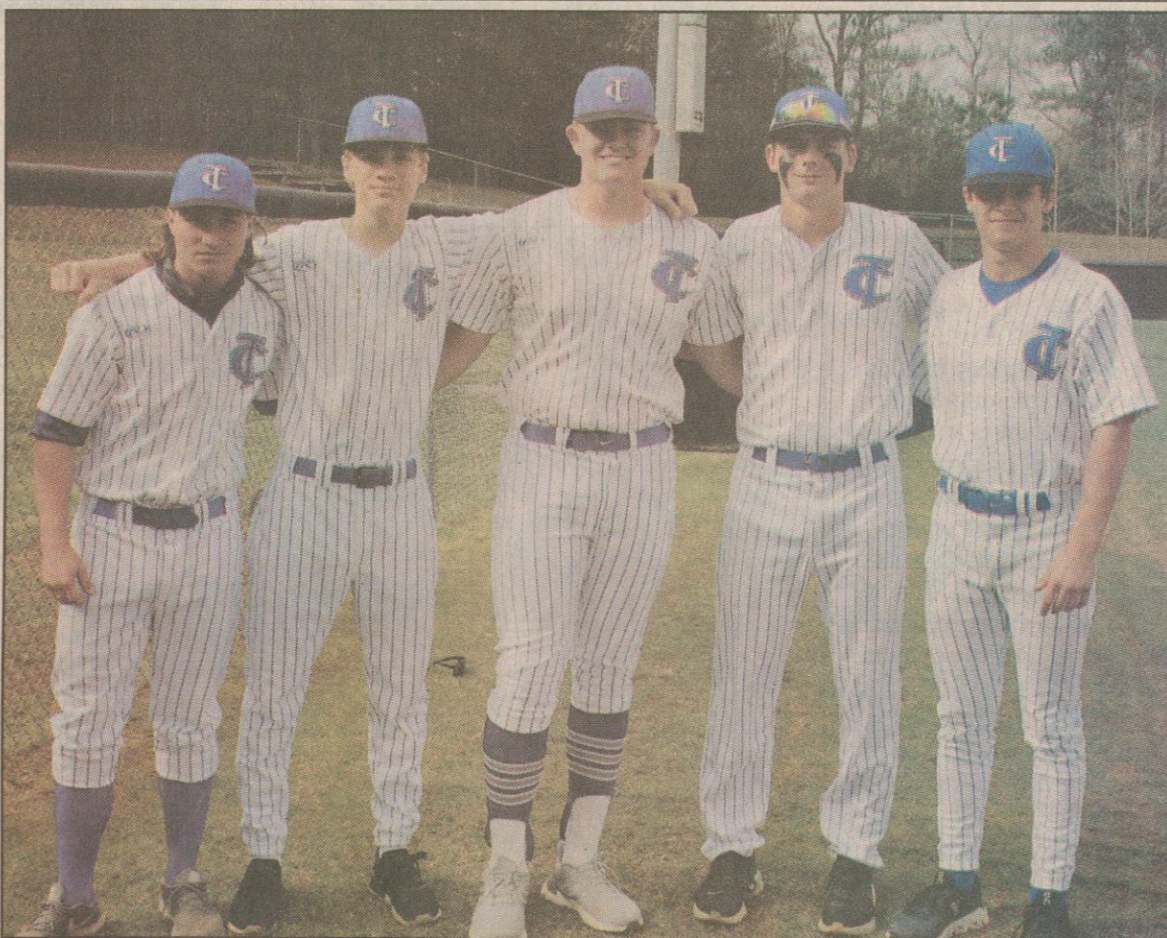

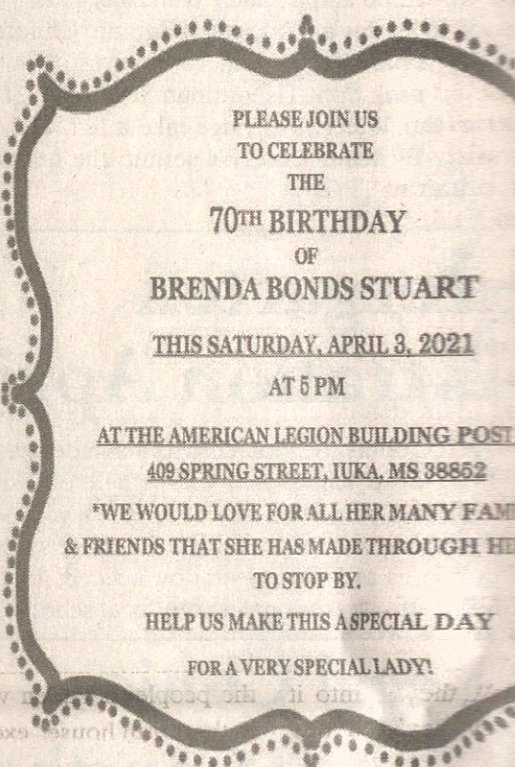

My First Tornado!

It's early summer, 1950, I'm 4 years old and sitting here in Uncle

T. Woodruff's store in Paden. It's mid-morn-

ing and cloudy, bad cloudy.

Other and Daddy let me

stay here with P. T. and

my Lena this week while

they went back to Mem-

phis to work. Uncle P.T.

was sitting behind the cash

register by the window on

a big stool, behind the

counter where he kept all the

credit slips, some new and

some yellowed from age.

And then there was the

cheese cutter with that big

top of cheese on it with

oil spots. It sat out all

day, I guess you don't have

refrigerate cheese. Cus-

tomers would come in and

pick up their groceries

and lay them on the coun-

ter to pay. If they had any

money left, they might

"gimmy some of them

cheese". "Them cheese",

thought that was the

end. And then there is

an ice cream box. It has

two lids on it and when

it opened, cold smoke

flows out. He has three

colors, chocolate, straw-

berry, and "maneller"

. Maneller is my favorite.

We, already had an

eating morning, Aunt

Ma had killed what she

called a garter snake in

the garden. But that was

nothing compared to what

was about to happen.

These are different

times, no air condition-

ing, no television, it's

summer and all the doors

and windows in Paden are

open. The only sound you

can hear will be a slam-

ping screen door, or some

band and wife "into

and someone will

"Well, they're into it

now", or maybe a dog

barking.

Aunt Lena had been

making a pot of turnip

soup that morning and

the house was full of

smell. I hated turnip

