were long, short, and numbered in various sequences for each telephone owner. As indicated above, our phone was for MFC operations; however, employees could turn the crank to make one long ring, and an operator employed by the Bell telephone system located in Tishomingo, would connect the caller to the commercial company's lines. The caller was charged for the call.

I was a freshman going to the Northeast Mississippi Junior College in Booneville-now named Northeast Mississippi Community College. There were times when

my schedule was such that I could substitute for my father when he needed to take care of family matters.

In those days, the Woodall Mountain was often known as a "Lovers' Lane" used when father was not there. Lovers would often drive up there, and if they saw no vehicle, they assumed that they could make use of the privacy that was on the top of the mountain. However, they did not know that people on the ground could not see inside the cabin that was constructed on the top of the one-hundred-foot-tower. This being a family newspaper, I will not describe what I observed several times when I was all alone in that tower.

One day when I was on duty, I had a very embarrassing thing happen to me. The Woodall Tower was one of three towers assigned to watch for forest fires in the northeast Mississippi area. The other two towers were located at Golden and Blue Hill in Prentiss County. There was a very large round map of the area located inside the cabin of each tower. The degrees were marked around the perimeter of each map on which there were located a large sighting device mounted in the exact center of the map and pins, to which a nylon string was attached, were located on the site of the location of the towers. When a towerman would see smoke arising from a forest fire, he would call the other two towermen and give them his sight reading. Each towerman would then stretch his string over the site. The location of the fire would be where the strings crossed on the map. The towerman nearest the fire would call a work crew to fight the fire with tools and equipment that were very primitive when compared with today's implements.

Now for my most embarrassing work day. I was seated on the bench attached to the inside of the cabin wall and working on

a research paper that I was assigned to do by one of my professors at NEMJC. My telephone rang, and when I picked up the receiver the towerman in the Blue Hill Tower said "Virgil I see a smoke arising, and looks as if it is near you." I immediately jumped up, and to my horror, the fire was coming up the mountain toward me. Needless to say, I went into action very quickly. At that time the tower was constructed of wood, and I called the fire fighting crew that arrived and put out the fire. It is my understanding that the tower was later replaced with one constructed of steel.

After I moved to Clinton, MS, I told that story to my backyard neighbor, Carl McIntyre, who was the Sunday editor for the Jackson Clarion Ledger. One Sunday morning thereafter, I opened my newspaper, and to my surprise, Carl had posted the story for all subscribers to read.

About two years ago I told my neighbor and his wife about Mr. McIntyre's posting that event in the paper. They said that they were from south Mississippi and did not know about the story; however, they said that they had heard a lot about the Woodall Mountain being the highest point in Mississippi. Thereafter, my wife and I took them to see the Tishomingo State Park, Woodall Mountain, downtown Iuka, Coleman State Park, and the Pickwick Dam. They were

impressed and were very impressed with the overall beauty of the areas we visited.

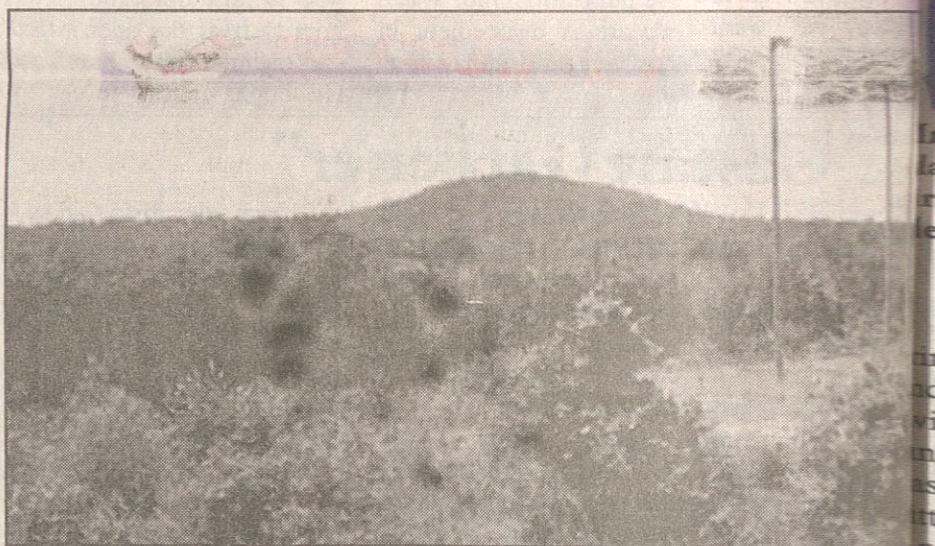
Being the highest point in Mississippi, makes the Woodall Mountain a very special place, and I would like to suggest that the economic development agencies in the northeast Mississippi area employ a consulting firm to develop a plan to make the Woodall Mountain a small State Park similar to some of those located along the Natchez Trace Parkway.

