Katelyn Isabella Barnes, of Tishomingo, Mississippi, was among the more than 60 University of Mississippi students to receive a 2021 Marcus Elvis Taylor Memorial Medal, the university's highest academic award.

The honorees were recognized for their achievements on Thursday, April 8, at The Pavilion at Ole Miss.

Katelyn is a Senior Biology and Biochemistry major in the College of Liberal Arts. She is the daughter of Donna Barnes and the late Scotty Barnes. She was a 2017 graduate of TCHS and will graduate from Ole Miss in May. After graduation she will attend UMMC school of medicine to become a physician.

The Taylor Medals were established at UM in 1904 by Dr. William A. Taylor of Booneville in memory of his son, an honored 1871 alumnus of the university. The award recognizes no more than 1 percent of the student body each year.

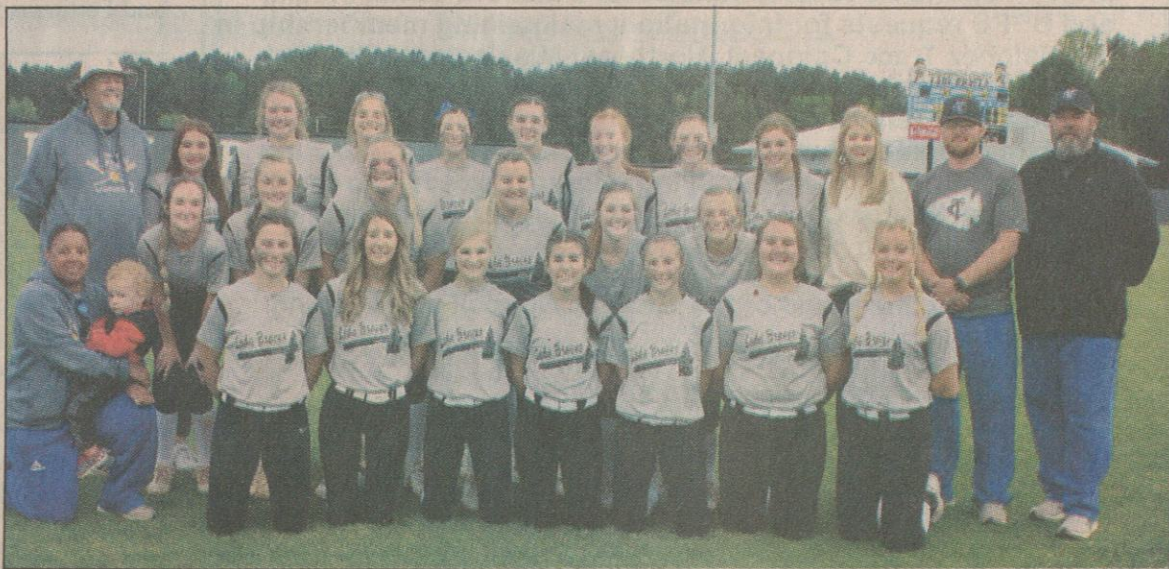
A time of celebration for Reuben Grissom's accomplishment is planned for this Friday at 7:30 pm at the Iuka Fire Department.

