## Mayor and Board of Aldermen to Clean Up City of Iuka

We believe Iuka is one of the most beautiful towns in North Mississippi. Unfortunately, in every community, we have some issues with unkempt and dilapidated properties. In recent City Board meetings, actions have been taken to take care of resources in town according to state law and recently enacted ordinances. City Zoning and Building Inspector Bo Johnson has been issuing warnings and then citations to those who refuse to clean their yards and

and. The Board of Aldermen just passed a slum ordinance which empowers the City to demand repairs or demolish buildings that are deemed unfit for human



habitation. The City has discussed several abandoned, condemned or otherwise blighted properties that will be given an ultimatum to repair and refurbish or get knocked down.

The Board also recently revamped the animal ordinance in town in an effort to crack down on loose and vicious dogs in the City limits.

If you have any issues with trashed properties in the city or loose or vicious domesticated animals, please contact City Hall. Together, we can make Iuka the best small town in the state!

## Governor Tate Reeves Releases New Executive Order

JACKSON — Today, Governor Tate Reeves signed Executive Order 1549. This order will go into effect at 5:00 PM on March 3rd and stay in effect until March 31st.

"Today, I signed what I expect will be one of my last executive orders regarding COVID-19. Our hospitalizations have plummeted, and our case numbers have fallen dramatically as well. In fact, our case numbers have fallen to the point where no county meets the original criteria for a mask mandate," said Governor Tate Reeves.

"I am replacing our current orders with recommendations. Everyone should continue to listen to Dr. Dobbs and other

health advisors for the best possible wisdom regarding how you can personally stem any risk of catching COVID. Their insight is valuable. The only rules that will remain in this order are a capacity limit of 50% on indoor arenas, and those that govern K-12 schools."

Mississippians are encouraged, though not ordered, to wear a face covering and practice social distancing. K-12 schools will still require a mask where social distancing is not possible. Seating for K-12 extracurricular activities at outdoor venues is now set at 50% capacity and 25% maximum seating capacity inside. Seating capacity for indoor bowl and arena seating is now increased to 50%.

## Skeletal Remains Found in December Identified

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack Wilton, a decomposed body which was found December 18 by hikers just 2 miles south of Iuka has been identified.

He received word this week from the Mississippi Crime Lab

in Pearl, MS that the remains belonged to Eric Bond, 36, who was last seen in the area off of Hwy. 25. He had been missing since November of 2018 and had been reported missing to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at that time.


## Two Arrested for Drugs by Sheriff's Deputies

On February 22nd, 2021, Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle on Hwy. 365, due to erratic driving. During the traffic stop, deputies observed some drug paraphernalia inside the vehicle as well as a strong odor of narcotics coming from inside said vehicle. At this time, deputies placed both the driver and passenger under arrest for the paraphernalia and a search of the vehicle yielded a large amount of alleged Methamphetamine, a large amount of alleged Marijuana, Oxycodone, Hydrocodone, and various other prescribed prescription pills in two separate bags inside the vehicle.

Deputies also found evidence that the occupants of the vehicle were possibly selling narcotics due to baggies being found inside the vehicle as well. Both the driver and passenger were then transported to the Tishomingo County Jail where they were both officially charged, and an investigation was conducted into the alleged narcotics that were found and the occupants of the vehicle.

Chirel Rippe, 43-year-old, white female, of 2060 Fulton Road Iuka, Mississippi was officially charged with: Felony Possession of Controlled Substance (Methamphetamine) with Intent to Sell; Felony Possession of Controlled Substance (Marijuana) with Intent to Sell; Felony Possession of Controlled Substance (Hydrocodone); Felony Possession of Controlled Substance (Oxycodone).

Bond was also set by Tishomingo County Justice Court Judge, Seth Adams, in the amount of \$20,000 for the above listed charges.

This case is still pending, and more arrests may be forthcoming.

## New Iuka Certified Firefighter Robert Walden





Our Cross Planting Vision: Plant a minimum of one Cross per state in the United States — Plant a minimum of one Cross


per country around the world. Publishing on the internet why the Cross is important with the accompanying testimony while "Declaring the Glory of God".

## Lessons On Life From The Prophet Isaiah (part 12)

We have been looking at Isaiah chapter one for some weeks, but I think there is more here that can help us, so we will look at Isaiah 1:19-20: "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land: But if ye refuse and rebel, ye shall be devoured with the sword: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it." Could God possibly have made His message more clear that what we see in these two verses? I doubt it! It is not the simple, plain and honest message of God that most people want to hear, rather they want to hear some "way out speculation concerning the end of time, or some far-flung plan to make one rich, while still doing his own thing. Isaiah was God's messenger to Israel, but he is also God's messenger to the present age. What he says will, in general, be applicable to every age. Even if some parts of his message do apply more directly to the nation of Israel, yet there are lessons for all of the rest of us in his writing.

What could be more simply stated than the words of our verses above? We do not need a steady diet on "prophetic truth" to learn to walk with God in the present. Certainly it is good to learn prophetic truth, but if one never learns to walk with God in the process, he is not profited by his study of even biblical prophecy. The matter of being "willing" is on Isaiah's mind, and that "opens a can of worms" in some religious circles, for some seem to think that the human will cannot be yielded to God, either for salvation or service. I think most of us would agree that an act of God in convicting us of sin is necessary for salvation, but an obedience of humanity through the will to know God is also necessary. Isaiah was speaking to Israel as a nation, some of which knew God in salvation, and some of which did not. The matter of "eating the good of the land" depended on the movement of the human will in the right direction, and man can obey God, or refuse to obey Him! The good of the land was offered by the LORD to those who would be willing and obedient, but the judgment of God was offered to those who would not. It is interesting that the word "sword" in the Bible often spoke of the swords of enemy nations, and that seems to be implied here. When Israel obeyed God, the nations around them feared them, but when they disobeyed God, the nations around them often attacked them in battle. I wonder if our nation might get a lesson from this? Notice that it was the mouth of the LORD that spoke the words of our verses, thus it was God Who would send blessing for obedience, or judgment for disobedience, and God has not changed His mind on this matter! The God of the Old Testament is the God of the present age. Even though we do not live under the law given to Moses, we are under law to Christ, as is stated in I Corinthians 9:21. God has not abandoned the world and allowed humanity to do whatever it pleases, rather He is patient and waits for men to repent and trust Him. By J. Holcut School - this school burned in March of 1960, and the building before it burned February 24, 1949. The original structure had been built in 1915.

Holcut school began in 1893 as a small one room school named Lebanon. In 1900 another room was built and Mrs. Jewel Nixon gave some land and called it Nixon School. About 1915 it was necessary to enlarge and a four room school was built and it was called Holcut because the land was given by John Holder and Eli Callicutt. In 1928 it was enlarged again. On Feb. 18th, 1949 fire completely destroyed the Holcut high school building. Four new classrooms under construction were destroyed and the lumber on the grounds for the additional rooms was also burned. The Tishomingo Fire Department reached the scene 16 minutes after they got the report, but could not save the building. A beautiful new brick building was constructed by Reynold Sims before the next school year. The fire which destroyed Holcut School classrooms and auditorium in March of 1960 did \$100,000 worth of damage. The gymnasium and cafeteria, separate from the school proper were not damaged. This time a bond issue was voted to be county wide and the school lost. It was not rebuilt.