How about a T-shirt with a script that states "I VISITED WOODALL MOUNTAIN" or "I CAMPED OUT ON TOP OF WOODALL MOUN-

TAIN." The latter could only be used if park had a few camp spaces. The Internet already has some pictures taken of the beautiful scenery available from top of the mountain.

Some possible funding sources could be Tishomingo County Development Commission, Mississippi Economic Development Authority, Appalachian Regional Development Act, Mississippi Department of Life, Fisheries and the Mississippi Legislature, etc.

A "Mountain of Pleasure" could produce a "Mountain of Pleasure."

What Is the Real Meaning of Christmas?

Christmas means different things to different people. To most, it is a heartwarming time with family and friends. To many children, it's about presents and Santa. To merchants, it means a season when many retailers finally begin making money.

But if you were to go back seven hundred years before the birth of Christ and ask the prophet Isaiah what it means to him, he would tell you Christmas is about the birth of a special child:

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6)

We hear these words each Christmas season during the singing of Handel's Messiah. This profound message is that God Himself would come to earth as both King and Savior.

Most Jews were waiting for the Messiah to deliver Israel from Roman oppression. They were looking for a Messiah of power and authority. But God had a different plan. He chose to send His son as a humble servant whose primary mission was to die for our sins (see Philipians 2:5-11).

The writers of the New Testament present Jesus as both fully human and fully God. Isaiah had said as much when he foretold the Messiah

coming to earth as both child and Mighty God. Confirming the words of Isaiah, the apostle Paul writes of Jesus:

"The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together." (Colossians 1:15-17)

What would motivate the Creator of everything that exists to step down from his lofty position as the sovereign ruler of the universe to become one of us? Jesus tells us that he came because God loves us—each of us.

The wonderful meaning of Christmas is that Jesus came to rescue us from the death sentence caused by our sin, and to give us hope and peace with God. He did it because he cares for you and me, and wants

to adopt us into his family—now and forever.

Why not take time this Christmas to reflect on God's great gift to you? The one who created you is the same one who came to earth and died for you!

The History behind the Shepherds and Angels in the Christmas Story

At that time, sheep farmers were generally seen as having low or little value by other people.

The type of sheep the shepherds would have been raising were 'fat tailed' (or broad tailed) sheep. They often had humps in the autumn and winter, rather than in the spring with most sheep in western countries these days.

The shepherds were quietly getting on with their own business when suddenly an angel appeared to them. I'm not surprised they were afraid! The Christmas Story The Shepherds being visited by an Angel

The angel's words to them told them of Jesus

and his amazing birth and how they could recognise him in a very crowded town. The words of the hosts of angels is very similar to the words sung during a sacrifice service in the temple when there were three blasts of the temple trumpets.

This is only the second time in the whole Bible that a group of angels rather than one angel had appeared to people, so this proved that they had a very important message to give to them. We don't know the names of the angels or how many there were of them, but in the Bible it says that there are millions of angels - so it would have been an amazing experience! If you'd like to

There's a theory that Jesus might have been born a couple of miles outside of Bethlehem - and was actually born in the company of the shepherds!

A couple of miles outside Bethlehem there was a special watch tower called the Migdal Eder, which means 'The Tower of the Flock'. It's thought that sheep born here were used as sacrifice animals in the Jewish Temple in near-by Jerusalem. So they were very special and the shepherds were thought of more highly than normal shepherds.