soup and the smell. If

it didn't like them, that

smell will really hit you



hard. Thank the Lord I got over that. My Aunt's name was Lena, but we didn't call her that, we called her "Lener". I was nearly grown before I learned there wasn't an R in her name.

Across the road from the store is the Masonic Lodge. A big two story frame building shrouded in mystery. "What do they do up there" I asked? "They ride goats" was the most common answer. The downstairs was rented out in apartments, my mother was born there, but right now the bottom is empty. I would learn later some of the best people in Paden belonged to that Lodge and they would be the first to show up and help when the destruction hit.

"This is a bad cloud" one of them said, "maybe we need to get to the storm house". "I think it's gonna blow over", Uncle P.T. said. He said that several more times before it hit.

The store is full of people, Simmy Green had walked up from south of town to get a sack of groceries. He had on his snap billed cap, he always had on his snap billed cap. "Yo folks be ok Simmy" one asked? "Yep, they in the storm house by now". I learned later that most of the people in Paden were in the storm house, except us.

It happened suddenly, as it always does, hard wind, hard rain, some hail, and then the Masonic Lodge across the road exploded, boards, furniture, glass everywhere. Next door to the Lodge

is Della Luttrell's house, a small unpainted frame house, it was untouched, and she was unhurt, I knew that because I was sitting in her lap in the store. I loved her, she was like a grandmother to me. We didn't call her Della either, it was "Deller", just like "Lener".

