

# Circuit Clerk Website Debut, tishcocircuitclerk.com

The Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk's Office will debut an official website on April 1st, 2021. The website address, tishcocircuitclerk.com includes information about the duties of the office, online tools for citizens to utilize, and offers a feedback tab. Other tools provided include links to local, state and federal agencies, as well as a listing of your local elected officials. Election related materials can be found such as; a voter registration form, polling place locator, a list of polling locations in the county, election results, upcoming election dates, and many other election topics. Circuit Clerk Josh Mc-Natt said, "The website offers a vast amount of information and resources for our citizens. We are excited to launch the site as expanding our communication was a key campaign commitment; we went from zero digital media to an active following on social media and now implementing a website."



The website also details information about the Circuit Court process; including court dates, payment processing for criminal fines, and free legal resources. Looking over the site you will find a dedicated page for Jury Service, and Marriage License. Marriage license applications are easily downloaded from the site, so you can complete prior to coming to the office. Many familiar landmarks

in Tishomingo County have been incorporated into the design of the website. McNatt added, "the website is a positive improvement and a tool that can be used for generations. We now have a foundation in place to expand on future opportunities, like online records and supporting the Mississippi Electronic Court System."



Thank the Lord I got over that. My Aunt's name was Lena, but we didn't call her that, we called her "Lener". I was nearly grown before I learned there wasn't an R in her name.

Across the road from the store is the Masonic Lodge. A big two story frame building shrouded in mystery. "What do they do up there" I asked? "They ride goats" was the most common answer. The downstairs was rented out in apartments, my mother was born there, but right now the bottom is empty. I would learn later some of the best people in Paden belonged to that Lodge and they would be the first to show up and help when the destruction hit.

"This is a bad cloud" one of them said, "maybe we need to get to the storm house". " I think it's gonna blow over", Uncle P.T. said. He said that several more times before it hit.

The store is full of people, Simmy Green had walked up from south of town to get a sack of groceries. He had on his snap billed cap, he always had on his snap billed cap. "Yo folks be ok Simmy" one asked? "Yep, they in the storm house by now". I learned later that most of the people in Paden were in the storm house, except

## essons On Restoration From The Prophet Isaial

I am not likely to write articles on all of the Book of Isaiah, although I might, but I really want to point out that God has always had a desire to restore that which is fallen or broken, and Isaiah chapter 2 is a great place to start on that subject. Isaiah 2:1-2 says, "The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. And it shall come to pass in the last days, that the mountain of the LORD'S house shall be established in the top of the mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills; and all nations shall flow unto it." It is a bit hard for most people to imagine a time when the whole world will be worshiping the

one true God, but Isaiah describes such a time in our verses. No, that time will not come until after Jesus Christ comes to earth again, at some point in the future, and brings wars and world problems to an end. There are several things that will have to happen before this time of peace comes, such as the rapture of the church; the tribulation, the conversion of Israel; the battle of Armageddon and the judgment of the nations

Notice that Isaiah writes concerning Judah and Jerusalem, and his prophecy is timely and accurate, in spite of the fact that hundreds of years have pasted since he wrote the words above. God is not on man's time-

Notice that words "last days" are incorporated into Isaiah's prophecy, and these days are still future, because the truths prophesied by Isaiah have not yet taken place. So, somewhere in the future God is going to bring Jerusalem and Israel to prominence by making that nation

and city the capitol city of the world and the headquarters of human, global worship. No, everybody on earth will not come to know Christ in salvation, nor will every religion come together into one big conglomeration, rather, all of the people of the earth will come to understand Who God is and how He is to be worshiped. Isaiah 2:2 does say that all the nations of the earth will flow to the mountain of the LORD for worship when Jesus comes back to earth to reign, after He has whipped the battle of Armageddon and judged the nations! Isaiah 2:3 says, "And many people shall go and say, Come ye, and let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; and we will walk in His paths: for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem." We have nev-

er seen a time like this, for the early days of the church saw persecution, and Jerusalem failed to recognize Jesus as Israel's Messiah, but

The disciples therefore rejoiced when they saw the Lord."