According to some sources, the lambs at Migdal Eder had their health checked by resting them in a 'manger' (or dip in a rock to stop them escaping) and were even wrapped in swaddling clothes to show they were special!

I'm not convinced about Jesus actually 'being born' at 'Migdal Eder' but having those shepherds being the first to be told about Jesus makes a lot of sense.

Having seen the new baby, the Bible says "... they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them."

One ancient prophesy from the Bible also said that the Jewish messiah would come to the 'tower of the flock'.

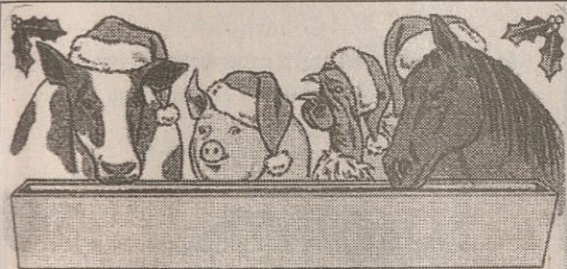

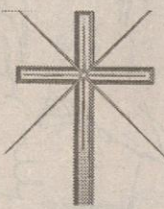

Legend Of The Christmas Rose

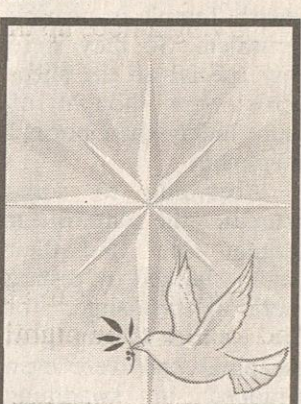

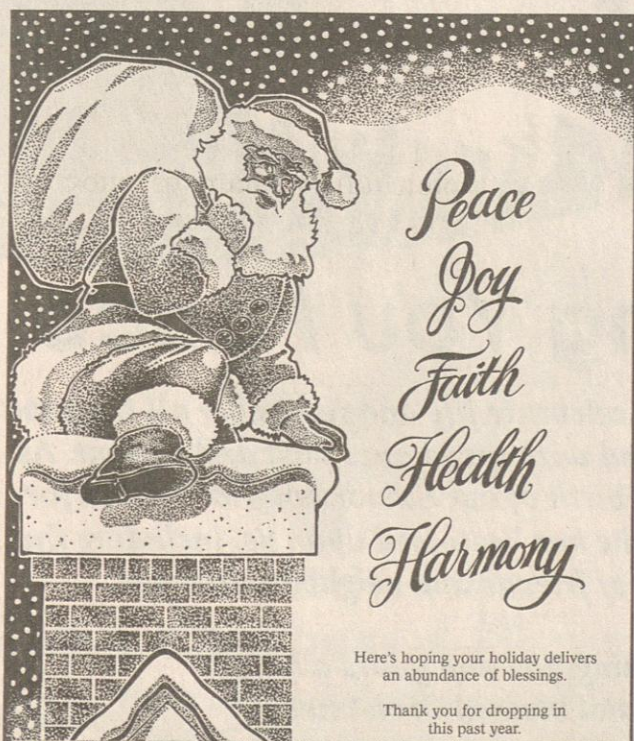

Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer

The famous Christmas song Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer started life as a poem created by an American advertising executive called Robert May. He was requested to produce a poem that could be given away to children by the Santa Claus employed by Department Stores at Christmas! Working as an Advertising Executive Robert May had a natural flair with words and was able to compose the Rudolph the red-nosed reindeer poem which was specifically designed to appeal to children. It was commissioned by the Montgomery Ward department store who up to this time purchased third party colouring books to give away at Christmas, this idea was conceived as a cheaper "in-house" option!

Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer

The brilliant marketing ploy proved to be a massive success and approximately 2.5 million printed copies of "Rudolph, the red-nosed reindeer" poems were given away in the first year of its publication! In 1949 the singer Gene Autry recorded a musical version of Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer lyrics with music composed by Johnny Marks. The recording of Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer lyrics was a Christmas hit with kids of all ages and sold 2.5 million copies during the Christmas week in 1949 and Rudolf became number one in the music charts.