Tishomingo Arts Council Awards Winners of Egg Decoration Challenge

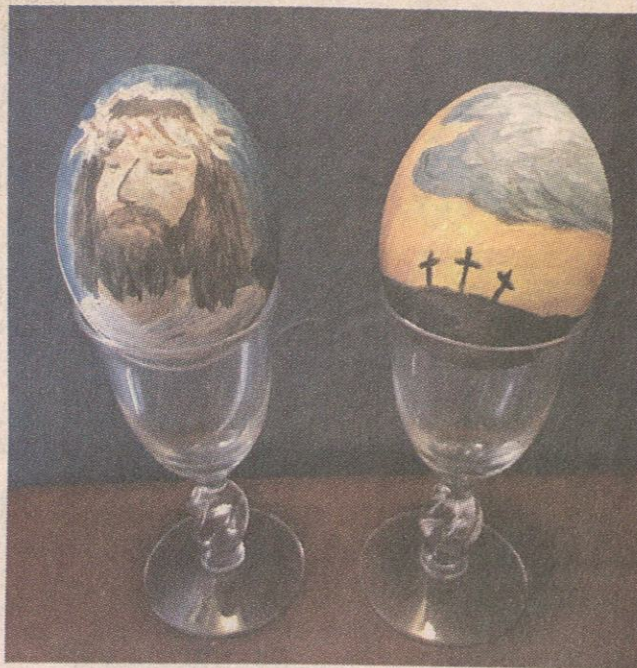

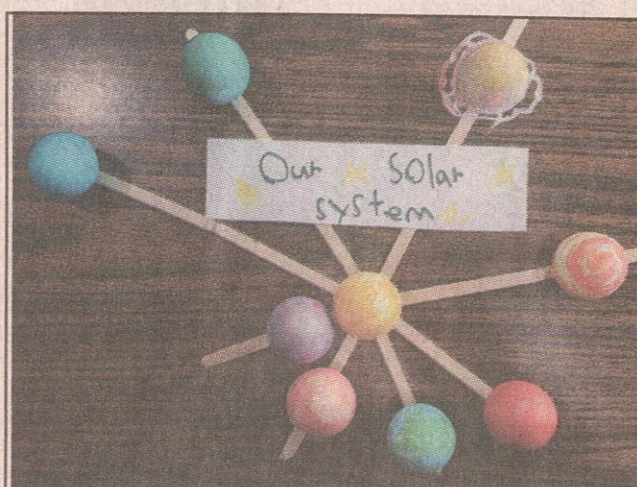

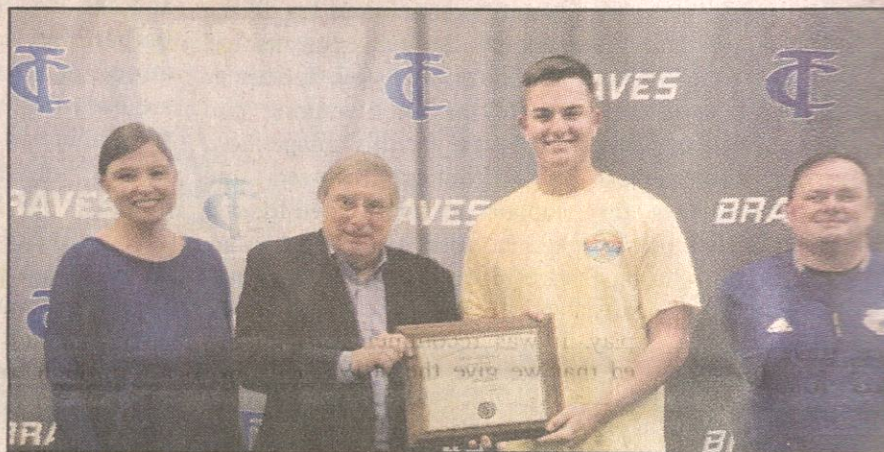
TC Track Members Compete in North Half

According to Coach Amanda Taylor, if the two place they will advance to the state which will be May 1 at Pearl High School.



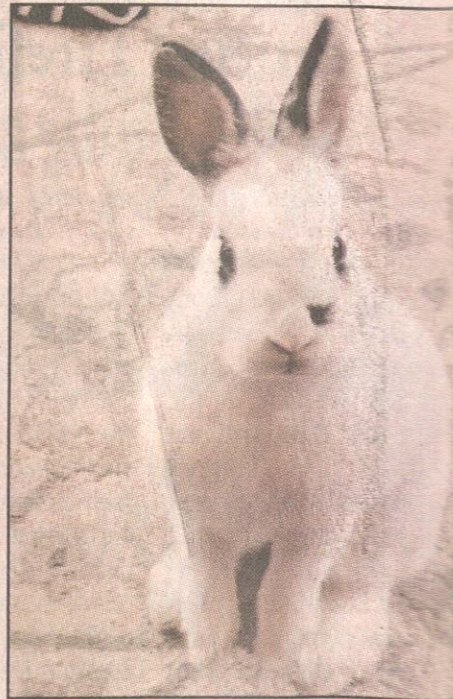
Jim Riley Receives National Football Foundation Scholarship

