## Magnolia Regional Health Center to Partner with Yellow Creek Port Authority to Build New Clinic in Burnsville

Magnolia Regional Health Center (MRHC) is expanding to Tishomingo County as a result of an agreement reached between Yellow Creek Port Authority (YCPA) and the healthcare organization.

In March, local delegates, including Sen. Rita Marks, Sen. Daniel Sparks, Rep. Bubba Carpenter, Rep. Rick Bain, and Rep. Jody

Steverson, worked to obtain \$750,000 to be used by YCPA to construct a medical clinic in Burnsville and meet the workforce health care needs of many of the industries located at both port locations.

The YCPA board recently received proposals for the use of a building on port property and selected the MRHC clinic project as the best use for the location. MRHC will

own and operate the medical clinic and YCPA will provide the land to assist the project.

The new clinic will be located in Burnsville, Miss., and plans for construction are underway. The newly built clinic will serve both industry and community healthcare needs.

"The city of Burnsville is thrilled to welcome Magnolia Regional Health Center

to our community," said David Nixon, mayor of Burnsville. "MRHC has cared for patients in our region and community for many years, and I am confident the new clinic will serve residents of our community for years to come."

"Our board of directors, leadership team and entire staff consider it a privilege and tremendous opportunity

to expand critical primary care services into Tishomingo County and the city of Burnsville," said Jim Hobson, chief executive officer at MRHC. "By strategically expanding our clinic presence into Tishomingo County, we are able to continue to pro-

We're all excited now that we're able to schedule concerts, plays, shows, and talks from visiting artists... and this is, I think, a beautiful introduction into all these great things that are about to happen. Things are getting... real."

At the end of the day, the real beauty of the magazine is its reflection of our area.

"My favorite aspect of the magazine is that it gives an

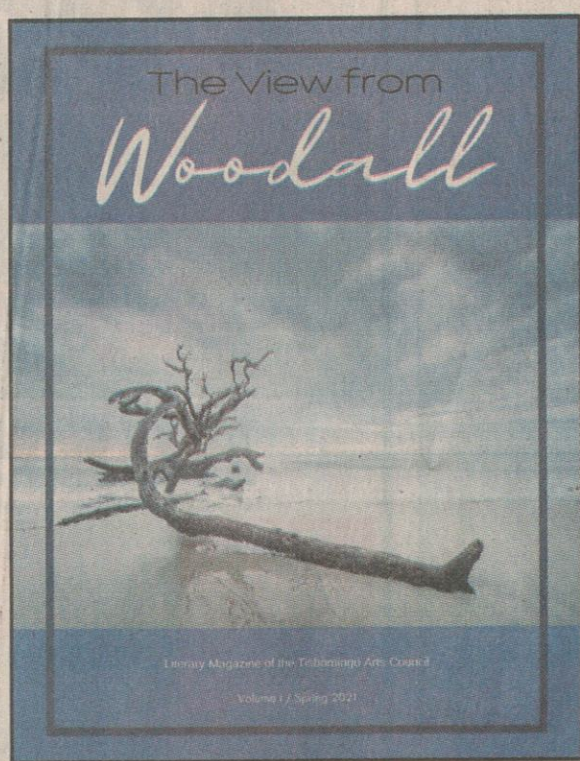
audience to artists and writers who would not otherwise have one," says Embrey.

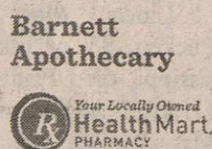

## DAR Makes Plans for In Person Meetings Next Year

The Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone Chapter 394 had hoped to meet in May but again it was not in person but by phone and news paper. We are going to try and meet in June and to try and make plans for the up-coming year.

The fashions worn before and during the Civil War are Victorian styles, but the clothing worn by women in the Confederate States take on a slightly different style. Southern women learned to make do with less and the famous scene in Gone With the Wind, when Scarlett uses drapes to make a dress had some basis in fact. Clothing was mended and remade. Homespun became a popular, even patriotic substitute for manufactured fabric during the war. We like to visualize women of the Antebellum South in traditional Victorian hoop skirts, grandly belled with ribbons and bows. Of course, like fashion periods, the and, elegant styles of the period were limited to the wealthier classes. Simpler versions of hoop

skirts were worn by women of less means. The elite women of the Antebellum South enjoyed French and English fashions. The elite women of the south wore fabrics in silk, velvet for colder weather; fine lawn, linen, and muslin in warm weather. White was a popular color in warm weather for women with status. Black, worn for mourning, was often worn due to the high death rate and during the war as women lost loved ones who perished in battle.

Large prints were difficult to match and restricted to the wealthy as the voluminous skirts were made of up to 5 yards of fabric, and using a print, stripe or plaid increased the need for even more material.

Accessories- Jewelry: brooches and matching chunky bracelets. Fans: Fans were popular. A nosegay, or small bunch of aromatic flowers. Small purses or drawstring bags held a lady's necessities. Aprons, often worn for cooking or doing chores protected dresses.

Lace was not widely

used, except for collars and cuffs. Collar and cuffs were removable for laundering or a stylish change. Parasol: A fabric umbrella carried on a sunny day to protect a woman's complexion from the sun, and offered a kind of portable shade.