Christmas Trees

Decorating evergreen trees had always been a part of the German winter solstice tradition. The first "Christmas trees" explicitly decorated and named after the Christian holiday, appeared in Strasbourg, in Alsace in the beginning of the 17th century. After 1750, Christmas trees began showing up in other parts of Germany, and even more so after 1771, when Johann Wolfgang von Goethe visited Strasbourg and promptly included a Christmas tree in his novel, *The Suffering of Young Werther*.

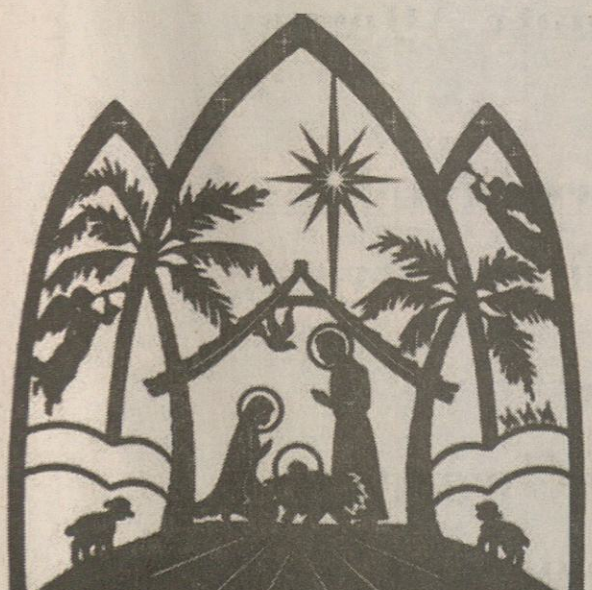
In the 1820s, the first German immigrants decorated Christmas trees in Pennsylvania. After Germany's Prince Albert married Queen Victoria, he introduced the Christmas tree tradition to England.

In 1848, the first American newspaper carried a picture of a Christmas tree and the custom spread to nearly every home in just a few years.