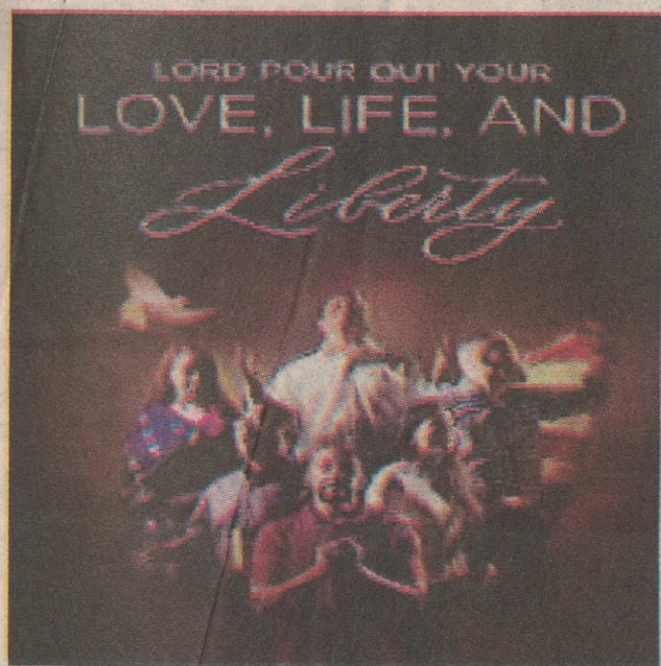

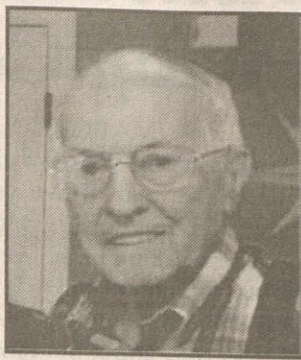

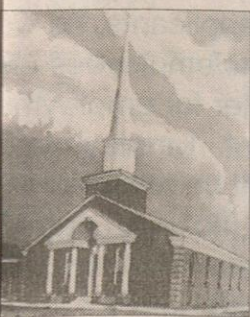

DC April Program

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone, Chapter April's program was "The Life of a Confederate Soldier". We did not expect to be in person but hope to be there May at an outside location (Mineral Springs). We will be placing this on several locations on April 26th, Confederate Memorial Day. Good books to read on this subject is "Hardtack and Coffee: Soldiers in the Civil War" by Bill Dillings and "Confederate Infantryman" by Durury. The Civil War's common soldier — who he was, how the conflict transformed his life? When we look at the lives of men like us, we gain insights into courage and sacrifice demonstrated by each and every Confederate soldier. And again, they were called to perform tasks that would have been unthinkable in their past lives as farmers, teachers, lawyers, owners, carpenters, non-workers.

Most Confederate soldiers looked a great deal like their Federal counterparts — although they were even more likely to be farmers by trade. The war was largely a young man's fight — older soldiers typically filled more specialized roles or were officers; some teenagers about their age and front line combat, many others served in support capacities, notably as musicians.

The life of a soldier during the Civil War wasn't easy. Not only did soldiers face the possibility of getting killed in battle, their daily lives were full of hardships. They had to deal with hunger, bad weather, poor clothing, and even boredom between battles. Soldiers were woken at dawn to begin their day.

One of the most disgusting features of the war was the filthy situation that was the result of the sickness of the soldiers...men were not used to the climate, the exercise, and the food, so the whole experience was in direct contrast to life at home. Common viruses and infections included typhoid fever, malaria, pneumonia, tuberculosis, pox (both small and chicken), scarlet fever, measles, mumps and diphtheria.