Women of the Civil War period wore many layers of undergarments. Chemise, corsets, and the hoop skirts were popular. The Hoop skirts were mostly for the richer and was for evening wear. Lower class women did not wear wide hoop skirts, though less expensive crinoline cages (with fewer hoops) were available for those who could afford the style. The lower classes wore coarser fabrics.

Most women of the day wore solid fabrics. Stripes and plaids were limited to the wealthy as matching pieces of fabric use more material. Small prints, like calico, were easier to match and mend. Calico prints were usually dark to hide stains. Black was a common color for all classes and worn for mourning dress.

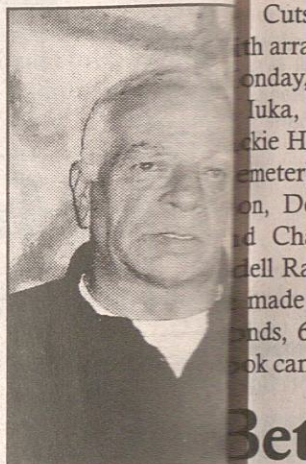

# The Form of God's Judgment that Came to Rebellious Judah (part 5)

If we go back to the garden of Eden, we will learn that God had an order for the home and family, even though that order was not followed very well by even our first parents. Isaiah writes from the fact that God is in control of all governments, whether or not those governments and their peoples willing submit to Him, or suffer His judgment for failing to submit. I do not think any of us need to use Scripture to "push our own ideas", but I do think all of us should be honest enough to figure out what God is saying about human government in Israel, as well as in the nations of the world. Actually, the idea of government started a long time before any formal hu-

man government was set up, for it started in the garden of Eden. By the time we get to the prophet Isaiah hundreds and thousands of years have passed since Eden. So, Isaiah writes about the wrong of mankind, both in governmental leadership and individual actions.

Isaiah 3:14-15 will continue our story: "The LORD will enter into judgment with the ancients of His people, and the princes thereof: for ye have eaten up the vineyard; the spoil of the poor is in your houses. What mean ye

that ye beat My people to pieces, and grind the faces of the poor? saith the Lord God of hosts." We have not yet seen exactly the "form of judgment" that God will bring on Judah, but we are seeing that He will bring judgment. In these verses we see that God will enter into judgment with the ancients (meaning the old men, basically) of His people. But we also see that the princes of the people are involved in this judgment, which means the leaders. The reason for God's judgment is also given, for these have

eater the vineyards that were not theirs; they have spoiled the poor; they have beaten God's people to pieces and ground the faces of the poor, which means to treat them like grain that is "ground" in a mill! Oppression by leaders has always been condemned by the Lord, as is the case here! We see that it is the "princes", or leaders of Judah, who are oppressing the people, especially the poor. The idea of having "eaten up the vineyards" and having the "spoil of the poor" in the houses of the ancients and princes also speaks of the oppression of the poor and the financial strain put on them by the princes. God asks the princes what they meant by

their actions, and any who may think that such questions from God were only for people of ages past will someday learn that God is always against oppression, no matter from what "page in history" it may come! God has not finished with His message of judgment on Judah, but I will not be able to go further than this for this writing. I will say that the message from our verses comes from "the Lord God of hosts", which means that God is over all the "hosts" of men. Our word "hosts" means: "a mass of people, especially warriors. So God is over all "hosts" of men, including soldiers, kings and common people!

## Shiloh National Military Park to offer Special Ranger Led Tour

SHILOH- Shiloh is pleased to announce a ranger-led hike entitled: "Crittenden Pushes the Union" on Saturday, June 19. Join Park Ranger Timothy on a hike which will provide a glimpse into the advance, as they attempted to negotiate the tangle of the Hornets' Nest, and drive the enemy from the Daniel Davis Wheat Field and the Hamburg Road, where it halted as the battle drew to a close.

General Thomas L. Crittenden's 5th Division of General Don Carlos Buell's Army of the Ohio fought the center of the Union line as it began its attack on April 7th, 1862. To the troops fighting through the center of the battlefield that morning, the severity of the previous day's combat became apparent. When the Union Division commanded by General Thomas Crittenden approached the dense woods which the day before was dubbed, "The Hornets' Nest," they ran into very heavy resistance. Over several hours of fighting the Union advance ground to a halt.

The hike will take place from 10:00 am - 12:00 pm and hikers will meet at Tour Stop #2 (Confederate Cemetery). The distance of the hike is two-miles over rough terrain passing through woods and crossing streams. Participants should wear clothing and shoes appropriate for the weather. Insect repellent and sunscreen are recommended.

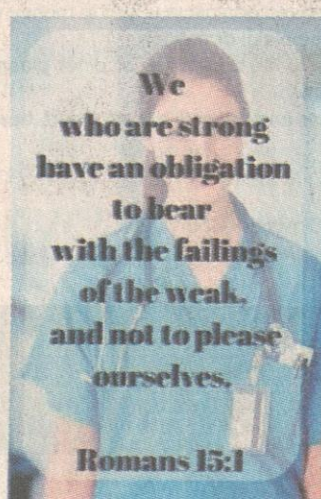