And then it was all over, and amazingly, no one was hurt. Someone came running up and said, "it got Billy West's house, but they're ok, they were in the storm house." Storm houses in Paden are all pretty much the same, crossties for the sides, pine slabs on the floor, with a tin roof. You could really tell when the rain changed to hail. The insides were all the same too, a bench around three sides and a shelf up top to put canned stuff from the

garden, a coal oil lamp for light and a hoe to kill the snake, there was always a snake.

We didn't escape completely, it took the tin roof off the store building. I can look up and see daylight through the cracks in the ceiling planks.

It was maybe an hour later, after all the rain had stopped and we learned that no one got hurt that the real excitement started. A big red truck drove up. They came pouring out, all dressed in uniforms asking if we were hurt and then handing out sandwiches and cookies and cokes and yes, candy. It was the Red Cross. God bless the Red Cross, they put a tarpaulin over Uncle P.T. store and gave me some more candy. My first tornado.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE INITIAL HEARING

The Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi, is considering applying to the Mississippi Development Authority for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant of up to \$450,000 for Infrastructure Improvements or a Community Livability Improvement Project.

The State of Mississippi has been allocated approximately \$100,000,000 that will be made available to cities and counties on a competitive basis to undertake eligible community development activities. These funds must be used to benefit low- and moderate-income persons.

The activities for which these funds may be used are in the areas of public facilities and economic development. More specific details regarding eligible activities, program requirements, and the rating system will be provided at a public hearing which will be held at the Tishomingo Town Hall on April 19, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. The purpose of this hearing will be to obtain citizen input into the development of the application.

The location of this hearing is accessible to persons with disabilities. If a translator is needed for non-English speaking persons, please contact Mayor James F. Tennyson at (662) 3402 at least three (3) days prior to the meeting in an effort to accommodate this request. The Town of Tishomingo does not discriminate on the basis of disability in the admissions or access to or treatment of employment in its programs or activities.

All comments are welcome and must be submitted in writing. For those unable to attend this meeting, written comments will be considered until the close of business on April 24, 2021. Written comments should be mailed to the Town of Tishomingo c/o Mayor James F. Tennyson at P.O. Box 70, Tishomingo, MS 38873-0070.

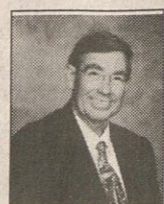
Lessons On Restoration From The Prophet Isaiah

I am not likely to write articles on all of the Book of Isaiah, although I might, but I really want to point out that God has always had a desire to restore that which is fallen or broken, and Isaiah chapter 2 is a great place to start on that subject. Isaiah 2:1-2 says, "The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. And it shall come to pass in the last days, that the mountain of the LORD'S house shall be established in the top of the mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills; and all nations shall flow unto it." It is a bit hard for most people to imagine a time when the whole world will be worshipping the

one true God, but Isaiah describes such a time in our verses. No, that time will not come until after Jesus Christ comes to earth again, at some point in the future, and brings wars and world problems to an end. There are several things that will have to happen before this time of peace comes, such as the rapture of the church; the tribulation, the conversion of Israel; the battle of Armageddon and the judgment of the nations. Notice that Isaiah writes concerning Judah and Jerusalem, and his prophecy is timely and accurate, in spite of the fact that hundreds of years have passed since he wrote the words above. God is not on man's time-

table, thus He can do His work in His Own timing. Human beings get a bit impatient with God, when things do not come together in their timetables. Notice that words "last days" are incorporated into Isaiah's prophecy, and these days are still future, because the truths prophesied by Isaiah have not yet taken place. So, somewhere in the future God is going to bring Jerusalem and Israel to prominence by making that nation

and city the capitol city of the world and the headquarters of human, global worship. No, everybody on earth will not come to know Christ in salvation, nor will every religion come together into one big conglomeration, rather, all of the people of the earth will come to understand Who God is and how He is to be worshiped. Isaiah 2:2 does say that all the nations of the earth will flow to the mountain of the LORD for worship