Civil War-era encampments were not known for wide open spaces and fresh air. It took little time for an army to alter a landscape by the sheer mass of its presence. Verdant areas became a muddy mess in no time under

the feet of thousands of soldiers and horses. With little understanding of sanitation, camps were notoriously nasty abodes; lice were rampant, and dysentery, often caused by impure drinking water, killed more men than enemy bullets.

Soldiers spent more time in camp than anywhere else. On average, soldiers fought one day out of every thirty! Can you imagine the surprise of many soldiers when they found out they would be spending significantly more time in camp than on the battlefield? Most of this time was spent practicing drills since soldiers from both sides were not professional soldiers. They learned how to fight, march, and move as a team. They also marched from camp to camp and sometimes had guard duties. In their free time, soldiers on both sides played music, card games and gambled. Letters and care packages from home were often causes for celebration.

Life in camp was similar whether you fought for the Union or Confederacy. Because the Union had more factories and economic support, those soldiers received supplies that were slightly better and more abundant than soldiers in the Confederacy.

It may be hard to imagine, but the issues also divided many families in the Civil War era. Some family members fought for the Union, while others sided with the Confederacy. The war brought on more than 600,000 American casualties. In many of those deadly battles, brothers fought against their own brothers. The life of a soldier in the 1860s was an arduous one, and for the thousands of young Americans who left home to fight for their cause, it was an experience none of them would ever forget. Military service meant many months away from home and loved ones. A furlough was hard to come by as every man was needed in the field and few men ever had a chance to visit home.