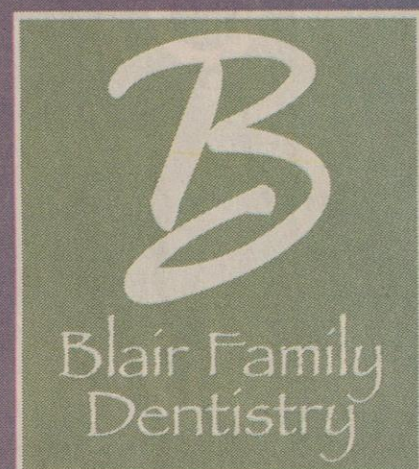

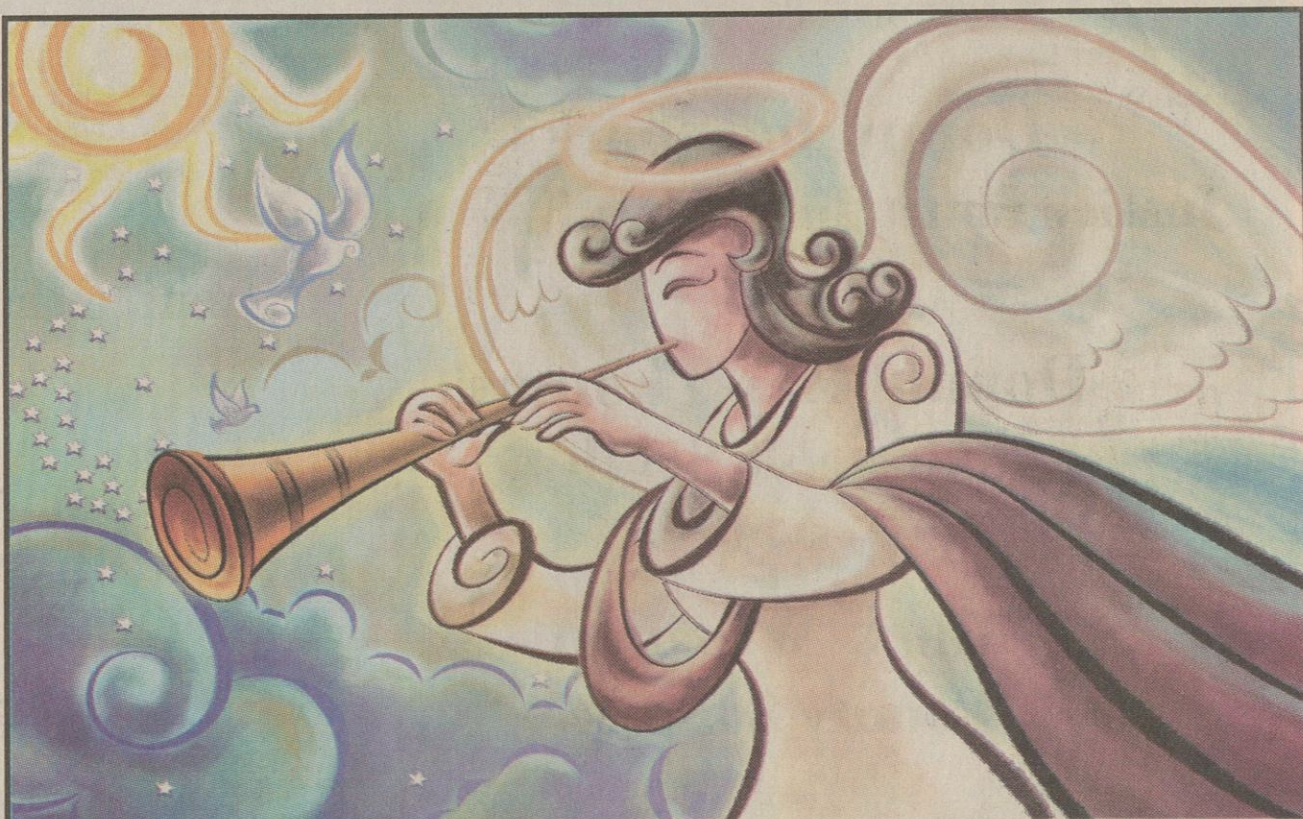

Christmas Cards

An Englishman named John Calcott Horsley helped to popularize the tradition of sending Christmas greeting cards when he began producing small cards featuring festive scenes and a pre-written holiday greeting in the late 1830s. Newly efficient post offices in England and the United States made the cards nearly overnight sensations. At about the same time, similar cards were being made by R.H. Pease, the first American card maker, in Albany, New York, and Louis Prang, a German who immigrated to America in 1850.

Poinsettias

In 1828, the American minister to Mexico, Joel R. Poinsett, brought a red-and-green plant from Mexico to America. As its coloring seemed perfect for the new holiday, the plants, which were called poinsettias after Poinsett, began appearing in greenhouses as early as 1830. In 1870, New York stores began to sell them at Christmas. By 1900, they were a universal symbol of the holiday.

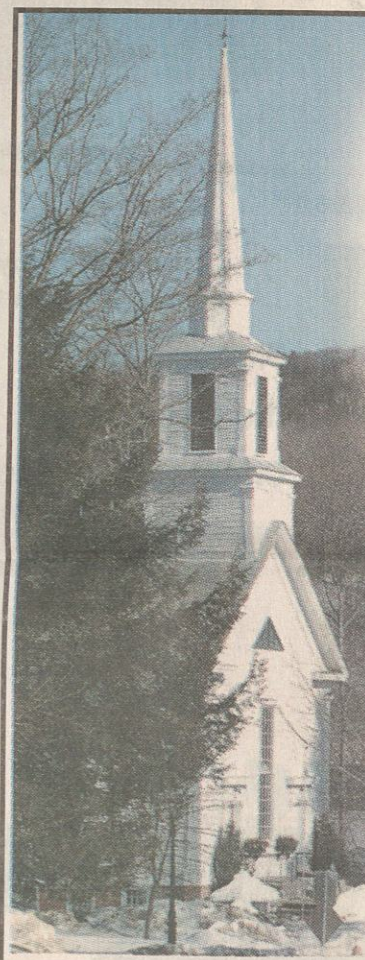