when Jesus comes back to earth to reign, after He has whipped the battle of Armageddon and judged the nations! Isaiah 2:3 says, "And many people shall go and say, Come ye, and let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; and we will walk in His paths: for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem." We have never seen a time like this, for the early days of the church saw persecution, and Jerusalem failed to recognize Jesus as Israel's Messiah, but this will change at some point in

the future. Jesus will be the "dispenser" for the world. God and the church congregating in worship of God will take a miracle from God for this purpose, and it will be proceeded by the word of God. 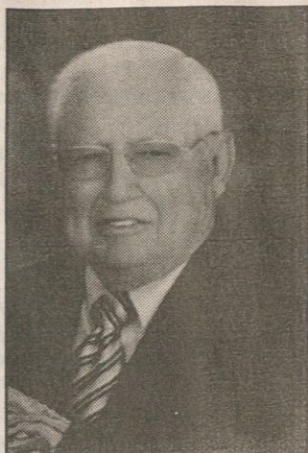

directed \$186 million of these funds to be administered by MHC.

This funding can be used for rental assistance, rental arrears, as well as utilities and home energy costs including electricity, gas, water and sewer, trash removal, and energy costs, such as fuel oil. The funding CANNOT be used for telephone, cable, or internet expenses.

Eligible households may receive up to 15 months of assistance to make rent and utility payments current

An application for rental assistance may be submitted online by an eligible tenant or a landlord can initiate an application on behalf of that eligible tenant. Tenants and landlords must apply through the www.ms-ramp.com website. Funds will be paid directly to landlords and utility service providers.

As defined by The U.S. Department of Treasury an "eligible household" is a renter household in which at least one or more individuals meet the following criteria:

Qualifies for unemployment or has experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship due to COVID-19;

Demonstrates a risk of experiencing homelessness or housing instability; and

Has a household income at or below 80 percent of the area median.

Documentation is required to prove eligibility requirements.

Eligible households that include an individual who has been unemployed for the 90 days prior to application for assistance and households with income at or below 50 percent of the area median will be prioritized for assistance.

Eligible households who receive rental assistance through the RAMP program are not allowed to receive assistance from any other federally funded rental assistance program.

Baseball and softball are at the height of their seasons. The final tournaments will be in mid-April.

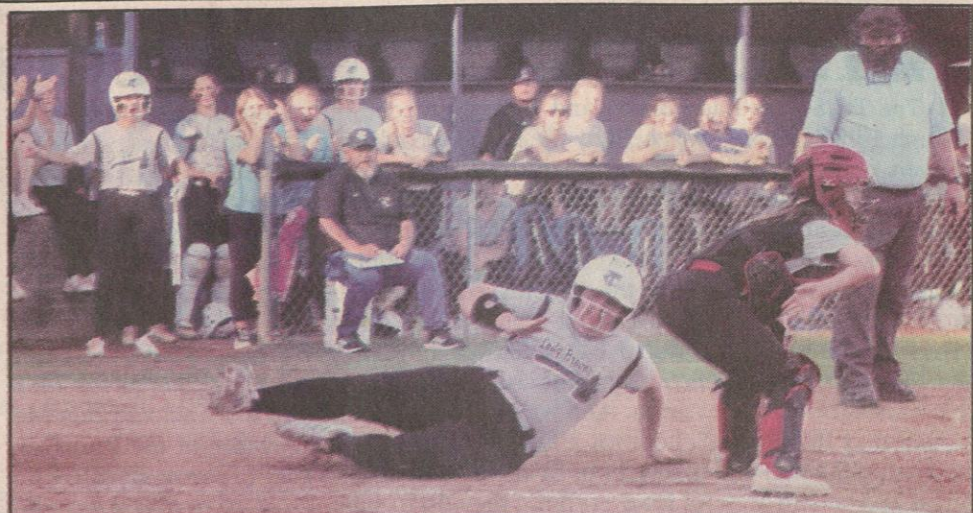