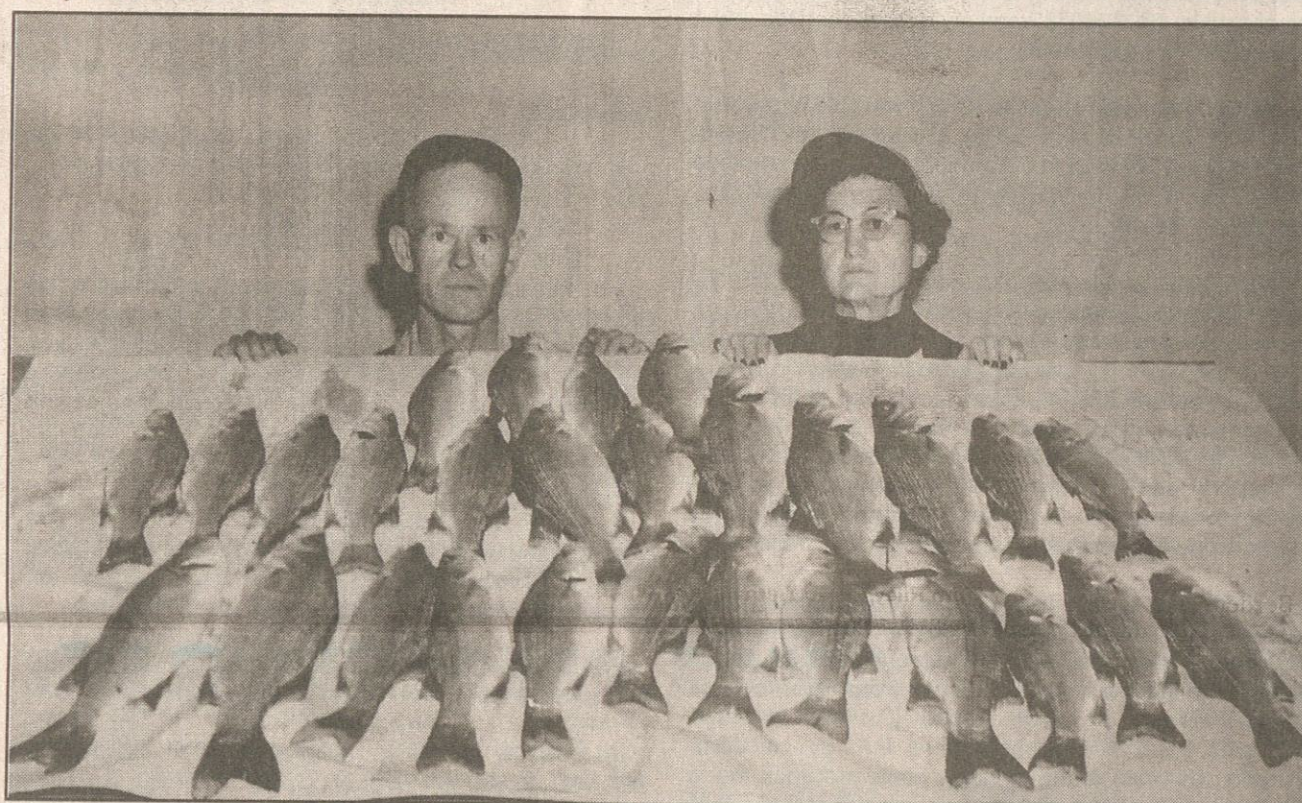

Mrs. Thompson is a regular visitor of the Trimms in Tishomingo each year and she said one of the main reasons she came here was "the mighty fine fishing available in Pickwick Lake."

My brother, George Robert Page, Jr. liked the taste of real tobacco and wanted to smoke worse than any male or female I have ever known. At our local church the men couldn't wait to get out of the pew and get outside so they'd light-up. When they stood around outside talking of them would smoke two or three and drop it and put their foot on the cigarette to be sure it was George Robert, when he knew no one was watching gathered all these cigarette butts up and put them in the little tobacco sack until he was alone. Then he'd empty the tobacco from these butts into his sack and would give him enough for a week. Too bad for Mom just happened to find his treasure. His legs were like a peach-tree, but switches never cured his taste for

We (our families) were picking cotton just east of Cripple Deer School House and the wagon and chairs were parked on the school yard. On this particular day George Robert, Bernice Keith, and I were picking cotton close together where we could talk.

As everyone started to the wagon to weigh empty their sacks George Robert got out his bumper tobacco cigarette and for fear I might tattle to us if we didn't want one. "Yes! Yes!" He quickly one and handed it to us. We had to hurry. I had rabbit tobacco but never the real thing. My dad had Chesterfield on Sundays and rolled his own during the week. I'm sure the other men were the same. This was in the 1930's

I never knew what happened to me, but all of a sudden, I became deathly sick. My head was spinning, I was sick-at-my stomach, and found it difficult to get on the wagon to weigh my cotton. I must have smelled the smoke instead of blowing it out. I couldn't remember what was wrong or at thirteen my legs were numb. I'd gotten the usual - a switch and in front of everyone. The other two got weighed up and back to picking cotton around the rest of the evening.

This was the best thing that could have happened to me. I can honestly say, "I never smoked another cigarette in all these 96 years."

My niece, Lori, and I talked about this incident she was visiting this week. We talked of how a young age we'd smoke rabbit tobacco. Neither of us found any in years. After she went home, she got some at East Prentiss. When she comes to, I'm going to bring me some to see if at "96" I can rabbit tobacco. She confessed, "I tried it and it had a bad taste in your mouth."

I don't understand why when we were kids we slip and smoke it. Forbidden fruit always has a "it's a good taste." That is why many of the habits we had impacted our lives today. Tobacco, Alcohol, stealing or not giving your boss a good day's work your pay are many ways we can mess up our lives.

One has to set a good example and *teach* out right from wrong and if necessary don't "spare and spoil the child." Discipline should be done. It hurts, but it won't kill you whether it's a good thing to, taking away privileges, put in quiet time (I never knew existed) or as in the old days "a good tree switch on the legs." All these are good adjustments and done in love and moderation make good loving men and ladies who are in great demand in A today. Be one.

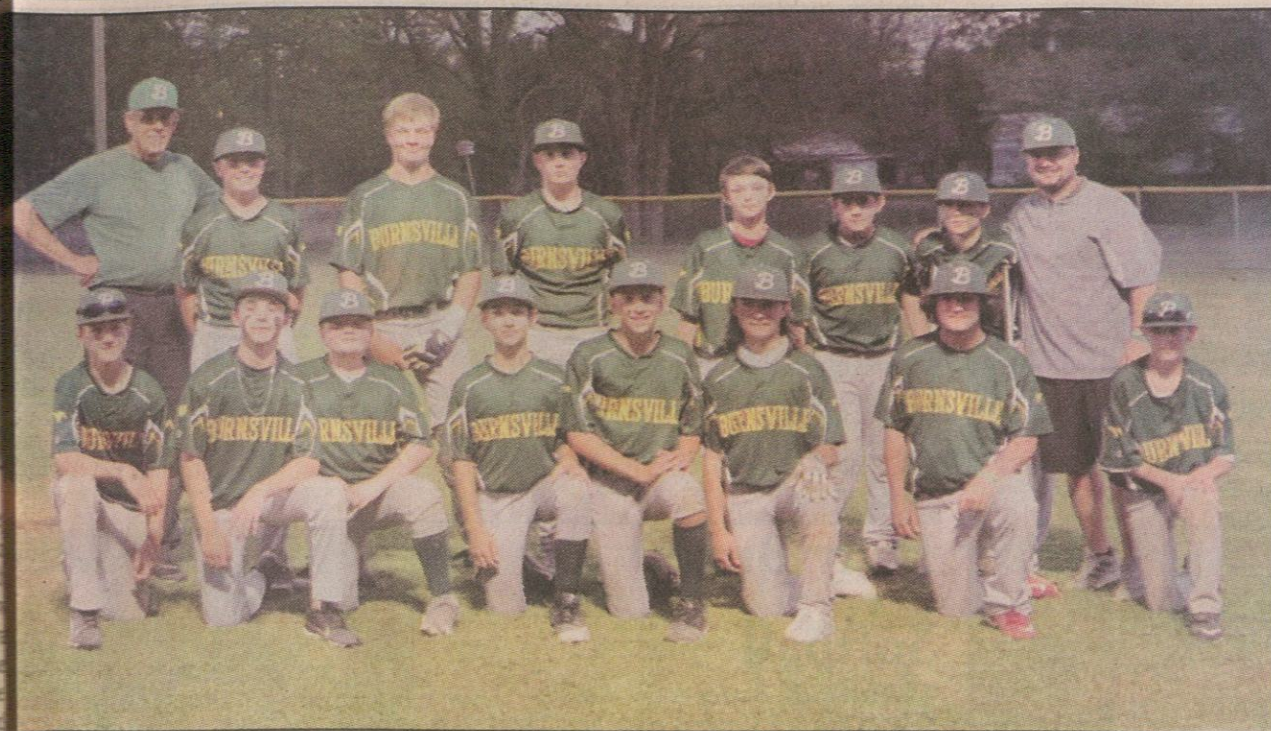

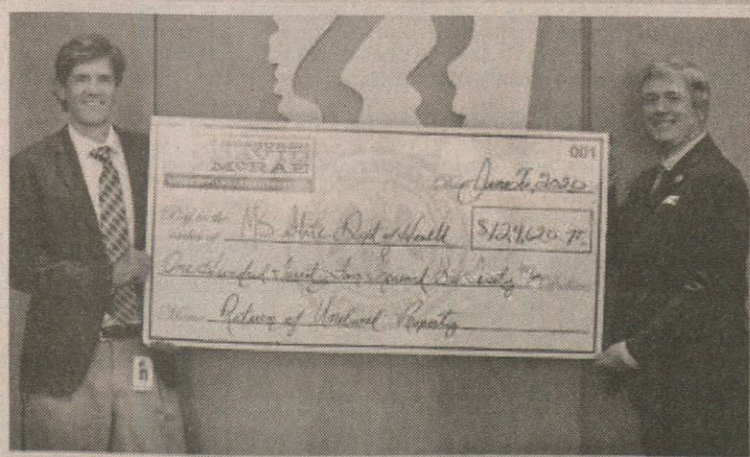
